- I, James C. Kirkpatrick, hereby certify as follows:
- 1. I am the duly elected, qualified, and acting Secretary of State for the State of Missouri.
- 2. A part of my duties include being the keeper of the official statutes of the State of Missouri and the promulgation of same.
- 3. I hereby certify that Sections 560. 120 and 560. 135 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri 1959, define the crime of Armed Robbery First Degree by Means of a Dangerous and Deadly Weapon and delineate the limits of punishment of said crime. A true copy of said sections is set out hereinafter in full in words and figures as follows:

Section 560. 120. Robbery in first degree.

"Every person who shall be convicted of feloniously taking the property of another from his person, or in his presence, and against his will, by violence to his person, or by putting him in fear of some immediate injury to his person; or who shall be convicted of feloniously taking the property of another from the person of his wife, servant, clerk or agent, in charge thereof, and against the will of such wife, servant, clerk or agent, by violence to the person of such wife, servant, clerk or agent, or by putting him or her in fear of some immediate injury to his or her person, shall be adjudged guilty of robbery in the first degree."

Section 560. 135. Armed robbery -- punishment for robberies.

"Every person convicted of robbery in the first degree by means of a dangerous and deadly weapon shall suffer death, or be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary for not less than five years, and every person convicted of robbery in the first degree by any other means shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary for not less than five years; every person convicted of robbery in the second degree shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not exceeding five nor less than three years; every person convicted of robbery in the third degree shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not exceeding five years."

The Ambassador of the United States of America at London presents his compliments to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary for Foreign Affairs and has the honor, on instructions of the Department of State, to request the extradition to the United States in accordance with the Extradition Treaty between the United States of America and Great Britain signed at London on December 22, 1931, of James Earl RAY, alias Eric Starvo GALT, alias John WILLARD, alias Harvey LOWMEYER, alias Harvey LOWMYER, alias Ramon George SNEYD, alias Ramon George SNEYA, alias W. C. HERRON, alias James McBRIDE, alias James O'CONNER, alias James WALTON, alias James WALYON, alias Paul BRIDGMAN, alias "JIM", presently in custody in the United Kingdom under the name of Ramon George SNEYD for the crimes of murder and robbery with violence. Mr. Ray is presently under indictment in Shelby County in the State of Tennessee for murder in the first degree. This crime is covered by paragraph 1 of Article 3 of the Extradition Treaty between the United States of America and Great Britain. Mr. Ray has also been convicted of the crime of robbery, first degree by means of a dangerous and deadly weapon on December 17, 1959 in the city of St. Louis, State of Missouri, and sentenced on February 19, 1960 to be confined for a period of 20 years. He escaped from the Missouri State penitentiary on April 23, 1967,

leaving an unexpired term with legal expiration of March 16, 1980. This crime is covered by paragraph 16 of Article 3 of the Extradition Treaty. Both the State of Tennessee and the State of Missouri have requested his extradition. Authenticated documents covering the aforementioned indictment and conviction are attached.

- 2. The Government of the United States of America is prepared to designate agents to receive Mr. RAY alias Eric Starvo GALT, alias John WILLARD, alias Harvey LOWMEYER, alias Harvey LOWMYER, alias Ramon George SNEYD, alias Ramon George SNEYA, alias W. C. HERRON, alias James McBRIDE, alias James O'CONNER, alias James WALTON, alias James WALYON, alias Paul BRIDGMAN, alias "JIM", in the United Kingdom and convey him to the United States at the proper time. Therefore, the Ambassador would be grateful if Her Majesty's Government would inform him when the agent or agents should come to this country to receive the said James Earl RAY, alias Ramon George SNEYD.
- 3. The law firm of Rowe and Maw, Stafford House, Strand, London, W.C. 2, has been authorized to represent the United States of America on the requisitions of the State of Tennessee and the State of Missouri in this matter.



AFFIDAVIT

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA) ss:

LYNDAL L. SHANEYFELT, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

- I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and am assigned to the Laboratory of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at its Headquarters Office in Washington, D. C. I have been employed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation continuously since 1940, except for almost one year of army service in 1945. From 1940 until 1951 I did photographic work. In 1951 I became a Special Agent and was assigned as a field investigator to the Detroit Field Office. In 1952 I was reassigned to the Laboratory as a document examiner specializing in photographic matters. Since 1952 I have been employed continuously and exclusively in examining questioned documents and photographic evidence. I have received training in this specialized field in the Laboratory, attending lectures, reading the recommended literature on the subject, and conducting experiments, as well as working initially as an apprentice under an experienced examiner. During the course of my career I have examined thousands of photographs for the purposes of comparison, including comparisons to establish the identification of individuals.
- 2. I have examined the photograph attached as
 Exhibit 2 to the affidavit of Donald F. Wood, a copy of
 which photograph also appears as Exhibit I attached to this

affidavit, and compared it with the photographs attached as Exhibit II to the affidavit of George J. Bonebrake, a copy of which photographs also appear as Exhibit II attached to this affidavit, and have concluded from my examination which involved a comparison of the front view of the individual depicted in the attachment to the Bonebrake affidavit and the individual depicted in the attachment to the Wood affidavit that these two photographs depict the same individual.

3. I have based my conclusion on a comparison of all of the facial characteristics in these photographs, including the contour of the ears, nose, mouth, areas surrounding the eyes, and the significant wrinkles and lines appearing in the face.



AFFIDAVIT

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA) ss:

GEORGE J. BONEBRAKE, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

- of Investigation in Washington, D. C. I have held this position since October 1941. I have attended schools and other training classes conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to qualify me for my position. During the time I have been a Fingerprint Examiner, I have made millions of fingerprint comparisons for identification purposes. I have testified as a fingerprint expert witness in numerous cases in federal and state courts as well as in military courts-martial with regard to my findings based on comparisons of fingerprints.
- 2. On April 5, 1968, at approximately 5:15 a.m., at the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington, D.C., I received certain objects of evidence from Special Agent Robert Fitzpatrick. These objects were identified to me as being part of the investigation into the shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr. in Memphis, Tennessee, on the previous day. Among the items delivered to me were a Remington Model 760 rifle, serial number 461476, with Redfield telescopic sight number A 17350, and a pair of 7 by 35 Bushnell binoculars, serial number DQ 408664. I examined each of these objects for latent fingerprints, and subsequently on April 5, 1968, I developed one latent fingerprint on the rifle, one latent fingerprint on the telescopic sight, and one latent fingerprint on the binoculars. These were the only latent prints on these

objects which contained sufficient characteristic ridge detail to be of value for identification purposes.

- 3. On April 19, 1968, I compared each of the afore-mentioned three latent prints with the known fingerprints of James Earl Ray obtained by officials of the Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles, California, on October 11, 1949. The fingerprint card made by the Los Angeles Police Department is contained in the official fingerprint files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington, D. C. From my comparison I formed the opinion that they were the fingerprints of the same man. I determined that the latent fingerprint on the Remington rifle and the latent fingerprint on the binoculars are identical to the left thumbprint of James Earl Ray, and that the latent fingerprint on the telescopic sight is identical to the right ring-fingerprint of James Earl Ray.
- 4. The official fingerprint files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington also contain the fingerprint record of James Earl Ray, taken in connection with his incarceration in the Missouri State Penitentiary on March 17, 1960, following a conviction of first degree robbery. I have compared the fingerprints of James Earl Ray taken in connection with his arrest on October 11, 1949, by the Los Angeles Police Department with the fingerprints taken in connection with the incarceration of James Earl Ray in the Missouri State Penitentiary on March 17, 1960, and I have determined that these prints are of the same person.

 California Police Department. Attached as Exhibit II is a photographic copy of the known prints of James Earl Ray, taken on March 17, 1960, in connection with his incarceration in the Missouri State Penitentiary. Attached as Exhibits III, IV and V are three photographs, each depicting one of the afore-mentioned three latent finger-prints developed by me respectively on the rifle, the telescopic sight, and the binoculars.
- 6. I am also an Assistant Custodian of the fingerprint records of the Identification Division of the Federal
 Bureau of Investigation. As such, I am familiar with the
 contents of those records and am authorized to have copies
 made of those records and to certify as to their authenticity.
- 7. The fingerprint card attached as Exhibit II on Form FD-249, is a true copy of the original record in my custody and was prepared under my supervision. The original was received by the Federal Bureau of Investigation from the Warden of the State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 4, 1960 and contains the photograph (profile and front view), fingerprints, and signature of James Earl Ray, an inmate of the Penitentiary then serving a 20-year sentence.



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

AFFIDAVIT

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA) ss:

ROBERT A. FRAZIER, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

- 1. I am 49 years old and I reside in Hillcrest Heights, Maryland.
- I obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Idaho in 1940. I have been a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation since December 1942. I am Chief of the Firearms Unit of the Physics and Chemistry Section of the Federal Bureau of Investigation laboratory in Washington, D. C. I have been assigned to the Firearms Unit continuously since June 9, 1941. I received the specialized training program in firearms identification of approximately one year duration from the Federal Bureau of Investigation when I was initially assigned to the Firearms Unit. Since being assigned to this unit I have made thousands of comparisons of bullets and cartridge cases with the firearms for the purpose of determining whether a particular firearm fired a bullet or cartridge case. I have testified on numerous occasions in federal and state courts, as well as in military courts martial, as a firearms identification expert witness.
- 3. On April 5, 1968, at the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory, I received certain items of evidence from Robert Fitzpatrick, Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation who had brought

them by airplane from Memphis, Termessee. These objects had been obtained in connection with the investigation of the shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr. on the previous day.

- 4. Among the items of evidence I received was a .30-06 Springfield caliber Remington rifle, Model 760, serial number 461476, with clip, and a Redfield telescopic sight, serial number A17350. I also received from Special Agent Fitzpatrick a .30 caliber metal-jacketed "soft-point" sporting type Remington-Peters bullet, an expended .30-06 Springfield caliber Remington-Peters cartridge casing, and a Peters cartridge box, bearing manufacturer's index number 3033 containing five unfired .30-06 Springfield caliber Remington-Peters cartridges and four unfired .30-06 Springfield caliber U. S. military cartridges containing full metal-jacketed bullets.
- 5. I determined from microscopic examination that the expended .30 caliber metal-jacketed rifle bullet had been fired from a barrel rifled with six lands and grooves, right twist. As a result of my examination of the submitted rifle I determined that it produces general rifling impressions on fired bullets having the physical characteristics of those on the submitted bullet. I also determined that the submitted bullet was a 150-grain soft-point bullet identical to the bullets in the five Remington-Peters cartridges contained in the submitted Peters cartridge box.
- 6. Because of distortion due to mutilation and insufficient marks of value, I could draw no conclusion as to whether or not the submitted bullet was fired from the submitted rifle.

7. The .30-06 Springfield caliber Remington-Peters cartridge case was identified by me as having been fired in and extracted from the submitted rifle. This determination was based on a comparison of the microscopic markings of the firing pin, bolt face and extractor left on the cartridge case by the rifle. Based on physical characteristics, I determined that the fired bullet was of a kind that the manufacturer loads into the submitted cartridge case to produce cartridges similar to the Remington-Peters cartridges in the Peters cartridge box.

- I, Donald F. Wood, being duly sworn, depose and say:
- (1) I reside at 405 Lance Lane, Birmingham, Alabama and am employed by my father Robert E. Wood, Sr. at his store Aeromarine Supply Company, 5701 Airport Highway, Birmingham, Alabama as a salesman:
- (2) On Friday, March 29, 1968, in the early afternoon I observed Mr. U. L. Baker, also a salesman at the Aeromarine Supply Company, completing the sale of a rifle to an individual unknown to me. The purchaser had given his name as Harvey Lowmeyer. He purchased a Remington Model 700, caliber .243 Winchester with a Redfield scope mounted thereon, and 20 rounds of .243 ammunition.
- (3) Later that afternoon someone identifying himself as Lowmeyer called on the telephone and stated that he had had a conversation with his brother and had decided that he wished to exchange the rifle he had purchased for a Remington Model 760, 30.06 caliber. I agreed to make this exchange at additional cost.
- (4) At approximately 9:00 o'clock A. M. on Saturday, March 30, 1968 the same individual returned to the store with the gun he had previously purchased. I told him that I would change the scope from the caliber .243 rifle to the model 760, but that it would take me until approximately 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon.
- (5) He returned that afternoon and I gave him the Model 760 gun with the scope mounted on it. The Serial No. of the gun was 461476, and a copy of the sales invoice is attached to this affidavit as Exhibit 1. I also exchange the box of .243 caliber ammunition for a box of 30.06 ammunition. I did not charge him the additional amount as anticipated because the base and rings used mounting the scope for the second gun were less expensive and made up the difference. The purchaser left the store carrying the gun in a cardboard box utilized by the Browning Manufacturing Company. This box was given to him because, with the

scope mounted on it the rifle would not fit in the normal Remington box.

- (6) On April 16, 1968 I was visited by two agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and shown photographs of seven white males. After viewing the group of photographs which were identified to me only by number, and after careful consideration, I selected the photograph which had been marked No. 5 (attached to this affidavit as Exhibit 2) as the man to whom the rifle was sold on March 29, 1968 and who returned it to me on March 30, 1968 in exchange for a Remington Model 760. At that time I advised the agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as follows: "I can't say exactly at this time, but I think this is the man. To the best of my memory I believe that this is the man that bought the gun".
- (7) Upon examining the photograph again today I reaffirm the statement I made on April 16, 1968, to the agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
