I want back outside and gave Jerry Prokes the four drinks and then want back to the car with Jon Frabbicle with our two drinks. More time passes and when I was ready to so including and so to sleep right before I left I saw that everyone but Jerry Prokes had left Aunt Charlie's. Jerry Prokes told me that he was I have to wait until he was finished with buying the cocsine before he could purchase any antiques as he didn't know how much money he would have left.

Again I emphasized the fact that I wanted absolutely nothing to do with the drug docklings or any illegal activities. After speaking with Jerry Prokes I left Aunt Charlie's and went home to my mother's home to go to sleep. Before I left Aunt Charlie's, Jerry Prokes told me that he'll be through with his business by tomorrow night, so that he would know how much money he would have left to spend on art and antiques by then. He urged me to meet him at Aunt Charlie's the following night with photographs and materials.

The second night that Jerry Prokos was in town I went to Aunt Charlie's with my photographs of a de sculptures. When I arrived the second night neither Jerry Prokos or Special Agent Jerry Chapmen were there. Scott Boyd, Tommy Rauschenberg, Jimmy Boyd and his girl friend, Jan Beechcamp and Arme Rhett had arrived. I was talking with Jimmy Boyd and his girl friend when Jerry Prokos came in with Special Agent Jerry Chapman.

When Jerry Prokes first walked in I asked him if he had finished his business yet, and he said that he hadn't. I told him that when he was through with his ousiness for him to get with me which he assured me that he would. I sat with him and Special Agent Jerry Chapman for a few moments and showed them photographs of the ancient Chinese jade sculptures.

Tommy Rauschenberg was on the phone at this time and when he got off the telephone at this time and when he got off the phone, he whispered something into the ear of Jerry Prokos and then Jerry Prokos was whispering to Special Agent Jerry Chapman and then Special Agent Jerry Chapman got up and left with Tommy Rauschenberg and Scott, Boyd.

The rest of the evening until I was arrested I was sitting with Jimmy Boyd, Jimmy Boyd's girl friend and Anne Rhett at a table with Jerry Prokos. We were not discussing drugs or anything of the sort. I was discussing ancient Chinese jade sculptures and old times, and whit mutual friends were doing.

Just moments before Federal D.E.A. agents stormed into Aunt Charlie's Jimmy Boyd got up to use the rest room and his girl friend went to get more drinks or something, leaving just Anne Rhett; myself and Jerry Prokos there. At this time, Jerry Prokos attempted to give me a large amount of money in advance as a down payment for the purchase of ancient Chinese jade sculptures. He also attempted to purchase a black jade and like gold bracelet; an antique green jade Ching Dynasty jade amulet and 18K gold chain for more than what they were worth.

I didn't accept this money from Mr. Produce I had enly the toggraphs of jade soutplines with me ind because I had that Mr. Prokon't behavior was of whichly suspections return. There vereffee to the this I now know that that hight who would be million to testify to this. I now know that Mr. Prokos was attempting to give me marked one hundred collar notes which would have linked me to that the dealth.

At the timerof my arrest in Audit Charles I offered absolutely no resilutence to the agents of the D.E.A., but with hendouffs much on my hands I was beatened by the D.E.A. arents first in front of the front window of Aunt Charlie's so that all who were inside of Aunt Charlie's could see. There were many people there that sight who will gladly testify to this. I'm sure a very this is not the full extent of my abuse.

Upon entering Aunt Charlie's These seme Federal D.E.A. agents cursed me and called me a fagget; Loudly stating such slanderous insults as "Byron, you goddamn fagget! So you want to go back to prison and suck some more dicks and take it in the ass." I was also physically struck inside the establishment of Aunt Charlie's by those same fine representatives of the Federal Government. Furthermore, Agent Bennie Swint; Jr. made the remark very loudly so that all could hear "Come on you goddamn fagget, move it! You're going back to prison to suck some big dicks."

Certainly this is slander, not discounting the fact that I was struck numerous times in a public place. Many girl friends know that I have no unnatural sex drives. These same agents robbed me of over \$70.00. I can prove the manner in which I canned this money which was my Social Security check which I had cashed, some of which I had spent. I can produce people who were there to testify to the fact that I had the money just moments prior to my arrest. Plus, I have the receipt still where I had only \$1.85 when I entered the Fulton County Jail immediately after my arrest.

I shall not fail to mention that upon my arrival at the D.E.A. headquarters in Atlanta, where I was taken first after I was picked up at Aunt Charlie's, agent Bennie Swint, Jr. took me to an office to further search me and "talk to me." Once agent Bennie Swint. Jr. and I were alone in that office, Bennie Swint said to me "Now why don't you call Brad Marcello up and ask him to sell you a pound of heroin. I bet you he won't do it now."

Also, at this time agent Bennie Swint, Jr. removed a black jade and likegold bracelet from my arm which I had purchased for cash 12.5/74 and for which I still have my receipt as well as an antique silver malacite ring which I also still have my receipt for there I boundty them. I also had in my possession one Chien Lung (ca. 1750 A.P.) white jade amulet of a lock which was buried with the dead to lock their spirits to the earth so that they wouldn't become thest. These items were never returned to me nor was I given a feccipt for them by agent Bennie Swint. At the Proliminary Coaring Dade Joel Toldmin dropped the charges against me because of a Moto he Fad received from the D.E.A. stating that T had book working with Them providing information on Strug traffits sing. Harold A. Gold of Nadler and Gold (Suite 1710, Rhodes-Haverty Blaz., 13) Poschtron Shi, Atlanta) represented me at the Proliminary Hearing.

I was indicted by the Pederal Grand Jury on the charge of conspiring to distribute six obness of cocains on March 6th. I was charged with conspiracy to sell and distribute 10 ounces of cocaine at the Prelim nary Hearing at which the charges were dropped. What happened to the four missing ounces of cocaine?

The original charges against us was conspiracy to sell and distribute 10 ounces of cocaine and by the time the charges reached the Crand Jury, it's only 6 ounces. Now here is a surprise, while Tommy Rauschenberg was in jail with me, he told me that he had sold Special Arent Jerry Chapman 2 lbs of cocaine that night and Scott Boyd agreed with Tommy Rauschenberg as to this fact - that it was 2 lbs of cocaine that Tommy Rauschenberg gold - not 6 ounces as the charges stand now and not 10 ounces as the charges were at the Preliminary Hearing.

What happened to the restrof the cocaine which the agents solzed Tommy Rauschenberg has been sentenced to seven years in rederal prison with no parole, so he will probably be willing to testify as to the amount of cocaine which he sold to special Agent Jerry Chaoman the night of this arrest.

Mr. Harold A. Gold who represented me at the Preliminary Hearing was an attorney for the Public Defenders office. William Scott Boyd was in the Fulton County Jail with me and was discussing with me the possibility of having Harold Gold represent him in this case. Jimmy Boyd, Scott Boyd's brother told my mother over the telephone that they were going to pay Mr. Gold to represent Scott Boyd. Shortly after this conversation occured, Mr. Gold dropped my case completely.

While in jail Scott Boyd wrote a letter to Mr. Be nard Fensie r-wald stating that I had absolutely nothing to do with the sale or distribution of the cocaine for which I had been charged. Scott Boyd also indicated in his letter to Mr. Fensterwald the I was being framed by Jerry Prokos, as I had absolutely nothing to do with that dope deal.

Later, I was told that Mr. Gold took Scott Boyd before a closed session of the Federal Grand Jury on March 6, 1975 where Scott Boyd testified that I set the whole cocaine deal up. I was told that Scott Boyd did this because Mr. Gold had promised him that he would receive a light sentence by so doing. My trial is set for April 14, 1975, 10:00 A.M. in the Old Post Office Bidg., Room 318, Judge James C. Lill, later changed to Judge Edenfeld.

las been convicted of time f Jerry Prokos has been convicted of two foodlos, one for sales of heroin in Michigan and the other one for steading an airplane. Brad Marcello (this is not his real name) and is Prognick Orleans, Louisana was arrested in New Orleans towards the end of 1967 or the early part of 1968 for Bossession of heroin which was found in the garage portion of a carage martrant in which Brad Marcello was living. Brad Marcello made bond on this chirpe and their promptly left the state of Louisana. He never went to court on this charges, are still pending against Brad Marcello in the state of Educada, lat though, it isn't on the NCIC computer used by the police as they are old charges. According to my information, there is still a warrant outstanding for Brad Marcello's arrest in New Orleans. These ren are Tederal narcotics agents and are protected by the Drug informant Administration. This is why I have been framed for this charge. Jorry Prokos onios, one for sales

If you'll remember, I had arranged to make a very large buy of narcotics from Brad Marcello, Jerry Prokes and Mick Catri when I first started to work for the J...A. Iv as not allowed to proceed and have Brad Marcello and his associates go through with the sale of a large amount of narcotics to my buyer who was to be a D.E.A. agent. Instead, I was framed by Jerry Prokos and arrested by the D.E.A.

Furthermore, I had arranged for the D.E.A. to make a size oble buy of nercotics from Charlie Land whom I mentioned earlier. Charlie Land's brother is Lemand and they sell every kind of drug or narcotic which there is to sell, and yet, they are never arrested or anything, with the exception of a few counteror arrests which resulted in Charlie spending. absolutely no time in prison. I had also arranged for the D.E.A. agents to purchase cocaine from Mr. Ambroise of Ambroise & Company which is located directly across the street from the Old Post Office Building. Mr. Ambroise is Ron Daveney's partner in that business.

I originally met Ron Daveney through Bill Arnett as Ron Daveney was working with Bill Arnott in William and Robert Arnett, Inc. until Are Ron Daveney did many dishonest things to undermine Bill Arnett's business which resulted in Ron Daveney being kicked out of the company. After Bill Arnett threw Ron Daveney out of his business, Ron Daveney became associated with a Mr. Ambroise.

When Mr. Ambroise and Ron Daveney formed their partnership, they opened up a small art callery on Poplar Street which is directly across the street from the Old Post Office building. The company is now list-ed under "Jewelers" - Retail, "87 Ponlar Street, N. W. Mr. Ambroise and Ron Daveney are now using Ambroise and Company as a Tront for the smuggling of narcotics into this country from South America in particular.

After my return from Chile, just prior to my decision to attempt to Work for the Federal candsters, Mr. Ambroise and I made contact when I wondered into his business off of the street one day after doing some research work on art. Upon introducing myself, Mr. Ambroise recognized me. (although, I do not remember having met him before). Mr. Ambroise approached me with the propersition that he would like for me to distribute narcotics for winself and Mr. Deventor of the property of the proper tribute narcotics for binself and Mr. Daveney. Mr. Ambroise informed

Mr. Ambreise didn't even seem to worky on care about the fact that he told me that Ron Daveney was in South America to smuggle docaine into this country.—If I was involved in something like that I certainly wouldn't just tell anyone about what I was doing. Man Ambreise told me that if I would distribute cocaine for him and Ron Daveney. I wouldn't have to worky about being arrested if I was careful as Mr. Ambreise is a very close personal friend and business as sociate of a Federal narcotics ment by the name of Mr. Amods from Glayton County, Georgia.

I didn't believe Mr. Ambroise when he told me this as I felt that he was just trying to get me to sell his dope for him and ret me into trouble. Now I do completely doubt that there is any honesty as far as the D.r.A. is concerned.

Going back to wayne who was a big time syndicate fining and dope out of Columbia up through Florida, if you'll remember I gid not know Wayne's last name, although, he was living in the Hill Top apartments off of Piedmont Road. I still remember the apartment in which Wayne lived. Wayne's apartment was located directly across from that of Mr. Jeff Wilcox's who was a local heroin addict, with whom I did not associate but knew only briefly and mostly I know him by his terrible reputation. There should still be 15 caliber built noise in that apartment where Wayne's little boy was playing with one of Wayne's machine guns and it went off.

New Wayne was married to a woman of short statue with blond hair whom he always referred to as "the hooker." I suppose he firth hamed her that.

Going back to Brad Marcello, during one of Brad Marcello's and Jerry Prokos' tring to Atlanta, I introduced Jerry Prokos to Mr. Gary Margol and Mr. Jim Plant who is doing research work at Emory University in the fields of Bio Chemistry and Micro-Biology. Neither Cary Margol or Jim Plant are drug dealers, nor involved in any illegal activities to my knowledge.

In any event, on Brad Marcello's and Jerry Prokos' next trip to Atlanta, they approached both Mr. Plant and Mr. Margol with an offer to pay them for helping Brad Marcello and Jerry Prokos set up a lab to make such drugs as MDA, PCP, STP, etc. Mr. Marcello and ir. Prokos offered to pay for the lab and all of its equipment, chemicals, etc., as well as peving both Mr. Plant and Mr. Margol for their set vices, plus a percentage of the profits from the sale of the drugs that they would be making.

Jorry Proces and Brad Mircolds were to the drugs which would be made by the lab. Brad Marcello had arranced all of these dope deals separately and had offered to give me 165,000.00 to deliver the done from his plane to each of these people or their representatives. To prove to me that he was not lying, Brad Marcello phoned Michael Tutock at his home in Farmington who confirmed that he was buying a pound of so-caine from Brad Marcello. Michael Tutock also stated that he was selling some pounds of P.C.P. to Brad Marcello. Shortly after Brad Marcello made this offer to me, I jumped on the next jet out of Detroit to Atlanta leaving Brad with his dope deals.

Another odd incident occured just about December 29, 1975 (Time not sure as to the date). I was nicked up by this nick by the name of Jon Frabbiele. Unile at Jon Frabbiele's finantment, Jerry Prokos called me and told me that he had fotten the number where I was from my mother. Jerry Prokos was calling me reparting his burchases of ancient Chinese jade sculptures and other objects of art which was to take place during Jerry Prokos next trip to Atlanta. During my conversation with Jerry Prokos, I mentioned Brad Marcello's hame.

After I was through talking to Jerry Prokos, Miss Practicle told me that she knew Brad Marcello, Brad Marcello's father and his brothers and whole family. Miss Practicle also indicated that she knew Nick Catri as well. while I was in Asia with Bill Jackson, I learned through him that he had sent a shipment of Asian heroin back to the United States consealed inside a teckwood log. While in Banckok, Bill Jacksom purchased a lot of hugh teckwood logs - One of these had a hollow place in it in which the beroin was hidden. After the heroin was hidden inside this hollow place in the log, it was packed in with dirt, then a layer of cement was added, covering this thin layer of cement was a layer of plastic wood or "wood puddy."

BACKGROUND: This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King in Memphis, Tennessee, in April, 1968. James Earl Ray had pleaded guilty in State Court, Tennessee, and is presently serving a 99-year sentence.

Ray had appealed his conviction on grounds that he was not properly represented or counseled by his attorney at the time he entered his guilty plea in 1969. However, in February, 1975, a Writ of Habeas Corpus was denied Ray in U. S. District Court, Western District of Tennessee.

On June 21, 1975, the Wire Services carried information revealed by Atlanta, Georgia, Public Safety, Commissioner Reginald Eaves, to the effect that Eaves was in possession of "... strong information on the conspiracy" in the death of Martin Luther King. Eaves indicated that he had received this information from a second party, which information "warrants our serious consideration." A copy of this information was furnished by Eaves to our Atlanta Office.

A review of this information by the Atlanta Division revealed that the source, Robert Byron Watson, previously had been interviewed by Special Agents of the Atlanta Division on 4/7/71. At that time, Watson admitted that his information pertaining to the murder of Martin Luther King was completely fabricated. Subsequent investigation also failed to substantiate any of the information as reversed by Watson. The results of that interview and of the subsequent investigation were furnished to the Civil Rights Division, U. S. Department of Justice, in April, 1971.

The information furnished by Mr. Eaves to the Atlanta Office is identical to that previously furnished to the Atlanta Office in 1971.

(Recent investigation by Atlanta Police Department is based on information received by Eaves recently pertaining to an individual, Robert Byron Watson, who has furnished statements pertaining to his knowledge of a conspiracy. Watson had furnished this same information to Secret Service and to FBI in 1971, and at that time, during FBI interview, admitted information was fabricated. Statement of Watson and results of interview were furnished to Department in 1971 and again in 1975 when received by Atlanta FBI from Eaves. Eaves has been advised of this information pertaining to Watson.)



Eaves then returned the ball to where it had been ever since the Nobel Prize winning civil rights leader was gunned down in 1968; The U.S. Department of Justice and local authorities in Memphis.

The commissioner ordered an investigation into the King murder a month ago after comedian Dick Gregory gave him a copy of a statement by a twice-convicted drug dealer. Robert Byron Watson, who claimed to have overhears several Atlanta men discussing King's murder a week before it occurred.

The Watson statement proided no accurate information in the assassination.

The Atlanta Constitution, Page 1-A, July 30, 1975

Eaves said the statement did give Atlanta investigators unspecified "leads" in the case, but indicated the "leads" had nothing to do with the Atlanta men.

In fact, he said two of the men named by Watson who are still living in Atlanta took polygraph examinations over the weekend, and the lie detector indicated the indivis-

uals were not involved in the alleged conspiracy.

"Based on this evidence," Eyes said in a prepared statement, "our investigation, therefore, causes us to reject the probability of a conspiracy based upon the specificallegations made by Watson in the document he submitted relative to Dr. King's death."

Watson and his mother, Mrs. R. W. Watson, have been trying to convince officials of the truth of the 21-year-old's story since 1970, two years after Dr. King's death.

The Atlanta office of the BI said it obtained the same aformation in 1971 and found groundless.

Watson claims to have been framed on charges of importating heroin in 1972 and charges of conspiring to distribute cocaine in January 1975 by "high government officials and the syndicate" because of his knowledge of the conspiracy.

Eaves said the Atlanta Bureau of Police Services investigation "found no evidence to support his claims."

A mental examination has been ordered for Watson, who is confined to the Federal Youth Center in Ashland, Ky.

At one point during the bureau's probe, Eaves said it would have been impossible for the FBI to investigate the Watson statement four years ago, because some of the information was as new as 1974.

During the Wednesday press conference, however, Eaves admitted that the new information concerned drugs, not the assassination.

Eaves' King Probe Called 'Waste, Embarrassment'

Public Safety. Commissioner Reginald Eaves' fruitless investigation into the assassination of Dr. Mar in Luther King Jr. was "a waste of time. money and a source of embarrassment to me and my family," one of the targets of that investigation said Wednesday.

Bane Culley, self-employed Atlanta businessman, said he had cooperated fully with investigators in the probe "at a great cost to me in terms of time and lawyers" fees."

Eaves said Wednesday a report he re-

sceived alleging an Atlanta-based conspiracy to kill Dr. King "could not be substantiated."

"Unless new information becomes available, I consider the subject closed," Eaves announced at a press conference.

Culley and several other men were named by Robert Byron Watson, a federal inmate serving time for a drug conviction, as having plotted King's death a week before the civil rights leader was shot April 1, 1968, on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis.

"I have no comment on what Watson had say until I have a chance to read his entire statement," Culley said. "But I think the fact that both the FBI and the Atlanta police have looked into it and dismissed it speaks for itself."

Culley said intelligence officers who interviewed him were "polite" but were not specific about what he was suspected of.

"I volunteered to take a polygraph examination," Culley said. "When it was completed I didn't even ask what the results were. I knew what they were."

Culley admitted that he knew his accuser when the young man worked at a Buckhead left gallery, the scene of the alleged plot to kill Dr. King. "If you know Watson or have ever alked with him, then you know what his sharges are worth," Culley said.

Watson, 21, is currently serving a five, year sentence in Ashland, Ky., for conviction of narcotics trafficking. U.S. District Judge Newell Edenfield, who originally sentenced Warson, has since ordered that he undergo psychicatric examination.

A rambling, 34-page statement by Watson on his dealings in the drug market included about three pages of information alleging the King plot. Eaves said Wednesday the statement was given to him by comedian Dick Gregory.

"I can now state categorically that many

"I can now state categorically that many of the names, places and dates concerning the alleged conspiracy have been corroborated," Eaves said. "However, equally as important, Watson's claims of involvement by individuals he named as conspiring to kill Dr. King could not be substantiated."

Eaves said that while the investigation of Watson's allegations proved fruitless, detectives did receive information "which indicates a

possibility" that there may have been a conspiracy linked to King's death.

He added, however, "We are unable to attest to the reliability of persons who claim knowledge of a conspiracy."

Because of the "many questions" which remain in the case, Eaves said he would ask the Justice department, officials in Memphis and U.S. Rep. Andrew Young to initiate an investigation "to insure that an injustice has not been perpetrated."

Eaves declined to discuss what new information his investigators had received. He conceded that Watson's report was the same one received and dismissed as useless by the FBI in 1971.

In the course of the investigation Eaves had accused the FBI of being uncooperative and not allowing access to its records.

Eaves said his investigators talked with 11 law enforcement agencies and 35 "non-governmental persons" during the investigation.
