For information of Memphis, referenced airtel and LHM furnished information from a Birmingham source, with whom insufficient information has been received to establish reliability, that indicated that MARTIN LUTHER KING's assassination was "lined up" by FRANK LABERTO (phonetic), an underworld figure in New Orleans.

FRANK LABERTO's connection in this matter was previously explored. Memphis airtel to New Orleans, 4/20/68, enclosed information received on 4/8/68, from JOHN MC FERREN, a Negro male, residing at Route 4, Box 133A, Somerville, Tennessee. On 4/4/68, MC FERREN picked up supplies for his grocery store at LL&L Produce Company, 814 Scott St., Memphis, Tennessee. While there, MC FERREN overheard a white male on the telephone say, "Kill the SOB on the balcony and get the job done. You will get your \$5,000." That person later said on the phone, "Don't come here. Go to New Orleans and get your money. You know my brother."

LL&L Produce Company was found to be operated by JAMES WILLIAM LATCH and FRANK CAMILLA LIBERTO. FRANK LIBERTO had a brother, TONY, in New Orleans REC-9 44-38461-60

Gn the late afternoon of Friday, 12/5/75, the U.S. Department of Justice submitted a request to FRIHO (General Investigative Division) to review all feles pertaining to the MURRIN investigation on Saturday and Sunday, 12/6-7/75.

As you are aware, the MURKIN investigation encompassed 84 sections of file. The locating of these files on such short notice and deadline was a task of considerable magnitude.

In the early evening of 12/5/75, Mrs. Emily L. Rogers Night Supervisor, Files and Communications Division, was advised of this request and urgency of same. Re Buffalo nitel dated 11/28/75 relating to newspaper publicity, etc., at Toronto, Ontario, Canada concerning efforts to reopen investigation of Dr. KING's death in the United States. Re nitel reflected that one HAROLD KIRK of Toronto was to be interviewed by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department (MTPD), Toronto since he reportedly had information relating to a former cellmate at Mimico Correctional Institute, identified as CLIFFORD H. ANDREWS, aka R. L. WARREN. As noted in referenced nitel ANDREWS, according to Toronto newspaper publicity reportedly could testify as to his participation in the plot to assassinate Dr. KING.

On 12/3/75, Staff Sgt . GERALD A. STEVENSON, Homicide Squad, MTPD, advised he had been responsible for an investigation in Toronto which led to HAROLD KIRK's subsequent incarceration at Mimico and that KIRK, probably because he remembered STEVENSON's name called the Homicide Squad at approximately 3:15 p.m. on 11/28/75 at which time he made reference to the KING newspaper publicity and asked to be interviewed.

Sgt. STEVENSON advised that he interviewed KIRK later on that afternoon at Mimico and that he apparently intended to impress STEVENSON with his importance due to his former association with CLIFFORD H. ANDREWS.

BU 44-374 STEVENSON characterized KIRK as a prolific check passer in the past and a "con man". KIRK claimed that he first met ANDREWS while in the hospital ward at Mimico in July, 1975 at which time he made various statements, exact details unrecalled, relating to the KING assassination. It was not until KIRK read the newspaper publicity re ANDREWS on 11/28/75 that he felt that there might be some substance to ANDREWS claim to have some knowledge of the alleged plot to assassinate Dr. KING. KIRK recalled that ANDREWS had told him he was in need of money to return to the United States and that he had also asked KIRK regarding the location of an individual in Toronto from whom he might obtain money. KIRK had no knowledge if ANDREWS had been successful in contacting this person in Toronto following ANDREWS release from Mimico. Summing up the contact with KIRK, Staff Sgt. STEVENSON was of the opinion that he, KIRK, had nothing positive to furnish relating to an alleged assassination plot based on conversations he had with ANDREWS previously. As previously reported in referenced nitel, ANDREWS reportedly was released from Mimico on 9/30/75. In this regard, Inspector GEORGE SELLAR (NA), Homicide Squad, MTPD, Toronto, advised 12/9/75 as follows: The 12/5/75 edition of the "Toronto Star," a Toronto daily newspaper, contained an article captioned, "Cited in King Case, Jailed Canadian Says He Knows Nothing," and was datelined Calgary, Alberta. This article made reference to ANDREWS, identifying him as CLIFFORD HOLMES ANDREWS, formerly of the Southampton - Port Elgin area of Ontario, as presently being incarcerated for a three month Canada period at the Calgary Correctional Institute, after being convicted of car theft. Reportedly, the institute's warden, identified as TERENCE DOWNIE, was quoted in the article as saying ANDREWS told him that he did not know anything about the assassination of Dr. KING and further that he did not wish to be interviewed by anyone concerning it. - 2 -2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

BU 44-374 An additional article regarding this matter appeared in the 12/6/75 edition of the "Toronto Star," wherein the warden of Calgary said that ANDREWS actually was serving only one month in prison there and that it was expected he would be released around 12/10/75. This article, along with other things, pointed out that prison records, not further identified, revealed that ANDREWS was in jail in Sudbury, Ontario, on the day that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was assassinated in April, 1968. Reference is made to Tampa memorandum dated July 2, 1974.

On December 12, 1975, Robert Thomas Wehunt, Jr., 3109 Hartnett Avenue, Tampa, Florida, telephonically contacted the Tampa Office of the FBI and advised that on December 12, 1975, Angel Castillo, a reporter for the "St. Petersburg Times," a daily newspaper published in St. Petersburg, Florida, had contacted Wehunt and had requested that Wehunt telephone collect to John Crewdson, a reporter for the "New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York. Mr. Wehunt advised that Castillo indicated that Crewdson should be contacted by telephone number 202-293-3100.

Wehunt advised that he subsequently contacted John Crewdson at the above-listed telephone number at which time Crewdson indicated that he desired to come to Tampa, Florida, to interview Wehunt concerning information that Wehunt had previously furnished to the FBI concerning three signed statements that Wehunt's father had obtained from convicts in the Fulton County Jail, Atlanta, Georgia, indicating that these convicts had been approached by very influential businessmen to kill Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. for \$100,000. Wehunt stated that from his conversation with John Crewdson it was obvious to him that Crewdson had obtained the results of the interview of Wehunt by an FBI Agent of the Tampa Office which interview took place on July 1, 1974. Wehunt advised that he did not give a definite answer to Crewdson but indicated that he would recontact Crewdson at which time he would furnish a definite answer.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Wehunt advised that he desired to bring this to the attention of the FBI and he indicated that he planned to contact Angel Castillo and have Castillo contact Crewdson to notify Crewdson that Wehunt did not desire to be interviewed inasmuch as Crewdson apparently had all of the information that Wehunt had previously furnished to the FBI. In addition, Wehunt advised that he was going to notify Castillo that he is fearful of his life if it becomes public knowledge that he furnished information to the FBI to the effect that very influential businessmen had plotted to kill Dr. King.

On December 17, 1975, Wehunt telephonically contacted the Tampa Office and advised that upon instructions from his attorney he had contacted John Crewdson telephonically and had advised Crewdson that he did not desire to be interviewed by Crewdson.

At approximately 6:03 p.m., on 4/4/68, while standing on the second-floor balcony of the Lorraine Hotel in Memphis, Martin Luther King, Jr., was shot and billed when struck by a single-bullet. Minutes after the shooting applicite male was observed as he dropped a bundle on the sidewalk hear the scene of the crime and fled. Included in the abandoned articles was a rifle with a telescopic sight which was determined to have been purchased in Birmingham. We abandoned, in March, 1968.

By memorandum dated 4/4/68, Assistant Attorney, General Stephen J. (FBI jurisdiction was based on the possibility of a conspiracy to violate the civil rights of Markin Luther King, Jr., namely the Elghy to travel interstate. King had travelled to Memphis on 4/3/68 from Atlanta to take part in a demonstration scheduled bet 1/8/68

Investigation by FBI, Birmingham, revealed that on Friday, 3/29/68; a lone individual purchased a .341 cation model 700 Remington rille. The following day this individual returned this weapon, stated that his brother lindicated that this brother lindicated that this weapon was not sufficient and instead purchased a

Remington Model 760, .30-06 caliber rifle. This was the rifle recovered in Memphis immediately after the shooting of Dr. King.

Extensive investigation by this Bureau at that time determined the identity of the individual who purchased this weapon was Eric Starvo Galt.

On 4/16/68, the Attorney General authorized the filing of a complaint charging Galt with violation of T18, Section 241, for conspiring to interfere with the constitutional rights of Martin Luther King. Or.

On 4/17/68, Federal process was obtained and Galt was charged with conspiracy in that he and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother, entered into a conspiracy in Birmingham on 3/29/68, by reason of their purchase of the rifle later used in the shooting of Martin Luther King, Jr.

On 4/19/68, the Attorney General announced that James Earl Ray had been identified through FBI identification records as the Eric Starvo Galt against whom a Federal complaint had been filed.

Ray was arrested on 6/8/68 in London and was extradited.

On March 10, 1969, in State Court, Memphis, Tennessee, James Earl Ray entered a plea of guilty to charges of murder and received a 99-year sentence.

Federal process against Galt was dismissed on 12/2/71 by U. S. Commissioner Macy Taylor, Northern District of Alabama, based upon a motion filed by Ray's Attorney, Bernard Fensterwald, Jr.

Ray appealed his conviction on grounds that he was not properly represented or counseled by his attorney at the time he entered his guilty plea in 1969. However, a Writ of Habeas Corpus was denied Ray in U. S. District Court, Western District of Tennessee, on 2/27/75.

An appeal of this judgment handed down in the Western District of Tennessee was filed on behalf of James Earl Ray in the U. S. Court of Appeals, 6th Circuit, Cincinnati, Ohio, on 7/7/75. This appeal remains pending.

In the attached newspaper article which appeared in "The Washington Post" on 12/17/75, Jack Anderson claims that shortly after King's assassination on 4/4/68, Mr. Hoover, through an intermediary, sent word to Anderson that the motive behind the murder of King was cuckoldry and that the assassin apparently had been hired by a jealous husband. According to this article, the FBI intermediary identified the Los Angeles couple to Anderson.

Personnel in the Intelligence and General Investigative Divisions, familiar with our investigations of King and his assassination, were canvassed and had no recollection that an FBI representative contacted Anderson and advanced the above motive theory outlined in his article. In addition to canvassing personnel familiar with our investigations concerning King, there was recently completed a serial-by-serial review of the assassination (MURKIN) case and no evidence was discovered that Anderson was contacted.

Our canvass of personnel included SAC Richard Long of the Phoenix Office, who supervised the MURKIN case at FBIHQ.

Long stated that early in the MURKIN investigation, prior to identifying Ray, the Bureau interviewed a number of people close to King, including the Los Angeles woman with whom King had had a close relationship, to ask them if King had confided in them information relating to threats on King's life, which information could be used for leads in determining the identity of the assassin. However, Long did not recall anyone going to Anderson as claimed in the article.

The FBI vendetta against Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. didn't end with his murder, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, who had tried to blacken King's name while he was alive, also tried to tarnish it after his death.

Not long after King was gunned downron the balcony of his Memphis motel on April 4, 1963, Hoover sent word to me that the motive behind the murder was cuckoldry, that the assassin apparently had been hired by a jealous husband.

hired by a jealous husband.

I have held back this story for more, than seven years because of one rule against overlying sources. But floores is now today from the contemporary scene into history. His incredible attempt to panic King into committing suicide, it seems to me, also abrogates any right he may have had to confidentiality. Therefore, I have decided it is in the public interest to tell the story.

Back in 1968, I was on good terms with the old FBI curmodgeon. He sent word through an intermediary that King's killer, James Earl Ray, had been in Les Angeles shortly before he returned east to stalk the civil rights leader.

Hoover's messenger suggested that Ray had been hired by a Jealous husband, who had become enraged by the discovery that his wife had borne King's child. The intermediary identified the Los Angeles couple and showed me supporting dia, including an FBI report describing a passionate intertible between the wife and Dr. King in a New York City hote!

I was eager, of course, to find out who was behind the assassination. So I flew to Los Angeles and did my damnedest to confirm the FBI leads. I waylaid the wife and husband separately for confrontational interviews and questioned

others who might have known of the alleged love affair, the paternity of the child or the attitude of the husband toward King.

I could find absolutely no evidence that contradicted the couple's own explanation that Dr. King was an honored friend of the family, a frequent guest in their home and nothing more.

I also discovered with deepening apprehension that there were no FBI agents on this trail that was supposed to be so hot. I returned to Washington satisfied that the FBI story was erroneous and half convinced that it was a deliberate hoax.

Yet I was reluctant to believe ill of Hoover. Like so many others, I wanted to believe there was at least one rock of integrity in Washington. He had, after all, created a miracle — an honest and efficient police force out of what had been in 1924 a corrupt menagerie of drunks, hacks, misfits and courthouse hangers on. So I kept the jury out on Hoover.


In late 1970 the jury came in, for me. I happened to be on an airplane with the late Rep. Hale Boggs (D-La.), then the House majority leader. He told me how members of Congress were being intimidated, if not blackmailed, by Hoover.

He said that the FBI would come upon a skeleton in a member's closet — a woman, a vice, a shady business associate — and then get word to him that an accusation against him had reached the FBI and they wanted to alert him so he could be on his guard. From then on the member was likely to be a captive of Hoover.

For the next few days, I circulated among officials and reporters who were likely to know something about the dark side of Hoover. It discovered that every last one of them was afraid of Hoover. A check of the newspaper morgues in late 1970 demonstrated, the result of Hoover's carrot-and-stick mastery of public relations: decades of laudatory, often

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Buther King, Jr., in Memphis, Tennessee, in April, 1968.

Attached is a copy of a UPI release dated 12/11/75, in which Harold Weisberg, an author who has written several books critical of the Warren Commission, the FBI, Secret Service, and various police agencies, alleged that law enforcement units "from Tennessee to the Department of Justice" hid exidence and "contrived the story that Ray was a "lone unassisted assessin." Weisberg made the following allegations pertaining to the FBI:

ALLEGATION: There were marks on King's clothing which could not be matched to any possible effect of the bullet:

FACT: Autopsy reports in describing the damage to the triple right side of the face of Dr. King where the single bullet struck indicated "... there was a large gaping wound.

In the autopsy report, Dr. J. T. Francisco describes the entrance wound by stating there was "... extensive exceptable lesion affecting the right side of the face ... with a fracture of the right side of the mandible." (lower jaw).

The FBI Laboratory report dated 4/29/69 sets out the following information in relation to the examination of the clothing of Dr. King.

"There is a large hole in the right front portion of the shirt: The necktie has been forcibly torn apart in the right front neck portion also. The

or objects causing the damage were larger than a bullet of .30 caliber size and irregular in size as all of the yarns were broken, not cut. One or more segments of bone could not be eliminated as the cause of the damage."

ALLEGATION: The FBI knew there was no mark on the windowsill from which Ray was said to have fired the rifle.

FACT: Examination of the bathroom from which the shot was fired revealed that the bathroom window was jammed open to a height of about 3". Lt. J. D. Hamby, Homicide Bureau, Memphis Police Department, removed the windowsill because the sill "... appeared to have a recently made indentation."

The FBI Laboratory report of the examination of the windowsill dated 4/11/68, stated that the board bears a recent dent which could have been caused by a light blow from the muzzle of a weapon. The dent contains microscopic marks of the type which could be produced by the side of the barrel at the muzzle but insufficient marks for identification were left on the board due to the physical nature of the wood.

ALLEGATION: Weisberg stated that he had asked for the results of any spectrographic analysis of the bullet which killed Dr. King and was told there was none. Under his FOIA suit, he obtained such an analysis.

FACT: Under FOIA, Mr. Weisberg did request numerous material pertaining to this investigation, including the results of any spectrographic analyses.

The FBI denied this request by letter dated 6/27/75, and based this denial on the fact that James Earl Ray has an appeal pending in the U.S. 6th Circuit Court of Appeals. This denial was reversed by the Deputy Attorney General.

In his letter dated 12/1/75, Deputy Attorney General Tyler modified the denials for material by the FBI and stated, in error, that "... analyses were made only on the clothing of Dr. King at the time of his death."

The erroneous information furnished to Weisburg concerning the spectrographic analysis of the bullet came from the letter of the Deputy Attorney General to Weisberg and not from this Bureau.
