

Memorandum to Mr. Gallagher RE: MURKIN

Ralph never said the money being offered was to kill King. Powell states neither he nor his brother were involved in the murder of King.

Claude Powell, Jr., was interviewed and although he also claims a payment offer was made to kill King, his account differs somewhat from that of Leon Owen Powell. Claude Powell, Jr., states that three or four weeks prior to the murder of King, he and his brother, Leon, were seated in a booth in Pete's Bar in Atlanta. Ray Godfrey, Friend of Leon's, joined them in their booth and engaged in conversation with Leon. Claude paid no particular attention to what they were talking about. Godfrey then left the booth and approximately ten to fifteen minutes later, an unknown subject (unsub), a white male, joined them in their booth and placed an expensive-looking briefcase on the table. The unsub told them he wanted them to kill King and would pay \$25,000 now and \$25,000 when the job was done. The unsub then opened his briefcase, which was full of wrapped currency. Claude stated he was shocked, assumed it was some sort of a joke and he ignored the unsub. The unsub then closed his briefcase and departed.

Ray Godfrey has been fully identified as Arnold Ray Godfrey and has advised that he did not talk with either of the Powells re the assassination of King nor did he introduce anyone to them re the assassination of King. He denied all knowledge of any assassination plot re King.

The CRD requested that Bureau polygraph examinations be afforded to Godfrey and to the Powells to attempt to resolve this allegation.

When Arnold Ray Godfrey was interviewed on 1/13/76, and denied any involvement in this matter, he agreed to submit to a polygraph. When he was contacted on 1/16/76, however, Godfrey stated "I am innocent" and then advised he did not wish to take any polygraph examination and did not wish to talk to the FBI any further. He stated if the FBI needs any further information, they should contact his attorney.

On 1/19/76, Claude Powell, Jr., was afforded a Bureau polygraph examination at Midland, Texas. The polygraph examiner concluded that Claude Powell's response to certain questions indicated he is "truthtelling" in stating someone did, in fact, offer him and his brother \$50,000 to kill Dr. King. Claude Powell's response to another question and his reactions following the answer indicate he has possible knowledge regarding the unidentified person who made the payment offer.

The results of our investigation have been closely coordinated with the CRD. Mr. Robert A. Murphy, Chief, Criminal Section, CRD, stated he desired to know the results of the polygraph examination of Leon Owen Powell, who was not immediately available, before making a determination as to whether Godfrey's attorney should be contacted concerning his polygraph examination, and before making a determination as to what additional investigation should be conducted to resolve this allegation.

DETAILS: Leon Owen Power1 was not available for a Bureau polygraph examination until the p.m. of 1/29/76. During pre-polygraph interview, Leon Owen Power1 stated Godfrey never mentioned the amount of money to be paid other than "big money." (initially stated Godfrey offered \$50,000.) He advised while at the bar, someone stated King should be killed, and Claude made statement to the effect he would kill him for the right amount of money. When questioned during the polygraph about Ralph (LNU) saying he had \$25,000 in the briefcase, Power1 stated Ralph had only said "25," and there would be "50" (not \$50,000 as initially stated) when King was buried.

During the polygraph Powell appeared to have difficulty in breathing, and stated he was very nervous concerning the whole matter. The polygraph examination was determined to be "inconclusive."

On 2/2/76, this matter was thoroughly discussed with Departmental Attorney Murphy. He stated Godfrey's attorney should not be contacted at this time, and the following additional investigation should be conducted to resolve this allegation: Reinterview the Powells to resolve differences in their accounts of the alleged meeting; have each of the Powells prepare a diagram of the bar and booth where alleged meeting took place; verify that Powells and Godfrey were in Atlanta at time of alleged meeting; interview co-workers of Claude to see if he has talked about this alleged meeting; identify and interview former employees and customers of

Pete's Bar re any knowledge of alleged meeting or of Ralph (LNU); conduct investigation into the background of Godfrey; interview Claude's wife; reinterview Dorothy Davis, wife of deceased bar owner Pete Davis, to see if he had ever talked of any such payment offer; show artist's conception of Ralph (LNU) (as prepared by Leon) to Claude and all pertinent witnesses; show on an Atlanta city map location of Pete's Bar in comparison to where James Earl Ray stayed in Atlanta; and conduct other obvious and logical investigation.

Mr. Murphy advised he was advising the USA, Atlanta, and the USA, Memphis, of the institution of this investigation re the Powell allegation.

Mr. Murphy stated the FBI should not comment to any inquiries from the news media concerning this investigation, and any such inquiries should be referred to the CRD.

Atlanta and El Paso are being instructed by separate communication to promptly conduct this investigation.

NOTE: Reference is made to a conversation between Departmental Attorney Robert A. Murphy and SA H. N. Helterhoff on 2/2/76 wherein Mr. Murphy requested the following investigation:

Atlanta and El Paso should thoroughly review the interviews of the Powells noting the differences in each of their versions and reinterview the Powells to further resolve all details of this alleged meeting in the bar. Determine when and how many times they talked with each other about this alleged meeting since its occurrence. Determine from them how it can be verified that they were in Atlanta at the time of the alleged meeting and conduct any independent investigation to verify they were actually in Atlanta at the time of the meeting. Have each of the Powells prepare a diagram of the interior of Pete's Bar, including the booth where each participant of the alleged meeting was seated. Determine from each if the unsub (Ralph LNU) had any type of an accent. El Paso question Claude specifically re polygraph indicating he has possible knowledge regarding the unidentified person.

El Paso should show the artist's conception of Ralph (LNU) (the final, as prepared by Leon Owen Powell) to Claude Powell, Jr., in a spread of photographs. El Paso should also interview co-workers of Claude Powell, Jr., to determine if he has talked about this alleged meeting. El Paso will re-check records of Scottish Inn for record of any outgoing calls made by Claude Powell, Jr.

Atlanta should ascertain if any records are in existence to establish identity of all former employees of Pete's Bar and interview them for any knowledge of this incident and attempt to identify Ralph (LNU).

Atlanta should also identify and interview all known former customers of Pete's Bar noting that Diane Brady, who operates "the office" bar, stated a lot of the customers are still around and frequent her bar, "the office."

Make further attempts to identify and interview "Duke."

Atlanta should make further efforts to locate and interview "Dottie," a former employee of Pete's Bar. If necessary, if it can be arranged, have Diane Brady observe Dottie Underhill to determine if she is identical with the Dottie formerly employed at Pete's Bar, since Underhill denied she ever worked there.

Atlanta should conduct investigation into the background of Arnold Ray Godfrey to attempt to resolve the allegation by the Powells that he introduced the unsub to them in the bar. Identify and interview his relatives, associates, including any "country and western singer" associates. Particularly determine if Godfrey ever known to associate with a Ralph and attempt to identify and interview Ralph. Verify Godfrey's presence in Atlanta at time of alleged meeting. Mr. Murphy stated Godfrey's attorney should not be contacted at this time.

Atlanta interview Jackie Powell, 4163 Canby Lane, Decatur, Georgia, wife of Claude Powell, Jr., for any knowledge of this incident, including whether Claude Powell, Jr., ever told her about this alleged payment offer.

Atlanta and El Paso should show the artist's conception of Ralph (LNU) in a spread to all pertinent witnesses.

Atlanta reinterview Dorothy Davis re remembering whether her husband ever told her of anyone coming into bar with large amount of money, or if she has any knowledge of this incident; show on an Atlanta city map location of Pete's Bar in comparison to where James Earl Ray had stayed in Atlanta.

Mr. Murphy stated he is advising the USAs at Atlanta and Memphis of the institution of the investigation re the Powell allegation.

Mr. Murphy also stated that no information should be disseminated to the USAs. Mr. Murphy stated that the FBI should not comment to any inquiries from the news media concerning this investigation and any such inquiries should be referred to the CRD.

INFORMATIVE NOTE

UPI on 2/1/76 quoted Long Island, New York, newspaper "Newsday" as reporting "several FBI Agents and at/least one Memphis (Tenn.) police officer" infiltrated black militant group, the Invaders, which was "in the vanguard of rioting" 3/28/68 in Memphis in which one was killed and several injured. Martin Luther King's return to Memphis, where he was assassinated, is attributed to this riot. It is stated "the FBI and Memphis police have verified that their agents were working within the Invaders organization at the time of the riots and King's assassination

Attached Memphis teletype advises that Invaders, aka Black Organizing Project, was organized in Memphis in 1967, and adopted philosophy of nihilism and anarchy. Bureau investigation ran from 1/15/68 to 10/70.

During 3/68 riots, Memphis was operating 5 extremist informants, none in a policy level in any organization, only one was a member of Invaders and he was not a leader. No Bureau Agents ever penetrated Invaders. One Memphis Police Department undercover officer penetrated Invaders, but not in policy position. He has been publicly disclosed and is no longer in police department.

Memphis has never publicly reported Agents or informants worked within Invaders (External Affairs, Press Office similarly has made no such report.

Memphis sources have reported King's group used Invader members as parade marshals and guards as reported by UPI. Memphis sources reported on organi-

zation plans, structure and activities, but never tried to turn Invaders against King group, nor did they advocate or plan riots. Attorney General will be advised of the facts of this matter.

THE INVADERS, ALSO KNOWN AS BLACK ORGANIZING PROJECT, A BLACK MILITANT ORGANIZATION THAT AD OPTED THE PHILOSOPHY NIHILISM AND ANARCHY, WAS ARGANIZED IN MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE, IN 1967. THE INFLUENCE OF THE ORGANIZATION WAS WEAKENED BY ARREST OF NUMEROUS MEMBERS AND ADVERSE PUBLICITY IN 1969. IN AUGUST, 1970, THE ORGANIZATION SPLIT INTO TWO GROUPS AND IN OCTOBER, 1970, THE TWO GROUPS DISCONTINUED ALL ASSOCIATION WITH EACH OTHER AND THE INVADERS BECAME A DEFUNCT ORGANIZATION.

DURING THE 1968 RIOTS IN MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE, THE MEMPHIS OFFICE OF THE FBI WAS OPERATING FIVE "INFORMANTS WHO WERE FURNISHING INFORMATION REGARDING EXTREMIST

ACTIVITIES AT MEMPHIS NONE OF THESE INFORMANTS ERE ON A POLICY MAKING LEVEL WITH ANY ORGANIZATION AT MEMPHIS. ONLY ONE OF THESE INFORMANTS WAS A MEMBER OF THE BLACK MILITANT GROUP KNOWN AS THE INVADERS. HE WAS NOT IN A POSITION OF LEADERSHIP IN THIS ORGANIZATION. NO SPECIAL AGENTS OF THE FBI AT ANY TIME PENETRATED THE INVADERS. SOURCES AVAILABLE TO THE MEMPHIS OFFICE HAVE ADVISED THAT DURING THE PERIOD OF THE 1968 RICTS AT MEMPHIS, SCLC DID USE INVADER MEMBERS AS PARADE MARSHALS AND AS SECURITY GUARDS.





SHE PICKED THE PHOTOGRAPH OF ARNOLD RAY GODFREY OUT OF A SPREAD OF PHOTOGRAPHS AND ADVISED SHE HAS KNOWN HIM SINCE HE MOVED TO ATLANTA FROM COPPER HILL, TENNESSEE. SHE STATED HE WAS A VERY QUIET INDIVIDUAL AND COULD NOT BELIEVE HE WOULD BE IN ANY SORT OF TROUBLE. SHE ALSO PICKED THE PICTURE OF CLAUDE POWELL AS BEING A FREQUENT PATRON AT THE BAR. SHE WAS UNABLE TO PICK FROM THE SPREAD OF PHOTOGRAPHS THE ARTIST'S CONCEPTION OF RALPH (LNU) AS BEING EITHER A PATRON OF THE BAR OR A FRIEND OF RAY GODFREY. WHEN SPECIFICALLY SHOWN THE ARTIST'S CONCEPTION, SHE STATED SHE DID NOT REMEMBER ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO LOOKED LIKE THAT EVER BEING AT THE BAR. EVANS ADVISED GODFREY NEVER WORKED AS A BARTENDER AT BAILEY'S. END PAGE THREE.

F. B. I. U S DEPT. OF JUSTICE On 1/19/76, LEON OWEN POWELL, 2786 Alston Drive, Apartment 9, Decatur, Geogia, telephonically contacted the Atlanta Office of the FBI, advising he was sick and desired to postpone his polygraph examination until the week of 1/26 - 30/76:

On 1/29/76, LEON OWEN POWELL voluntarily appeared at the Atlanta Office of the FBI to submit to a polygraph examination. POWELL was advised of his rights by SA JOHN B. REYNOLDS as shown on a warning and waiver of rights form, which he signed after reading. POWELL also executed a consent or waiver 66 take a polygraph examination form.

On 1/29/76, at 7:45 PM, LEON OWEN POWELL, after executing FD-328 (Polygraph Consent Form), was afforded a polygraph examination in the Atlanta Office of the FBI. Assisting in the collateral interview was SA AUGUST W. BULFER. POWELL, during pre-polygraph interviewedsubstantially furnished the same information as in previous interviews with the exception to information concerning money offered by GODFREY. POWELL, according to his recollection, stated GODFREY never mentioned the amount of money to be paid, but indicated he stated he was looking for someone who was interested in making "big money". Also, GODFREY indicated "big money" would be paid for killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. POWELL previously stated GODFREY made the statement \$50,000 was to be paid. However, when going over the polygraph questions to be asked nim, he requested that the amount be deleted from the question and the words "big money" be substituted for \$50,000. According to POWELL, the conversation with GODFREY came about while they were sitting in Pete's Bar during the fall of 1967, and the conversation was concerning MARTIN LUTHER KING's activities at which time someone stated KING should be killed and POWELL's brother, CLAUDE POWELL, made a statement to the effect that he would kill him for the right amount of money. POWELL advised a couple of days after the initial conversation with GODFREY while they were in Pete's Bar, a white male entered the bar inquiring about the POWELLS. After locating them, he stated he came to talk to them concerning a matter that had previously been discussed, after they acknowledged in the affirmative that they knew why he was there. The white male, whom POWELL identified as RALPH, then asked if they were ready to go through with it.

POWELL stated this white male never mentioned the Killing of KING or discussed how the killing would take place, but only displayed a small briefcase which contained a large amount of money. One question of the polygraph examination was "Did RALPH say he had \$25,000 in the briefcase?". However, POWELL stated RALPH never indicated the exact amount, only stating he had "twenty-five". POWELL; when questioned as to whether he meant \$2,500 or \$25,000, stated RALPH never did state the amount but he realized that that much money in that size briefcase would have to be at least \$25,000, RALPH also made the statement that there would be "fifty more" when MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was buried. However, when he questioned them as to whether or not they would go through with it, CLAUDE POWELL stated they would have to think about it, at which time RALPH departed the bar stating if they had not made up their minds by that time, he could not do business with them.

POWELL was afforded four separate examinations, the first being a card test where POWELL viewed three different cards of different colors but was advised to deliberately lie to the color of two of these cards. It was noted the results of this examination indicated no significant reaction to these questions and this test was inconclusive.

Examinations two, three, and four, all containing relevant, irrelevant and control questions, the relevant questions concerning statements made by GODFREY and contact by RALPH, were also inconclusive, in that POWELL did not react significantly to any one of these questions. POWELL did react to two questions concerning GODFREY, particularly the questions, "Did GODFREY ever ask you if you were interested in making big money?", and "Did GODFREY tell you the big money was to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.?". The reaction indicated on the chart was not significantly strong enough to draw a conclusion as to deception and it is possible this reaction could be attributable to POWELL's changing his story from the original interview of GODFREY making the statement concerning \$50,000 to now stating "big money".

During the polygraph examination, POWELL appeared to have difficulty breathing and the upper pneumograph had to be continually adjusted by the examiner. POWELL did not appear overly nervous, did not display any outward sign of emotion, but did state all during the polygraph that he was very nervous concerning this whole matter and that he had a hard time breathing

properly, particularly as the polygraph examination progressed. When questioned concerning responses indicated on the chart, POWELL would only state that he was telling the truth, and that he told all he knew and could recall concerning this incident. POWELL indicated he had a high school equivalency degree, however, he appeared to be of limited intelligence and appeared to be much older than forty years of age. During questioning, he admitted to doing a lot of beer drinking, however, denied drinking anything during the day of the examination.

A review of these charts reflects that POWELL responded generally in the same manner to all questions asked with no significant response to any individual question whereby a conclusion could be drawn as to his being truthful or untruthful. Therefore, these polygraph examinations were determined to be inconclusive.

On 1/19/76, at 8:15 PM, CLAUDE POWELL, JR., was afforded a polygraph examination by SA LOREN K. LEE, of the San Antonio Division of the FBI, who was unassisted in the collateral interview.

POWELL's "yes" responses to questions, "Did someone offer you and LEON \$50,000 to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR?", and "Did someone ask you to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.?", were less than responses to control question, indicating POWELL is truthfelling in stating someone did, in fact, offer him and his brother \$50,000 to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. POWELL's "no" response to question, "Do you know who asked you and LEON to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.?" and his reactions following the answer indicate a possible knowledge regarding the unidentified person mentioned in the above questions.

ROWELL was left with the impression that results of the polygraph examination were unclear and that the strong possibility exister wherein the FBI would request an additional test in the immediate future. Results of the test were not discussed in any way with POWELL nor was interrogation effected.
