JONES' WIFE, ELIZABETH, HAS INFORMED JONES SHE HEARD A BROADCAST ON RADIO STATION WDIA, MEMPHIS, THAT THE STATION HAD RECEIVED A LETTER FROM LANE STATING HE WAS ACTING AS SOLOMON JONES' ATTORNEY AND THAT JONES' LIFE WOULD BE IN DANGER IF HE APPEARED BEFORE THE HSCA TO TESTIFY.

ACCORDING TO JONES, LANE IS NOT NOW, HAS NEVER BEEN, AND WILL NEVER BECOME HIS ATTORNEY. JONES IS UNDER THE IMPRESSION THAT LANE WOULD BE PLEASED IF HE APPEARED BEFORE THE COMMITTEE AND TESTIFIED THAT THE FBI WAS INVOLVED IN THE KILLING OF DR. KING BUT DOES NOT WANT HIM TO APPEAR AS A WITNESS OTHERWISE.

JONES WAS SUBPOENAED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS (HSCA) IN JANUARY, 1978, BUT THE APPEARANCE WAS CANCELLED DUE TO THE DEATH OF SENATOR HUMPHREY. HE WAS INFORMED BY THE HSCA HIS APPEARANCE WOULD BE RESCHEDULED. NO DATE HAS BEEN SET.

Inmate **ROBERT R. HART**, inmate number 23747, date of birth [redacted] was interviewed at his request at the Bureau of Prisons Facility, the Federal Correctional Institution, El Reno, where he is confined. HART advised he is currently serving a two year sentence from St. Louis on a possession of firearms charge with anticipated release June, 1979. He stated he has information with reference to **JAMES EARL RAY** and that he has previously been approached by congressional committees and the Secret Service and that to date, he has refused to co-operate. He stated that he is soon due for release and it is his desire to now co-operate so that he will not be bothered following release from prison.

HART stated that **JAMES EARL RAY**, a former neighbor in a neighborhood in vicinity of Mississippi and Park Streets, St. Louis, Missouri, came to his, HART's, residence at 1921 Rutger (phonetic), shortly after midnight the day KING was assassinated, and that RAY remained at the residence until daybreak. HART stated that RAY asked that a note be delivered to his brother, **JERRY RAY**, who owned a bar on Broadway in St. Louis, and attempt was made to deliver that note, HART stated, but the bar was closed. The note stated that, "The black son-of-a-bitch won't be f----- any more white broads". Note was short and consisted of one handwritten page.

HART said that he has more information, but will not disclose that information until he has been given assurance of no prosecution by Missouri State authorities. He explained that at the time RAY came to his residence, he (HART) knew that RAY was an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary and that if he admitted that RAY visited his residence the night of the KING assassination, that he felt he could be prosecuted for harboring a state fugitive.

HART said DAVID SELLERS was the manager of the apartment in which he resided on Rutger Street in St. Louis, Missouri. HART said that at the time of RAY's visit, he did not know that RAY assassinated KING and that he later realized what happened when RAY was arrested in England.

HART STATED THAT JAMES EARL RAY, A FORMER NEIGHBOR IN A NEIGHBORHOOD IN THE VICINITY OF MISSISSIPPI AND PARK STREETS, ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI, CAME TO HIS (HART'S) RESIDENCE AT 1921 RUTGER (PH) SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT THE DAY KING WAS ASSASSINATED AND THAT RAY REMAINED AT THE RESIDENCE UNTIL DAYBREAK. HART STATED THAT RAY ASKED THAT A NOTE BE DELIVERED TO HIS BROTHER, JERRY RAY, WHO OWNED A BAR ON BROADWAY IN ST. LOUIS, AND ATTEMPT WAS MADE TO DELIVER THAT NOTE, HART STATED, BUT BAR WAS CLOSED. NOTE STATED THAT "THE BLACK SON OF A BITCH WON'T BE F----- ANY MORE WHITE BROADS." NOTE WAS SHORT AND CONSISTED OF ONE HANDWRITTEN PAGE.

HART SAID THAT HE HAS MORE INFORMATION BUT WILL NOT DISCLOSE THAT INFORMATION UNTIL HE HAS BEEN GIVEN ASSURANCE OF NO PROSECUTION BY MISSOURI STATE AUTHORITIES. HE EXPLAINED THAT AT THE TIME RAY CAME TO HIS RESIDENCE, HE (HART) KNEW THAT RAY WAS AN ESCAPEE FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, AND THAT IF HE ADMITTED THAT RAY VISITED HIS RESIDENCE THE NIGHT OF THE KING ASSASSINATION, THAT HE FELT HE COULD BE PROSECUTED FOR HARBORING A STATE FUGITIVE.

On October 12, 1978, Edwin B. Coleman, Sheriff, Alcorn County, Corinth, Mississippi, telephonically contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation advising that on that date, he received a letter from James Earl Ray, postmarked Petros, Tennessee, Zip Code 37845, requesting that the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department furnish any records they may have to indicate that a 1966 Mustang displaying Alabama License B8993, was observed in Alcorn County, Corinth, Mississippi, April 1, 1968. In his letter, Ray claims to have been registered at a Corinth motel on April 1, 1968.

As reflected in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, extensive investigation concerning Eric S. Galt and a 1966 Mustang registered in the Galt name, was conducted subsequent to the killing of Dr. Martin Luther King in Memphis, Tennessee.

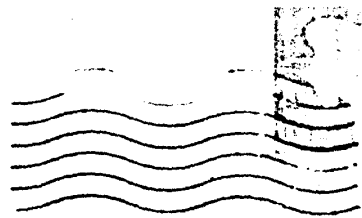

On April 1, 1968, I checked into a Motel in Corinth, Mississippi, and departed the following morning. Until just recently I assumed the authorities knew this consequently I never asked anyone to check into the matter. Now I learn the authorities believe I was else where April 1st.

My reason(s) for this letter is to enquire if your office has a record, through perhaps a routine check of cars registered in Motels on the aforementioned date, of the automobile I was driving. It was a 1966 Mustang registered under the name of Eric S. Galt; Alabama tag no. B 8993.

Also, assuming Motels have to be licensed by the city or county in Mississippi, would either of thoes Governments require Motels to retain, or furnish them to retain, a list of the Motel Guests ? possibly for tax purposes.

Finally any other information about the above subject from your office would be very much appreciated, such as the 1968 Owner of the Motel I stayed in ( see diagram attached), providing the Diagram can be matched with the Motel.

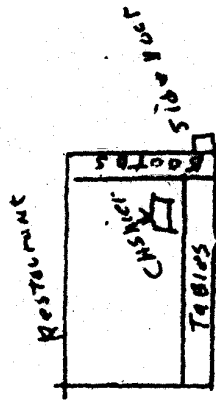

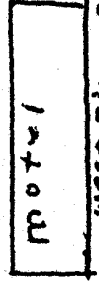



SOLOMON JONES, JR., was interviewed at the Shelby County Jail (SCJ), Memphis, Tennessee. JONES furnished the following information:

JONES is serving a jail sentence at the SCJ following conviction on a charge of embezzlement. He is married to ELIZABETH JONES and they have six children, ranging in age from 4 to 18 years. His permanent address is 852 Faxon Street, Memphis, telephone 525-3447. Prior to his incarceration, he was employed by the Hughes Bonding Company, 95 North Second Street, Memphis, which is managed by NEILS JONES. JONES is represented by WAYNE EMMONS, Attorney, 100 North Main Street, Memphis, in all legal matters involving him.

In 1968, JONES served as chauffeur for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING while Dr. KING was in Memphis. He was present at the Lorraine Motel, Memphis, on April 4, 1968, and was standing near Dr. KING when he was killed on that date. Immediately after Dr. KING was shot, JONES observed an individual dressed in something white moving behind the building across the street on the west side of the Lorraine Motel. This is the direction from which JONES heard a noise that was apparently the sound of a gun shot. He did not know the identity of this individual.

On November 22, 1978, SOLOMON JONES was again contacted at the Shelby County Jail. He furnished the following information:

On an unrecalled date, WAYNE EMMONS, JONES' attorney, informed JONES that ~~DUNCAN RAGSDALE~~ was attempting to locate him for ~~MARK LANE~~, an attorney. RAGSDALE was a candidate in the 1978 election campaign opposing Congressman HAROLD FORD for U.S. Representative in the congressional district in Memphis represented by Mr. FORD. RAGSDALE learned JONES was incarcerated at the SCJ.

On an unrecalled date, approximately 30 days ago, RAGSDALE and MARK LANE made an appearance at the SCJ and requested permission of SCJ officials to see JONES. RAGSDALE

JONES said, "I don't know who it was." LANE said, "The FBI put the woman in the crazy house to keep her from testifying she saw the FBI around the building before the shooting took place. Don't you think the FBI has gotten hold of FAUNTROY to keep him quiet and from bringing the FBI to testify before the Committee?"

JONES is of the impression that Mr. LANE wants him to testify before the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) provided he testifies that the FBI helped kill Dr. KING and prefers JONES not testify otherwise.

Following the appearance of Mr. RAGSDALE and Mr. LANE at the SCJ, they proceeded to the Lorraine Motel where they held a press conference. At this conference Mr. LANE announced he had met with SOLOMON JONES, the chauffeur of the late Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., but that Mr. JONES would be unable to accompany him at that time.

The following day a news release attributed to LANE contained information to the effect that JONES is a key witness to the killing of Dr. KING and that the HSCA would not let him testify because his testimony would destroy the Committee.

Also on the following day, Mr. RAGSDALE reported that Congressman FORD knew there was a cover-up in connection with the death of Dr. KING. Congressman FORD responded that this was a political stunt on the part of RAGSDALE.

JONES' wife, ELIZABETH, and mother-in-law, MAGGIE MOORE, have heard a radio broadcast on Memphis radio station WDIA wherein it was reported that WDIA has received a letter from LANE stating he was acting as an attorney for JONES. The letter also stated that JONES would be in danger if he appeared as a witness before the HSCA.

LANE is not now, has never been and will never be retained as an attorney by JONES. JONES was subpoenaed by the HSCA and was scheduled to appear as a witness on January 17, 1978. This appearance was canceled due to the death of Senator HUMPHREY. JONES was informed by the Committee he would be subpoenaed at a later date but has not been subsequently subpoenaed.

On November 22, 1978, JONES furnished a written statement which is as follows:





I, Solomon Jones, Jr., make this free and voluntary statement to Burl F. Johnson and James A. Davis, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). No threats or promises have been made to induce me to make a statement. I realize any statement I do make may be used in a court of law.

I am currently serving a jail sentence at the Shelby County Jail (SCJ), Memphis, Tennessee, following conviction on an embezzlement charge. My permanent residence is located at 852 Faxon Street, Memphis, telephone 525-3447. Prior to the incarceration I was employed by the Hughes Bonding Company, 95 North Second Street, Memphis, which is operated by Neils Jones.

In 1968 I served as chauffeur for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., while Dr. King was in Memphis. I was present at the Lorraine Motel, Memphis, on April 4, 1968, and was standing near Dr. King when he was killed on that date. Immediately after Dr. King was shot I observed an individual dressed in something white moving behind the building across the street on the west side of the Lorraine Motel. This is the direction from which I heard a noise that was apparently the sound of a gun shot. I do not know the identity of this individual.




 On an unrecalled date, Wayne Emmons, my attorney, who has an office at 100 North Main Street, Memphis, telephone number 523-7788, informed me that Duncan Ragsdale was attempting to locate me for Mark Lane, an attorney. Ragsdale was a candidate in the 1978 election campaign opposing Congressman Harold Ford for U.S. Representative in the congressional district in Memphis represented by Mr. Ford. Ragsdale learned I was incarcerated at the SCJ.

On an unrecalled date, approximately 30 days ago, Ragsdale and Mark Lane made an appearance at the SCJ and requested permission of SCJ officials to see me. Ragsdale told the SCJ officials I had invited him and Lane to visit me, which is not true. Ragsdale later told me it was necessary for him to tell the jail officials this in order to obtain permission to see me. After I signed a memorandum prepared by SCJ officials indicating I was willing to see Ragsdale and Lane, the jail officials allowed them to visit with me.

On November 22, 1978, JONES orally advised that DUNCAN RAGSDALE confined his remarks to statement about Congressman HAROLD FORD having knowledge of a cover-up in connection with the death of Dr. KING.

Mr. JONES stated that the written statement represents an accurate report of the information he recalled on the occasion of his interview by Mr. LANE. He stated he is concerned about the safety and welfare of his family and wanted the FBI to know of his concerns.

ELIZABETH JONES, 852 Faxon Street, Memphis, Tennessee, was interviewed at the lobby of the Shelby County Jail, Memphis. She furnished the following information:

She is the wife of SOLOMON JONES, JR. On November 20, 1978, she heard a news broadcast on Memphis radio station WDIA wherein the newscaster reported that WDIA had received information from MARK LANE that he, LANE, was acting as an attorney for SOLOMON JONES, JR. According to this report, LANE had received a letter which indicated JONES would be in danger if he appeared as a witness before the Committee investigating the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. The origin of the letter LANE reported he had received was not mentioned on the broadcast.

The November 23, 1978, issue of the Memphis Commercial Appeal, a daily newspaper published in Memphis, Tennessee, contained an article on page 71 entitled, "Payoff not Accepted, King's Driver Claims". According to this article, on November 22, 1978, SOLOMON JONES, JR., chauffeur for the late Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., said that Attorney MARK LANE offered him \$1,000 to say the FBI had harassed KING and might even have set up the plot to kill him. JONES, who was one of the last persons to talk to KING before he fell dead of an assassin's bullet in 1968, said he told LANE he knew nothing of such allegations and refused the money.

LANE, the attorney for JAMES EARL RAY, convicted killer of Dr. KING, strongly denied the accusation on the night of November 22, 1978. He said he had met JONES in the jail in the presence of lawyer DUNCAN RAGSDALE and no such offer was made. LANE said, "Either the reporter (who talked to JONES) is a liar or Solomon Jones is a liar".

RAGSDALE, who ran unsuccessfully against U.S. Representative HAROLD FORD of Memphis in November, 1978, disputed the charge by JONES. He said, "That's not true at all. Nothing like that was said. There was never any discussion of money or of Mr. Lane serving as an attorney for Jones. I frankly cannot believe that Mr. Jones made those remarks. If he did, it was only because of tremendous pressures brought to bear on him by either the FBI, the local district attorney general's office or both."

RAGSDALE said he had not sought out JONES but was approached by JONES' attorneys about two months ago. The attorneys told him that he, RAGSDALE, should talk to JONES because he had an interesting story to tell. LANE and RAGSDALE went to the Shelby County Jail and were allowed to talk with JONES after some haggling. There was no discussion of money.

As an inmate of the State Correctional Institution, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania, Hilton wrote letters to the FBI on 3/23/77 and 5/9/77, offering his assistance. Both of these letters were furnished to Philadelphia, with instructions to interview him unless information was present making such contact inadvisable. FBIHQ files contain no information concerning results of Hilton's interviews, if conducted.

In view of the current interest of the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA), in the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., you should promptly contact Hilton. His letter of 11/27/78 should be acknowledged and he should be
