For a complete listing of the evidence, refer to Laboratory report PC-A5498 BX, previously submitted to the Memphis Office.

Results of examination:

The lead cores of the bullets in the five cartridges, Q4 through Q8, were found to vary in composition even though they were all from the same manufacturer.

The core portion of the Q64 bullet fragment from the victim's body is similar in composition to the lead core of the bullet in the cartridge designated Q4 and could have come from a source such as represented by the lead core of the bullet in Q4.

The bullet jacket portion of specimen Q64 is similar in composition to the metal of the jackets of the bullets in the Q4 through Q8 cartridges and could have come from the source represented by these bullets.

No indented writing or other markings of significance were noted on either Q286 or Q287.

Large printing, such as the word "CAMADA" on Q286, is more a form of art than hand printing. Because of this, the hand printing characteristics of the individual who prepared Q286 are not apparent and therefore this printing could not be satisfactorily compared with the hand printing on specimens received in this case.

Ray is known to have checked out of his Los Angeles hotel, 3/17/68, and checked into an Atlanta rooming house, 3/24/68. He delivered a package of clothing in New Orleans for Marie Martin sometime between these two dates at 10:30 p. m. Dale Redrigues, who received the package in New Orleans, now recalls that it was raining the night the package was delivered. Weather Bureau records show it rained heavily in New Orleans throughout the day and evening of 3/21/68 and in the early morning hours of 3/22/68. No other rainfall was recorded from 3/17/68 to 3/24/68.

Milior Rernard J. Poiry, Custodial Officer, Missouri State Penitontiary, advised he has information from the prison grapevine, no source identifiables that Ray made contact with Walter Nolan, St. Louis, a former intente, and that Nolan was possibly the brains behind the King murder. Nolan has previously been interviewed and alleged Ray escaped from Missouri State Penitentiary thirty days beforethe effane was reported. Additional inquiries are being made concerning Nollin.

James 2. Bradley, serving a life sentence at Misseuri State Penitentiary, advised that Ray has very small veins making it-difficult for him to "main line" his amphetamine shots.

Neal Edgar Acby, now in a Texas prison, furnished the following information. He knew Ray in Missouri State Prison for five years prior to Ray's escape in April, 1967. Asby was chief cook and Ray worked for him as a slicer in the bread room. In 1962 Ray attempted to escape but his ladder broke. In 1966 he again attempted to escape but a rope broke and he fractured his arm when he fell. Achy would not discuss Ray's

actual escape because he claimed the method used by Ray can still be used by other prisoners. He did say the smart thing to do would be to have a man waiting outside to assist the escapes but he would not state whether or not Ray had assistance.

According to Aeby, Ray liked to tinker and built an air-conditioner for his cell out of various spare parts. He also repaired radios. Ray handled minor narcotics to get cash for commissary items but Aeby sever knew Ray to use "hard" marcotics.

Acby described Ray as very deadly and said he had a nervous breakdown in 1963 or 1964 and developed stomach trouble; consequently, he needed special foods and quit smoking, possibly because of his stomach.

In a Louis Lomez story published 4/25/68, it was stated that Jerri, alleged by Lomez to be a mysterious blonde girl friend of Ray, and been at the Royal Hetel, Milwankee, using the same Dennis and had mysteriously disappeared.

Dennis has been identified as Dyrell Dennis, a narcotic addict who was confined to a State hospital in California from 5/4/67 to 1/6/68 when she was placed in a half-way house at Vinewood Center. When she failed to maintain required daily contacts, a warrant was issued for her arrest on 3/28/68 but California will not extradite.

Dyrell Dennis has been located at Towne Hotel, Milwaukee. She states she left Los Angeles about two weeks ago by Greyhound Bus to visit her seventeen-year-old son in Milwaukee and will remain in Milwaukee if she can find employment; otherwise, she will return to Los Angeles. Dennis denies any knowledge of the subject. She was registered at the Royal Hotel, Milwaukee, 4/14/68 - 4/21/68. The hotel management suspects she was engaged in prostitution or nercotics activity.

Ray reportedly escaped from Missouri State Penitentiary, 4/23/67, although it has been alleged that he actually escaped thirty days before the escape was reported. Records of the penitestiary show that John Ray, brother of the subject, visited Ray at the prison on 4/22/67. His last prior visit was 11/13/66.

Everett Collier, vice president and editor, Houston "Chronicle," advised that Louis Lomax and Charles Stein arrived in Houston on the afternoon of 4/25/68 and spent five hours searching for the telephone allegedly used by Ray on 12/16/67 when he was en route to New Orleans with Stein. They were accompanied by a "Chronicle" reporter who was to photograph the telephone booth if it was located. The reporter told Collier that Stein was very vague and not sure of the area from which the call was made.

If a further search on 4/26/68 was nonproductive, Lomax and Stein planned to fly to San Antonio, rent a car, and drive back to Houston on Interstate 10 looking for the telephone.

Collier also advised that the North American Newspaper Alliance was trying to get in touch with Lomax for a story about Stein's association with Eay and his trip to New Orleans with him in December, 1967.

Delores Evans was interviewed by our Los Angeles Office and she stated that Martin Luther King, Jr., was "very close and intimate friend." She stated she had known him since November, 1966, he was responsible for saving her marriage and King was a very close friend of her bushand and other members of her family. Evans stated that she had no idea regarding anyone who would have wanted to kill King but if any such information comes to her attention, she will advise the FBI attence. Delores Evans praised the FBI for the action it was taking in this matter.

With respect to the Director's inquiry regarding the variances in description between James Earl Ray and Eric Galt the following is set forth. James Earl Ray who used the alias Eric Starvo Galt has been identified as the subject in the King case. Ray is an escaped convict from the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri. His description is based on information in the official records of the penitentiary where he was photographed and his description was recorded. He is forty years old having been born at Alton, Illinois. This has been verified through official birth records.

It was determined through exhaustive investigation that King's slayer was an individual who had used the names John Willard, Harvey Lowmyer and Eric S. Galt. The description of this individual and information on his past activities were developed through witnesses, some of whom had only fleeting contact with or observation of the subject, resulting in variations in the descriptions furnished. On painstaking reconstruction of the subject's background we secured a photograph which had been taken in connection with his completing a bartending course in California in March, 1968.

In order to afford the most extensive and widespread publicity to the subject to possibly assist in his early location and apprehension, this photograph and description and past activities, as then reported, were released to the general public.

Upon identification of Ray as being Galt we were then enabled to furnish more precise description and background information from official records.

The descriptions of the then unknown subject developed in the initial stages of this investigation were based upon extensive interviews of witnesses in varied locations reaching from Tennessee to California. The remarkably close resemblances which we developed and the information elicited which revealed the true extent of the subject's physical description shows that a most commendable job was done by the Agents in their investigative activity.

The Associated Press article had been the subject of a previous memorandum in which it was indicated that Assistant Chief Bill Price of the Memphis, Tennessee, Police Department, denied making the statements attributed to him and this was submitted to the Director in a letter from Frank Holloman, former Special Agent who is now in charge of the Memphis Police Department.

# WBI Discounts Conflicting Reports on King Suspect

FBI officials are quietly trying to play down contradictory descriptions of the appearance and habits of James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, the elusive escaped convict charged with the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The discrepancies have fueled speculation that perhaps Ray and Galt actually are two persons, or that two or more persons used the name Galt.

No official statement has been issued to rebut this theory. But FBI sources insisted that Ray and Galt are the same person.

are the same person.
"We know there's only one person involved here," said one official.

"We've got his fingerprints and we know who he is."

Although the FBI now insists the man it seeks is Ray, it has not amended a conspiracy complaint against Galt—charging that Galt had conspired with "an individual he alleged to be his brother" to violate Dr. King's civil rights—to change the name to Ray.

In enlisting the public's help in the manhunt, the FBI has distributed thousands of flyers. The first set bears Galt's name, the second Ray's.

Puzzling aspects of the case continue to pop up.

Atlanta residents said cigarette or cigar ashes were scattered on the carpeted floor of a white 1966 Mustang that FBI agents impounded there a week after Dr. King was slain. They also said a cigar butt fell out of the car when agents opened the door. The FBI has said the car was owned by Galt. But a number of people who knew Galt say he does not smoke.

Reporters showed copies of the FBIreleased picture of Galt to the Birmingham witnesses, and to residents of the Memphis rooming house from which the fatal shot was fired. Almost all said the photo didn't resemble the man they saw.

Varying ages have been given for the hunted man, from 25 on up. The FBI said Galt gave his age as 36. It

An FBI official brushed off the

varying descriptions, saying "you run into this every time — it's human nature."

"Anyway, this guy is a professional con. He can change his hair line in three minutes with a razor, and he can gain or lose 20 pounds when he wants to."

There are conflicts, too, in descriptions of Galt's habits, including:

Appearance: The FBI reported Galt "is said to be a neat dresser," while others who knew Ray said he was careless in his dress.

Speech: The Memphis rooming house manager said the man to whom she rented a room three hours before Dr. King was slain had a Southern drawl. An inmate who knew Ray in the Missouri penitentiary said Ray, a native of Illinois, had no Southern accent.

Money: Galt appeared to spend money freely, and paid \$2000 cash for the white Mustang. Ray, said the inmate, "was tight as a tick . . . if you owed him money, even a few cents, he would have you to death."

Music-dancing: The FBI said Galt
"is a fan of western and country
music" and "is said to be an avid
dancer." The inmate said Ray "never
expressed any liking" for music or

dancing.
The FBI said Galt took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965. But after reporters pointed out Ray was in prison these two years, FBI officials said the statement should have read "reportedly" took dancing

Galt graduated from a Los Angeles bartending school last March, the FBI said. Reporters determined that at this same time a duplicate driver's license was mailed to Galt at the Birmingham rooming house

mingham rooming house.

Dr. Donald B. Peterson, superintendent of a Missouri state hospital where Ray was examined for six weeks in 1966, said "We didn't find anything to indicate he was a killer or had tendencies to kill."

The penitentiary warden, Harold Swenson, said he remembered Ray. "It's odd, but I won't believe he did it (killed Dr. King) until it is proven."

But in Dalton, Ga., a former cells mate quoted Ray as once saying he would be willing to kill Dr. King for a \$1 million bounty.

Marie Martin, also known as Marie Dennino, who traded television sets with Fay in Los Angeles, has been reinterviewed. She is employed as a cocktail waitress at the Suitan Room in the St. Francis Hotel and also resides at the St. Francis. Ray had a room at the St. Francis from 1/21/68 to 3/17/68 when he checked out giving a forwarding address of General Delivery, Atlanta. Ray checked into the Atlanta rooming house, 3/24/68.

Martin now recalls Ray last came to her room at the St. Francis shortly after he graduated from bartending school. (He graduated 3/2/68.)

At that time Ray said he was going to New Orleans and Marie gave him he board phenograph records and clothing for her daughter in New Orleans.

The fast time she saw Ray he thid her that when he was in New Orleans in December, 1967, he stayed with friends who lived near ghat highway.

The Martin also advised she was contacted on the evening of 4/83/68 by Louis Lomax who was brought to her room by Charles Stain. Most of her conversation with Lomax dealt with her exchange of television sets with Ray and Lomax also questioned her regarding Ray's gift friends. She states she told Lomax she did not know of any girls Ray dated. Martin advised that Ray once went dancing with a girl named Helen who claimed to be a stant rider for the television program "Gunsmake." He also made unsuccessful attempts to date another girl named Helene, a former exotic dancer. Marie Martin claims she has not been intimate with Ray.

At the Vegas Club, near the St. Francis Hotel, it has been determined that one Helma, a "belly diacer" at a bur on Sunset Boulevard, occasionally comes to the Vegas Club. Efforts are being continued to locate Helena and any other girl friends of Ray.

Marian De Grasse, 18-year-old daughter of Marie Martin, New Orleans, advised she received a telephone call from her mother on 3/16/68 stating that a friend maned Eric would deliver a box of clothing in a few days. She received the box from her grandmother, Lorraine Calloway, on 3/24/68 and noted it in her diary.

Lerraine Callowsy, New Orleans, recalled that her daughter-in-law, Dale Rodriguez, brought her a box of clothing for hisrian De Grasse sometime in February or March.

Dale Redrigues stated that an unknown man called at her home about 10:30 p. m. in February or March, 1968, and gave her a box of clothing for Marian De Grasse. She saw this man only for a few seconds at her door and cannot describe him. She took the box to Lorraine Calloway within a few days.

While at Leavenworth, Ray worked as a baker as well as in the fire department and the paint shop. When he was conditionally released, 4/5/58, he indicated an intention to contact bakery unions for employment and to eventually get a job as a baker on a ship sailing to South America.

Walter Nolan, who requested his identity be protected, advised he was Ray's closest associate at Missouri State Penitentiary. He described Ray as a loner who considered all convicts as potential stool pigeons and furnished little, if any, information about himself. Nolan claims Ray actually escaped from prison thirty days before the escape was reported and that he walked out the front door instead of hiding in a bread truck as officially claimed.

It has previously been reported that Raymond Louis Curtis alleged while Ray was in Missouri State Penitentiary, Ray spoke of a \$1,900,000 bounty on King. Curtis also talked to the press and has been widely quoted in this regard. Larry Sere has now voluntarily contacted the Memphis Office, requested his identity be protected, and furnished the following information.

Sero was in Missouri State Penitoniary from February until June, 1964. He was asquainted with both Ray and Raymond Louis Curtis. Sero mentioned to Ray and Curtis he had heard speculation that if King

ever attempted a boycott in Mamphia it would be worth a lot of mensy to local businessmen to have King killed. Sees says this was sheer speculation and no particular group of businessmen was mentioned and the statement Stock had absolutely no basis in fact; if Curtis and Ray interpreted it otherwise they were reading more into it than Sero intended. He does not recall who first mentioned this idea to him.

Sero described Ray as a bern leser who does not know how to make friends but who bates Regrees and has a strong desire to perform some notorious act that will make him feel important. Sero questioned Ray's ability to plan and execute even the simplest "caper."

Jerry William Ray, brother of subject, Wheeling, Illinois, has received a telegram from "Life" augustue and has advised us that he consequently furnished "Life" information conterning his family for which he was paid \$150. He believes "Life" will publish a story on Ray either this week or next week.

Russell Les Martin informed the Little Rock Office he received a pardon about three months ago after helping authorities break up a narcoties ring in Missouri State Prison. Prior to Ray's escape, Martin alleges Ray sold narcoties to other innates.

Additional witnesses at Puerte Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, state that when Ray was there last fall he drank beer during the daytime and almost any kind of mined drink at night. When effered a cigarette he invariably replied, "I don't smake anything but marijuana;" however, no one has been located who saw him use marijuana. While in Puerte Vallarta he appeared to be on a meticulous budget alleting so much a day for drinking and an equal amount for feminine companionship.

Louis Louisz and Charles Stein reportedly left Los Angeles, 4/25/66, for Houston, Tunne. A confidential source in the telephone company at Los Angeles advised that Louisz inquired for tell call information on Sam J. Recile, 510 O'Kosfe, New Orienne, telephone mumber 321-1411. This number was determined to be listed to the "Times Picayune States Rem" and the telephone company is not obtaining any tell information for Louisz.

Joe Peters, bartender in the Sultan Room, St. Francis Botel, San Francisce, advised that Louisx had been using the Sultan Room as an office for a week or ten days but had been told to leave by the owner. Peters added that Louisx had inquired about a blonde named Jerri with nearly every patron of the Sultan Room and had received no information.

Charles Stein has previously said that when traveling to New Orleans with Ray, 12/15-17/67, Ray made calls from various telephones in Texas on 12/16/67 but except for one occasion he returned to the ear so quickly Stein believed the calls had not been completed. Stein described an area near Houston as the place from which Ray used a telephone long enough to complete a call. A detailed search by FBI Agents has located nine telephone booths similar to Stein's description but telephone company records show so calls recorded at these locations on 12/16/67.

Gary Delana, nowe director, Radio Station KNUZ, Houston, confidentially advised the Special Agent in Charge that Hugh Alasworth of "Newsweek" was contacted by Louis Louis Louis and Charles Stein and told that they would arrive in Houston sometime on 4/35/66 to retrace the route taken by Stein and Ray for the purpose of locating the telephone booth from which Ray made a call. Delaun has been asked to accompany Louis and Stein and he will confidentially advise the Houston Office of their activities and the results of their inquiry. Arrangements have been made with the telephone company at Houston for the field office to be advised of any requests for information concerning long distance calls made on 12/16/67.

RE: MURKIN

There has been recent press publicity regarding an alleged search for King's killer in Mexico. We have made no such search. It is noted, however, that Legat, Mexico City advised that Mexico City Police, on the basis of an alleged resemblance of Claude Chester McLaren, Jr., to an artist's conception of the subject, questioned him as he was boarding a plane 4/8/68 in Mexico City to travel to Houston. McLaren identified himself as employed by a firm in Venezuela. He had traveled from New Orleans to Honduras 3/30/68 and entries on his passport verified this fact. McLaren was photographed by the Mexicans, and although it appears that he was out of the country during the pertinent period, his photograph is being obtained to display to pertinent witnesses.

It is noted that the subject, when purchasing the rifle in Birmingham, paid for it with \$20 bills, and the suppect who rented a room in the flophouse in Memphis from which the fatal shot was fired also paid for his room rent with a \$20 bill. The landlady at the flophouse furnished three \$26 bills, one of which was given to her by the suspect, but she does not know which of the three bills was received from him. The binoculars purchased in Memphis 4/4/68 were also paid for with \$20 bills. The individual using the name Galt, when he purchased the white Mustang in Birmingham, also paid in cash with \$100 and \$20 bills. The serial numbers of the \$20 bills obtained from the landlady are being processed in the National Crime Information Center to determine whether this memey may have been buit money from a bank robbery or otherwise recorded as stolen property.

The Philadelphia Office determined that Barclay Laundry, 253 South Tenth Street, Philadelphia, has used a laundry tag such as the one found on clothing abandoned near the crime scene with the rifle which is believed to be the murder weapon. The Barclay Laundry last used such a tag 12/19/67 for the laundry of one Fred Neibauer, a Philadelphia school teacher residing at 2213 Spruce Street. Philadelphia, whose Social Security No. is

At the time specimens Ql through Q3 were typed, the typewriter was equipped with a red and black bichrome ribbon which was possibly installed upside-down in the typewriter, based on the fact many of the letters have printed red in the upper portions.

As the result of searching specimens Ql through Q3 in the Anonymous Letter File, it was found that an extortion letter was prepared on a typewriter having the same style of type in the case captioned "Unknown Subject, also known as Mrs. J. O. Donovitch; Managers, Fremont, Mint and Flamingo Hotels, Las Vegas, Nevada - Victims - Extortion." As the instant typewriting is mostly upper-case


