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Mustang Probed in King Death

FBI Seizes Car

ATLANTA, April 12 (UPI) — An impounded white Mustang resembling one that roared away from the scene of the sniper slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. last week in Memphis, Tenn., was under close inspection and guard by the FBI today.

"No comment," was the only word from officials, except to add that no warrant had been issued for the car's registered owner, Eric Starvo Galt, 37, of a Birmingham, Ala., address, where residents of a rooming house said they hadn't seen Mr. Galt in three months.

Florida police, at the request of the FBI, had issued a statewide "locate and notify" alert for Mr. Galt yesterday afternoon, about the time the 1966 Mustang was towed into the FBI's Atlanta headquarters and cloaked in secrecy. The FBI cancelled the alert about five hours later. There was no explanation.

SINCE FRIDAY

The Mustang, bearing 1968 Alabama license 1-38993 with two 1967 Mexican tourist stickers on its windows, was found in the parking lot of a south-east Atlanta apartment project about five blocks from the gold-domed capitol. Several residents said the car had been there since last Friday, the day after Dr. King's slaying.

Mrs. Ernest Payne said she saw "a nice looking man" get out of the car Friday morning and walk away. She said he was about 5-feet, 10-inches tall, 170 pounds with sandy hair.

Another resident, Mrs. John H. Riley, said she saw the car as early as 7 a.m. Friday, about 12 hours after Dr. King was shot 382 miles away. Joe Manus said he had seen the car since last Friday and Mrs. Mary Bridges reported seeing a well-dressed, dark-haired man near the car recently.

DESCRIPTION

Mrs. Bridges was uncertain whether the man resembled a police artist's sketch of the assassin who shot Dr. King with a 30.06 Remington rifle, reported purchased in Birmingham, after checking into a flophouse across from Dr. King's hotel in Memphis. The killer, described as a neatly dressed man with dark hair and "a silly smile," fled the rooming house after shooting Dr. King and abandoned the rifle and a suitcase in a nearby amusement center.

One Memphis witness said he saw a man get into a white Mustang and take off at high speed. Another witness theorized the Mustang was not from Tennessee because it had no front tag and no Memphis city inspection sticker.

Last night, in New York, U.S. Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark said regarding the King slaying that "we will report on some developments that should be made public soon," asked when, he replied, "when there are facts, a report will be made." Mr. Clark said, however, "I remain as optimistic as I ever have been" that the killer will be caught.

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False Police Reports of Chase After Dr.

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 11 —A false Memphis police report broadcast shortly after the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. last Thursday night has given impetus to speculation that the civil rights leader was the victim of a conspiracy.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Memphis police have said for several days that the killing was done by one man.

Memphis policemen who were searching for Dr. King's killer on the night he was shot were drawn to the north side of the city 34 minutes after the shooting by a false report from "police car 160" that a white Mustang automobile, believed to be the getaway car, was speeding along city streets.

Detectives have been investigating the possibility that the report was relayed by an accomplice of the killer to the central police radio in an effort to keep attention away from an escape to the south.

Intensive Inquiry

Frank, C. Holloman, director of the Memphis Fire and Police Departments, said that the possibility of such a fraudulent police report by an accomplice of the killer was under "intensive investigation."

One purpose of the investigation, Mr. Holloman said, is to determine whether someone had used a transmitter tuned to a police department frequency to relay misleading information that would draw police attention to north Memphis while the killer escaped across the Mississippi River into Arkansas or down U.S. Highway 55 into the State of Mississippi.

"We have this aspect as well as some other aspects of this case under investigation at this time," said Mr. Holloman. "Beyond that I cannot comment."

Mr. Holloman, who is a retired F.B.I. inspector, refused today to say if he now believed that more than one person was involved in the slaying of Dr. King.

"I just can't comment on that," he said.

King's Death Given Impetus to Conspiracy Theories

Last week, Mr. Holloman agreed with a statement by Attorney General Ramsey Clark that the slaying appeared to have been done by only one person.

Although both Mr. Holloman and Attorney General Clark have said that the slaying was extremely well planned, they said that there was no evidence indicating that more than one person had been involved.

Mr. Holloman also declined today to predict an early solution to the slaying.

The false police report was broadcast at 6:35 P.M., a little more than a half-hour after the fatal shot was fired. At that time the police were setting up

A short time before that, the police radio had broadcast an alert for a white Mustang with a radio antenna similar to those on automobiles equipped with citizen band radio receivers and transmitters.

At 6:36 P.M., the police radio reported that a blue hardtop 1966 Pontiac had joined the chase for the white Mustang.

In the next 10 minutes, several progress reports on the "chase" were relayed through the headquarters radio to other police cars headed to the area.

At 6:47 P.M., the police radio broadcast a report that someone in the white Mustang was shooting at the time.

The Commercial Appeal, a Memphis newspaper, today quoted Lieut. R. W. Bradshaw, who was assigned to police car 160 that night, as having said that he saw no white Mustang and did not chase one that night.

Lieut. Bradshaw said today that any comment would have to come from Mr. Holloman.

A Memphis television station, WMC-TV, said tonight that a local radio equipment dealer had reported that he had been monitoring police radio calls immediately after Dr. King's shooting and had heard the calls supposedly made from police car 160.

Two of the three Toronto men whose names were chosen as aliases by James Earl Ray.

How did Ray get names of three whose description matched his?

Police were unable to explain yesterday how James Earl Ray was able to choose as aliases the names of three Toronto men who resembled him in appearance at least superficially.

Ray was arrested in London on Saturday in the assassination of Rev. Martin Luther King.

One of the men, Eric St. Vincent Galt, not only looks like him but he bears a scar in the middle of his forehead and on the palm of his right hand. Ray has similar scars.

And yesterday another disparity appeared to have been cleared away. The name used by Dr. King's assassin was Eric Starvo Galt—a different middle name from that used by Mr. Galt.

But yesterday Mr. Galt said that he used to sign his middle name with the initials St. V. and that for the two periods after the initials he drew a small zero.

Eric St. Vincent Galt

To demonstrate, he signed his name and the middle initials looked surprisingly like the name Starvo.

Both the RCMP and FBI said yesterday they were keeping open the possibility that there was an international conspiracy to murder Dr. King.

Ray is being held on charges of being in possession of a false Canadian passport issued under the name of

Ramon George Sneyd and of possessing a firearm without a certificate.

Mr. Sneyd is a Toronto police constable. The third alias used was the name of Paul Bridgman, who is a coordinating consultant in the Toronto Board of Education language study centre.

All three men whose names were used have dark hair and Mr. Galt and Mr. Bridgman are 5 foot 11½. Mr. Galt, 54, weighs 172 and Mr. Bridgman, 35, weighs 190.

Ray, who also has dark hair, is 40, weighs about 174 and is 5 foot 10.

Police have refused to give any details about Mr. Sneyd, but photographs show that he is dark-haired and bears a superficial resemblance to Ray.

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identification marks are there."

Mr. Bridgman has no identifying scars and police refuse to say whether Mr. Sneyd has any.

Mr. Galt said he obtained a passport last November but it appeared unlikely that Ray could have taken information from it because police believe he was using the name in Montreal as long ago as July, 1967.

They say that a man resembling Ray and using the name Eric Starvo Galt checked into a rooming house in Montreal's east end in July and remained there until September.

The rooming house janitor identified Ray as the tenant from FBI photographs shown to him by RCMP investigators. A lease bearing the name Galt was also sent to the FBI, Canadian officers said.

The janitor and his wife, whom the police refused to identify, said they thought the man was a U.S. tourist visiting Expo 67.

Mr. Galt said yesterday he did not visit Montreal last summer.

He added that FBI officers had told him that he was the only Eric S. Galt in Canada.

It was information that Ray had been in Montreal last year that prompted the FBI to ask the RCMP to check all passport applications last year in case Ray had applied for one.

The RCMP went through 200,000 to 250,000 applications in two or three weeks and on June 1 discovered Ray's picture accompanying an application for a passport in Mr. Sneyd's name.

Ray had used the name Bridgman when he rented a large, bare room in a down-at-the-heels rooming house at 192 Ossington Ave. on April 8, five days after Dr. King's assassination.

On April 19, following publication of his photograph in Toronto newspapers, he moved to another rooming house at 962 Dundas St. W. where he rented another dreary room on the second floor, this time under the name of Sneyd.

While he was there his landlady Mrs. Sun Loo said she saw a "fat man", who called at the door, pass an envelope to him four days before he flew to London on May 6.

FBI and RCMP said they have no further information on the mystery caller. Superintendent C. R. Doey, officer in charge of criminal investigation in Toronto, said he had no other evidence of a link associated with Ray at any time during his stay in Canada.

in addition to the passport, Ray obtained birth certificates in the names of both Mr. Sneyd and Mr. Bridgman. Ontario Deputy Registrar-General H. F. C. Humphries said that if an applicant has the correct place and year of birth and the names of the

parents a birth certificate is issued with no questions asked.

The necessary information could be obtained from back issues of newspapers, he added.

Newspaper files at the Toronto Central Library contain birth notices of both men. The Toronto Daily Star of Oct. 8, 1932, contains a notice of Mr. Sneyd's birth and The Evening Telegram of Nov. 10, 1932, contains a notice of Mr. Bridgman's birth.

The files are open to any person who wishes to use them.

Above Mr. Bridgman's notice there is a small pencil mark where someone had ticked it off.

Provincial officials confirmed yesterday that no birth certificate had been issued in Mr. Galt's name.

Mr. Galt said yesterday he had no idea where Ray could have picked up his name. He was particularly puzzled over the similarity in their scars.

He said that the only document that he knew of that mentioned his scars was an RCMP clearance pass that he had received in 1961 when he was working on a secret project at the Union Carbide plant on Davenport Road. He still works there as a warehousing foreman.

The scar on his forehead is about 1½ inches long in the shape of an inverted V one end of which dips down to his right eyebrow with the other end midway to his left eyebrow.

The scar on his right palm is almost indistinguishable and follows his life line palm marking at the heel of his hand.

"I don't know what to think," he said. "It's a bit more than coincidence. The weight range is right, the height range is right and the

The fugitive

BRITRR! It shakes you a bit, doesn't it, to think that the man being sought for the shooting of Dr. Martin Luther King was living right here in Toronto with us for several weeks? It would be interesting to know just why James Earl Ray chose Toronto the Good, the City of Churches, in which to settle down for a while. Of course, there are a lot of things some of us would like to know about this case and perhaps in due course we will. The Royal Canadian Mounted Police seem to suspect that Ray's arrival and subsequent departure from Toronto was a little too well-organized and smoothly

handled to have been carried out unaided by one forlorn stranger travelling in a foreign land. It does appear that he knew more about how to obtain a phony passport than a lot of native Canadians do. I always had the impression there was a fair amount of red tape connected with obtaining a passport. Certainly it never seemed all that easy when I acquired one. It makes you wonder how many persons there may be in the world who are travelling around as Canadian nationals without being entitled to do so. At any rate, a long and patient RCMP search through the passport photo files seems to have provided the clue that led to the arrest of the man now being held in London's Cannon Row police station. That looks like excellent police work, to me. (It's a good thing the officer wasn't discovered going through these files by some ardent defender of the public rights, or there would have been some indignant letters to the editor, I'll bet you . . .)

Another curious thing that strikes you about this case is the startling resemblance between the photographs of the man now being held in London and the sketches made from eye-witness descriptions of the man who disappeared from the rooming house in Memphis, Tenn., after the shooting of Dr. King. The sketches were made by Federal Bureau of Investigation artists, using a technique which has proved successful on more than one occasion.

It seems to me there is an interesting connection between the alleged fraudulent birth certificate and passport in the Ray case and the present clamor for stiffer gun control laws which has followed the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. There are those who would now make it extremely difficult—some would make it impossible—for a hunter or member of a shooting club to obtain a firearm.

But it has always appeared to me that if such rigid laws were introduced, the law-abiding sportsman would end up bound hand and foot by red tape while the criminal who wanted to obtain a gun for illegal purposes would just go right on obtaining one by illegal means. If some thug wants something badly enough, there's usually some underworld method of obtaining it.

This, however, does not suggest that there shouldn't be some kind of tightening up in gun control, to at least the extent that any kook who can buy a money order wouldn't be prevented from ordering a gun from the handiest mail order house.

Canada's Lawmen Feel He Is Agent Of Global Ring

Sophisticated Steps Used in Fleeing Appear to Be Beyond One Man's Capability

TORONTO, June 11 — Canadian officials today probed the possibility that James Earl Ray, a small-time hood, may have been the trigger man in an international murder conspiracy.

Their theory is based largely on the fact that Ray, 40, who hid nearly a month while authorities searched the world for

him in connection with the murder of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., hoodwinked police with smart moves and sophisticated techniques believed far beyond his powers.

The world hunt spread to Brussels and Lisbon where, according to unofficial reports, Ray may have been picking up funds funneled through a Swiss bank account.

"We are conducting a very intensive investigation into Ray's background and movements while in Toronto," Canadian Mounted Police Superintendent C. R. Doey, in charge of the criminal investigation branch in Toronto, said Monday.

No Link to Aliases

"We have several leads. We're looking into the places he frequented and the contacts he made while he was here."

Toronto police also were conducting their own investigation, primarily concerned with how Ray obtained information on two local citizens whose names he picked as aliases.

Bernard Simmonds, deputy commissioner of police, emphasized again today that there was "definitely no connection" between Ray and the two local men.

Information used by Ray—the birth dates and family names of the two men—appeared in the birth columns of the Toronto star in late 1932.

Sufficient Facts

While investigators would not officially comment on a possible international conspiracy, they privately acknowledged there were sufficient facts to back such a contention. Among them:

1—Ray always had money, with no visible source of income. There is no record of his having worked here, although he claimed a variety of jobs in order to obtain lodging and a passport.

He frequented bars, paying cash, usually in U. S. money and often at an unfair exchange rate. He always paid his rent on time and paid for a round trip ticket to London with \$345 in U. S. small bills.

2—There is evidence that Ray had contacts here who knew his identity, though he was living in more than one place under more than one assumed name.

One of those contacts was described by Mrs. Sun Loo, landlady at a rooming house at 962 Dundas St. West, as a "tall, husky" man — her description to the mounties, who said he may have been only a delivery man, although they have not been able to trace him.

3—Ray showed expert knowledge in ways of obtaining phony documents and in his choice of the actual local names under which he masqueraded.

Officials are trying to find out how a U. S. citizen from an impoverished broken home, with an eighth-grade education, a man discharged from the Army for "ineptness," a man who continually bungled his own smalltime crimes, could suddenly have had the money, the accomplices and the knowledge of such things as Canadian passport laws.

Amazing Likeness

Ray used two aliases here: Nelson George Sneyd, name of a metropolitan police constable, and Paul Bridgman, name of a consulting teacher for the Board of Education. Both men denied knowing either Ray or each other.

In addition, an Eric St. Vincent Galt, who until recently signed his name Eric St. V. Galt, lives here. He is a 52-year-old warehouse foreman for Union Carbide.

How Ray happened to choose the name is not known, but there are amazing physical similarities between the two men. Mr. Galt is 5-foot-11, weighs 170 pounds and has a scar between his eyes and one on each palm. Ray is 5-foot-10, weighs 174 and has two scars on his forehead and one on his palm.

Standard Fugitive Kit Costs \$15 in Toronto—and No Sweat

Ray Had No Trouble Obtaining Papers Because Canada Has Lax Passport Laws

TORONTO, June 11 — For less than \$15 James Earl Ray bought himself the standard Canadian international fugitive kit—a passport and two phony birth certificates.

The kit took him to England and Portugal in a two-month flight from Memphis, Tenn. He even picked up a second passport along the way with little trouble.

It is ridiculously easy to plunk down \$5 and get a passport in Canada.

You send in a filled-in form along with two pictures of yourself.

Ray even had travel bureau clerk Lillian Spencer fill in his forms as a convenience to him. He paid \$3 extra for the service.

Ray gave the name of Ramon George Sneyd when he applied for the passport. He later got a birth certificate under that name and one under the name of Paul Bridgman. He paid \$2 each for the birth certificates.

Simple to Avoid Rule

One passport requirement states you must have the signature of a sponsor. A number of occupations of acceptable sponsors are listed: Accountants, policemen, lawyers, doctors or judges.

To get around this requirement, however, it is simple to make a declaration that you have known no qualified sponsor for the required two years. The declaration has to be notarized but in Ray's case a notary at the travel agency signed his form without even seeing him.

As Mrs. Spencer said: "Well, it could be . . . not exactly dangerous . . . but highly embarrassing," if one of the declaration forms went awry.

If you're in a hurry, you can get a passport in Ottawa with only a few hours' cursory check. Otherwise it takes about five days to a week to mail your application — No fingerprints needed — and get your completed passport.

Birth Certificate Easy

The federal government attempted to pass a law recently setting a sentence of up to 14 years in jail for misuse of a passport but the coming federal election killed the bill.

As it stands, no one cares what you do with your passport —outside Canada.

Getting a provincial birth certificate in Ontario is almost as easy if you have an old copy of a newspaper, as did Ray.

Copy a name, birthplace, date of birth and mother's maiden name from a birth announcement, as Ray did for Paul Bridgman, born 1932 in Toronto, and mail another form. Wait a week and presto. Most of the certificate-getting is done by mail, a boon to those under 21 who apply for false certificates to use to get into bars.

To Cross at Buffalo?

FBI officials and Ontario government registrars believe Ray may have obtained one certificate in Mr. Bridgman's name in order to return to the U. S. through Buffalo.

A birth certificate, by some quirk of customs officers, is a better means of identification when crossing the Canadian-U. S. border than is a passport.

About one of every 10 border crossers are checked for identity on a busy night, said immigration officers.

Ray may also have obtained a birth certificate so he could get a job in Toronto.

It is harder to prove you are old enough to drink in Ontario (by signing forms and showing identification) than it is to outfit yourself with official documents.

Many Have No Papers

There are still many jobs in Toronto where you can work in peace for years without any identity cards or Social Security numbers.

There are 25,000 or more people in Toronto who came in on visitors' visas from other countries and stayed without passport or birth certificate.

Among the 25,000 are criminals, draft dodgers (at least 1000 in Toronto, Army deserters from the United States too unskilled or ignorant to qualify for immigration.

Biggest Rocket Attack

SAIGON, June 11—Viet Cong guerrillas today launched their biggest rocket attack on Saigon, killing at least 19 persons and wounding more than 140, officials said.
