AL ROSEN called at 10:14 a.m., 4/23/68, and raised an inquiry concerning the Tallahassee UPI dispatch which appeared in the "Florida Times-Union" this morning relative to the issuance of a pickup on ERIC STAAYO GALT. ROSEN stated he had talked to SAC PROMBOSE who stated he had received several calls concerning the matter.

I explained to Mr. ROSEN that we had checked with the Tallahassee RA and determined that the story is based upon an APB issued by FRP last night based upon receipt of the earlier wanted flyer which names GALT as being sought in connection with captioned case. ROSEN inquired as to whether or not we knew who the UPI representative was and when I answered affirmatively, stated we should promptly contact him to set the facts straight and to inquire why he did not use the RAY story inamuch as all press services had been furnished information concerning the true identity of CALT as being JAMES RAY. He likewise suggested that the reporter's name be furnished the Bureau and that we consider contacting his boss to complain as this is the only instance of a news service getting the two stories out of proper perspective. He also suggested that we contact the FHP and ask why they went ahead with the old story when all the press services and newspapers had the more current one.

He desired a call back but nothing in writing concerning this matter.

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) The FBI issued a perplexing pickup order to Florida law enforcement agencies Monday night, asking them to be on the lookout for Eric Starvo Galt, wanted for "civil rights conspiracy."

The flier said Galt had used the aliases of Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard but it did not mention the name James Earl Ray, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoever has said tay and Galt are one and the same man.

in Florida at 8:22 p.m.
In Florida, but it was cancelled within minutes and the FBI later indicated that it had been issued by mistaken. sued by mistake.

The FBI would not comment on why the order was issued in Florida, or why it failed to mention Ray.

Hoover said last week that an exhaustive check of fingerprints proved that Galt and Ray were the same man.

Martin Luther King, prominent civil rights leader, was shot to death April 4 as he stood on a hotel balcony in Memphis, where he was leading marches in a garbage collectors' strike.

Last week the FBI issued a warrant for Galt's arrest on charges of conspiring to viowww.g's civil rights.

At 1:10 p.m., Mr. BILL GIBSON, Associated Press representative at Tallahassee, called and in your absence I spoke with him. He raised the question of the UPI story with a Tallahassee dateline which appeared in this morning's Times-Union and which purports discrepancies between the FBI's looking for GALT and JAMES EARL RAY. He asked for official clarification.

Under your name I indicated to him that in checking, the FBI had determined the story originated with UPI in Miami and that insofar as this office was concerned that news service had made no effort to clarify the alleged discrepancy. It was pointed out to Mr. GIBSON that the alleged discrepancy. It was pointed out to Mr. GIBSON that the alleged discrepancy. STAAVO GALT was determined by us to be based upon receipt of the wanted flyer concerning this individual which as a matter of policy is mailed from Jacksonville to all law enforcement agencies and others in this territory. This flyer was mailed over the weekend and apparently received by FHP, Tallahassee, who routed it to a dispatcher who subsequently made a pickup broadcast on GALT Monday night.

I told Mr. GIBSON the UPI had chosen to disregard the nationwide release made Friday, April 19, 1968, identifying JAMES EARL RAY as being identical with a man known as GALT. I further told him that if UPI had checked the release facts or with the FBI that the linking of GALT with RAY would have been again repeated.

Mr. GIBSON expressed appreciation for this clarifying information and stated he would TWX the information to his headquarters in Miami.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmngham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968 from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as ______, his height as 5'll", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

For further information re JAMES EARL RAY, all offices are directed to press release furnished them by the Bureau on 4/19/68.


