Ray Hiding As Hippie?

ASBURY PARK, N.J. (49) — Asbury Park police said — and then denied — today that they received an FBI report saying James Earl Ray, charged with the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., might be in New Jersey and associating with hippies.

Deputy Police Chief Thomas Flanagan told an Associated Press newsman, "The FBI has information he (Ray) may have settled in New Jersey. He may be associating with himses"

with hippies."

Later Flanagan denied to the same AF newsman he ever made transfer tematics. In

the interim an FBI official reported he had talked with Flanagan. Another officer had given other newsmen similar accounts of the FBI flyer before Flanagan was reached first.

Allen Warren, a reporter for the Asbury Park Press, said he learned of the flyer on a routine check of police headquarters.

He said he was flipping through "wanted" posters when he noted an alert underlined in red which said: "The FBI has reason to believe that James Earl Ray is asso-

ciating with hippies in New Jersey."

Warren said that when he went back an hour later the alert had been ripped from the bottom of the poster.

Flanagan said his department received a standard flyer yesterday from the Washington office of the FBI on Ray, including the latest photos.

R. W. Bachman, special agent in charge of the FBI in New Jersey, said in Newark that he has no knowledge that Ray is in the state. Bachman said he does not know of the flyer.



RE: JACK MAYNARD RAY

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES M. UNDERHILL:

About 11:35 A.M., March 24, 1965, an individual identifying himself only as JACK RAY telephonically contacted the Durham, North Carolina, Resident Agency of the FBI and asked whether information concerning killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING would be of interest. The caller inferred he himself had just finished serving a long prison sentence. He declined to furnish his whereabouts or any more details but agreed to come immediately to the Durham Resident Agency, which he failed to do.

About 2:35 P. M., March 24, 1965, an individual identifying himself as GEORGE MC IAMB, telephone repairman for General Telephone Company of the Southeast, President of the Durham County Citizens Council, and the local Telephone Workers Union, all Durham, North Carolina, contacted the Durham Resident Agency. MC IAMB stated that at about 7:15 P. M. on March 23, 1965, he received a telephone call at his residence from an individual identifying himself as JACK RAY. RAY had said that a former member of the Citizens Council, whose name was not given, gave him MC IAMB's name. RAY, according to MC IAMB, stated he was on his way to Alabama and was wanting the help of the Citizens Council. RAY further said he was calling about MARTIN LUTHER KING and his associates. RAY asked whether the Citizens Council would help him if he were caught after doing what he was going to do.

MC LAMB stated he informed RAY the Citizens Councilwould not enter into any conspiracy and asked RAY what he intended to do. RAY replied he was going to "bust KING wide open." MC LAMB said he then advised RAY they had nothing to talk about and terminated the conversation.

MC LAMB said he had made some inquiries among members of this Citizens Council at Durham but failed to develop anyone knowing RAY. MC LAMB said he would immediately notify the FBI in the event he was contacted by RAY or received any further information about him.

Efforts through the Durham Police Department and the Durham Credit Bureau to identify RAY were unsuccessful on March 24, 1965.

On March 25, 1965, JACK MAYNARD RAY of 1814 Vale Street, Durham, North Carolina, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI at Durham. RAY related as follows:

On Tuesday, March 23, 1965, he was at the "Country Kitchen" at Durham, North Carolina, operated by a Mr. GREEN. RAY got in conversation with GREEN and then GREEN introduced RAY to GEORGE MC LAMB, President of the Durham County Citizens Council and the local Telephone Workers Union. MC LAMB took RAY to a car believed to have been a Ford Station Wagon. There MC LAMB expressed hatred of Negroes and asked RAY if RAY would shoot JAMES FARMER, Executive Director of Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) and/or MARTIN LUTHER KING. RAY said he would do so if the price were right and the money was "on the line." RAY claimed MC LAMB asked whether RAY would try to get a shot at KING or FARMER in Selma, Alabama, for \$5000 and said that MC LAMB exhibited a photograph of FARMER.

RAY stated MC LAMB had pointed out it was unlikely that a person shooting either FARMER or KING in Alabama, Louisiana, or Mississippi, would be convicted of any serious crime.

RAY continued that MC LAMB again met him in the station wagon near the "Country Kitchen" on the evening of

March 24, 1965. He mentioned sending RAY to Jackson, Mississippi, to contact an undisclosed person there. MC LAMB also indicated he would arrange to secure a rifle for RAY, since all RAY had was a long barrel .38 caliber Smith and Wesson pistol. RAY said MC LAMB gave him \$20.

RAY acknowledged he was the individual who had telephoned the Durham Resident Agency of the FBI on March 24, 1965, and said he had not kept the appointment because of rain.

RAY stated that he has no intention of harming FARMER or KING and will notify the FBI if he receives any further request along this line.

RAY stated he himself had served approximately 25 years for a robbery in 1942 of a bank in Hyattsville, Maryland. He stated since he was released he has been making liquor in the vicinity of North Wilkesboro, North Carolina, and that he recently paid a fine at Charlotte, North Carolina, for public drunk and carrying a concealed weapon, a pistol. During this interview RAY was in possession of a quart bottle of wine with the larger portion of it gone.

The following investigation was conducted at Durham, North Carolina, by SA CHARLES'S. MILLER:

On April 26, 1968, HORACE H. HALLETT, Durham, reported that GEORGE E. MC IAMB was still employed by the telephone company but was now in the purchasing department. Employment records reflected that he was at work at Durham, North Carolina, April 3-5, 1968 and worked nine, ten, and nine hours respectively these dates.

On April 29, 1968, HALLETT, supra, advised his records reflected GEORGE E. MC IAMB was currently a division plant supervisor of the Marerial and Supplies Division. He resided at 2819 Way Cross Road, telephone number 682-2881. Records reflected MC IAMB was born at Sampson County, North Carolina. He was hired by the telephone company June 1, 1953, under Social Security number

He stated MC IAMB was now a part of management and no longer a member of the IBW Union although he was believed to retain a close friendship with the present president of this organization, BUDDY HOLIAND.

HALLETT stated MC IAMB had an excellent work record and no information concerning financial difficulty, instability, or unusual obsessions was noted in the file.

On May 2, 1968, GEORGE E. MC IAMB, 2819 Way Cross Road, was interviewed at the General Telephone Company of Southeast Maintenance Plant. MC IAMB advised he had had no contact whatever with JACK MAYNARD RAY since the previously reported contact in March, 1965.

MC IAMB noted he never had in fact had any significant contact with RAY.

He did recall that at that time RAY had made a false allegation that the Citizens Council had tried to hire RAY to assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING but this had not been true.

MC IAMB stated since that time he, MC IAMB, had discontinued completely his affiliation with Durham County Citizens Council. He never had belonged to any Klan unit. Also, he had become a part of management and given up all affiliations with the Teamsters Workers Union.

MC IAMB stated he had no information whatever concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. As previously stated, MC IAMB stated he was opposed to acts of violence and would not uphold in any fashion the shooting of KING.

On April 26, 1963, Detective Lieutenant RICHARD MORRIS, Durham Police Department, advised he had made a check of his department, and none of the officers were aware of any information to indicate that JACK MAYNARD RAY had been in Durham, North Carolina, over the past two years.

MORRIS stated he had requested all officers to contact their informants for information as to the whereabouts of RAY.

On April 27, 1968, MORRIS stated officers of the Durham Police Department had been unable to develop any specific information as to the whereabouts of JACK MAYNARD RAY.

On April 30, 1968, ED MARKS, 1841 Vale Street, advised he understood JACK RAY had previously resided at that address with his sister, SUSIE WHITT, but that he had not seen or heard anything as to the whereabouts of RAY for well over a year.

On April 30, 1968, MELVIN BARBEE, 1810 Vale Street, advised he had known JACK RAY for many years as the brother of his next door neighbor, SUSIE WHITT. PARREE stated he had last seen RAY in about 1965. He said that the FBI had talked to RAY at that time and immediately after this, RAY had left Durham without notice, stating he was never going to come back.

BARBEE stated RAY's sister, SUSIE WHITT had moved to the Hocutt Road, Durham, North Carolina, but she had recently indicated she did not know RAY's whereabouts.

On April 30, 1968, SUSIE WHITT, Hocutt Road, Durham telephone number 596-7487, advised JACK MAYNARD RAY was her brother. She stated she had not seen him since 1965 when the FBI came to see him. She stated at that time he had been continually drunk. After talking with the FBI, RAY left Durham, stating he was never coming back. He indicated an intention of visiting his wife, MAE RAY, nee MAE HEIMS in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Mrs. WHITT advised she never knew Mrs. RAY's address but recalls she had worked at the Charlotte Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. WHITT stated her brother would say anything when drunk. She doubted very seriously any intention on his part to harm anyone. She noted further that he was born over 55 years ago, and no one would mistake him for being under 45.

On May 6, 1968, Detective R. D. RAY, Durham Police Department, advised he had known JACK RAY, but could furnish no information as to his current whereabouts. The only relative he knew RAY to have was his sister, SUSIE WHITT, and she denied any knowledge as to his whereabouts. RAY noted that when JACK RAY had previously been in Durham in 1965, he had been suspected of getting his nephew, the son of SUSIE WHITT, in trouble. JACK RAY himself was regarded as a drunk.

RAY stated the Durham Police Department records reflected RAY, Durham Police Department number 9865, had FBI number 864 684, and was born in Franklin County, North Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD J. BRENNAN and SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON in an effort to locate JACK MAYNARD RAY:

AT CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

Records of the Charlotte Police Department were reviewed and numerous references to RAY were located. The records reflected residences of 1915 Thomas Avenue and 1919 Thomas Avenue, and employment at Renfrow Distributing Company.

Neighborhood investigations reflected that Mr. RAY had last been seen in the Charlotte area some four years prior to 1968.

Mrs. SUZIE HUFFMAN, Secretary to the Personnel Director of Charlotte Memorial Hospital, advised that she could locate no record for MAE RAY, nee Helms as an employee of the hospital.

Mrs. ANNE HOWELL, Medical Records Librarian, advised the only record of a patient named MAE HELMS which might in any way be connected with one MAE HELMS in this matter, expired in April of 1963. She had a former address of 1619 Parsons Street, Charlotte. Neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of that location revealed that this particular MAE HELMS had never been married to JACK MAYNARD RAY.

Police records reflected that JACK MAYNARD RAY had been confined at Wilmuth Hospital; therefore, Mrs. BONNIE KNOWLES, Superintendent of Nursing, was contacted at Wilmuth Hospital, an Alcoholics Anonymous institution. No record of RAY was located; however, Mrs. KNOWLES reported he could have entered the hospital under any name he might choose to give; therefore, his photograph was circulated among members of the staff and patients, most of whom are repeaters. They related his face was familiar; however, they could not identify him.

Contact with personnel of Renfrow Distributing Company failed to reveal anyone who knew the current whereabouts of RAY. Mr. JACK RENFROW advised that RAY remarried one MAE HELMS, who worked as a practical nurse. Canvass of all local hospitals revealed that MAE HELMS worked as a private duty nurse at the Wesley Nursing Center; however, her current whereabouts were not known inasmuch as her mother had recently suffered a heart attack and confined to another local hospital.

A review of the records of the United States Probation Office at Charlotte revealed RAY listed his inlaws as Mrs. CORA HELMS, 1409 Pecan Street.

Inquiry in the vicinity of 1409 Pecan Street revealed that Mrs. CORA HEIMS was critically ill in a local hospital having suffered a heart attack. MAE HEIMS, her daughter, resides at 1401 Pecan Street, and MAE HEIMS was contacted.

She advised that she divorced JACK MAYNARD RAY approximately two years ago and the last contact she had with him was through his sister in Durham, North Carolina, who contacted her in January, 1967, stating that JACK MAYNARD RAY was confined to a hospital in Daytona Beach, Florida, suffering from convulsions. She related he was an alcoholic and she believed he is possibly dead.

Enclosed is one copy each of the USP, Leavenworth, Kansas classification material regarding LERCY BASIL MC MANAMAN and DONALD JAMES NISSEN, for Dallas and Jackson. Both inmates presently confined at USP, Leavenworth.

It will be noted that all authorized correspondents of MC MANAMAN are relatives in the Dodge City, Kansas area with the exception of one SYBIL ZURE, 423 Raymond Road, Jackson, Mississippi who according to the Parole Progress Report of October, 1966, MC MANAMAN plans to work with in the real estate business upon his release.

CARL ZARTER, Administrative Assistant, USP, Leavenworth, Kansas, on 7/19/67 was unable to identify any present or former inmate known as "LITTLE RED" from his records and those interviewed reported such person was not known to them.

1 copy cent Las Vigas 5-22-68. 22 JOHN EMMANUEL MAY, USP-L, Inmate #82455, FBI #4 714 728, sentenced in USDC, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 9/27/65 to 5 years for ITSHV on interview 7/19/67 by SA MAX E. RICHARDSON advised that he considered the story by NISSEN regarding an alleged plot to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. just one of NISSEN's "cock and bill stories".

MAY stated that he is not an associate of inmate MC MANAMAN, knows him only well enough to recognize him in the institution and has never talked to him. He added that he, MAY, keeps to himself, trying to serve his sentence without becoming involved in the troubles of other inmates and that he is not acquainted with the associates of MC MANAMAN. He denied knowing the identity of any inmate known as "LITTLE RED".

According to MAY it is well known to all inmates in the institution that he is a capable machinist and that he does a great deal of the mechanical drawing in connection with the work done in this institution. He added that when he became acquainted with former inmate DONALD JAMES NISSEN he learned that NISSEN had few friends among the other inmates. Further that NISSEN liked to talk about himself as well as about any subject, with anyone who would listen to him. He explained that NISSEN found him a good listener and would often spend several hours in the doorway of his, MAY's cell, talking while he, MAY was working on his drawings. He added that he seldom did much of the talking but only agreed with whatever NISSEN had to say on whatever topic was being discussed.

MAY stated he does recall that on one occasion NISSEN had mentioned that one "MAC", and he assumed NISSEN was referring to MC MANAMAN, had informed him there was a plot to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. for \$100,000. He added that NISSEN stated that it was "all set up" but that he did not want to tell him too much about it. MAY stated he informed NISSEN that he did not want to know anything about the matter. He said he further told NISSEN that KING was probably so well guarded that a person could not "reach him with a ten foot pole". MAY also recalled that NISSEN claimed that "MAC" had told him to get in touch with someone whose name he mentioned but which he does not now recall, in the real estate business when NISSEN was released.

MAY went on to state that he believes he indicated to NISSEN that he, MAY had heard some similar comment regarding \$100,000 being offered to kill KIHG. MAY stated this referred to an occasion several years ago when he was drinking in some bar in Raleigh, N. C. He explained that he was not acquainted with any of the occupants of this bar. He added that some of the occupants were discussing the current racial problems and one individual made the comment that "Someone had a good idea when they offered \$100,000 to get KING killed".

HAY further stated that at no time had NISSEN ever requested him to make any part of a gun. He stated that NESEN had once inquired if he, MAY, could make a gun and that he informed NISSEN that any machinist with any ability could make a rifle. MAY recalled that he and NISSEN at the same time were talking about what an advantage it would be for the military to have a rifle with a longer magazine or clip that would carry more cartridges than the one presently used.

MAY advised that when NISSEN mentioned the alleged plot to kill KING he paid little attention to what was being said and passed it off as just another of NISSEN's stories.

CHARLES L. FOREMAN, JR., USP-L Inmate \$81476, FBI \$970 939 sentenced in USDC, Cheyenne, Wyoming; 5/12/64 to 6 years for ITSMV, advised on 7/19/67 that he was not an associate of HC MANAMAN, that he knew no inmate associate of HC MANAMAN's who was known as "LITTLE RED" and that he had never heard any comment from any source regarding a plot or offer of \$100,000 for the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KINS, JR.

FOREMAN stated that for a period of time when he first arrived at this institution he frequently ate at the same table with MC MANAMAN but that although there was no friction between them they made other friends with whom they eat. He stated that he is aware that MC MANAMAN dislikes colored people and avoids contact with colored inmates but that he is not outspoken on the subject. He added that he had

never heard MC MANAMAN make any type of threatening or critical remark to any colored inmate and he is not known to have had any trouble with such inmates. FOREMAN stated that he did not know any of the present associates of MC MANAMAN.

USP, Leavenworth records reflect that LEROY BASIL MC MANAMAN #81371, FBI #1 244 125 was sentenced in USDC, Wichita, Kansas 1/18/63 to 8 years for ITSNV and on 3/31/64 in USDC, Topeka, Kansas to 1 year consecutive for Harboring a fugitive.

Under present mail procedures at the USP, Leavenworth, Kansas, no record is kept of what mail if any is actually received from or sent to any particular correspondent on an inmate's authorized correspondent list. SYBIL ZURE, Jackson, Hississippi is not on MC MANAHAN's authorized visitor list.

On 6/2/67, DONALD JAMES HISSEN, FBI No. 607 320 A. presently an inmate at Grayson County Jail, Sherman, Texas, was interviewed by SA W. J. WILKINSON, JR. and SA JOHN B. FULKS, at which time a signed statement was obtained pertaining to an alleged violation of NISSEN's civil rights since being brought to jail in Sherman as of 5/12/67. The Bureau has been advised of that matter under caption "GEORGE W. BLANTON, Sheriff, Grayson County, Sherman, Texas; DONALD JAMES NISSEN - VICTIM, CR, OO Dallas."

After obtaining a signed/statement in the civil rights matter, NISSEN orally furnished the following information, requesting that his identity be concealed as the source of the information. 44-769-

NISSEN stated that while at Leavenworth Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Karsas, from Jaly, 1965, until his release in April, 1967, he became very friendly with another inmate identified as LERGY MCMALANA. McMANAMAN was originally from Western Karsas, Toyn unrecalled, and was alleged to have bootlegged in Mississippi. According to NISSEN, he and McMANAMAN worked together in the shoe factory at Leavenworth. NISSEN claimed that the FBI had tried to "get" McMANAMAN on bank burglary charges but were unsuccessful and McMANAMAN was presently in the penitentiary on charges of concealing three stolen autos and was due for release sometime next year.

NISSEN said he had previously met McMANAMAN before going to the penitentiary in Jackson, Mississippi, and he recognized McMANAMAN "in the joint."

NISSEN said that just before he was scheduled to be paroled from Leavenworth, McManaman approached NISSEN, stating that he knew NISSEN was going to Atlanta as soon as he squared away two local detainers and HcManaman told NISSEN he needed him to set things up for him.

McMANAMAN told NISSEN that \$100,000 had been offered by the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan to be paid to anyone who would kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

NISSEN stated that after he was squared away on his two local Texas charges, McHANAMAN wanted him to contact a Mrs. FNU EURE, at the Eure Realty, Jackson, Mississippi.
McHANAMAN claimed Mrs. EURE is listed as a correspondent by him at Leavenworth Penitentiary. According to instructions, MISSEN was to contact Mrs. EURE and ask her when she next writes to McMANAMAN at the penitentiary to tell him "DON" had arrived. McMANAMAN indicated he would write and tell EURE that NISSEN was "O.K."

If NISSEN wanted to try to "pull this" himself, Mrs. EURE would put him in contact with two people identified to NISSEN only as FLOYD LNU, an honorary colonel in the National Guard at Jackson, Mississippi, and a second person whom NISSEN cannot now identify. NISSEN stated, however, that the unidentified person, according to McMANAMAN, had recently been appointed a Deputy U. S. Marshal at Jackson.

It was NISSEN's understanding that if he were willing to pull the job, he was to get in tough with Mrs. EURE, advise her, and she would thereafter put him in touch with the above two men, both of whom NISSEN understands are associated with the White Knights. NISSEN stated those men would insure payment if KING were killed.

NISSEN continued, saying that if he was not interested in doing the job himself, he was supposed to "case KING's place," (location not specified) in Atlanta, and check the layout. NISSEN pointed out he could do this rather easily, as before serving time, he worked for Encyclopedia Americana. After getting the layout, NISSEN was to tell McMANAMAN the set-up so that when McMANAMAN was released from the penitentiary he could handle it himself. NISSEN stated he would get a percentage of the money received by McMANAMAN for casing KING's residence. NISSEN stated that based on his knowledge of McMANAMAN, he believes McMANAMAN is perfectly capable of committing the plot. He stated McMANAMAN "hates Negroes and lets them know it in the pen."

NISSEN also claimed that another inmate at Leavenworth, a JOHN MAY, a nearby celleate of NISSEN's when he was at the penitentiary, has knowledge of the aforementioned plot.

MAY is from Rock Island, Illinois, and has worked as a machinist at the arsenal in Rock Island. He is presently at Leavenworth on a Dyer Act charge. McMANAMAN had asked NISSEN to contact MAY to determine if MAY could build a long barrel and firing pin for a new type of .38 automatic pistol. McMANAMAN knows that MAY is an excellent machinist and a friend of NISSEN's. According to NISSEN, McMANAMAN intended to use this long barrel pistol with the scope and firing pin to be made by MAY in the killing of KING. McMANAMAN planned to dispose of the scope, firing pin and long barrel, and replace the original barrel and firing pin and in this manner the gun could not be traced to McMANAMAN.

NISSEN claims be contacted MAY about McMANAMAN's proposal and MAY reportedly told NISSEN he did not want anything to do with the plan, but he stated he could make a long

barrel for the gun if so desired. NISSEN advised it would be "O.K." for the FBI to contact NAY in order to verify NISSEN's story. NISSEN feels MAY will protect him, as they are good friends.

NISSEN claims that MAY also told him he also had heard of the \$100,000 sum put up for the death of KING. MAY's information apparently came from an unrecalled source in either North or South Carolina.

NISSEN understands the \$100,000 is supposed to be a standing offer.

NISSEN said CHARLES FOREMAN and "Little Red," not otherwise identified, innate at Leavenworth, were close friends of McMANAMAN, and may have information on captioned matter.

For the information of the Bureau, Jackson Office has been designated origin in this matter, inasmuch as that office is origin in the case entitled "WHITH KNIGHTS OF THE KU ELUX KIAH OF HISSISSIFFI." Also, if HISSEN's information is to be given any credence, Mrs. FHU EURE would have detailed information on the captioned matter.

Dallas, at this time, is unable to evaluate the information furnished by NISSZN on captioned matter, but for the further information of the Bureau and receiving offices, prior to furnishing the above information and prior to furnishing the signed statement in the civil rights matter, NISSEN stated "I first wanted to knew if I furnished you (FBI) information, if you would help me." NISSEN was immediately advised by the interviewing agents that there would be no dickering or trading, but that they would be glad to accept any information he cared to furnish.

Dallas has not deemed it warranted at this time to furnish NISSEM's information in letterhead memorandum form, and that determination is being left to the discretion of the Jackson Division after the completion of the following investigation.

Photograph No. 2 should bear the caption "JAMES EARL RAY (Photograph taken late January or early February, 1968, in California." This is a head shot of RAY in a business suit which shows marked cleft in chin.

Jacksonville is reproducing copies of these two photographs locally and each Agent in his contact with news media is requested to insure that these receive widespread distribution. Several of these will be furnished to each of you.

I noted the Jacksonville "Florida Times-Union," Wednesday, May 8, 1968, showed these two pictures in a news article in a UPI news release so it may be the major papers will have already received and published this article and photograph if they were tied in with this new service but many of the smaller papers, particularly the weeklies in your area may not have the picture or article so we want as widespread distribution of this photograph as possible.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM LEE BOLYARD at Panama City, Florida on April 23, 1968:

BUD HASTINGS, operator-owner, Treasure Island Motel, Panama City Beach, Florida, furnished the following information:

On March 25, 1968, a Mrs. JASPER WARD and a Mrs. GEORGIA DAVIS came to his motel seeking a room. He pointed out to them that he was at the motel carrying out certain maintenance details in preparation for opening the motel and that he was not at that time ready to rent any of his units in that he was still in the process of painting and carrying on other maintenance details. Thereafter, Mrs. WARD and Mrs. DAVIS left and returned within a short period of time stating that they liked his motel the best of any locations they had observed on the beach and requested that he rent them a room, if possible, for several days vacation. He explained to them that he was willing for them to rent his motel room if they were aware that the office to the motel was not opened and there would be no telephone service as a result of the office being closed. Both agreed that they desired to rent the room and thereafter he rented them Unit Number 4 which unit at that time was available for occupancy.

Mrs. WARD registered, listing her address as 2540 Ransdell Avenue, Louisville, Kentucky. At the time they registered, Mrs. WARD and Mrs. DAVIS were driving a 1967 Cadillac convertible. Mrs. WARD identified herself as a State Senator in the Kentucky Legislature. At the time they registered they indicated that they would be there from two to three weeks. They also indicated that they anticipated another guest arriving within several days who would join them at the motel.

On April 1, 1968, he came to the motel to continue his maintenance duties at which time he observed an individual seated on the patio of Unit Number 4 drinking a can of beer. This individual introduced himself as Reverend A.D. KING. Reverend KING checked into Unit 5 as a part of the party of Mrs. JASPER WARD and Mrs. GEORGIA DAVIS. They remained at the motel until April 3, 1968 when Reverend A.D. KING checked from the motel. Mrs. WARD and Mrs. DAVIS did not check from the motel, but stated they were leaving encounter to Memphis, Tennessee to participate in a demonstration march with Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING. Mrs. WARD indicated that she and Mrs. DAVIS would return to Panama City Beach to complete their vacation.

Mrs. WARD returned to the motel on April 6, 1968 at which time she checked herself and Mrs. DAVIS from the motel. Mrs. WARD was alone at the time.

During the time that these individuals stayed at the Treasure Island Motel, he had very little conversation with them as they remained on the beach most of the day, during which time he was in the general area conducting maintenance work on the motel. He did not observe any of these individuals having any visitors during the time they were at the motel, and they used the pay telephone located outside the motel office during their stay as the motel office was not opened. He recalls that they made numerous telephone calls and that they had numerous incoming calls through the pay telephone during the hours that he was in the general area conducting his maintenance duties.

Mr. HASTINGS advised that he has no information whatsoever pertaining to the death of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Other Offices receiving copies of this airtel were not furnished rerep and so the following background information is being set forth to assist these Offices in conducting the requested investigation:

Investigation has determined that the subject, using the name of ERIC GALT, left Los Angeles, Calif., on 12/15/67, driving his Mustang automobile, in the company of CHARLES J. STEIN, of Los Angeles. STEIN had formerly been a resident of New Orleans and the alleged purpose of this trip was for STEIN to pick up two children of his sister's who were residing in New Orleans and return them to California. According to STEIN, they arrived in New Orleans on 12/17/67 and left New Orleans on 12/19/67. STEIN stayed with relatives and investigation has determined that subject registered at the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, on 12/17/67 as ERIC S. GALT and was assigned room 126. The registration card indicated GALT's automobile to be a Mustang bearing Alabama license 1-38993 and his address as 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Ala. The subject, as GALT, stayed at the motel until 12/19/67 when he checked out.

Interviews of motel employees in regards to the subject have been negative in that they cannot recall him.

There is set forth under a caption for each Office the identity or identities of persons staying at the Provincial Motel from 12/17 through 19/67. The identities of these persons were obtained from the motel registration cards as well as other information which is set forth under the name. The date listed under each name is the date the individual or individuals stayed at the motel. Each Office should locate and interview these individuals for any knowledge or contact they may have had with the subject. Various photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, which have been furnished to all Offices, should be displayed to these individuals to ascertain if they recall RAY.

In order to assist Memphis, the Office of Origin in this matter, each Office should set forth the results of this investigation in report form with copies of the reports designated for the Bureau and Memphis.

In the preparation of these reports, it is suggested that an appropriate predication for this part of the investigation be utilized in the details prior to reporting the results of contacts with these individuals. As an example, the following information might be used for this predication:
