Re Kansas City teletype to the Bureau and Indianapolis dated 4/18/68.

On 4/18/68, Mr. LINDELL R. CHURCH, Attorney, CHURCH, PREWITT, JONES, WILSON & KARCHMER, 110 Landmark Building, Springfield, Missouri, appeared in the Springfield Resident Agency and advised SA PAYSON that he had observed an individual who was driving a North American Van Lines' truck which was parked at the Landmark Building for unloading purposes. He stated that this individual closely resembled, in his opinion, the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT as shown on the front page of the Springfield Daily News for April 18, 1968.

CHURCH described the unidentified driver of the vehicle as follows: white male, blue eyes, 5'10-11", long dark hair, 160-170 pounds, age early 30's. He stated that he understood that this driver had a southern accent and was allegedly from Alabama.

On 4/18/68, OTTO ROLF, Route 4, Box 379, Springfield, was contacted at his place of business, the Landmark Building parking garage, on Olive Street, where he is the superintendent. He advised that he had been present on the morning of 4/18/68, when a North American Van Lines' truck had come to the Landmark Building for the purpose of unloading a new IBM machine. He stated that he had read the Springfield Daily News for 4/18/68, and had noted the photograph contained on the front page thereof. This photograph was of ERIC STARVO GALT, the accused slayer of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

ROLF advised that the driver of the North American Van Lines'truck closely resembled the photograph of GALT and descriptive information as reflected in the accompanying article in the newspaper. He stated, however, that the driver's face was longer and thinner than the face in the photograph on the front page of the newspaper.

ROLF was shown two composite drawings which purport to represent a likeness of the slayer as depicted from the result of FBI investigation. ROLF selected the first of these composite drawings which shows a white male with close cropped hair in a cut resembling a "flat top." He stated that the shape of this man's face and nose very closely resemble the facial features of the driver of the North American Van Lines' truck. He stated that the driver, however, did not have short close cropped hair but his hair was somewhat longer and appeared to be raised up off the top of his head similar to the hair reflected in the second composite drawing.

ROLF described the driver as follows: white male, 5'9-10", 160-170 pounds, blue eyes, early 30's, thick brown hair combed straight back which did not lie flat on his head. He stated that he spoke with the driver and the driver had a marked southern accent and indicated that he had come from the State of Alabama.

ROLF advised that he was struck with the similarity between the driver's appearance and that of the photograph of GALT as reflected in the Springfield Daily News of 4/18/68. He stated he engaged the driver in conversation and mentioned GALT to him. He stated that the driver appeared somewhat shocked when he mentioned GALT and terminated their conversation with an incoherent reply. ROLF advised that he had written down the license number on the North American Van Lines trailer. He gave that license number as follows: 1969 Indiana 31642.

On 4/18/68, JEAN SMITH, Building Manager, Landmark Building, Springfield, Missouri, advised that the certified public accountant firm of ROPER and RICHARDSON, Landmark Building, had received delivery of a new IBM machine via North American Van Lines on this date. She stated this machine was delivered by an unidentified white male approximately 5'10"-6', with dark hair, who appeared to be in his late 20's. She stated that he was wearing cowboy boots. She advised that ALLAN MC CRACKEN had a copy of the bill of lading for this particular shipment.

A copy of the following described bill of lading was obtained from ALLAN MC CRACKEN on 4/18/68: North American Van Lines Bill of Lading #21658 which reflects the shipment of an IBM machine from IBM Systems Manufacturing Division, 700 Banyan Trail, Boca Raton, Florida, to ROPER and RICHARDSON, Landmark Building, Springfield, Missouri, consignee. The office of the

shipper is reflected as North American Van Lines Fleet Operations, Fort Wayne, Indiana. This bill of lading is signed B. J. PARKER on behalf of the shipper. MC CRACKEN advised that PARKER is the name used by the driver. This bill of lading was dated 4/10/68, and reflects delivery made on 4/18/68. MC CRACKEN stated that the driver indicated to him that he was enroute to St. Louis, Missouri, to make further deliveries.

On 4/18/68, LEON BEDELL, Building Superintendent, Landmark Building, was shown composite drawings purported to be a likeness of the slayer of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He advised that, in his opinion, the driver of the North American Van Lines' truck who had delivered an IBM machine to the Landmark Building on 4/18/68, did not resemble either of these composite drawings. He stated that he helped the driver unload the machine and the driver appeared to be a nice, intelligent young man to him. He stated that the driver did mention that "the man who killed LUTHER KING is long gone by now." This last statement was reportedly made during the course of a conversation among LEON BEDELL, his son TOMMY BEDELL, and the driver.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EARL A. PAYSON on 4/18/68, in an effort to trace the itinerary of the above described North American Van Lines' truck: CHARLES WHITEHEAD, Manager, North American Van Lines, Incorporated, 1852 Blaine, Springfield, Missouri, advised that he had no record of the above described vehicle being in the Springfield area. He stated that the above described vehicle was probably a "new products' hauler and the Springfield office of North American Van Lines handle only the shipment of household goods and personal property. He referred SA PAYSON to the North American Van Lines' dispatching office in Joplin, Missouri, where he stated a record should be on file pertaining to this particular vehicle.

Mrs. SUSAN SMITH, Dispatch Clerk, North American Van Lines, Joplin, Missouri, was telephonically contacted and advised that the Joplin office of North American Van Lines contained no record identifiable with the above described vehicle. She stated that if this vehicle was carrying new products, that the shipment would originate through the North American Van Lines' office at

DIRECTOR J. EDGAR HOOVER SAID THAT A SYSTEMATIC AND EXHAUSTIVE SEARCH OF LATENT FINGERPRINTS UNCOVERED IN THE DR. KING CASE AGAINST THE FINGERPRINTS OF THE OVER 53,000 PERSONS FROM WHOM "WANTED NOTICES" HAVE BEEN POSTED IN THE FILES OF THE FBI"S IDENTIFICATION DIVISION LED TO THE DETERMINATION THAT GALT AND RAY ARE IDENTICAL.

MR. HOOVER SAID THAT RAY, WHO IS 40 YEARS OF AGE, WAS REPORTED MISSING FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI, SINCE APRIL 23, 1967. HE HAD BEEN RECEIVED AT THAT INSTITUTION ON MARCH 17, 1960, TO SERVE A 20-YEAR SENTENCE FOLLOWING CONVICTION IN ST. LOUIS FOR ARMED ROBBERY AND FOR OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE OWNER.

IN SEPTEMBER, 1966, WHILE SERVING THIS SENTENCE, HE WAS CONFINED FOR A TIME IN THE MAXIMUM SECURITY WARD AT THE STATE HOSPITAL AT FULTON, MISSOURI.

PRIOR TO THE 1960 CONVICTION FOR WHICH HE RECEIVED THE 20-YEAR TERM, RAY HAD BEEN CONVICTED OF BURGLARY IN LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA, IN 1949; ARMED ROBBERY IN CHICAGO, ILLINOIS, IN 1952; AND FORGING UNITED STATES POSTAL MONEY ORDERS IN MISSOURI IN 1955.

HE HAS SERVED TERMS IN THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY JAIL IN 1949; IN STATE PRISONS AT JOLIET AND PONTIAC, ILLINOIS, IN 1952-54; AND IN THE FEDERAL PENITENTIARY AT LEAVENWORTH, KANSAS, IN 1955-58.

RAY WAS AN ENLISTED MAN IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY FROM FEBRUARY, 1946, TO DECEMBER, 1948, AT WHICH TIME HE WAS GIVEN A GENERAL DISCHARGE DUE TO INEPTNESS AND LACK OF ADAPTABILITY FOR MILITARY SERVICE. WHILE IN THE ARMY, HE RECEIVED A THREE-MONTH SENTENCE AT HARD LABOR FOR BEING DRUNK AND BREAKING ARREST.
