

On April 22, 1960, Missouri State Penitentiary, (MSP) records were checked and the following information obtained regarding CARL BENTON DEAKE:

DRAKE was received at the MSP, February 5, 1960, and assigned #00189, from St. Louis City to serve an 8 year sentence on charge of Robbery First Degree b/m of D & DW (three charges). He was discharged June 1, 1965.

He is described as a white male, born at Greenville, Kentucky, height 5'82", weight 148, brown hair, blue eyes, ruddy complexion, slender build, occupation construction, bricklayer and truck driver, FBI #1729B, prior MSP #72030.

Referenced communication advised that subject JAMES EARLY RAY, aka, was last known to be in Atlanta, Georgia, area on 4/5/68. Intensive investigation by the Atlanta Office to date has not established mode of transportation utilized by RAY after 4/5/68, through checks with transportation companies, car rental agencies, etc.

All offices are requested to check car recoveries in their respective divisions of cars stolen from the State of Georgia subsequent to 4/4/68 and consider same to have been possible mode of transportation for subject RAY. The same consideration should be given to any cars recovered in the near future that were stolen in the State of Georgia after 4/4/68. In instances where cars were stolen from Georgia and the transporter of same cannot otherwise be accounted for, investigation should be conducted to determine if RAY was person who may have stolen and transported same. This is being brought to attention of all Agents in the event any such stolen cars come to their attention during their investigations.

CLOSE FRIENDS. DESCRIBED HIM AS HAVING BAD NERVOUS CONDITION AND
A DEFINITE MENTAL PROBLEM. RAY IN HIS OPINION WAS TAKING POWDERED
AMPHETAMINE WHILE IN PRISON AND ALTHOUGH HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF AMOUNT

RAY WAS USING, HE SUSPECTED GREAT QUANTITY AT TIMES WHEN THE SUPPLY WAS AVAILABLE AND AT OTHER TIMES NONE DUE TO WEIGHT LOSSES AND GAINS OF TEN TO FIFTEEN POUNDS OVER SHORT PERIODS. BARNETT NOTED THAT AMPHETAMINE TAKEN IN QUANTITIES WOULD PRODUCE A SUBSTANTIAL RAPID WEIGHT LOSS. THE SUPPLY OF AMPHETAMINE PRIOR TO ONE NINE SIX FOUR WAS READILY AVAILABLE AT FIVE DOLLARS A SHOT OR LESS. AFTER ONE NINE SIX FOUR WAS VERY SCARCE BUT WHEN AVAILABLE REMAINED AT FIVE DOLLARS A SHO T. 

Mrs. FRANCES STOKER JAMISON, 453 Pasee, Kansas City, Missouri, advised she has been legally separated from her husband, WILLIAM HOWARD JAMISON, for about three years. She stated he has been extremely religious since getting out of prison, and in her opinion is "sick", but would not harm anyone. She said JAMISON was in Kansas City, Kansas, at the time of KING's murder residing at 906 Ohio, Kansas City, Kansas, but left about a week later for California.

Mrs. JAMISON said she had a letter from her husband on 4/29/68 in which he indicated he was an Evangelist for Gospel Wings, 1948 Clinton, Los Angeles, California. She does not know of any threatening statements made by JAMISON regarding MARTIN LUTHER KING, but stated he might have made such statements while he was a member of the John Birch Seciety. She stated he has not been associated with this organization since getting out of prison.

Reference telephone call this date to interview USP-L inmate AUBREY AEBY #7080% as to his knowledge of the association of this brothers NEAL & BILLIE AEBY with RAY in view of the report that they were somewhat involved in naycotic avitivities with RAY while all were in the MSP Jefferson City, Mo. Also to ascertain the whereabouts of another brother JAMES AEBY ..

AUBREY AEBY, inmate, USP-Leavenworth, Kansas 4-28-68 advised that he was not aware that either NEAL or BILLIE AEBY were acquaintances of RAY as he had had no correspondance with them and had never heard RAY mentioned by any of his relatives. AEBY stated that hew hardly knew his brother NEAL as he had left home before NEAL grew up.

AUBREY AEBY stated that he believes that NEAL AEBY may still be in the MSP held there on a Texas detainer. BILL AFBY is now believed to be in Dallas, Texas, however the last he heard in a letter from him which was some months ago, BILL's address was Box 64 Seagoville, Texas which is on the old Seagoville road.

As to JAMES AFBY, AUBREY stated that he is a highly respectable person who has nothing to do with other members of the family and has never been involved in any difficulties with the law. He stated he has not heard from JAMES for some time but was last operating a service station at Preston Road and Mockengbird Lane and resided at 4439 Perdue, Dallas, Texas.

HARMAN, JR. that according to his records, the first Gaslight bar licensed in the city was licensed on 7/11/60, at 1403 Main Street, and had formerly been licensed at the same address as the Trade Winds Bar. A Gaslight bar has operated continuously in the city since that time and is presently operating at 3740 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri.

On 4/30/68, RODNEY BOJECK, Sertender and Assistant Manager, the Gaslight Bar, 617 Central Street, Kansas City, Kansas, advised SA ROBERT V. HARMAN, JR. that that bar had been operating under that name only since about 1962, and was definitely not operating under that same prior to 1960. He explained that there had been no other Gaslight bar in Kansas City, Kansas.

Since a bar known as the Gaslight was not la operation in Kansas City prior to subject RAY's arrest and continuous incarceration beginning on 10/16/59, no investigation will be conducted at Kansas City, Missouri, to locate any girl friend of subject RAY whom he may have not at such a bar.



For the information of the Kansas City Division, EDGAR T. PIANCHE, 925 Gaiennie Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, furnished the following confidential information requesting that under no circumstances during subsequent interviews should it be indicated that this information came from PIANCHE or from New Orleans:

According to Mr. PLANCHE, BEVERLY HEBERT, who is in Fort Smith, Arkansas, to establish an Arkansas residence to obtain a divorce, told him confidentially that her boy friend, BILL SORRELIS, who she intends to marry when her divorce is obtained, was contacted at Fort Smith by BOS MEISON. Both SORRELIS and NELSON are allegedly employed by Litwin Corporation, Wichita, Kansas. According to PLANCHE, HEBERT overheard conversation between SORRELIS and NEISON to the effect that NEISON was in Memphis, Tennessee, on Thursday, April 4, 1968, and later came to Fort Smith, Arkansas, arriving late. HEBERT claimed there was a rifle in the back of a white Porche sutomobile with Oklahoma license which belongs to MEISON. NEISON

LR 157-1215 reportedly Fort Smith by plane or automobile and went to Oklahoma, returned to Arkansas, then went to Tennessee and came back to Arkansas. SORRELIS is alleged to have threatened HEBERT and told her that if she ever said anything about the conversation she had overheard between SORRELIS and NEISON that SORRELLS would kill her. Mrs. BEVERLY HEBERT, nee Koller, 704 Clifton Court, Fort Smith, Arkansas, was located on April 26, 1968, and furnished the following information to SAs RALPH E. RAWLINGS and RICHARD S. BRANDT: She has known WILLIAM GILMORE SORRELLS all of her life. He is presently employed at Wichita, Kansas, by Litwin Corporation as a draftsman or engineer. On March 30, 1968, SORRELIS accompanied by a friend, BOB NELSON, drove from Wichita, Kansas, to Fort Smith, Arkansas, in SORRELLS' white Chevrolet Corvair. They had a great deal of car trouble en route and called her at intervals during the trip from Wichita to Fort Smith. They returned to Wichita to work on or about March 31, 1968. They returned to Fort Smith again on April 6, 1968, to spend another weekend. On this occasion she went to the airport with SORRELIS who had driven to Fort Smith in his automobile and they picked up NELSON who had flown from Wichita to Fort Smith. Mrs. HEBERT advised she knows nothing about BOB NEISON except that he is a college graduate and is also employed as an engineer or draftsman by Litwin Corporation, wichita, Kansas. She believes both SORRELLS and NELSON work at Wichita, but admitted it is possible they are sent to other cities by the company. She described NEISON as follows: White Race Male Sex 2

Mrs. HEBERT denied that she had overheard any conversation between NEISON and SORRELIS which would indicate that either of them had been in Memphis, Tennessee, on or about April 4, 1968, or to indicate they might have knowledge of the murder of Dr. KING. She denied that she had any knowledge of what type of an automobile NEISON might own and disclaimed any knowledge of a white Porsche automobile.

Mrs. HEBERT examined photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and advised he in noway resembles NEISON. Mrs. HEBERT denied that she has made any statements to anyone which would indicate that SORRELIS or NEISON had had anything to do with the murder of Dr. KING.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs JAMES B. KELLY and WALTER F. SCOTT on 4/24/68.

AT ROSALIA, KANSAS

JUANITA WYMORE, Rosalia, Kansas, was contacted at her home. She stated that her son, JOHN WYMORE, had told her that he and KENNETH WATTS had picked up a hitch-kiker on Saturday, 4/20/67, that resembled the picture of JAMES EARL RAY that was being shown on television. JOHN had not wanted to say anything to anyone else about it, but she had thought that it was important enough that she had called in to report it. The boys had mentioned that there were two hitch-hikers that possibly were traveling together and she had thought that it was possible that one of them was RAY and the other could possibly be RAY's brother that had been mentioned.

JOHN WYMORE advised that he and KENNETH WATTS were traveling north on highway 77 from El Dorado to Florence, Kansas at around 6:00 to 6:30 P. M., 4/20/68, when they observed two men standing a short distance apart. The two men appeared to be hitch-hiking north on 77. He had been driving and had stopped to pick up the man that was standing the farthestssouth: This man had asked them to pick up the second man, but he had refused to do so, and their passenger had waved at the other man as they had passed. He saw another car stopping to pick the second man up as they were driving away. He described the man that he had picked up as follows:

a little heavier, darker hair cut shorter, and wearing a dark suit. He stated that he only saw the second man from the side and rear so could give no further description. He had not seen the man well enough to give any detailed description and had only remarked to his mother that this man fit the general description of JAMES EARL RAY. He could not say that this man resembles RAY in any way other than general size and build.

KENNETH WATTS, Rosalia, Kansas, was contacted at his home. He stated that he does recall the two hitch-hikers that he and JOHN WYMORE observed on Saturday night, 4/20/68. He recalls that JOHN had stopped to pick one of the men up. This location would have been approximately 3/4 of a mile North of EldDorado, Kansas on Highway 77. He does not recall that the man they picked up gave any indication of knowing the other man, and does recall that this man did state that he was not acquainted with the other man. He recalls that another vehicle had already stopped near the second man and that the man was in the process of entering a blue automobile at the time that JOHN had stopped for the man standing farthest south. He described the man that rode with them as follows:

He stated that he had not considered that either of the hitch-hikers had resembled the picture of JAMES EARL RAY that he has seen on television uhtil JOHN WYMORE had mentioned it, and then he could only say that if either of them did so, it would have had to be the one that they did not pick up. He had only seen the second man from the side, so could give no further description.

Both boys stated that the man that they had picked up

had indicated that he was enroute to a town that was approximately ten miles beyond Florence. They could only recall the name as possibly being Oedar Falls, or some other Falls. Neither of them is familiar with any town with the name Falls in it that is near Florence. They had left the man at the intersection of highway 77 and the main street leading off into Florence, and had not seen the other man again. When they returned past the same intersection later the same night they did not see the man that they had left there.

On 4/26/68, FRANCIS TOWLE, Sheriff, Chase County, Cottonwood Falls, Kansas, advised that Cedar Point, Kansas is the only town name that he can recall, in the vicinity of Florence, Kansas, that would possibly be mistaken for Cedar Falls. He stated that he is not aware of anyone having arrived in town over the previous week-end. He stated that he would make inquiry and if he was able to locate anyone fitting the description of the hitch-hikers or anyone that had arrived on 4/20/68, he would notify the Wichita RA of the FBI.

The following investigation was conducted by SA THOMAS H. WEAVER:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI: :

On April 29, 1968, a former inmate of the Missouri State Penitentiary advised as follows:

He knew JAMES EARL RAY at the Hissouri State Penitentiary (MSF). From his conversations with RAY, he learned that RAY's maximum ambition in life was to make a "score" of about \$20 - \$30,000.00, after which he would go to Mexico to "hide out", living simply on the loot at the favorable Mexican exchange rate. RAY had spoken to him about his previous trips to Mexico, following "two or three" armed robberies, involving small scores, where he would "cool off" and live on beer, beans and milk. RAY spoke of Campache Bay, near the Yucatan Peninsuka, and he spoke of living with peasants on the outskirts of the town of Campache, Mexico. RAY also spoke of a cheap "red light district" he favored located in the town of Torreon or Torrejon (phonetic), which the former MSP inmate thought was located in north central Mexico. Cost was a factor in anything RAY did, and he apparently lived frugally and budgeted his money carefully.

RAY did not like Megroes in general, but he expressed no particular feeling toward MARTIN LUTHER KING, although he has heard RAY refer to Dr. KING as "MARTIN LUTHER COON". RAY read enthusiastically, especially the weekly news magazines available at the MSF, and he would react in an outspoken manner opposing H. RAP BROWN and STOKELY CARMICHAEL when he read of their activities, as well as in opposition to publicity Dr. KING received in certain instances.

The former MSP immate meyer heard of any bounty mentioned with regard to Dr. KING at the MSP or elsewhere. He believes he has heard RAY speculate that there might be some money available through some splinter group for the murder of BROWN or CARMICHAEL, but he never heard him speak in this regard about Dr. KING. RAY did not mention specific groups or any knowledge of any real payoff information. He recalls RAY's telling him, during the time he celled with him, that while he was on the minor construction detail at the MSP, one of the guards referred to the Megro immates working on the detail as "boy", and the Megroes went on a "sit-down" strike, and induced about two of the white immates to join their strike, and when one of the Megroes referred to RAY as "gray", he got into a fight with that lumate, although the prison officials never learned of the fight, and the former MSP inmate's knowledge of the fight was as a result of RAY's telling him, and he does not know whether or not it is true.

RAY was a hypochondriac in that he took six or seven different kinds of pills daily, imagining that he had a "cranial depression" and a "rapid palpitation of the heart". He would use former inmate's watch with a second hand and time his pulse. He was able to obtain "pills" from going on sick call as well as through inmate sources in the MSP. The former inmate had some pills he had obtained for treatment of his arthritis, from which he obtained no relief, and RAY took these pills, thinking that he might some day have arthritis, and the pills might ward off future effects of that affliction. He believes RAY was selling amphetamine all the time he was in the MSP, but former inmate does not know his source.

RAY mentioned a traffic for the sale of small appliances in Mexico, due to the tariff Mexicans had to pay for such items they purchased legally, and he spoke of having smuggled such items into Mexico. He said he was acquainted with a man who operated a small scale smuggling business, who lived near the town of Campeche, Mexico. RAY mentioned this man so often that former immate recalls his name: either MATEO LOPEZ GARCIA or MATEO GARCIA LOPEZ, who apparently had lived for some time in the United States, and who spoke English. He believes this is the man RAY referred

to as the owner of a small fishing boat, and he would sauggle things from Brownsville, Texas, into Mexico through Campeche Bay. He believes RAY made trips on this boat with the man, and apparently Mexican Nationals are not checked upon entering Mexico through Campeche Bay in fishing boats. He does not believe RAY could speak Spanish, other than for basic words for basic needs. He heard RAY mention a brother in St. Louis, Missouri, and he believes some of RAY's trips to Mexico were with either the brother or with someone he had participated in armed robberies with, name not given. RAY indicated he had invested a little money in TV sets and washing machines which were transported to Mexico by his friend with the fishing boat. RAY said he had been to Mexico City "a couple of times", and he apparently liked Mexico City, but said it was a "towrist trap", and he could not afford to stay there.

RAY's only reference to working had to do with past bartending jobs. He believes RAY said he had tended bar somewhere in Peoria, Illinois, and at some other town in southern Illinois, exact location not known. He never mentioned Oregon or Canada, that former immate recalls.

BAY never mentioned to him his plans for escape or specific plans to hide out any particular place, but his conversation indicated he wanted to "make the one big score" and retire in Mexico. He mentioned that he and another man, name not mentioned, drove to Mexico, apparently Campache, one time, in an old model Chevrolet, specific routes not mentioned. He does not know how RAY made his other trips to Mexico he claimed to have made. He said that he had lived in a rented three-room shack on the outskirts of Campache, within walking distance of the town, and from his conversation, former immate gathered that this was during the late 1950's. RAY said he had been in Arizona before, but he did not mention any of the Mexican-United States Border towns, other than Brownsville, Texas.

He recalls RAY mentioned having watched a "fire dance" done by small Negro boys at a hotel in Acapulco, Mexico. He indicated he had not stayed at the hotel where the performance was, since it was too expensive, but stayed at an unnamed cheaper hotel, and he indicated that live coals
