He said that from the name and number a check could be made xxax for the actual license which contains the name, address and descriptive data. He indicated it would be impossible to program the computer to make a general search for the complete drivers license without first securing the licensee's name and number from the "control" tapes which are made as a temporary record and have been destroyed for applicant's who applied prior to April 8, 1968.

Mr. BILLINGS suggested that Identification Orders of JAMES EARL RAY be furnished to his office for distribution to the 32 drivers license examiners throughout Kansas.

Mr. BILLINGS advised that tapes are prepared which include all new k and renewal drivers licenses which contain complete name, address, and description of licensee. The tapes are forwarded to the U. S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Safety Bureau, Washington, D. C., for a check National against records of the Nakian Drivers Register. He said this check is to locate applicants who are suspended or revoked in another state, and if the tapes aren't immediately destroyed after checking, the possibility exists that a more rapid and detailed check could be made at that agency.

BILLINGS inmate, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners. Springfield, Missouri, was first interviewed at the Medical Center regarding captioned matter on 4/26/68. It is apparent from this interview and subsequent interviews that he is primarily concerned about getting a Federal detainer lodged against him from Montgomery, Alabama, lifted. He has stated that he could furnish information that would assist in identifying the subject of this case if this detainer were lifted. It is doubtful in the mind of the interviewing agent that he has this information in his possession. In his intervlew of 5/20/68, BILLINGS indicated that the name ENIS HEAD was tetally unknown to him. He denied that he stayed on a permanent basis at Carmerdelle's Canal Bank Inn continuously from May to December, 1965. He reported that when he stayed at this place initially in Apartment 6, it was already occupied by two men who were working off shore and that these men had rented this apartment from the owner. He stated that he and BEN BLACKWELL moved into the apartment when the occupants went to work off shore and would not be needing the apartment.

10-760-966 Mm / Mm He feels certain that in Mine, 1965, BLACKWELL paid the rent to the owner. He indicated that he left about June, 1965, and returned to Columbia. South Carolina, where he lived with a woman named JUNE TAYLOR. He stated he stayed in Columbia for about a month and then returned to New Orleans, but rather than staying at the Canal Bank Inn, he stayed at an unrecalled motel on Chef-Menteur Highway under his true name. He indicated he remained here for a month or a month and a half, during which time he just gambled at various establishments in Slidell, Louisiana, which is about 20 miles from New Orleans. visit BLACKWELL at the Canal Bank Inn during this time and BLACKWELL had another roommate, name unrecalled. He stated after he left New Orleans, he was in Dallas and Irving, Texas, and that he was here on two occasions; however, he cannot recall just exactly when this was. He stated he believes one of the times was in 1966, when he stayed at 1627 Cooper Street, in Irving, Texas, and had a job with a firm known as Shedd Bardish Foods, Inc.

Still in 1965, exact dates unrecalled, he traveled to Las Vegas, Nevada, where he stayed at the Horseshoe Club under the names of ROBERT JAMES, Dallas, Texas. He stated that while here he sent a telegram to his wife in Pennsylvania, and she joined him in Las Vegas. He stated they then traveled to Artesia, New Mexico. He believes he arrived in Artesia sometime in July, 1965, at which time he opened a fruit stand, which he called Robert's Produce, located in the 4900 block of Main Street. He stated he and his wife lived right behind the fruit stand. In August, 1965, he took his wife as far as Wilmington, Delaware, and called his brother and told him to come and return her to her home.

He then went to Hartford, Connecticut, and got a job at Williams Ford, where he took care of the used car lot. At this place of business he used the name JAMES ROBERTS and he stayed about two weeks. He stated that at the end of the second week he stole about \$1,500 from this company from a night deposit and left. He stated he does not recall the name of the place where he stayed in Hartford, Connecticut, but it was a room in some rooming house. He then traveled to Buffalo, New York, where he stayed at an unrecalled hotel under the name LAURENT RIQUIER. He stated this was in the latter

part of 1965, and the only reason he went to Buffalo was so that he could travel to nearby Batavia, New York, to bet on the horses. He stayed about two weeks and then returned to New Orleans, where he continued his gambling activities in various clubs in Slidell and Covington, Louisiana. He stayed in a motel in New Orleans called "Monte Leon" under the name LAURENT RIQUIER. He stated that this was toward the end of 1965, and that BLACKWELL was still staying at the Canal Bank Inn. He stated he wanted to emphasize that the owner of the Canal Bank Inn is incorrect when he says that he stayed at the inn from May to December, 1965, on a continuous basis. He stated this is not so and that he was quite transient during most of this period.

BILLINGS stated he believes he can be of assistance in this investigation, however, he would have to have an assurance of a Federal detainer lodged against him at the Medical Center being dismissed. He was informed that no such promise could be made to him.

Again, for information of receiving offices, it is documented that BILLINGS has been and still is of questionable mental competency.

For information of Louisville and Omaha Divisions, which did not receive referenced teletype, the St. Louis Division awised as follows on 5/20/68:

IVAN DALE UNDERWOOD, former immate, Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on 5/20/68 advised he was not acquainted with JAMES KARL RAY while IMDERWOOD was incarcerated at the Missouri State Penitentiary. On basis of name and photograph, UNDERWOOD believes RAY is identical with an individual who worked with RALPH RESPRO for a short period during the late 1950's at Joplin, Missouri. REMPRO carried on a furnace and heating business and would "finger" residence and business establishments in Joplin area. On pretext of free inspection of premises, RENFRO would gain entrance to case establishment for possible robbery or burglary, or if the comer was guilible, he would attempt to sell a new heating unit. As of 18 months ago, RENFRO was working at an independent oil company service station on 20th Street in Joylin, Missouri, and hung out at Elmer's Bar, Main Street, also at Joplin.

In an effort to locate and interview RALPH REMYRO to determine if he had in the past employed JAMES RABL RAY or had any knowledge as to his wheregbouts, the following investigation was conducted by SAM JOSEPH W. JACKSON and LAWRENCE R. NOLAN:

AT JOPLIN MIRBOURI

On 5/21/68 a review of Polk's City Directory for Joplin, Bissouri, 1956-1967 editions, failed to reveal may information regarding RALPH REMPRO.

On 5/21/68 a review of the current combined telephone directory for Joplia, Carl Junction, Carterville, and Webb City, Missouri, area failed to reveal a telephone listed to RALPH RESPRO.

Om 5/21/68 INEME CLARK, Clerk, Records and Identification Buream, Police Department; CLEMMIS EUGENE COMMLAND, Chief Deputy Sheriff, and RACHEL BRAXTON, Credit Buream, all advised records of their respective offices contained no reference to HALPH REMERO and that they had never known anyone by that name as a resident of Jeplin, Hissouri.

On 5/21/68 the following individuals all stated they did not know RALPH REMPRO as either a present or former resident of Joplin, Missouri:

EARL FORTHER, Records and Identification Officer, Police Department;

WALTER H. FLENNER, Captain of Detectives, Police Department; MAROLD ARBEN, Detective, Police Department; W. T. NAYLOR, Dispatcher, Police Department; OLEN J. DANIELS, Detective, Police Department; JOHN EUBANKS, Lieutemant, Police Department.

On 5/21/68 JAMES H. RENTTRO, Branch Manager, Lairmore's Armored Car Service, advised while he did not know BALPH RENTRO it seemed to him RALPH RENTRO about two years ago had briefly been employed at the Communers Service Station, Inc., 2002 Main Street, Joplin. RENTRO stated while he had mover met RALPH RENTRO, that he, JAMES H. RENTTRO, recalled having been asked by his prother-in-law, HAL W. STEPHENS, Manager, Consumers Service Station, Inc., if he was any kin to RALPH RENTRO, an attended at the station, and that he, JAMES H. RENTRO, had replied that he had never heard of and was no kin to anyone named RALPH RENTRO. In this regard, RENTTRO said he had never met RALPH RENTRO and had no idea as to his present location.

On 5/21/68 Patrolman WILLIAM R. STEPHENS, Police Department, advised an individual named RENFRO had briefly worked for HAL N. STEPHENS, his father, at the Consumers Service Station, Inc., 2002 Hain; however, Patrolman STEPHENS related he had never met RENFRO and had no information as to the latter named individuals whereabouts. He also advised he was of the opinion HAL N. STEPHENS had discharged RENFRO nearly two years ago, possibly for drinking on the job.

On 5/22/68 HAL N. STEPHENS, Manager, Consumers Service Station, Inc., advised he had hired a drifter named RALPH REMFRO to work as an attendant on 4/2/66, and had fired REMFRO for drinking on the job on 6/22/66. REMFRO was not reliable, drank heavily, always drew against his earnings, and has not been seen by STEPHENS since he was

fired. STEPHENS did recall that at Christmas, 1966.
RENTRO had mailed a Christmas card to the service station employees from some western state, possibly Washington; however, STEPHENS said he had theorem the Christmas card many and actually had not paid any attention to the postmark, but had only pated it was some western state.

STRPERED maid he did not knew whether REEPRO me married or single, that he had mover seen REEPRO in because with any person away from his place of employment, and did not have the slightest idea in what city REEPRO might be living at this time. He could only state that REEPRO had loft Joplin nearly two years ago and that REEPRO's present whereabouts are unbecome to him.

On 5/22/65 it was determined telephone number MA 4-9879, furnished by RENFRO to MAL N. STEPHENS, was listed to ESSA JEAN WHIPPLE, ake Mrs. Floyd Whipple, 2124 Adele, Jeplin, Missouri.

On 5/22/62 the house at 2124 Adele was found to be vacant.

AN 3/2/88 JOHN HOSWILL, 2126 Adele, advised EMMA JEAN UNIPPLE, and firm. Fleyd Whipple, had moved from her been at 2124 Adele to Ames, lown, about a year ago, and that he was unable to furnish her residence or employment address at that city. He stated he did not know RALPH RESPRO as a fermor resident at 2124 Adele, but presumed he had been a recemp at that address prior to the departure of Mrs. WHIPPLE from Joplin.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROWEN B. AYERS on May 17, 1968:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI

Mr. HAROLD SWENSON, Warden, Missouri State Penitentiary, advised that in Food Services, RAY received \$2.00 per month official pay. He said in industries the pay might run as high as \$12.00.

Mr. M. J. STEWART, Treasurer, said the ledger sheets of RAY'S account reflected all items received and disbursed by him together with the sources of each. The first column "cash credit" indicates the amount received from the state. He said there was nothing unusual about RAY'S account. He said checks can be drawn up to \$20.00 for the commissary. Any amounts sent out over \$20.00 require approval by the warden. The check is usually sent with a letter stating the purpose of the payment outgoing, he said.

JAMES WALLACE, previously interviewed, was upset about being recontacted. He said he should have not furnished any information in the first place as he did not want to get involved. He said, after calming down, that he was raised in South St. Louis and OWENS used to "hang around" that area a great deal and he met him there and associated with OWENS until he went to Illinois to prison. He said there was not any doubt in his mind about having seen OWENS and RAY together in St. Louis at the bank, and it would have had to be in the summer of 1967. He said his wife was with him. She is BETTY WALLACE, 1031 Lynch, St. Louis, Missouri. He now recalled that they parked the car in the parking lot and both walked into the bank so she should have seen OWENS and RAY. He said they maintained a joint checking account in the bank and his wife had a savings account in the bank (Jefferson-Gravois). He could not fix the date.

The records of the Identification Division, searched by HARRY LAUF, reflected a CHARLES MARTIN WALLER, #68389, served a sentence of 50 years. No WALTERS was found with this sort of sentence.

J. RAYMOND BILLS, Board of Pardons and Paroles, stated that WALLER was paroled on June 13, 1967, and resides at 204 East Lindenwood Boulevard, Kansas City, Missouri. His parole officer is WILLIAM LEWIS, Kansas City, Missouri.

RONALD WESTBERG, Missouri State Penitentiary, #71859, said he knew RAY well. He said he was working in Food Services in the vegetable room when RAY escaped and he knew all about it. He said another inmate was going to escape in the bread box, but he and RAY decided, since RAY had more time, that RAY would go. He said the other inmate gave RAY some money and some clothing he had acquired to make the escape, and RAY went with the cooperation of the other inmate covering him and "for him". WEST-BERG said under no circumstances would he divulge the identity of this other inmate since he is a good friend of his and still in the prison. He said there was no conspiracy and no mention had ever been made of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and he doubts that RAY had anything to do with that murder. He said it was a case of law enforcement attempting to get a "scapegoat".

ED WEATHERS, Missouri State Penitentiary #76239, assigned to the hospital, said he was out of the penitentiary from June of 1966 to August of 1967 when he was returned for parole violation. He said he knew RAY to talk to him, but knew nothing of his escape and could furnish no information concerning his whereabouts. He said he has heard of a lot of cliques in the penitentiary that make bets, handle emphatimines, etc., but he knew of no organization called Cooley or similar and had never heard of any bounty on Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Warden HAROLD SWENSON, Missouri State Penitentiary, advised he could locate no record of FRANK BICKLEY, in or out of the penitentiary,

Sgt. DORSEY ARNOLD, Missouri State Highway Patrol, Jefferson City, Missouri, advised no record for FRANK BICKLEY could be located.

On May 18, 1968, Assistant Warden JESS ELLIOTT, Missouri State Penitentiary, and JAMES R. DOYLE, Identification, advised they could locate no FRANK BRICKLEY as ever having been in the Missouri State Penitentiary.
