Ray Alleges 'Federal Agents' Killed Dr. Martin Luther King

St. Louis (AP)—A television station quoted James Earl Ray yester-day as saying federal agents killed Dr. Martin Luther King, jr., and "used me to be the fall guy."

Station KMOX-TV said this was part of a statement dictated by Ray to his brother, Jerry Ray, in the Tennessee State prison in Nashville. Jerry Ray read the statement on camera to Barry Serafin, a KMOX-TV reporter who accompanied Jerry to Nashville Wednesday.

James Earl Ray, an escapee from the Missouri State prison, pleaded guilty to killing King and was sentenced to 99 years. His attempts to obtain a new trial so far have been unsuccessful.

The statement was written in long hand by Jerry Ray, who signed his brother's name, Serafin said.

The statement said James Earl Ray was working with federal_agents—not otherwise identified by name or organi-

zation-during the spring of

"They told me I was helping them to supply arms and guns to Cuba refugees to overthrow Castro and the Communists in Cuba," the statement continued. "The reason why I've

made trips to Mexico was in regard to helping the agents of the federal government to supply arms to Cuban refugees there to overthrow Castro. The federal agents led me to believe that I was in Memphis in April for the same purpose."

At another point that statement said: "I knew nothing about King being in Memphis until after King had been killed. I could not argue with the federal agents I worked for because they would have put me back in the Missouri State prison at Jefferson City if I failed to take orders from them. I know that the federal agents merely used me to be the fall guy when they killed King."

The statement said Ray hopes some high government official "will expose the whole deal" so he will be freed.

"If they don't, we have more information which we will release in the near future. I don't know what motives the federal agents had for killing King. Ask former Attorney General Ramsey Clark. Maybe he knows."



Judge Orders More Exercise and a Job For James Earl Ray

Nashville, Tenn. (AP)—A it is only to protect him from ederal judge ordered Tennes-bodily harm." federal judge ordered Tennessee state prison officials yesterday to provide more exercise and a job to James Earl Ray, who says he prefers the threat of death at the hands of fellow inmates to remaining in solitary confinement.

Judge William E. Miller's order could result in Ray's becoming a part-time food server and janitor in the prison's maximum security section. Ray is the admitted killer of Dr. Martin Luther King, jr.

Orders Plan by State

Miller ordered the state to submit by January 12 a plan "recreation, incorporating work and exercise" for Ray, who had sought an injunction against continued maximum security confinement. He contended it was impairing his health and violating his rights.

The state said Ray, who was sentenced to 99 years in King's slaying, was being kept in the 6-by-9-foot cell here for his own protection.

"Enforced idleness can be cruel punishment," Judge Miller said in handing down his order, "particularly when

Miller described as constructive a suggestion by W. S. Neil, warden, that Ray be allowed to help serve food to other maximum security prisoners while they were locked up, and help janitors with cleanup. The judge reserved final judgment, however, until, he received the written plan.

Expresses a Wish

Ray was asked at the daylong hearing whether he feared harm from other inmates, and replied, "I'd rather face that then 99 years in solitary."

Miller said at the outset he would decide only if the confinement violates Ray's rights under the eighth amendment which prohibits cruel and unusual punishment.

On 2/20/70, BILL GORDON STEINHOFF was interviewed at KSP, Lansing, Kaneas, upon his request. During the course of the interview, STEINHOFF was vague as to why he wanted to talk to an FBI Agent, referring to a previous interview with an FBI Agent, (FNU) JOHNSON. STEINHOFF advised he had talked to JOHNSON in Wichita, Kansas, during 11/68. SA HICKMAN asked STEINHOFF the nature of the interview at which time he stated that the interview was relative to facts concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. STEINHOFF was reluctant to furnish any information concerning his prior interview, and in view of this, no further attempt was made to extract information from STEINHOFF.

On 7/31/70, GEORGE BEN EDMOXDSON, a former Top Ten Fugitive, who is presently residing and working in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, under the assumed name of ALEX BORMANN, personally appeared at the Pittsburgh Office at which time he furnished the following information:

EDMONDSON advised that he is presently residing with his wife JINETTE and his young son at Brighton Terrace, Apartment 403, 721 Brighton Road, Pittsburgh, Pa. 15233, after having recently moved to Pittsburgh from Montreal, Canada, where he had been living and working since his release from the Missouri State Prison (MSP), Jefferson City, Missouri, on \$5,000 bond pending an appeal with the Missouri Supreme Court on his armed robbery sentence. EDMONDSON stated that since his release from MSP he has been living and working under the assumed name of ALEX BORMANN. He stated he is employed as a project engineer by Rust Associates, Ltd., Montreal Canada, a Division of Litton Industries and was recently transferred to Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh, Pa., for a new work assignment. EDMONDSON stated that officials of Rust Associates, Ltd., and Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh are cognizant of his present status and his background as a former Top Ten Fugitive.

EDMONDSON advised that his purpose in contacting FBI, Pittsburgh at this time was because he was greatly disturbed over some recent developments that have come to his attention which could result in his identity being exposed, thereby jeopamizing his employment and all that he has accomplished since his release from prison.

EDMONDSON stated that he recently learned that a book entitled, "I Slew a Dreamer," written by WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE, published by Delacorte Press, New York City, is being sold throughout the United States and Canada. He stated that this book is a story about JAMES EARL RAY and the events leading up to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that upon reading this book, he determined that his name and some of his aliases, including ALEX BORMANN, are frequently mentioned in several chapters of the book with regard to the author's suspicions that he, EDMONDSON may have been involved with and influenced JAMES EARL RAY in the plot to murder KING, while both he and JAMES EARL RAY were serving prison sentences together in the MSP.

EDMONDSON stated he is fearful that notoriety of this book will lead to his subsequent exposure by some news media tracing him to Pittsburgh. He stated he has already received one anonymous telephone call at his place of employment wherein the caller suggested he go to a bookstore and read, "I Slew a Dreamer" which he would find very interesting.

EDMONDSON stated that he immediately notified his attorney, JAMES A. DUNN, Carthage, Missouri, of the contents of the book and mailed him a copy to read. He stated that he has also brought this book to the attention of his superiors at Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh. He stated that if he should be exposed he will consider filing a damage suit for slander against the author and publisher of the book. He stated that insofar as the author's suspicions, that he was involved with JAMES EARL RAY in the murder of KING are concerned, they are not true and FBI records would substantiate him on this as he was extensively interviewed along these lines by the FBI after his apprehension as a Top Ten Fugitive.

EDMONDSON stated that he was merely bringing the above mentioned developments to the attention of the FBI for informational purposes. He stated he is awaiting instructions from his attorney as to what action he should take with regard to his problems.

James Earl Ray In Civil Appeal

Memphis (AP)—An attorney for James Earl Ray, self-confessed slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King jr., says a ruling in a civil suit on Ray's behalf probably will be appealed to the U. S. Supreme court.

The comments of Richard J. Ryan came after the U. S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals dismissed Ray's attempt to void contracts between himself and Percy Foreman of Houston and Arthur Haynes, sr. of Birming, lam, lawyers and William Bradford Huie, a writer.

Ray contended in his suit that the three men duped him into signing a contract and that they were more interested in getting him to enter a guilty plea to King's death in 1968 than they were in seeing that he had an adequate defense.

Ray had charged that an open trial would have diminished royalties to Huie and the two lawyers from writings about the slaying, since facts would have been placed on open record. The guilty plea did not require a full-scale trial.
