Circumstances of Instant Offense INMATE'S VERSION: (The following is a statement which subject wrote while he was working in the Classification Department.) He states that he did not commit the instant offense. He could have accepted a one year workhouse sentence for a plea of guilty, but preferred to stand trial. He states that this crime was alleged to have been committed in the year of 1929, and that due to the fact he was incarcerated in the State Prison of Illinois from 1930 to 1941, he could not stand trial in the case sooner. The case was appealed to the Supreme Fourt and the decision of the lower court was affirmed.

Subject was discharged on parole December 22, 1950, his parole was revoked and returned to prison February 20, 1952 to complete the remainder of his sentence.

Subject states that on March 16, 1951, he was arrested on suspicion at a friend's house in St. Louis County. He claims he does not know why he was arrested. On Movember 18, 1951, he was tried on the habitual criminal act and again on February 1, 1952. On February 18, 1952 he was tried for robbery, and the jury rendered a verdict of not guilty on each charge. Subject states the parole revocation was a mystery to him.

He claims his friends at Missouri University (Mr. and Mrs. Lou Tritschler) will help him find a job and home. Mr. Tritschler is allegedly a veterinarian, and was supposedly subject's supervisor at Church Farm at one time. Nolan said he is not particular about what kind of work he would do.

SUMMARY

This 65 year old white man from St. Louis claims to have been on the streets less than one year since 1929. He has served 7 more years since his last parole. He has made a fair adjustment, institutionally. On that basis there would be no
