At 11:12 A.M., 4/22/68, SAC WESLEY T. WHALEY, Houston, telephonically furnished the following information.

WHALEY stated unidentified senior ticket agent at Houston Airport reported to Houston Office lookalike he had seen at Houston Airport about noon Sunday, 4/21/68. Ticket agent states he recalled this individual after seeing a notice on FBI television show.

According to WHALEY, individual is described as 6'1", brown hair, neatly trimmed goatee, light colored cowboy straw hat, beige levi type jacket, black horn rimmed sun glasses.

Senior ticket agent stated it is possible this individual boarded National Airlines Flight 47 out of Houston, which was scheduled to arrive in Los Angeles on Sunday afternoon, 4/21/68. He stated the following stewardesses were working this flight:

(FNU) LEVINE
(FNU) CARBONE
(FNU) HARRINGTON
(FNU) MC CLAIN

According to the senior ticket agent, these stewardesses are currently at the Huntley House Hotel, not further identified or address furnished, and are scheduled to leave Los Angeles at 2:00 P.M. Los Angeles time today, 4/22/68, en route to Miami, Florida, on National Airlines Flight 48.

WHALEY requested that the above stewardesses be interviewed to determine if they recognize the above individual and whether, in fact, he was identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

WHALEY stated that an airtel of confirmation would follow.

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

For information, GEORGE DURYEA, Director, Locksmithing Institute, 1500 Cardinal Drive, Little Falls, N.J., made available the aforementioned items to SA DON G. OWENS and SA JAMES R. LAUGHLIN, on 4/19/68, and requested his identity be protected.

For information, the examination certificates mentioned in Paragraphs #3 and #4 above were sent to the Locksmithing Institute by GALT along with his completed lesson. The grade for the lessons was printed on the examination certificates by Locksmithing and mailed back to GALT. When the letters were determined to be undeliverable they were returned by the Post Office to Locksmithing Institute.

The examination certificates should, therefore, have been handled by GALT.

It was also determined that a payment of \$5.25 was received 2/29/68. At that time, GALT ordered a special Padlock Handbook which is not furnished to students during regular course but must be purchased separately.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [redacted] his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH E. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

For further information re JAMES EARL RAY, all offices are directed to press release furnished them by the Bureau on 4/19/68.

 these individuals prior to April 27, 1967.
