

Dear Mr. Calt:

Our accounting office has now called our attention to your letter about the social security program. We regret the delay in replying.

Anchosed are some informational pamphlets including a legislative history of the program, which you might find helpful.

The provisions of the Social Security Act of 1935 went into effect on January 1, 1937, and the coverage of self-employed people (1950 Act) was effective January 1, 1951. There were no limitations on the number of employees an employer could hire without paying social accority contributions. Each employer was required to report carnings and pay contributions for each employee whose carnings were covered by the Social Security Act.

You may be interested to know that your social security district office is well stocked with material concerning the program. They can provide you with publications that are available for general distribution and will allow you to examine and copy many publications that are not available for general distribution.



Referenced communication reflected that General Delivery, Atlanta, Georgia was a large manila envelope addressed to ERIC GALT, 9533 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California which address had been crossed out and in turn had been forwarded to General Delivery, Atlanta, Georgia. There was no postmark on the envelope but the reverse side was stamped 4/13/65, Hollywood. The envelope appeared to comtain a regular size sheet of paper and a booklet with return address of HEW, Social Security Administration, Baltimore, Maryland.

The files of BA CS-4 were checked and they revealed that a letter postmarked 2/29/68, Los Angeles, California had been mailed to Social Security Administration, Baltimore, Maryland, with return address of RRIC GALT, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California 90028. The letter itself is dated 2/29/68, is typewritten except for the written signature ERIC GALT and is as follows:

DAVID McDONALD, Supervisor, National Airlines Ticket Office, Hobby Airport, Houston, Texas, furnished following additional information today:

Last evening while watching the FBI Story on television he observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was immediately reminded of a passenger whom he checked through on either National Airlines Flight 23 or National Airlines Flight 47 at approximately noon, 4/21/68. He described the person as about 6'1", with brown hair and a neatly trimmed goatee approximately 1" long covering the bottom lip and chin area only. He was wearing a light colored cowboy type straw hat, a beige Levi type jacket, and black horn rim sun glasses. He, while being checked by McDONALD, removed his sun glasses and stared intently at McDONALD. McDONALD stated the general configuration and look of this man's eyes appeared to be practically identical with the eyes in the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY. He said the passenger's nose and general shape of his face and mouth also resemble the photograph of RAY. The passenger checked through with no luggage and was carrying a small two-handle type flight bag. He said he was unable to determine whether or not the passenger was identical with RAY but that he felt there was a good possibility that they might be identical.

National Airlines Flight 23 departed Houston at the above described time en route for Las Vegas with final destination San Francisco. National Airlines Flight 47 departed Houston at the above described time en route nonstop to Los Angeles.

AT APPROXIMATELY THREE THIRTY AM ON APRIL NINETEENTH. NINETY SIXTY EIGHT. HE AND TWO OTHERS, GARY S. GOODMAN, CALDWELL, NEW JERSEY, AND LENNIE (LNU), A FRIEND OF GOODMAN'S FROM UPSTATE NY, WERE SLEEPING IN WAITING ROOM AT PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT AWAITING SEVEN THIRTY PM TWA FLIGHT TO NY. A TWA CLERK WAS ONLY OTHER PERSON PRESENT IN WAITING ROOM. WEISZ WAS AWAKENED BY AN UNKNOWN MALE WHO ASKED IF HE COULD BUY A SHIRT. WEISZ SOLD HIM FOR ONE DOLLAR A TAN AND GREEN BLAID BUTTON DOWN, LONG SLEEVE SPORT SHIRT, SIZE MEDIUM, BRAND J. C. PENNEY COMPANY. UNKNOWN MALE PAID FROM A LARGE ROLL OF BILLS AND WHILE PAYING DROPPED THREE WRAPPED ROLLS OF COINS ON THE FLOOR. UNKNOWN MALE CHANGED FROM WHITE DRESS SHIRT HE WAS WEARING IN WAITING ROOM AND PLACED THE WHITE SHIRT IN A LOCKER THERE. ABOUT TWENTY MINUTES LATER, HE WENT OUTSIDE AND A CAB DRIVER ENTERED WHO ASKED TWA CLERK TIME THE NEXT FLIGHT LEAVES. HE WAS TOLD FIVE TEN AM AND LEFT. UNKNOWN MALE THEN RETURNED AND ASKED CLERK SAME QUESTION AND RECEIVED SAME ANSWER. UNKNOWN NALE ASKED THE CLERK IF HE COULD LEAVE COLUMBUS ANY OTHER WAY BECAUSE HE SAID HE HAD TO LEAVE IMMEDIATELY. HE WAS TOLD TO TRY A BUS OR TRAIN. AND PROCEEDED TO TELEPHONICALLY CONTACT THE GREYHOUND BUS COMPANY AND A NUMBER OF RAILROADS. HE WAS OVERHEARD BY WEISZ TO SAY THE ONLY TRANSPORTATION soon enough for him was a four thirty am greyhound bus to los angeles OR SAN FRANCISCO. THE UNKNOWN MALE HAD A CONVERSATION WITH THE THREE

BOYS WHO WERE CURIOUS AS TO WHY HE HAD NO LUGGAGE. IN RESPONSE TO THEIR QUESTIONS HE TOLD AT TIMES THREE DIFFERENT STORIES; HE HAD NO LUGGAGE, HE LOST IT, AND IT WAS ROUTED TO ANOTHER AIRPORT. HE ALSO TOLD THEM HE HAD AN UNUSED AIRLINE TICKET TO REDEEM BUT DID NOT HAVE TIME TO DO SO. TWA CLERK SAID HE HAD NO TICKET. UNKNOWN MALE THEN CALLED A CAB AND LEFT ALLEGEDLY FOR GREYHOUND BUS TERMINAL.

ABOUT FOUR THIRTY AM, TWO YELLOW CAB COMPANY DRIVERS ENTERED WAITING ROOM AND THREE BOYS OVERHEARD CONVERSATION REGARDING UNKNOWN MALE THAT ONE DRIVER HAD DRIVEN FROM AIRPORT. DRIVER SAID HE WAS SUSPICIOUS OF THIS PERSON WHO SAID HE WAS FROM ST. LOUIS AND WHOM HE HAD DRIVEN TO A PRIVATE RESIDENCE IN THE AREA. DRIVER SAID HE WAS PAID WITH A ROLL OF DIMES WHICH HAD CINCINNATE ON THE WRAPPER. DRIVER SAID HE WAITED OUTSIDE RESIDENCE TO SEE IF SOMEONE WOULD LET THE UNKNOWN MALE ENTER AT THAT EARLY HOUR, AND WAS TOLD BY THE UNKNOWN MALE NOT TO WAIT BUT TO LEAVE. THE DRIVER DID NOT OBSERVE THE UNKNOWN MALE RING A BELL OR ATTEMPT TO ENTER THIS HOUSE. CAB DRIVER ALSO STATED THIS PERSON RESEMBLED PHOTOGRAPH OF JAMES EARL RAY THAT HE HAD SEEN IN THE NEWSPAPER.

WEISZ ESTIMATED HE OBSERVED AND TALKED TO UNKNOWN MALE FOR ABOUT AN HOUR AND AFTER OVERHEARING CAB DRIVER'S CONVERSATION, THE THREE BOYS, TWO CAB DRIVERS AND TWA CLERK DISCUSSED UNKNOWN MALE AND AFTER VIEWING PHOTOGRAPH OF JAMES EARL RAY IN NEWSPAPER, DECIDED THE UNKNOWN MALE CLOSELY RESEMBLED RAY.

SOMETIME AFTER FIVE AM, THEY DECIDED TO CONTACT THE FBI WITH THIS INFORMATION. GOODMAN TELEPHONICALLY RELATED THE ABOVE CIRCUMSTANCES TO THE CINCINNATI OFFICE. HE WAS INFORMED SOMEONE WOULD BE OUT TO OBTAIN THE DETAILS FROM HIM, BUT HE EXPLAINED THAT THEY HAD RESERVATIONS TO LEAVE FOR NY AT SEVEN THIRTY AM AND COULD NOT WAIT AT THE AIRPORT. GOODMAN ALSO RETRIEVED THE UNKNOWN MALE'S WHITE SHIRT FROM THE LOCKER WHICH HE HAS IN HIS POSSESSION NOW IN NEW JERSEY.

WEISZ DESCRIBED THE UNKNOWN MALE AS WHITE, MALE, ABOUT FORTY FIVE YEARS OLD, FIVE FEET TEN INCHES, ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY POUNDS, MEDIUM-HEAVY BUILD, STRAIGHT, MEDIUM LENGTH, LIGHT BROWN HAIR, THIN LIGHT MUSTACHE, TAN COMPLEXION, NO GLASSES, NO NOTICEABLE ACCENT BUT NOT FROM EASTERN OR NORTH EASTERN US. NO NOTICEABLE SCARS, MARKS OR TATTOOS. DRESS DIRTY WHITE SHIRT, CHINO TROUSSERS, BLACK SHOES, NO JACKET, NO HAT.

Complaint agent RUSSELL ANDERSON at approximately \$:30 PM on above date received a call from Lt. STEVENSON, LAPD Intelligence who advised that a "source" which he could not devulge, had furnished him info that at 7:39 PM tonight, an individual who identified himself as ERIC STARO GALT, placed at long distance telephone call from Los Angeles area code 213, telephone number 696-8632, to telephone number 205 (area code for state of Alabama)881-9863 at the Ember Club for a Mr. EARL CAMPBELL. The Lt. stated he could provide nothing further.

Writer thereafter contacted General Telephone Company Special Agent JOHN GURZAK (protect) and requested listing info for this 213 area code number, supposedly in the Whittier area.

GURZAK called back advising that number listed to ficker Motors Used Car Lot, at either 502 West Washingesawississ WhittierBlvd., or 12540 East Whittier Blvd., Whittier.

Per instruction Supervisor NOLAN, writer shorily thereafter recontacted GURZAK in effort to obtain toll info regarding call. GURZAK called back advising toll record located at Pacific Telephone Company toll station in Whittier and that he had requested that the chief operator at this station give writer the desired info.

Writer was thereafter called by the whole chief operator at above station who advised as follows re this call:

Call was placed as advised above, at 7:39 PM, 4/18/68, from Whittier tel number indicated above, by man identifying self as GALT. Wanted talk collect to EARR CAMPBELL at Ember Club in Alabama, town not mentioned tel # 205-881-9863. CAMPBELL was described as an attorney at law. Ember Club was contacted by long distance operator who was advised that CAMPBELL was not at the club at present and is was not known when he would be returning. GALT thereafter cancalled the call.

At 12:04 PM, 4/23/68, Deputy Chief ROBERT HOUGHTON, Detective Bureau, Los Angeles Police Department, telephonically contacted the office and spoke with the writer concerning captioned matter.

HOUGHTON stated he was officially offering the assistance of the Los Angeles Police Department in handling the above investigation and this would include Los Angeles Police personnel, Los Angeles Police facilities, which would include contact with informants and sources known to the Los Angeles Police Department. HOUGHTON in passing remarked that as far as he knew, the Los Angeles Police Department had not been requested to conduct any investigation by the FBI, and that his department only had that information which appeared in the press concerning the case.

HOUGHTON was advised that his offer would be referred to the SAC, and he was thanked for his consideration and offer of cooperation.





This defendant on April 1, 1955 entered a plea of guilty to an information in one count which charges that he on or about March 21, 1955 at Ransas City, Missouri knowingly, wilfully, unlawfully, and feloniously forged a material endorsement on a J. S. Post Office Department Honey order No. 7-12,237,597. On this seme date a companion, Valter Terry Rife, entered a ples of guilty in Docimis No. 19119 to an information in one count charging him with the lorgery on Narry 21, 1755 of rostal money order to. 7-h2,239,500. Imposition of sentence as to defendant and his companion was deferred and this presentence investigation was ordered.

The facts of the case are as follows: In March 7, 1955 the U. J. . ost office st col erviles, illinois was burglarized and sixty-six blank W. S. Postal Kont Crders, Serial Wos. 7-62,237,535 to 7-62,239,600 inclusive, and the office val deting stamp were stolen. On March 8, 1955 at Alten, Illinois en unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of these stolen money orders. On March 21, 1955 one of the stolen money orders, order No. 7-h2,237,597, was presented to Askin's Clothing Company, 1206 Grand Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, by an unknown rerson in payment for a suit of clothes which was never deked up after alterations had been made. This money order, which was in the amount of 175.00, was made rayable to Willard J. McDride with the purchaser being shown as Ver- ... non 'c ride. On this same date on unknown person presented states money order No. 7-12,237,568 to the Chaffee Office Machine Company, 1410 Grand Avenue, Manras City, Missouri, in payment for a used portable Remington typeariter. This money order, too, was in the amount of 175.00 payable to millard in Corido with the surchaser being shown as Vergou McBride. The manager of thus ilm, being suspictious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the customer. On March Ch, 1955 Rife executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he admitted he had prepared, forged and uttered the postal money order presented to the Chaffee Office Supply Company in Mancac City. He adulted preparing the some, order which was attered on forged endorgement at askin's clothing Gempany, . ansar City, Missouri. He said tood that he mad proposed the isce of the money orders made ready for cashing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other money orders on formed andorsements in the states of Florida, Louisiana, francas, and Fiscouri. He recalled unsuccessfully attempting to each the money order at Alto, Illimois on Carch 1, 1955. In his statement he admits that he purchased in Cuincy, Illineis the stolen sensy orders. They were cold to him by an unidentified men for \$20. On March 21, 1955 Ray, dealiring to execute statement for postal inspectors, did verbally state that he had participated with it o in the coshing of the stolen money orders in the various states. He decided netually knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he shalltedly presumed that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for 123. He admitted that it was be who forged and uttered the sensy order presented in Askin's Plothing Company in Kansas City, Missouri. He stated that he purchassi for 11 in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willard J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two money orders uttered by Rife and Ray in Yanses City, Pisseuri and as well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illinois have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the money orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 15, 1955 when reinterviewed by jostal inspectors Rife and Ray gave particulars relating to the cashing of twenty-seven additional stolen money orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. Two of the stolen money orders have not you been recovered. They, houseer, are counted for as Ray has edulated eaching one of them at a luggege store in Manches City, Mancas and Rate adults caching one of them at Mismi Beach, Florida.

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rice and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the room which they accoupled a quantity of merchandice they had acquired by passing the stolen mency enders. All personal checking accounts and savings accounts in the name of DOLORES EVANS were reviewed by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN JR. The results of investigation re these accounts have been set out in PD-302 form for the report.

It was ascertained that THEODORE EVANS possibly might have a checking account at the Bank of Finance, an all Negro Bank.

SA GEORGE MOOREHEAD, telephonically contacted a source at the above bank, who is a vice president at the bank, and requested to cause a search of checking account records in the name of THEODORE EVAN.

Source stated that the Bank of Finance had such an account on file, that EVANS was a personal friend of his, and was apprehensive to furnish banking data from the account.

The above information was discussed with Supervisor JOHN S. TEMPLE, and it was recommended that no further efforts be made to review EVANS' account, inasmuch as the source is most valuable in checking accounts maintained at the bank by US, Black Panthers, Republic of New Africa, and other militant groups, all of whom are of interest to this office.

The following investigation was conducted by SAS MELVIN L. FLOHR and RICHARD F. KILCOURSE.

On 4/23/68, MARY REINHART, Retail Merchants Credit Association, Los Angeles, advised the writer that her records reflect that FRED FOXWORTHY, 11871 Bray St., Culber City, is a Deputy Marshall for the County of Los Angeles.

On 4/23/68, an undentified pretext call to the LA County Marshall's Office determined that FRED FOXWORTHY is a Departy Marshall and works out of the West Los Angeles office.

on 4/24/68, Mrs. ROSANN ROSSO, 11859 Bray St., Culver City, was interviewed concerning her original call about FOXWORTHY. She related her observations, which substantially coincided with those of her call on 4/23/68. She added that she had learned that the possible cousin of FOXWORTHY might also have an additional last name of STATEMEN.

On 4/24/68, FRED FOXWORTHY, 11871 Bray St., Culver City, advised that his wife, NELLIE, has a cousin named JAMES EARL RAY STATEN, who has lived all his life in Bowling Green, Kentucky. FOXWORTHY stated that when all the publicity about JAMES EARL RAY started, he and his wife had joked about the coincidence concerning the name of her cousin. FOXWORTHY stated that they have not seen this cousin in about 28 years. He guessed that JAMES EARLRAY STATEN would be about 40 now and thus he has no idea what he looks like now.

FOXWORTHY advised that he is a retired Indiannapolis, Indiana police officer and, at one time, headed the Burglary Detail. He stated that he was acquainted with HARVEY FOSTER, who was SAC in Indiannapolis at one time. FOXWORTHY was cordial and complete in his answers to questions.

It is recommended that no further action be taken re

At 10:06 a.m., 4/24/68, JOHN MICHOLAS, who described himself as a "skid row bum", telephonically furnished the following information:

NICHOLAS stated he was in the vicinity of the Union Rescue Mission on Main Street, Los Angeles, the morning of 4/24/68. He stated he overheard one of the officials at the Mission commenting to another that a search of the Mission records reflected a J. E. HAY was registered in 1961. These individuals discussed the possibility that this person was identical with JAMES EARL/RAY and that "at the proper time" they would bring this information to the attention of the FBI.

NICHOLAS stated he was furnishing this information in the event it resulted in any reward which he would welcome. NICHOLAS declined to furnish his current address and stated he would "be in touch".

Immediate contact with Supervisor NOLAN reflects that subject JAMES EARL RAY was in custody of the Missouri State Penitentiary during 1961.
