Writer received call on above date from man who refused identify self stating did not want to become involved. Advised that he served time at Leavenworth Penitentiary, Kansas during the same period of time murder suspect EARL RAY was there, which caller believed to be 1955.

Comminued that about four months ago or so he accidentially bumped into RAY down in the San Pedro area and at that time, caller gave RAY his address and telephone number. Stated that he has not seen or heard from operation RAY until earlier today when he received a call from him. RAY advised he was "hot as a cow pistol", needed some "bread" and that he was in San Porco Pedro where he intended on staying in a mission there.

Caller stated he advised RAY he did not want to get involed with him and that he would not help him and then hung up. Caller refused to provide any further info and hung up.

Short time later, this same individual called writer again and stated that he had been thinking about the call he had just made and thought he had better furnish his name and address or writer might possibly not believe him and think his call just another one from a "nut". Caller identified self as CHARLES CALVIN BOOKMAN, address 980 South Figuroa, the Belmont Apts., Apt. # 201. BOOKMAN suggested that FBI Agents might want to come to his aprtment and interview him re his story, that he would be in the apartment all night.

Indices checked and files located possibly ident to BOOKMAN 66-3380 and 76-232. Files reflected individual with BOOKMAN's name was CI of Richmond Office around 1952 and that this office considered BOOKMAN a reliable informant who had furnished good info in the up past. 76 case reflected BOOKMAN arrested by FBI, Los Angeles for parole violation.

Supervisor NOLAN advised and requested SA AIKEN and another agent be dispatched to interview BOOKMAN.



Included in the material recovered were two scraps of newspaper both of which are generally alike in shape. As reflected in an insert which hasbeen prepared, these scraps contain portions of the Los Angeles Times classified advertisement pages. These pages appeared in the issue of Sunday November 19, 1968 and bear numbers 51 through 54.

The writer did not conduct investigation with reference to all places referred to in these advertisements on the scraps. One of the advertisements referred to houses for sale and were not investigated. One advertisement concerned a \$15. a week room in the Reseda area, but no investigation was conducted with reference to that ad as the address in Reseda was not mentioned and the telephone number was not complete as it appeared in the scrap.
