On 4/30/68, Miss SUSAN FARD was interviewed at her place of employment, 5670 Wilshire Boylevard, suite 1330, the offices of the Chicago Sun-Times, by the writer and SA E. RHEAD RICHARDS.

Miss GARD stated that on two or three occasions, she went to the National Dance Studios, located on Pacific Avenue, Long Beach, California, with her fiances RALPH PIERCE. She stated that PIERCE was a dancing student at the studio, and on the occasions that she went to the studio with him, they had dates later in the evening, after he finished his dancing lessons.

She stated that she did not know any of the students of the dance studio, nor did she know any of the instuctors. She stated that she conversed with ROD ARVIDSON, the owner of the studios on one or two occasions. She stated that on the occasions she went to the dance studios, she remained in the studio ** Lebby, and studied a US Navy Manual, inasmuch as she was in the USNR, and was at the time studying to pass her Yeoman 1st Class examination.

She stated that she did not know anyone by the name of **SAMES** ERIC S. GALT or JAMES EARL RAY. She was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, at which time she advised that she had never observed him in her life, to her knowledge.

She stated that she and PIERCE had engaged in conversations about GAIT, after it became known to them that he was a dancing student at National Dance Studio during the same period as Pierce. She stated that PIERCE told her that he did not recall ever s eeing GAIT at the studio.

On 5/1/68, RALPH PIERCE Co-owner Senior Taco, was interviewed at his office, 5670 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR. at which time he advised as follows:

He stated that during a portion of January and February, 1968, he was enrolled as a dancing student at the National Dance Studios in Long Beach, California. He stated that on several times Miss. SUSAN GARD, his fiancee accompanied himto the studios, and on these occasions, she remained in the main reception lobby of the studios, while he, PIERCE, completed his lesson, and they thereafter would go an a date for the evening.

He stated that he did not know any of the other students of the studios, and usually there was only one or two other students present in the studio while he was having his lesson.

He was specifically asked if the name of ERIC S. GALT or JAMES EARL RAY ment anything to him. He stated that up until recently, he had never heard of the name before, however he had read much about GALT in the newsmedia in connection with the captioned matter.

He was exhibited a photograph of RAY, and after reviewing the photo stated that he could not recall ever having seen RAY before in his life.

In view of the above, it is recommended that no further investigation be conducted in this phase of the sase.

The following investigation was conducted by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR.

Mr RODNEY ARVIDSON, Owner-Operator of National Dance Studios, Long Beach, California, advised SAs AIKEN and E. RHEAD RICHARDS as follows on 4/25/68:

He stated that one LANNART G. CEDRUP, Foreign Correspondent-Sweden, 7550 woodrow wilson Drive, Hollywood, California, had generally been a nuisarce at the National Dance Studios and had been a disruption in the orderly affairs of the studios. He stated that he had desired to talk with other students who had enrolled in dancing lessons about the same time as JAMES EARL RAY for the Swedish Press. inasmuch as M.L. KING was awarded the Nobel Prise in that country.

CEDRUP learned that a girl, first name SUSAN had attended a dance lesson with a friend, who was a pupil at the studios. Her friend was RALPH PIRRCE, who was employed Senior Taco, a franchised taco vendor,

CEDRUP was told that she mi/ght be possibly Swedish extraction, and from there, CEDRUP Areamed up "the blond associate" known to RAY.

ARVIDSON stated that PIERCE was presently out of town, and he had contacted him telephonically in Modesto, California. ARVIDSON stated that he discretely attempted to obtain SUSAN's last name from PIERCE, and PIERCE would not give him the last name until he had time to talk with the girl, stating to ARVIDSON that SUSAN was his fiancee.



Incomplete reporting continues to limit the comparison of monthly patient movement totals shown in the successive publications of this series. Mowever, it appears there was some increase in Short-Dayle program activity during January. The data show a rise in monthly admissions to each of the three types of direct service and an increase in the caseload of the rehabilitation services. Increases are also indicated in the total number of inpatient and day care days and outpatient contacts.

Re Possible Mental Condition of Subject RAY

On 5/2/68, CHARLES LUNDHOLM, Bureau of Viostatistics, California State Department of Mental Health, Sacramento, California, advised they had no record of subject RAY or his aliases ever having been a patient in any of the mental institutions back to 1922. This would also include committed alcoholics.

LUNDHOLM advised that this would not be a complete record for the State of California inasmuch as about 2/3 of the counties in California have their own Inpatient, Cutpatient and Rehabilitation Centers where one could go on his own volition. The names of all these individuals are not submitted to the state. He said it was possible that counties could have central indices but did not know whether the indices would be by name or file number.

Whether counties in all states have their own facilities as they do in California is not known, but those that do, a check would have to be made at county as well as state level to be all inclusive.

Above is being submitted as a suggestion and checks on county level will be held in abeyance so that the Bureau and Office of Origin may offer additional observations if deemed advisable.

LUNDHOLN furnished a Statistical Bulletin No. 39 dated 3/14/68, wherein each county having inpatient, outpatient or rehabilitation types of service is listed as well as the number of each. It may be noted that Los Angeles County has 243 such centers.

Los Angeles, San Diego, and San Francisco are being furnished two copies of this bulletin in the event counties listed thereon are to be contacted.

Both CLARKE and SHELLEY stated they have seen photographs of RAY numerous times on television and in various news media publications. They both said they are positive that no one even resembling RAY has frequented the San Moritz Inn at any time.

They both stated that they would remain alert, and if any of their customers even closely resemble RAY, they will attempt to identify the individual and immediately advise the Los Angeles Office.

On 5/8/68, JAMES H. TOWNSEND, 808 North Pine Street, Anaheim, California, and his brother, RUSSELL (NMN) TOWNSEND, 535 South West Street, Anaheim, California, were contacted at their place of employment, 1110 South Pomona Avenue, Fullerton, California. On that date, both TOWNSENDs admitted receiving phone calls from HAROLD EDWARD NICHOLS on 3/29/68.

JAMES TOWNSEND advised that he recalls receiving his phone call from NICHOLS some time during the afternoon on 3/29/68. TOWNSEND stated that NICHOLS was calling in connection with a trip TOWNSEND was making to the California Republican Assembly Convention, which was being held in Berkeley, California on 3/29/68. TOWNSEND stated that he departed Orange County Airport on 3/29/68 and was picked up at the Oakland Airport by NICHOLS and taken to the hotel in Berkeley, California.

JAMES TOWNSEND advised that he himself made three calls to NICHOLS on 3/29/68 in connection with his arrival time in Oakland. He stated he recalls leaving the Disneyland Hotel at 7:05 p.m. on 3/29/68 and arriving in Oakland later that same night.

RUSSELL TOWNSEND advised that he has known NICHOLS for better than six years and has worked with him on numerous

occasions. He stated he cannot conceive of anyone even thinking that NICHOLS would have anything to do with the murder of Dr. KING. TOWNSEND stated that he has discussed the FBI interview of NICHOLS with NICHOLS in connection with themurder of KING, and both he and his brother JAMES TOWNSEND could not understand how anyone would think of connecting NICHOLS with Dr. KING. RUSSELL TOWNSEND stated he recalls getting a phone call from NICHOLS on the morning of 3/29/68 but could not recall the exact content of this call except to state that NICHOLS was trying to reach his brother JAMES TOWNSEND.

No further investigation being conducted Los Angeles in connection with NICHOLS or TOWNSEND at this time.

Pursuant to our meeting of 4/24/68, when I stated I would prepare a memorandum for your case file, the following is a report of the statements given to me by the above-named informant who believes the man she knows as "Earl" is one and the same as your suspect James Earl RAY, AKA Eric Starvo GALT.

On 4/24/68, I interviewed informant Florence Holloway SIMPKINS, currently on California State Parole from the California Institution for Women. She stated that she has known for some time a Donald Martin BLAA, who has used the names Donald MARTIN and John FISHER, and who is currently using the latter name and will be so referred to as FISHER in this memorandum. His nickname is "Rocky". She describes him as a W.M.A., approximately forty-two (42) years old, a former Chicago resident who has described to her his check-writing and drunk rolling activities, although she does not believe he has ever served any prison sentences.

Informant states she met FISHER about eleven years ago in Cleveland, Ohio, and that FISHER was a friend of her husband, now deceased. She ran into him in Los Angeles in early 1967 and that he had just married a girl name Irene whom he left shortly after the marriage.

Irene is currently employed as a waitress at the Terrace Restaurant located in the Terrace Hotel - 1256 West Seventh Street in Los Angeles.

Informant stated FISHER began living with a woman in Glendale, California, known only as Dolores, in the Spring of 1967, and that Dolores lived at and was the manager of an apartment house at 410 South Glendale Avenue (Apt. #102) in Glendale, California.

FISHER took Dolores to Cleveland, Ohio in July of 1967, according to the informant, and returned without her about a month later and subsequently told the informant that Dolores had been fearful of returning after stealing about \$500 in rent receipts from her employers, the apartment house owners.

Informant saw FISHER in September of 1967 at the King Edward Bar, Fifth and Los Angeles Streets in Los Angeles, at which time FISHER allegedly told her of meeting two brothers in or around the state of Kansas during August and while en route back to Los Angeles from Cleveland. He stated the brothers were named Earl and Paul and that he had driven them to Los Angeles. (FISHER was driving a cream colored 1959 Ford Sedan, California License SBF 294.)

California License SBF 294.)

SIMPKINS states FISHER brought Earl and Paul over to her apartment at 1219 West Fourth Street the day after she had seen him at the King Edward Bar as related above. She states "Earl" looked just like the photograph being publicized of James Earl RAY, except that the cheeks seemed slightly less full and that he looked more dissipated than the picture shows.

Informant stated that FISHER lived with her during October and November of 1967, and that he made arrangements to move to Long Beach with Earl and Paul. On 11/26 or 11/27/67, she advises that Earl and Paul showed up at her apartment and that the brothers and FISHER later left to move into a Long Beach residence, location unknown, but believed by informant to be close to the waterfront.

Informant next saw FISHER on Christmas Day, 1967, when he showed up for dinner with a Bob BICKERING and John Richard HOWARD. HOWARD tends bar at the King Edward Bar at Fifth and Los Angeles Streets, Los Angeles. On that occasion, FISHER told informant that the brothers, Earl and Paul, were still living in Long Beach, but that he (FISHER) was staying at the St. Francis Hotel.

FISHER lived with the informant during the first half of February of 1968, and for a while in January, lived with a Main Street gospel preacher, name unknown, who lives with a girl friend named Lori, also a Main Street gospel preacher. Informant gives their phone number as 781-3335.

On or about February 20, 1968, SIMPKINS was told by FISHER that Earl and Paul owed him some money and that he wanted to collect, inasmuch as the brothers were planning to take a trip to New Orleans. FISHER planned to meet Earl and Paul that night at a bar, name unrecalled by informant, located below the St. Francis Hotel. (She referred to the hotel as being in Pasadena, although phone company information shows no listing for such a hotel in Pasadena. There is a St. Francis Hotel in Alhambra, and of course the St. Francis Hotel on Hollywood Boulevard in Hollywood where RAY is known to have resided.)

Informant states that on the night of February 20, 1968, she accompanied FISHER to the bar below the St. Francis Hotel and that they met with a foursome which included Earl and Paul, a musician whose name the informant does not recall, and a female named Avis KIRKWOOD who SIMPKINS described as a blonde in her late twenties. Informant states she recalls the blonde female because they discussed employment and KIRKWOOD suggested that SIMPKINS get in touch with her later about being hired at the Duarte Hospital.

Informant gives Avis KIRKWOOD's address as 908 Vuena Vista Road in Duarte and employment at the hospital, possibly called Duarte Community Hospital, and on the same block as KIRKWOOD's residence, and KIRKWOOD's supervisor at the hospital as a Mrs. Leslie.

SIMPKINS stated she hasnot seen the brothers since that occasion, but that on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, 1968, she saw for the last time John FISHER, that he was drinking at the King Edward Bar at Fifth and Los Angeles Streets, and that she did not speak to him because she was upset over his damaging her apartment while intoxicated earlier that month. She states one of his friends, and a roomer of hers is a Donald WATERS who works at Foothill Motors, 1318 East Colorado Boulevard in Pasadena.

Informant described Earl as being like an "okie", that he was quite coarse and crude, expressed considerable animosity towards Negroes and had commented particularly hostilely about seeing some Caucasion women in Los Angeles being in the company of male Negroes. She described his brother, Paul, as being more subtle and refined in his personality and as being a neater dresser.

Informant SIMPKINS, according to her parole agent Mrs. V. Jones (MA. 0-2470), has a background of forgery and alcoholism and a poor reputation for truthfulness.
