MULLIGAN had previously been employed by the Burns Detective Agency and had for a short period of time worked in this vicinity at the Hardman Facility.

MULLIGAN was observed by the writer to have only a slight resemblance to the photograph of RAY taken in 1960.

The writer contacted J. W. HOAG, Personnel Officer, William J. Burns Detective Agency, who reviewed MULLIGAN's fingerprint card at which time it was determined MULLIGAN's

U.S. Credit Bureau, handling collection of Union Oil credit card of THOME, contacted, and furnished fact that THOME had purchased gasoline for auto registered to JAMES E. SIMS of Los Angeles. Investigation reflected SIMS presently in Indianapolis, and lead set out to interview SIMS.

Lead set out to Dallas to check in Arlington, Texas, location of collect call by THOME to son. Lead convered with negative results. (per 188)

Leads still outstanding to Dallas and Atlanta. STEPHEN THOME advised he told father FBI wanted to talk to him, but father refused, believing FBI wanted to "kill" him.

These records revealed that HILL was convicted of Grand Theft in the Circuit Court, State of Missouri, County of Barton on 10/10/66, and was sentenced to State Prison. HILL was paroled to California from Missouri on 5/16/67.

A social evaluation of HILL reveals he has average intelligence, but has a noticeable difficulty accurately expressing himself. His lack of education tends to be magnified by his hillbilly accent, and backwoods logic.

HILL was on parole from Missouri and had been out of that institution only a very short period of time prior to his involvement leading to his arrest and continual confinement since 6/17/67.

On 5/24/68, FLOYD EVANS HILL, California State Prison No. Bllll2 was interviewed at the above institution and furnished the following information:

He was arrested 6/17/67 by Los Angeles Sheriff's Office near Compton, California, has been in continual confinement since, and is serving a sentence of six months to ten years for Grand Theft of Pistol.

He was arrested for Grand Theft of Copper Wire in Barton County, Missouri in October, 1966, convicted, and sentenced to the Missouri State Penitentiary for a two years period. By about 11/21/66, he arrived at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, to start serving his sentence, and where he was confined for about 1½ months thereafter being transferred to the Men's Institution Training Center, Moberly, Missouri, where he remained for about six months. From there, he was transferred to a Missouri State Penitentiary honor farm called Rinse Farm (phonetic) which is just across the bridge from the State Prison at Jefferson City, where he was confined for only a couple of weeks prior

to release on parole on 5/16/67. When released on parole, he flew to California by airlines and was on the street about one month prior to his arrest confinement on 6/17/67.

At the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, he was confined in a two-man cell, but was moved around quite a bit and had quite a few different cellmates. At Moberly, Missouri, they had individual cells, and Rinse Farm housed them in barrack-type buildings.

HILL said he knew a lot of the inmates in the Missouri State Penitentiary at the above locations, but he does not know their names. He initially stated that he cannot place JAMES EARL RAY by name, photograph, or description as having been a cellmate at any of the above institutions. Upon further reflection and consideration, EVANS thought the center photograph on the FBI Wanted Flyer No. 442-A looked a little familiar to him, but he still definitely does not recognize RAY as having been one of his cellmates. He said that if RAY is identical to the person who he recalls resembled the center photograph on the above Wanted Flyer, that person was only a casual acquaintance of his. The man who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer walked back and forth to work with him at Moberly, Missouri Institution. The person who resembled the photograph on the Wanted Flyer worked in the woodshop at Moberly and HILL went to school there for a while and worked in the plumbing shop. HILL stated he did not get too well acquainted with this individual and can recall nothing of value about the person that he thinks resembles RAY except that person claimed to know quite a bit about safes, was to get out soon and wanted some help in writing up scores which HILL ignored since he wanted no part of it. As he recalls, the person he knew who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer of RAY wanted to score on safes in California and "go to Mexico and cool it." EVANS stated that since he was not interested in the matter, no specific place in California or Mexico was mentioned.

EVANS repeatedly denied that he knows RAY or anything about RAY other than stated that above and was emphatic in pointing out that he had no contact with RAY or the person who resembled RAY when he, HALL, was in California on the street in May and April, 1967.

During the interview with LOMAX, an individual approached the table and stated to LOMAX, "Are the signals still the same?" LOMAX replied in the affirmative and the individual left. LOMAX was asked to identify this individual and he stated, "He is a reporter for the Los Angeles Herald Examiner. As you know, I am doing a series of articles for them". LOMAX, television personality, was contacted in the Cellar Jounge of the Gala Motor Hotel, 925 South Figueroa Street, Los Angeles, California, at approximately 10:00 p.m. on 5/25/68. LOMAX advised that a source of his had advised him that JAMES EARL AAY, Top Ten Fugitive, was located in Room 903 of the Figueroa Hotel located at the corner of Olympic and Figueroa in Los Angeles. LOMAX advised that he had conducted some investigation and had ascertained that PAUL WINSON was residing in Room 903 and had been there since 9/1/67. LOMAX stated that his source had met WINSON previously/after which WINSON "disappeared for awhile" and now is back at the hotel. LOMAX was advised that the FBI would check out the information furnished by him and that he should remain at the Gala Motor Hotel. During the interview with LOMAX, an individual approached the table and stated to LOMAX, "Are the signals still the same?" LOMAX replied in the affirmative and the individual left. LOMAX was asked to identify this individual and he stated, "He is a reporter for the Los Angeles Herald Examiner. As you know, I am doing a series of articles for them". 

On May 20, 1968, THOMAS F. JOHNSON, San Diego County Sheriff's Office, El Cajon Substation, telephonically contacted the San Diego Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and furnished the Tollowing information:

JOHNSON advised that he yed been contacted by a fourteen-year-old boy named KRITT KIRT, 781 Monserate Avenue, Chula Vista, California. KING told him that while he was getting ready to leave the area in front of the Chula Vista library where ROBERT F. KENNEDY had just spoke, he was approached by a man who resembled JAMFS BARL BAY. This man asked KFITH where and when KENNEDY was to speak again. When told that he did not know where and when KFINEDY was to speak, this individual then asked him the location of a good place to eat with a telephone. KING felt that the man with whom he spoke locked very similar to a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY appearing in a recent issue of the Chula Vista "Star News."

Mr. WILLIAM DOBREVIR, "Citizens for Kennedy," KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters, San Diego, California, was contacted on May 20, 1968, at which time he advised that ROBERT F. KENNEDY had departed the San Diego, California, area en route to Los Angeles, California.

Mr. DOBREVIR was advised of the information furnished by KEITH KING and he stated that he would relay this information to the KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters at Los Angeles, California.

Deputy Sheriff THONAS F. JOHNSON, San Diego County Sheriff's Office, El Cajon Substation, El Cajon, California, was recontacted on May 21, 1966 and advised that he had no further information to relate concerning information furnished to him by KEITH KING, except to state that KING resides in his immediate neighborhood and considers him a highly reliable young man.

KETTH KING, 781 Monserate Avenue, Chula Vista, California, was interviewed on May 21, 1960 and he advised as follows:

KING had occasion to be present at the campaign speech of ROBRET F. KENNELY at the civic Center, Chula Vista, Carifornia, on May 20, 1965. A short time after the speech by Mr. KENNELY ended, which was then approximately 5:20 to 5:30 p.m., an individual closely resembling JAMES FARE RAY approached him and asked him if Mennely had made his speech yet. When told that he had, this individual appeared surprised and then asked where KENNELY was going to speak next.

KING stated that he had a schedule of Gr. KRNNETY's appearances in the San Blego area and told this imdividual that his next appearance would be at San Yeldro, California.

This individual asked KIVG where there was a good place to eat where he could obtain a telephone. He also asked him if there was a telegraph office in San Ysidro, to which KING replied he could not furnish this information as he did not know.

KING described this individual as approximately forty years of age, white, male, American, five feet eight inches to five feet nine inches, 160 to 170 pounds, hair medium brown, complexion fair to medium, wearing a blue coat, light-colored slacks and brown shoes.

KING advised that prior to seeing this individual he had read an article in the Chula Vista "Star News"

concerning JAMAS EARL RAY, which also had a photograph of RAY in the paper. According to KING, the individual who contacted him at Chula Vista closely resembled JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 21, 1968, Mrs. FISTE ZUNIGA. Manager, Western Union Office, San Ysidro, California, advised she usually closes the Western Union office at 5:00 p.m. on a daily basis; however, on May 20, 1968 she closed the office at 4:45 p.m. in order to go to the respection speech of Taxana F. KENNETY.

Mrs. ZUNIGA and she sairised that she har not seen anyone fitting his description in the San Taldro, Calliveris, area.
