Serial 854 sets out that one HENRY COLEMAN, 2542 Vineyard, Los Angeles, number RE 4-5817, Is a parking lot attendant at 935 West 8th Street, Los Angeles, and on 4/25/68, he had an individual drive a 1956 red Buick, California license PYR 391 into his lot, whom he believed resembled photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

On 4/30/68, COLEMAN was interviewed by SA's G. J. MOOREHEAD and GILBERT G. BENJAMIN and furnished the following information:

After reviewing photographs of RAY, he is certain that the person he had seen is not identical with RAY. He stated that the person he had seen was attempting to conceal his face and this made COLEMAN suspicious. He was concerned that this person would either hold him up or strip cars and had, therefore, contacted the authorities to have this driver "checked out".

Re memo of SA WAYNE L. BOURQUE, dated 4/30/68 at Los Angeles, California.

The following investigation was conducted in Los Angeles, California, by SA GEORGE E. AIKEN, JR.

Mrs. JAMES JUDD, aka JEANE JUDD, wasinterviewed at her residence, 5/16 The Belmont Apartment Hotel, 948 South Figueroa, apartment 412, Los Angeles, at which time she advised as follows:

She stated that she was of the belief that she danced with JAMES EARL RAY on the evening of 1/21/68. She s tated that she had been bowling, and had returned to a local bar-hangout, The Annex Bar, 871 South Figueroa, and thereafter began to drink beer. She stated that approximately one hour, and several beers after she entered the bar, she went to the juke box to play a selection when a white male, whom she described as looking like RAY approached her, asked her to dande with him, and thereafter came to her table and remained there until she left at about night.

JUDD stated that the bar was not crowded during the evening, and that STEVE ZEBB was the bartender the entire evening, and he probably could verify her story.

She stated that the unknown male was wearing a warm up jacket with "Tennessee written on the back."

She was shown several photos of JAMES EARL RAY, at which time she stated that she could not be certain whether the unknown male and RAY were identical.

She was asked by the interviewing agent if she was acquainted with CHARLES BOOKMAN, a resident of the Belmont Apartment hotel, and an individual who alleged that he had recently received atelephone call from RAY, and served time with him at Levinworth. JUDD stated that she did not know BOOKMAN.

MAY 6 1968 FBI — LOS ANGELES In an effort to further assess JUDD's story, immediately after departing from her apartment, the agent went to BOOKMAN's room, believing that if JUDD and BOOKMAN were acquainted, JUDD would telephone BOOKMAN of the fact that she had just been interviewed by an agent of the FBI.

She left the room quite upset, and BOOKMAN stated that he had talked with JUDD about RAY, and he intimated that the story that she had told the agent was a fabrication.

On 5/3/60 STEVE ZEBB, Bartender, Annex Bar, 871 South Figueroa Los Angeles, California was interviewed by SA AIKEN, at which time he was asked if he recalled a white male in the company of Mrs JUDD on the evening of 1/21/68, while she was a patron of the Annex. He answered in the affirmative, stating that although he did not know the individual's name, he was a local partron who frequented the bar occasionally. He stated that this indivual was a graduate from the University of Tennessee, was about 26 years of age, and that he was employed with some sporting goods firm in Los ingeles.

He was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and asked if the person above described by him appeared to be identical with RAY. ZEBB, after reviewing the photograph stated that absolutely the person he saw with JUDD, who wore a Tennessee warm-up jacket, was not RAY.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted in this phase of the investigation.

CARIMIE COUNLEY. Chief Security Officer. International Hotel, 6211 West Century Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, advised

SA BILLY DALE HUBBARD and WILLIAM N. HEARD, on May 3, 1968, that he had seen a man having a vague similarity to the picture he had seen in the newspapers of JAMES EARL RAY between 8 and 10 a.m. on ray 3, 1968. He stated he watched the man at a telephone booth in the lobby of the hotel. He described the man as being a white male, appearing to be about 45 years of age, 5 ft. llinches, 150 lbs. and had hair that came down over his collar. The man was wearing a medium blue sharkskin suit with a xxx lighter vertical blue stripe. He was shown the #Local Swingers" photograph and he could not identify the man at the hotel with the picture.

The following person employed by the hotel who would have been employed during the pertinent period of time advised they could not identify the photographs of RAY as being identical to anyone they had seen at the hotel:

On 5/2/68 at 6:10 PM the writer interviewed JAMES GILPIN, 17000 Burton Street, Van Nuys, California, telephone number 342-8401, who advised that he is the Safety and Security Supervisor. Cedars of Lebanon Hospital. 4836 Fountain Avenue, Los Angeles, California, and was furnished the following information:

An orderly in the hospital named GORDON GUTIERREZ, 1231 North Mariposa, Los Angeles, California, telephone number 666-8530, had advised the Personnel Office that he had seen a newspaper picture of RAY and thought that it was identical to one ROGER ELVIN REED an individual who commenced work as an orderly in this hospital on April 29, 1968.

GILPIN advised that both GUTTERREZ and REED were presently off duty, but would be working at 7:00 AM on the following day. He did have the employment form for REED and it reflected that he resides at 1116 North Mariposa, Los Angeles, date of birth 5'7½", 145 pounds, previous address 3933 South Broadway, St. Louis, Missouri. His marital status was shown as divorced (CAROL REED) and has two children, ages 13 and 10. His Social Security Number is and military status 3-A. Previous employment December, 1966, and January, 1967 in Alexian Brothers Hospital, St. Louis, Missouri. GILPIN stated that a telephone call to this latter hospital reveals that REED did work there during this period, but he was also informed that REED and another employee, DELMAR MICHAEL MAYEAUX, now with Cedars of Lebanon, were engaged in a homosexual affair during this same period. MAYEAUX resides at 1601 North Normandie Avenue, Los Angeles.

On May 3, 1968, SA WALTER M. BRADY and the writer interviewed GORDON GUTIERREZ and he advised that he had seen the original newspaper photograph of ERIC GALT, (the one with the eyes closed) and believed it looked like REED. GUTIERREZ reviewed other photographs of RAY and stated that none looked

like REED. When asked to describe REED he stated that he had not taken a careful look at his face as he did not want to arouse his suspicions, however he believed he was about 5'4", 140-150 pounds, had a "face rash" on his cheek and had reddish-brown hair.

GILPIN later stated that GUTIERREZ has a cop complex and was turned down by the California Highway Patrol (reason unknown). He said that he runs around like "007".

An attempt was made to interview REED, however it was eventually determined that he had called in and stated he would not be at work this date.

SA's proceeded to the residence of REED and received no response to our knock.

SA's G. J. MOOREHEAD and GILBERT G. BENJAMIN attempted to contact REED at his residence on the afternoon of 5/3/68 however he was not located.

RALPH SCHRADER, Registered Nurse, Assistant
Director of Nursing, Cedars of Lebanon Hospital, was then interviewed by SA's MOOREHEAD and BENJAMIN and he advised as follows:

He recalls that he interviewed and hired REED and after reviewing the photographs of RAY he is quite certain that they are not identical. He did state however, that there was certain facial similarities between REED and the original photos of RAY.

On May 6, 1968, SA's MOOREHEAD and JOHN W. WARREN interviewed ROGER ELVIN REED at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital, and were advised as follows:

He resides at 883 South New Hampshire, Los Angeles, California, 90005, telephone number 385-1125. He is living with a "roommate" and moved in over the past weekend. He was born in Tower City, Pennsylvania, where his former wife (CAROL FESIG) and two children, and presently reside at 139 West Grand Avenue.
