ANN MARIE CONDON, photographer, 7557 Sunset Boulevard, Hollywood, California, advised that on Sunday April 28, 1968, she and her escort picked up a hitchhiker on Santa Monica Boulevard and drove him as far as the Hollywood Bowl on Highland Avenue, Hollywood. This was about 1:30 AM that date.

She recalled that he had indicated that he was en route here from the mid-western part of the United States and that his car had broken down in the Pomona area, that he had no money, but was attempting to return there to see if he could get his car fixed. She recalled that he had indicated that he was a school teacher by profession, but that he was seeking work in any position that might be available.

She described this person as white, male, over 6', about 200 pounds, light blonde hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, and that he combed his hair back and slightly to the side.

She recalled that he was wearing a dark blue-grey sports jacket, a checkered shirt and grey pants. She stated that the only luggage that he carried appeared to be a small box similar to that housing an electric shaver.

She stated that on Monday April 30, 1968, she saw pictures in "Life" magazine which reminded her of the person that she and her escort had picked up on April 28, 1968.

She was shown pictures of JAMES EARL RAY and indicated that they were not identical to the hitchhiker previously mentioned.

He walked westerly when leaving the premises and she saw him with no car. He was alone and is described as follows:

Mrs. WEBSTER further advised that she has seen, off and on, for about four months a man, name and address and occupation unknown, who parks his car in a garage facing San Marino Street, and located between Irolo Street and Normandie Avenue, Los Angeles. She said that she had previously thought that he appeared to resemble the profile sketch of the suspect in the KING murder which she had seen in the paper, however, at that time he had not been seen



FRED MURPHY, also known as Pat Murphy, Night Manager of the Hotel Ambassador, and who resides at 111 South Oxford Avenue, Los Angeles, California, advised that a woman came into the hotel alone and registered for her and her husband. She gave an address on West Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles, which proved fictitious, and said her husband would be in later. said he understood another woman also shared the room but said he had never seen or talked to either of the women. After the hotel tried to lock the occupants out of the room, the man, RICHARD O'CONNER, asked him, MURPHY, what was the matter. man said he would write a check but he said he had no check blanks with him and when asked for identification, he said he had it in his luggage which had not yet been received from International Airport. The man said he would have the money in the morning. Later a call was received from a man identifying himself as O'CONNER. At that time he said he had a credit card for an oil company and said he would have the money in the morning.

MURPHY advised that he saw O'CONNER only the one time and knew of no vehicle O'CONNER or the women had. MURPHY said that he had told O'CONNER that the address on Olympic Boulevard was no good and O'CONNER admitted it. MURPHY said that it is possible that the woman professing to be Mrs. RICHARD L. O'CONNER was not actually his wife.

MURPHY described the man as follows:

WILLIAM F. GARDNER, Director of Security, Room 62, Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, advised that a blonde woman registered at the hotel on April 13, 1968, under the name Mrs. RICHARD O'CONNOR, saying that her husband would show up later.

An address of 515 West Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles, was given and they were assigned to Room Number 421 at \$24.00 per day. When the woman appeared at the hotel, she said they would be leaving on April 16, 1968.

Also in the room was another female. The two women were both very young but adults. The one who registered was obviously pregnant. Both were of the white race, both had dark hair and dark complexions. GARDNER said he did not know the color of their eyes nor the name of the one woman. On April 15, 1968, the two women were in the hotel's coffee shop and as they had been drinking they were asked to leave the coffee shop.

GARDNER advised that O'CONNER had a 1965 Mustang parked at the hotel; the parking lot attendant got the license number RYP 356 which, it was determined, was registered to KEN KOBAYASHI, 1326 South Gramercy. GARDNER said that the attendant might have misread the plate.

The groups' unpaid hotel bill amounts to \$316.71. They paid nothing and presented no bad check. They skipped out on April 16, 1968. The bill reflects telephone calls, an extraordinary amount of room service, and a charge on April 13, 1968, for \$9.45 for Cocommon Grove photographs.

GARDNER advised that the man was not at the hotel as much as the women. He tried to cash a check at the hotel through PAT MURPHY, the Night Manager, but had no check blanks or identification. GARDNER said that according to MURPHY, the man was shorter and younger than JAMES EARL RAY. GARDNER said that he did not know of others who saw the man, but said that

possibly parking attendants did. O'CONNER telephoned the hotel relative to his bill but never showed up to pay it. The women skipped out leaving their luggage which is still in the possession of the hotel.

GARDNER advised that after the skip, the hotel had found in the room a credit card of the American Oil Company Number I in the name of RICHARD L. O'CONNER. The hotel has this card and called the local office of the oil company and learned that records are maintained in Chicago, Illinois. Thereupon the hotel on April 23, 1968, wrote to that oil company at 165 North Canal Street, Chicago, attention of Issuance Department. GARDNER said that the Los Angeles Police Department was not formally notified of this skip but officers of that department came around and are aware of it. GARDNER advised that to make a formal Crime Report they would need sufficient identification data.

GARDNER said that he himself did not see either the man or the two women. He said that there was the remote possibility that O'CONNER might be identical with JAMES EARL RAY in view of the name "O'CONNER". GARDNER said that the possibility of being identical was not based on anyone thinking the man resembled the photographs of RAY in the papers. He said he had checked with the parking attendant and no one saw the group leave; and that the address given on Olympic was no good. GARDNER said that GEORGE WALLACE, 648 North Martel Avenue, Los Angeles, has the concession for taking photographs at the Cocoanut Grove located in the hotel. GARDNER said that the customer's name is placed on an envelope and this is returned to the customer so the customer's name is not maintained by WALLACE. WALLACE would have the negative along with the negatives for other pictures taken.

Mr. IRVIN advised he recalled registering DENNIS GUTHRIE into the Huntington Hotel on the night of April 7, 1968, and assigning him to room 447. He was shown a photograph depicting DENNIS GUTHRIE which had been removed from room 447 along with GUTHRIE's other belongings on April 26, 1968, after GUTHRIE failed to return on April 24, 1968. He advised the photograph was a good likeness of GUTHRIE who he described as follows:

Mr. JOSEPH MC CARTHY, Assistant Manager, Huntington Hotel, 752 South Main Street, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed at his place of employment at which time he furnished the following information:

Mr. MC CARTHY stated that one DENNIS GUTHRIE, the only address given as city, checked into the Huntington Hotel, Room 447 on April 7, 1968 at 11:40 p.m. He noticed a similarity between this individual and the FBI wanted flyer number 442-A dated April 19, 1968, depicting a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY. MC CARTHY related there was a strong resemblance between the individual registered at the Huntington Hotel as DENNIS GUTHRIE and JAMES EARL RAY. The resemblance between the two prompted him to contact the FBI.

Mr. MC CARTHY advised that GUTHRIE'S description was approximately the same as the identifying information on the wanted flyer for RAY. MC CARTHY described GUTHRIE as follows:

MC CARTHY related that GUTHRIE paid his rent once a week for approximately the first two weeks he resided in the hotel but the week of April 22, 1968 he began paying each day. Mr. MC CARTHY only saw GUTHRIE on about three occasions when he collected GUTHRIE's rent. Mr. MC CARTHY further stated that GUTHRIE appeared to be working in the area of the hotel as GUTHRIE asked to be called each morning at 6:00 a.m. Each time MC CARTHY saw GUTHRIE he was dressed in casual clothes

morning and not return until after MC MARTHY would go off duty. MC CARTHY related that he did not notice any type of shoes that GUTHRIE wore nor any type of jewelry worn by GUTHRIE. MC CARTHY stated that he never noticed GUTHRIE in the lounge at the hotel talking with any of the other tenants.

MC CARTHY stated he did not know whether GUTHRIE carried his money in a wallet or in his pocket inasmuch as when GUTHRIE paid his rent he would have the money in his hand, ready to pay the rent when MC CARTHY would observe him. MCTCARTHY stated the rent was paid in cash. MC CARTHY did not know the denomination of the bills by which he paid the rent. He stated he was sure the bills would have been larger than a \$20 bills or otherwise he would have recalled it.

MC CARTHY stated that the last day GUTHRIE was in the hotel was on April 24, 1968. GUTHRIE's room was held for two days and on April 26, 1968, MC CARTHY cleaned GUTHRIE's belongings from Room 447. MG CARTHY stated that GUTHRIE has not returned to the hotel since his departure on April 24, 1968.

MC CARTHY related he had never had any conversation with GUTHRIE and knew absolutely nothing about his background.

Mr. MC CARTMY observed a photograph which he had removed from GUTHRIE's room and advised that the individual depicted in the photograph was definitely the individual who identified himself as GUTHRIE and who resided in Room 447, at the Huntington Hotel, Los Angeles, California, until April 24, 1968.

MC CARTHY wastshown five photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, one of which was a photograph of RAY taken at the Missouri State Penitentiary in January, 1966. MC CARTHY advised GUTHRIE most closely resembled this photograph.

MC CARTHY made available the items which were removed from GUTHRIE's room, Room 447, by the orders of MC CARTHY to the hotel housekeeper and which are as follows:

MC KNIGHT advised that she cleaned the room on April 26, 1968 when requested to do so by Mr. JOSEPH MC CARTHY, Assistant Manager, Huntington Hotel. She related she had placed all of the individual's articles in a brown paper bag with the exception of two cans of beer which she poured down the sink.

She was shown five photographs which included two photographs of JAMES EARL RAY. She stated the individual occupying Room 447, whose photograph she was shown earlier, was definitely not identical to any of the individuals depicted in the five photographs.

On April 20, 1968, ALLAN ANGELHARDT, Apartment 28, 20909 Parthenia Street, Canoga Park, California, telephonically advised he had just observed an individual that resembled JAMES EARLYRAY leaving a coffee shop at the Rocket Bowl, on De Soto Street, north of Nordhoff in Canoga Park, California.

On April 24, 1968, ENGELHARDT advised that he had seen this man at the Rocket Coffee Shop on April 20, 1968, and he seemed to be tensely engrossed in reading the article concerning JAMES EARL RAY in the local newspaper. He advised that the unknown individual resembled the photos appearing in that newspaper on April 20,1968.

ENGELHARDT stated he followed the man to the parking area and observed him entering a 1959 or 1960 Ford Fairlane, bearing California plates EZR 721.

ENGELHARDT described this unknown person as 38 to 40 years of age, 5'10", 165 pounds, sandy to reddish blond hair, eyes not observed and no scars or marks visible. He remarked that he had never seen this person before.

A Department of Motor Vehicles check of California plate EZR 721, shows a listing to SAUL JOHN, 926 North Denair Street, Turlock, California, on a 1954 two-door Buick.

ERIC LEROY CASEY after being advised of the identity of SA ROBERT C. MARTIN, JR. and SA MALVIN LEE WESSEL and being advised of his rights by SA MARTIN as set forth on a rights and waiver form, was advised by SA MARTIN that they wished to interview him concerning any involvement he might have in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

CASEY advised that he had no knowledge of the death of KING other than what he had read in newspapers and that he has not been out of the states of California and Arizona since January, 1968, when he first arrived in California from Amarillo, Texas.

He advised that after arriving in California from his address 313 South Lamar, Amarillo, Texas he went to the Mission at San Jose, California where he stayed and worked and met HAYES P. PUFAHL. He advised that after leaving the Mission at San Jose, California in January, 1968 he went to a bartending school at Santa Clara, California. He stated he did not graduate from this school and left Santa Clara, California with PUFAHL and went to Death Valley, California to prospect. He advised that while in Death Valley and subsequently in the desert area near Trona, California they lived in the desert in the pickup belonging to PUFAHL.

He advised that in February, 1968 he and PUFAHL left Trona, California and went to Vidal, California also to prospect and lived in the pickup. He advised approximately two weeks ago they moved from Vidal, California to Earp, California continuing their prospecting.

He stated that he has no knowledge whatsoever of the person or persons who might have murdered MARTIN LUTHER KING and has been with PUFAHL the entire time since he left Santa Clara, California.

The credit card was issued April 26, 1968, to one CARL RAY, Ray Land and Cattle Company, Route No. 4, Box 868, Peco, Texas. Frontier Airline tickets were issued on May 1, 1968, at Denver, Colorado to one Mr. and Mrs. C. RAY. The Frontier tickets were issued for flight No. 710 from Las Vegas to St. Louis and return.

KEPP stated the individual who identified himself as Mr. RAY advised he would like to use the Frontier tickets as partial payment for the requested tickets for the flight to Honolulu.

At this point KEPP advised Mr. RAY that it would be necessary to checkwith her supervisor for approval of the redeming of the Frontier tickets.

KEPP stated she asked RAY where he was staying in Los Angeles and he replied "International Hotel" but was unable to recall room number.

KEPP stated she advised ROBERT NICHOLS and ROBERT WHALQUIST of the situation. Upon returning to her window approximately five minutes later the unknown white male had departed leaving behind the Frontier Airline tickets and Frontier credit cards earlier described.

HUMMEL advised that he was on duty at about 2:00 a.m. on March 19, 1968, when a man called the Blythe Federal Aviation Agency by radio stating that he was landing and wanted fuel. After fueling his plane the man personally came to the Federal Aviation Agency Office and talked with HUMMEL for about 15 minutes. He asked about weather conditions and said he was going to fly to Dallas, Texas, but was going to stop at El Paso, Texas, first.

HUMMEL did not see the plane this man was flying as he was only able to see the planes lights from his level.

HUMMEL felt he could identify this man again if he ever saw him in person. He recalled the man appeared to have a cold as he coughed a great deal.

NETTIE COPE, Kal Craft Aviation, Blythe Airport, Blythe, California, advised that at about 2:00 a.m. on March 19, 1968, she received a call from Mrs. HIMMEL of the Federal Aviation Agency, Blythe, stating that a plane was landing and had requested fuel by radio.

Mrs. COPE advised that she and her son, FRANK COPE, got up and went out on the flight line and a Cessna Skymaster, white in color with blue and yellow trim with push and pull propellers taxied up to the pit.

The plane was occupied by a white male, 28 to 30 years, 5'10" to 6', 180 pounds, olive complexion, dark brown hair, slight indentation on upper lip, no accent, wearing horn rim glasses and dressed in a white shirt, tie, and dark business brown suit. She viewed all the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated that RAY is not identical with the man who piloted the above plane.

This man purchased 30 gallons of gasoline and paid cash. He initailly asked if Mrs. COPE would take a Gulf credit card and she said that she preferred a Standard credit card at which time he said he would pay cash for the 30 gallons.

He also asked if she had any coffee and she replied no at which time he said he still had some coffee in his thermos bottle. He commented that the coffee in his thermos had been there since about 3:00 a.m. the previous day. In writing up the sale Mrs. COPE wrote down the craft number on a credit card ticket although the purchase was cash. This ticket with the number has since been sent to the bookkeeper, name unknown, for KALMAN STADLES, President of the Kal Craft Corporation. This bookkeeper lives in Yuma, Arizona and Mrs. COPE did not have her address. She stated that STADLES was currently out of town.

Mrs. COPE further noted that when the plane radioed in for fuel it gave the Federal Aviation Agency, Blythe,
