appeared in "Life" magazine, and the Governor of Louisiana placed a stop to the entire operation.

Mrs. STRADER advised her husband is in telephonic contact with her daily but declines to furnish information as to his location over the telephone, as he is very afraid. Mrs. STRADER was advised to inform her husband if he has any information he desires to furnish to the FBI, he can contact any FBI Field Office, who will then arrange for an interview with him.

For information receiving offices, Inspector THOMAS E. BISHOP, SOG, on 4-24-68 advised he had received a telephone call from CARL STERN, Washington, D. C., NBC Office, who told him that a man (FNU) STRADER, whom he had met on one occasion while covering a story in the South, had, on 4-24-68, telephoned him from someplace around Toledo, Ohio. STRADER informed him he was en route to the home of his wife's parents in Lexington, Illinois. He then told STERN a "fantastic tale" about him, STRADER, overhearing a conversation on 3-29-68 in Lebanon, Tennessee, concerning the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Apparently STRADER was of the impression that the people involved in the conversation knew he had overheard them, and they had taken his license number. STRADER believed there had been at least one shot fired at him since that time. STRADER informed STERN he had vital information concerning KING's murder and called STERN for advice as to what he should do. STERN advised STRADER to call the Springfield Office of the FBI and they would make arrangements to have someone meet him at his convenience in their territory. According to Mr. STERN, BISHOP stated that STRADER is afraid to approach any office and may desire to have someone meet him at a location other than an office.

The files of the Springfield Office contain the following references to ROBERT STRADER, however, it cannot be determined at this point whether or not they refer to ROBERT HOOD STRADER of Lexington, Illinois:

On 11-19-65 ROBERT STRADER, 6'1" - 2", 175 lbs., employed cutting timber near Edwardsville, Illinois, and in construction work at Southern Illinois University, Edwardsville, Illinois, was considered a suspect in the robbery of the Hamel State Bank, Bufile 91-20560, Sifile 91-2642.

In 10-66 prosecution of ROBERT H. STRADER was declined in an ITSMV matter which involved a rental car. ROBERT H. STRADER had represented himself as an employee of General Telephone Co., of Illinois, registering at two motels at Bloomington, Illinois, and had skipped without properly checking out and without paying for his room. SHRADER could not be located at that time but was described as a white, male, 35 - 40, 5'10" - 6', 150 lbs., dark brown hair, medium build and medium complexion. He was subject of Sifile 26-29006.

One ROBERT HOOD STRADER was subject of an ITSMV; UFAP - AUTO THEFT case in which Milwaukee was 00,9/63, Bufile 26-316708, Sifile 26-23403. This individual had a rather extensive arrest record dating back to 11/48 at which time he was AWOL and which involved record of arrest for issuing worthless checks, mail fraud, investigation of forgery, and defrauding an innkeeper. ROBERT H. STRADER, whose FBI No. was given as 244 633 A, [REDACTED] concerning which fingerprints were furnished by the State Bureau of Identification, Sacramento, California, on 8-3-60 and subsequently again on 9-21-60, was a patient at [REDACTED]. That individual was described as white, male, approximately 6'3", 190 lbs., fair complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair and was considered [REDACTED].

A check through NCIC on 4-30-68 indicated ROBERT STRADER was not currently wanted.

FBI Distributes 2 New Photos Of King Suspect

WASHINGTON (AP) — The FBI issued today two more photographs of James Earl Ray, who is being sought in connection with the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

An FBI spokesman said one of the latest photos is "considered to be the best possible likeness of Ray."

So far the FBI now has issued five photos of Ray.

The one the FBI considers the best was taken in late January or early February of this year somewhere in California. It shows Ray wearing a dark checked jacket, striped tie and button-down collar shirt. There is a curtain directly in back of him and a lamp nearby.

The FBI would not say where it obtained the picture, or where precisely it was taken, or by whom.

One Taken in Mexico

The other new photo, which the FBI said was taken last November at an undisclosed location in Mexico, shows Ray wearing dark glasses and a light colored shirt open at the collar.

The California photo appears to have been taken without the use of flash, and with side lighting. The Mexico photo appears to have been made with the use of a flash camera.

The two new photos confirm what FBI descriptions say—that his weight has been known to vary widely. The Mexican picture discloses a man with a thin face and pointed chin, much as he appeared in 1960 photos.

But the picture taken in California shows him edging up to pudginess, with a clear cleft in his chin.

Other photos issued earlier by the FBI included one of him taken at a Los Angeles bartending school in March 1968.

The original showed his eyes closed. At first an FBI artist drew in some open eyes from another photograph were imposed photographically.

The remaining two photos were taken in 1960 in connection with his conviction for armed robbery. He was received at the state penitentiary in Jefferson City, Mo., March 17, 1960, to serve 20 years. He escaped April 23, 1967.

The following investigation was conducted on 5/2/68
by SA THOMAS J. UTASKI at Newport, Ky.:

Mrs. ELIZABETH BRADLEY, 839 Washington Ave., Newport, Ky., (581-7886), advised that she saw an individual resembling JAMES EARL RAY in the vicinity of 9th St. and Washington Ave. in Newport, Ky., on two occasions in the immediate past. She stated that the individual who she saw bore a likeness to the newspaper picture of JAMES EARLY RAY carried in recent editions of the Cincinnati newspapers.

Mrs. BRADLEY stated that when the Cincinnati Enquirer first carried a picture of JAMES EARL RAY, the picture jogged her memory for a moment as if she had seen the individual pictured before. At the time she viewed the newspaper picture, she does not recall specifically seeing the individual pictured at any time or at any place. Her feeling at the time was that she had seen this individual some place at some time.

At 12:30 p.m. on 4/23/68 she saw the individual who she believes to closely resemble JAMES RAY on a street corner at 9th and Washington Avenue, in Newport, Ky. Mrs. BRADLEY was in the front of her house at 839 Washington Ave. immediately across from a bus stop on the even side of the 800 block of Washington Ave. The individual came from a Westerly direction on 9th, around the corner at Washington Ave. and stood waiting for someone to pick him up. Shortly after he arrived at the corner, a white female with sandy hair, attractive in appearance, drove up to the Washington and 9th St. corner coming from a Northerly direction on Washington Ave. and individual got into the automobile and they departed in a Southerly direction on Washington Ave. The woman was driving a 1963 black Fairlane automobile in average to poor condition. She did not notice

the license plate of the automobile. She stated that this incident took place at 12:30 p.m. on 4/23/68 when she was standing in her front yard.

On 4/29/68 at 7:30 p.m. she again saw the same individual dressed in the same clothes basically doing the same thing as the previous week. The individual rounded the corner coming from a Westerly direction on 9th Ave. and waited on the corner at Washington and 9th. Again the same sandy-haired white female picked him up shortly after he had arrived at the corner in a black 1963 Ford automobile. On the latter occasion, the individual sat on the steps of St. Stevens School at the 800 unit block of Washington Ave. directly across the street from Mrs. BRADLEY's residence. Mrs. BRADLEY recognized the possible connection between the individual whom she was viewing and the picture in the newspaper and in order not to arouse suspicion, she went into her residence which also afforded a clear view of the corner where the individual was waiting. Mrs. BRADLEY, although viewing the individual and the activities surrounding him was not able to get a good description of the white female driving the automobile nor the license plate on the black Ford automobile. Mrs. BRADLEY stated that again shortly after the individual arrived on the corner, he departed in the black Ford without anything unusual happening.

Mrs. BRADLEY described the individual as approximately 35 years old, 5'7" tall, with a round face and approximately 150 pounds in weight. She stated that the individual had dark brown hair and it appeared as if he were trying to grow his hair out from a crew cut in the not too distant past. His hair was very neat looking and was combed from his right to his left. Mrs. BRADLEY stated that the individual was a very neat dresser who wore the exact same outfit on both her viewings. She stated he wore gray sports pants and a mustard yellow shirt, open at throat, and also a dull drab yellow suit jacket. Mrs. BRADLEY also stated that on both occasions the individual was carrying a large grocery sack which was rolled down and it appeared to have something inside the bag. The sack was large, but rolled to such an extent as to have something small and light in the sack.

She recalls thinking at the time of viewing the individual that perhaps he had clothes in the sack. Mrs. BRADLEY stated that the individual did not act unreasonably suspicious and that she had seen nothing inconsistent with the theory that the individual was willing to work. Mrs. BRADLEY did state however that she has only seen the individual on two occasions at widely divergent times, which would indicate that the individual did not have a job to which he reported at the same time each day. Mrs. BRADLEY stated that she did see the individual on working days, the 23rd of April which was a Tuesday and the 29th of April which was a Monday.

Mrs. BRADLEY stated that she will keep a close watch of the area at 9th and Washington, in Newport, Ky. and that if anything comes to her attention relevant to the info she has furnished the FBI, she would immediately contact the interviewing Agent and apprise him of the new details.

Captain PATRICK CIAFARDINI, Chief of Detectives, Newport, Ky., PD, was advised of Mrs. BRADLEY's observations at 9th and Washington, in Newport, and CIAFARDINI stated that although no particular patrol car works in the area of 9th and Washington, he would advise patrol cars working in the general area to be on the alert for individuals fitting the description of JAMES RAY.

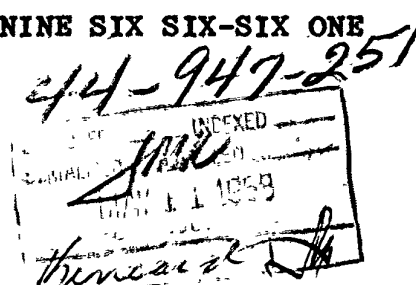

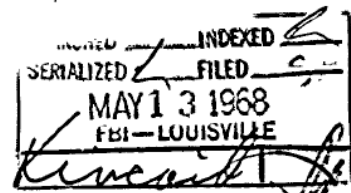

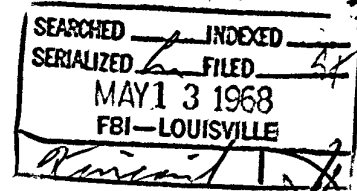
