Re Driver's License Check.

Investigation conducted by the Louisville Office at both the Driver's License Bureau, Frankfort, Ky., State Capital, and at the Jefferson Co. Driver's License Bureau, Louisville, reflects that a check of individual driver's license applications would be highly impractical and virtually prohibitive for the following listed reasons:

On 5/24/68, contact was had with Mr. HAROLD FOW, Director of the Driver's License Bureau, Louisville, Ky., and with Lt. ROGER WILHOIT, 5/27/68, the latter Director, Driver's License Bureau, Department of Public Safety, Frankfort, Ky., who advised as follows:

There are approximately 2 million separate files in the Drivers License Bureau representing holders of Kentucky Operator's Licenses. These records can be searched either through the code number assigned to each separate licensee or alphabetically. There is no manner by which the records can be searched as to a specific date of birth or age group and in order to accomplish this each file jacket would have to be searched individually. WILHOIT stated even if sufficient manpower were available to search these records, it would take an extremely long time to accomplish, probably as much as several months.

WILHOIT stated his department searches and files the drivers license applications or renewals received from all of the 120 counties in the state as they are received in Frankfort. At the present time all of the April, 1968, applications and renewals have been filed and the department is working on the group received in the Bureau as late as May 17, 1968. WILHOIT also stated that the applications for new drivers licenses are not filed separate from the renewals and there is a standard card utilized through the service with check marks appearing thereon where the applicant for a driver's license checks whether his request is for a new license or for a renewal. It was only WILHOIT's estimate, but he stated that applicants for new licenses in the state total approximately 5,000 monthly.

WILHOIT added that it would be a physical impossibility to check these drivers license records during a usual work day because of other commitments in the department, that his office is presently understaffed and if the work was to be done, in searching these 2 million records, it would have to be done after hours and time and a half overtime would have to be paid all of the employees. WILHOIT stated that it was only a rough estimate, but he believed the cost of searching these records would run about four cents a file. There is no state appropriation to meet this expense. With regard to a team of FBI Agents searching these records, WILHOIT stated that it would not be desirable to have any outsiders to go through the Bureau's records, no matter how responsible they might be. He pointed out that the Department of Public Safety has a responsibility to the public in reporting to the different examining stations prior traffic offenses for drivers license applicants and if one of these files on an offender was misplaced or misfiled and the offender was issued a legitimate driver's license and then became involved in a serious accident, the State of Kentucky would be liable from a civil standpoint for not identifying the applicant as a prior offender.

WILHOIT advised that when any applicant for a new license in the State of Kentucky makes an application, he would do so through any of the 120 counties in the state and would be required to take a written examination and even a driver's test regardless of whether he was licensed in another state. WILHOIT stated that these driver's tests are administered by examiners of the Kentucky State Police assigned to each of the counties in the state and as a practical manner in attempting to locate subject, JAMES EARL RAY, the individual license examiners could be contacted and shown the available photographs

of RAY to determine if he applied for a driver's license in the state.

In view of the above, UACB, the Louisville Office will contact each individual drivers license examiner in each of the 120 counties displaying and leaving wanted flyers on the subject with these examiners requesting that they be on the alert for any information indicating possible application for driver's license on the part of RAY. Efforts will be made at the same time to determine if anyone answering the description of RAY has made application during April and May of this year.

SAID THIS UNNAMED INDIVIDUAL INQUIRED ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN JAMES EARL RAY, AKA ERIC STARVO GALT, AND A CAUCASIAN MALE BY THE NAME OF JAMES HARDIN. THOMPSON SAID THIS UNNAMED INDIVIDUAL APPROACHED HIM IN EFFORT TO QUOTE GET A PIECE OF THE ACTION UNQUOTE CONCERNING THE REWARD MONEY. THOMPSON SAID THAT AS RESULT THIS CONVERSATION, HE NOW RECALLS DURING PERIOD MARCH ONE LAST TO MARCH SEVENTEEN LAST HE RECEIVED CALL FOR ERIC GAULT WHILE OPERATING HOTEL SWITCHBOARD. THOMPSON SAID WHEN HE ADVISED THE CALLER ERIC GALT HAD NO TELEPHONE IN HIS ROOM, THE MAN REQUESTED HIM TO LEAVE MESSAGE FOR ERIC GALT TO CALL JAMES C. HARDIN COLLECT. THIS CALLER PROVIDED THE CITY AND OPERATOR NUMBER, AS WELL AS NAME JAMES C. HARDIN. THOMPSON SAID HE RELAYED THIS INFORMATION TO GALT. THOMPSON ADVISED HE WAS QUITE SURE AS TO SPELLING OF NAME.

THOMPSON ADVISED THAT SUBSEQUENT TO INITIAL TELEPHONE CALL THERE WAS ONE OTHER, POSSIBLY TWO, CALLS BY THIS SAME INDIVIDUAL. HE ADVISED THIS CALLS CAME FROM BOTH ATLANTA AND NEW ORLEANS.

HE SAID SUBSEQUENT TO THESE TELEPHONE CALLS A PERSON WHO IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS JAMES C. HARDIN CAME TO ST. FRANCIS HOTEL SOMETIME DURING PERIOD OF MARCH ONE TO SEVENTEEN, SIXTYEIGHT. HE ADVISED THIS INDIVIDUAL DID NOT RESIDE AT ST. FRANCIS HOTEL. THOMPSON DESCRIBED THIS INDIVIDUAL AS MALE CAUCASIAN, THIRTY FIVE TO FORTY FIVE SEVEN TO FIVE EIGHT IN HEIGHT, ONE FORTY TO ONE FIFTY POUNDS, DARK HAIR COMBED BACK, NEAT, EYES POSSIBLY DARK, SLENDER BUILD, DARK COMPLEXION, SLIGHTLY ACNE SCARRED, SPOKE WITH SLIGHT SOUTHERN ACCENT.

THOMPSON SAID THE INDIVIDUAL WHO BROUGHT HARDIN TO HIS ATTENTION DOES NOT WISH TO IDENTIFY HIMSELF. HE SAID HE BELIEVES THIS INDIVIDUAL IS SUBJECT OF OUTSTANDING WARRANT FOR SOME UNKNOWN OFFENSE. THOMPSON WAS ADVISED OF IMPORTANCE OF THIS MATTER AND, FURTHER, THAT HE COULD POSSIBLY BE SUBPOENAED TO PROVIDE ABOVE INFORMATION. THOMPSON SAID HE MADE PROMISE TO THIS INDIVIDUAL WHICH HE FULLY INTENDS TO KEEP. HE STATED IT WOULD TAKE COURT ACTION TO INDUCE HIM TO IDENTIFY THIS INDIVIDUAL.

The killer of Dr. Martin Luther King was observed in Thelma's Lounge at 601 E Gray street and at this time the caller could observe him in the lounge.

The caller stated she did not wish to give out her name at the present time but wanted some agents to come to her home at 612 E. Gray, accross from the Lounge. She further stated that she wished the agents to come to her first so she could turn the man in and get credit for the apprehension.

The caller stated that the subject was a w/m and was acting funny and seemed out of place in a colored bar. The caller gave a brief description of the subject and it could possibly fit the subject, but she stated that she got the description from the paper.

The caller further advised that if someone did not come down and check this report out she would "call Washington or some other official and report that no action was being taken to apprehend the killer of King."

The caller was a negro female.

Supervisor Peters, SA Hutchison advised and SAs Cavanaugh and Hornback sent to check out the report.
