Referenced communication concerns an anonymous letter received at the Bureau which was postmarked 4/13/68 at Chicago, Illinois. The letter is dated 4/12/68 and indicates in part "about the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, it is not a white man (person). It was a colored person who is now hiding out at Hall of Motels in Memphis, Tennessee, on Fealder Street."

A review of a street guide for the Memphis metropolitan area does not list a street named Fealder. A review of a list of all the motels in the Memphis metropolitan area does not list a motel by the name of Hall of Motels.

A review of a street guide does not indicate a street in the Memphis metropolitan area that is similar in spelling or pronunciation to Fealder. The list of motels does not indicate a name anywhere similar to that of the Hall of Motels. None of the motels listed are located on a street with a name anywhere similar to that of Fealder.

Inasmuch as no information was developed as to the existence of a motel named Hall of Motels nor a street named Fealder, no further investigation is being conducted.

On 4/24/68, JOHN HOOTENL owner, Hooten's Texaco Service Station, 5071 Summer Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee, advised SA BAUER that JAMES GANN had been employed by him on and off for approximately 3 weeks starting sometime in the last week of March until April 11, 1968. HOOTEN stated that while GANN was working for him he lived somewhere on Wilburn Avenue in Memphis, and that GANN stated that he was originally from Marked Tree, Arkansas. He stated that GANN did not look anything like the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and could not have been involved in the KING killing because he was working at the service station on 4/4/68 up until 6:00 p.m.

HOOTEN stated that on 4/11/68, GANN came around to the service station with his wife and their car loaded with their family possessions and filled the car with gas and stated that he was going to St. Louis. HOOTEN added that this was GANN's second wife and that he had been previously married and divorced and was having some type of problem with his first wife over either alimony or child support payments.

A check of Memphis PD and Shelby County SO records do not reflect a record for the name of JAMES GANTS, JAMES GANTZ or JAMES GANN.

On 4/16/68 Mr. WILLARD H. RUNDQUIST, Vice-President, Wabash, Inc., 1217 Florida, Memphis, Tenn., was contacted in regard to a letter which he had given to a friend of his, Mr. FRED GATTAS, owner, FRED T. GATTAS Distributing Company, Inc., 387 South Main St., Memphis, Tenn., and which letter was later turned over to the FBI. He stated that he had written this letter and in it he had mentioned the name of a former employee of WABASH who he thought might possibly be involved in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. He stated that he furnished this information to Mr. GATTAS because he, himself, had no connections with local authorities but Mr. GATTAS was well known in Memphis and might know what should be done with it.

Mr. RUNDQUIST stated that neither he nor GATTAS felt this information had much value but he felt it should be brought to the attention of the persons investigating the death of Dr. KING. He stated that his only reason to suspect JERRY PAUL MC CARTER is because he believes that MC CARTER drives a creamcolored Mustang and that he has heard MC CARTER on a number of occasions speak against Negro people. He/stated this is not unusual, however, because he has heard many other Southerners say such similar things. Mr. RUNDQUIST made available the personnel file on JERRY PAUL MC CARTER, which reflected that his home address while employed at Wabash was 4085 Palm St.. Memphis, , date of birth Tenn., Social Security No. place of birth - Corinth, Miss., height - 5'll", weight - 178 lbs., married, no children. RUNDQUIST stated that he did not believe MC CARTER had ever served in the Armed Forces because he had overheard him mentioning the possibility of being drafted shortly prior to his departing Wabash. 44-1987-204-139

On 4/17/68 Mr. PAUL MC CARTER, 2152 Layton Ave., Memphis, Tenn., was contacted at his home and he advised that he has been employed for the past nine weeks with the Triangle Distributors, Inc., Tupelo, Miss., as a salesman working the Memphis, Tenn., area. Mr. MC CARTER stated that on Thursday,

April 4, 1968, he worked from approximately 7:30 A. M. to 4:00 P. M. in the afternoon in the Collierville and Germantown areas and that he returned home that afternoon and he and his wife worked in his yard. He stated that he did not know that Dr. KING had been killed until his brother, EVERETT BAKER, 3824 Overton Crossing, Memphis, Tenn., called about 7:00 P. M. that evening and told him. He stated that he has never made any statements in regard to Dr. KING which could be construed as threatening statements and that he would never kill anyone, regardless of his personal feelings. He stated that he had no information to furnish in regard to this matter.

He made available State of Tennessee Owner's Identification Card which reflected that a 1966 Ford Mustang, Title No. 11427832, Vehicle Identification No. 6F07T397001, was registered in the name of PAUL MC CARTER, 2152 Layton, Memphis, Tenn., lien in favor of the Union Planters Mational Bank, Box 131, Memphis.

Mr. MC CARTER stated that this Mustang is blue in color and this fact was verified by reporting Agent.

In view of the above, it is suggested that no additional investigation be conducted in this matter.

Mr. FRANCIS J. RUGRAFF, Manager, Delta Warehouse, Inc., 553 Plum Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee, furnished the following information:

He advised that he has been acquainted with an individual named JOHN E. GALT since about 1949 or 1950. He stated that GALT is a self employed cotton and linen broker and salesman with an office at 800 N. Clark Street, Chicago, Illinois. He stated that GALT resides somewhere in the Chicago area, but does not have a residence address for him.

He further stated that GALT is covered under the Delta Warehouse, Inc., group life insurance policy and that his number is 332901 and that he has been so covered since August 26, 1958. He advised that GALT has been in the cotton business all of his life or almost 50 years. RUGRAFF stated that he last saw GALT during a Delta convention at the Conrad Hilton Hotel in Chicago, Illinois, between March 9 and March 12, 1968, and recalls that he and GALT had been discussing how bad business had been this year, RUGRAFF furnished the following description of GALT.

RUGRAFF stated that he is fairly certain that GALT does not have any children and has never heard of any relation of GALT named ERIC STARVO GALT.

J. H. COFFEY, 7898 Raleigh-Millington Road, examined artists conceptions 1, 2 and 3, and the photo of ERIC STARVO GALT, and advised that none of them were (First Name Unknown) CRAVENS. COFFEY feels that CRAVENS is a reputable businessman and has no reason to suspect that he is involved in any way with the assassination of DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING other than he looks very much like the artists conception that first appeared in the newspaper.

CRAVENS is employed by Cravens Fabric and Supply Company, Little Rock, Arkansas, and has visited COFFEY 3 times in the last year. He comes to exhibit various fabrics to COFFEY, who is an upholsterer.

At 3:50 P. M. 4/24/68, an individual identifying himself as CARROL WYLLE, TV Sales, Telephone 275-2381, telephonically contacted the Memphis Office and advised he desired to furnish the following information as being possibly of value in the investigation of the shooting of MARTIN LUTBER KING:

WISTER J. HAYES, aka DUB HAYES, white male, age 45, 6', 185 lbs., currently employed as salesman for Zayres on Summer Avenue and believed residing on Paulus, was formerly employed by WYLIE. HAYES is originally from Louisiama and was formerly employed by Goodyear of Goodrich in the Lake Charles, La., area but has been in Memphis for the past three and one-half years. HAYES hates Negroes, is a member of the Klan and a "radical" who is always "causing controversy." WYLIE said HAYES is an "extremist" and a "psycho," whom he did not believe would shoot anyone, but who would be sympathetic to and assist anyone who might shoot a Negro. WYLIE said sometime ago HAYES was trying to raise momey for the defense of the white men involved in the "Civil Rights Case, "and made several trips in his efforts.

Efforts were made to obtain more specifics concerning the information furnished but WYLIE repeatedly said he had no such information and repeated he had no knowledge HAYES was involved in the shooting of KING but thought the FBI should be made aware of HAYES.

The following investigation was conducted at Nashville, Tennessee, by SA LAWRENCE J. OLSON, SR:

On/4/25/68, unsuccessful efforts were made to locate HENRY O'NEILL, Manager, American Airlines, Nashville, Tennessee. At American Airlines, Nashville, it was ascertained that Mr. O'NEILL was not working that date; however, he would return to work the following morning.

On 4/26/68, Mr. O'NEILL was contacted, at which time he advised that during the period 2/19-21/68, he was attending an American Airlines conference in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and one evening during the conference, and during the cocktail hour, the conversation turned to the possible racial situation in the U. S. during the summer of 1968. Mr. O'NEILL advised at that time he was rather pessimistic relative to renewed rioting breaking out during the coming summer at various places in the U. S. He said he had stated at that time that it was almost certain that Chicago would have difficulty this summer, in his opinion. Another person at the party took exception to this statement and a \$5 wager was made, with O'NEILL wagering that a riot would break out in Chicago the summer of 1968.

As the party went on, the conversation continued along this line and ROBERT ROULSTON of American Airlines, Washington, D. C., indicated he felt that the racial situation was deteriorating and that chances are that MARTIN LUTHER KING would be killed sometime prior to May 1, 1968. He, O'NEILL, took exception to this remark and a \$100 wager was made. He bet that MARTIN LUTHER KING would not be killed before May 1, 1968, and ROULSTON bet that KING would be killed.

O'NEILL said the conversation was rather a frivolous one at the time the wager was made and he did not take the conversation seriously and is sure ROULSTON did not either; however, on 4-4-68 while en route to vacation in Panama City, Florida, he learned that MARTIN LUTHER KING had been assassinated. He was quite shocked and felt obliged to fill out a check in the amount \$100, remembering the wager. He sent this to ROULSTON who replied by note indicating that

the check had been torn up as he felt it was a "bad bet" and he felt quite badly about having even suggested a wager along these particular lines.

Mr. O'NEILL advised that he has no information whatever regarding the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING; however, any information that does come to his attention in this regard, or regarding any other matters of investigative interest, will be immediately brought to the attention of the FBI.

#### MEMORANDUM TO ALL AGENTS:

#### RE: MURKIN

The Bureau has advised that all offices are to maintain contact with all mass communications media to insure that there is frequent reference to RAY and to his connection with this case. All Agents, particularly all resident agents, should be alert to all possibilities to obtain publicity in this matter and should make every effort to cooperate with the news media and to encourage them to carry photographs and articles concerning the subject.

All resident agents should make certain that appropriate fingerprint stops have been placed with those departments in the resident agency territory which have fingerprint files.

Nashville Resident Agency should insure that all possible stops are placed against the possibility of the subject obtaining a driver's license or automobile registration.

The Bureau has also advised that investigation should be conducted at all "hippie" rooming houses and similar establishments to obtain any information whatsoever concerning RAY. In those resident agencies where such rooming houses exist, the senior resident agent should consider it his responsibility to make assignments to insure that investigation is conducted in these areas. All Agents in their daily contacts in rooming houses of any nature should make certain that the subject's photograph is shown to persons managing such houses and if believed advisable, identification orders should be left on the premises for the assistance of the rooming house operator.

He stated he was in Birmingham through 4/2/68 after which he returned to Memphis. He stated he was driving a 1968 Chevrolet, Tennessee license JP 8387.

BIRDSONG stated he at no time used the name WILLIAM BUDING during his stayiin Birmingham.

Both BUTLER and MEEGAN leave the apartment in the morning hours and do not return until about 5:30 p.m. EBER described BUTLER as a white male, age 35-36, 175 pounds, black hair, BUTLER drives a Tan Chrysler. EBER obtained a telephone number left by BUTLER with the manager of the building and upon checking it determined it is a number listed to BUTLER's parents at Corinth, Mississippi. There were four people in the party and GERLT listed his ocupation as an employed of Jerry's Nursery.

Mrs. GRIDER recalled GERLT and his family and stated that GERLT informed herk that he was enroute to a nursery in McMinnville, Tenn. She added that GERLT spent only one night at the motel, departing on the morning of 3/11/68.

> At approximately 9 a.m. on 4/29/68, I discussed the evidence I had on hand with Director of Fire and Police FRANK C. HOLLOMAN, Memphis, Tennessee. HOLLOMAN stated that since he had not received the letter from the FBI Laboratory as yet he would appreciate the FBI holding the evidence until such time as the letter was received by the Memphis PD.

On the afternoon of 5/2/68. Inspector N. E. ZACHARY. Memphis Police Department, telephonically contacted me and advised that the Memphis Police Department had received the transmittal letter from the FBI Laboratory regarding the evidence in this case. I asked him if he would be interested in coming and picking up the evidence on that afternoon. He requested the evidence be held and stated he would be over to secure the evidence on the morning of Friday, 5/3/68.


As of 9 a.m., 5/3/68, the nine boxes, unopened, were delivered into the custody of Inspector ZACHERY. I told Inspector ZACHERY that there was a possibility that a request might be made later for additional examinations in connection with the evidence. Inspector ZACHARY said he was aware of this and as a result thereof he planned to deliver all evidence to the office of the State Attorney General and that the State Attorney General would assume custody of the evidence and place it under lock and key.

Inspector ZACHARY also stated it was at this time the intention of the State Attorney General to present the material to a Grand Jury on May 7, 1968. Inspector ZACHARY stated they anticipate requesting a first degree murder warrant for JAMES EARL RAY. He also said there is a possibility the State Attorney General's Office might want a representative of the FBI to testify in connection with this evidence.

The above information was furnished to Assistant Director ROSEN on 5/3/68.

On 4/15/68 THEIMA GALLIN or GALTIN was contacted by Bureau Agents at 47 Avon Road, Memphis, and advised that this was both her place of employment and residence. She stated she is a full-time live-in maid for the WILLIAM D. JIMISON, JR. family, above address. She stated that she did not wish at this time to be interviewed at length while in the home of her employer, but she would furnish the following information:

She stated that she had previously called Rev. L. A. HAMBLIN, Golden Leaf Baptist Church, Memphis, concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. She stated that it was her opinion that there was some connection between the killing of Dr. KING and the assassination of President KENNEDY in Dallas, Texas. She was unable to furnish any specific information in this regard, but stated she felt that a conspiracy was involved in both of these killings. She spoke in a rambling, almost incoherrent, manner, and was unable to substantiate her opinions in any manner.

She stated her employer, Mr. WILLIAM D. JIMISON, JR., owned a private plane and did a considerable amount of flying around the country and she felt that this activity, was somewhat suspicious. She stated that maybe he has some knowledge or information concerning the KING killing. She repeatedly stated she did not feel free in speaking to Agents at this time and that she would come to the FBI Office the following morning and furnish additional information.

On 4/15/68 Mrs. WILLIAM D. JIMISON, JR., advised that THELMA has been employed by her for a number of years and that she considers her to be a capable employee. She stated, however, that she has a tendency to exaggerate things and that THELMA has spoken often of her belief that a conspiracy was involved in the killing of Dr. KING.

Mrs. Jimison further stated that her husband is presently in Colorado on a business trip and that he is not employed by the U. S. Government in any capacity. She stated he is the President of the Mid-Continent Corporation. a real estate company, with offices at 16 North 3rd St., Memphis, and also is Vice President of the W. D. Jimison and Sons Company, 2306 South Parkway East, Memphis, Tenn. She stated her husband does own a private plane and does fly a great deal in connection with his business and on vacation. She stated her busband attended a convention of the Sportsman Pilot Association in Litchfield, Arizona, during the week of \*April 6-13, 1968. She stated she and her husband have three children, a son and 2 daughters, WILLIAM JIMISON, age 16, student at Memphis University School; LEE JIMISON, age 19, student at William Woods College, Fullton, Missouri, and GAY JIMISON, age 12, student at Hutcheson School, Memphis, Tenn. She also stated her family has lived in Memphis for approximately 20 years.

THEIMA GALLIN or GALTIN has not appeared at the FBI Office, and repeated efforts to contact her have been unsuccessful. On 4/25/68 Mrs. JIMISON telephonically advised that THEIMA had been gone for about 2 weeks attending a funeral in West Tennessee. She stated THEIMA left without saying exactly where she was going or if she would return. Mrs. JIMISON stated she will contact the FBI should she return.

JEWELL J. WILLIAMS, Mess Alley, Savannah, Tennessee, advised that he was released from the Federal Penitentiary in Springfield, Missouri, in July 1967. He returned to Savannah, Tennessee, where his mother ANNIE DOWNING operates a used clothing store at 913 Clay Street.

WILLIAMS stated that in September 1967 at approximately 8:00 p.m., an individual who strongly resembles JAMES EARL RAY came to his residence, 912 Clay Street, located directly across the street from the above-mentioned used clothing store. This individual wanted to know who sweed the store and if he could buy some ased clothing.

WILLIAMS advised that he told this man the store was closed but he would open the store for him. This individual told WILLIAMS that he was an FBI man and he was investigating gun running between Tennessee and Mississippi and needed used clothing to assist him in his work. He advised that he sold this individual two shirts and two pair of pants for 50 cents each and that this person changed from a sport shirt and pants into the old chothes. WILLIAMS advised that he laughed at this individual and told him he looked like "a local hillbilly." He added that the individual got mad at him and began berating him for making functions.

Mr. WILLIAMS further advised that he knew the man was not an FBI Agent because he had been in too many prisons to be fooled by such a story. He stated that he was suspicious of this individual and memorized the license number of the car he was driving. He stated he later wrote this information on the wall of the house where he was living. He recalled that this person was driving a 1965, 1966, or 1967 white Chevrolet bearing either Alabama or Mississippi license. He recalled that he attempted to charge this man \$1 apiece for the shirts and pants but they became engaged in an argument and the

unknown individual stated that he had traveled all the way from Iuka, Mississippi, to get the clothing and that he could have bought it for 50 cents each in Iuka. WILLIAMS stated that he sold the man the clothing for 50 cents each.

#### Mr. WLLLIAMS described this individual as

Mr. WILLIAMS recalled that the individual left in his white Chevrolet at a high rate of speed and that is the last time he has seen or heard from him.

Mrs. JAMES HARDY, 912 Clay Street, Savannah, Tennessee, consented to the Agent examining the left side of the wall in her front room. It was noted that there was writing on this wall. A careful check of the pencil notation on the wall revealed the following: 1964 or later Chevrolet, white, 70 4699, and the date 9/28.

Mrs. HARDY advised that she has lived in this house for approximately three months and the writing was there when she moved in. She could furnish no information regarding the person who made the notation on the wall.

At 2:45 p.m., this date, Captain JEWELL RAY Inspectional Bureau, Memphis Police Department, advised that he had just received an anonymous telephone call from a person who identified himself as CHARLIE who stated that JAMES EARL RAY's body will be found between the 15th and 18th of May in an area 50 miles south of where the individual from Baltimore, Maryland, was arrested by the Mexican police a couple of weeks ago. According to this anonymous caller RAY was paid \$50,000 to kill KING but was only able to spend approximately \$10,000. This money according to the caller passed through some 12 people's hands before reaching RAY and that arrangements had been made at least three years ago to assassinate KING. anonymous caller stated that the individual who arranged KING's death and who paid the \$50,000 desired that RAY's body be found. Caller stated that RAY departed Memphis immediately upon assassinating KING, was out of town within 12 minutes, traveled to Atlanta, Ga., subsequently traveled from Atlanta and returned to Birmingham, thereafter traveling from Birmingham to Las Vegas, to Phoenix, Arizona, and down into Mexico.

Captain RAY stated that the identical information has been received by two other police officers within the past thirty minutes, from the same anonymous source.
