On 4-6-68, Lt. McCACHERN, Homicide Squad, Memphis, Tenn., PD, advised this office as follows:

He stated he received call from ROBERT LEONARD of Louisville, Ky., who in turn informed him that a RUSSELL PEACOCK of Shepherdsville, Ky. closely resembles picture of UNSUB which appeared in local newspaper. He stated PEACOCK is an active racist in the Louisville area and reported to be member of the KKK. He allegedly has been leader of several burnings and arrested several times in connection with these by the Louisville PD. Memphis indices negative.

Louisville requested to make appropriate inquiry at Louisville PD for any record regarding RUSSELL PEACOCK; search its own indices for information of pertinence, and thereafter establish whereabouts of RUSSELL PEACOCK on 4/4/68, it being pertinent to note that Dr. KING was mudered at approximately 6 p.m. on 4-4-68.

Re: SANITATION WORKERS STRIKE, MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE RACIAL MATTERS

On April 5, 1968, Lieutenant E.H. Arkin, Inspectional Bureau, Memphis Police Department, Memphis, Tennessee, advised that shooting, vandalism and looting continued throughout the night of April 4, 1968, and into the early hours of April 5, 1968. These disturbances tapered off at approximately 3 a.m., April 5, 1968, but sporadic sniping at police cars, vandalism and looting have continued during the day of April 5, 1968. According to Lieutenant E. H. Arkin over 115 persons have been arrested in connection with this disturbance, over 30 persons injured and several policemen were hurt. No deaths have occurred; however, Ellis Tate, a Negro male, age 26, was discovered looting a liquor store on the evening of April 4, 1968, and he fired several shots at police officers with a rifle and was in turn seriously wounded by return fire from Memphis policemen.

Lieutenant Arkin advised that this distrubance was controlled by 3 a.m. on the morning of April 5, 1968, and that 1,131 members of the Tennessee National Guarse are not duty in Memphis patrolling streets in cooperation with officers of the Memphis Police Department, Shelby Cousing Market Lee Sheriff's Office and approximately two hundred members of the Tennessee Highway Patrol.

On the evening of April 4, 1968, Frank C. Holloman, Lo. Memphis Fire and Police Director, announced that all city and Shelby County schools would be closed April 5, 1968. A curfew was imposed by Memphis Mayor Henry Loeb from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., beginning Thursday, April 4, 1968, and is to continue in effect until further notice. Mr. Holloman announced that all liquor stores and night clubs are to be

Lieutenant Arkin advised that attorneys for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and Community on the Move for Equality (COME) requested permission on the morning of April 5, 1968, from Federal Judge Bailey Brown to permit a memorial march for Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., to be held at Memphis, Tennessee, on April 7, 1968, or April 8, 1968, He added that Ralph D. Abernathy, Vice President at Large, SCLC, announced on the morning of April 5, 1968, that a mass march in support of striking sanitation workers will be held in Memphis, Tennessee, April 8, 1968, regardless of whether Federal Judge Bailey Brown issues a restraining order or not.

On April 5, 1968, Judge Bailey Brown, United States District Court, Memphis, Tennessee, issued the following Opinion and Temporary Injunction regarding the contemplated march in support of striking sanitation workers:

At the inception of this hearing it was agreed by counsel that, in addition to defendants' motion to dissolve the restraining order, the Court would at the same time, and on the same proof, consider the City's application for a temporary injunction.

"Following the hearing, the Court advised counsel in chambers that it would issue a temporary injunction permitting the march under substantially the same restrictions as those proposed and submitted to the Court by defendants.

"Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., suffered his tragic death last evening and counsel were called back into conference this morning for further discussion. Counsel for the City stated that the City now joins with defendants in their proposal that the march be held and under the restrictions submitted to the Court by defendants.

"It is therefore ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED as follows:

'The march will commence on Monday, April 8, 1968, at 11 o'clock A.M. or any day thereafter provided that the defendants will provide at least 24 hours advance notice to the plaintiff, the City of Memphis.

- "B. The marchers will march four abreast and in the approximate middle of the street.

Lieutenant Arkin added that at noon on April 5, 1968, approximately one hundred members of the Memphis Ministerial Association visited Memphis Mayor Henry Loeb demanding that Loeb immediately settle the sanitation strike. The Association President, Rabbi James Wax, delivered a speech attacking Loeb and blaming him for the current tense racial situation in Memphis.

Lieutenant Arkin advised that sporadic looting, arson, and sniping continued throughout the evening of April 5, 1968, and that a 62-year-old Negro male, Roosevelt Jennings, 2443 Eldridge, was shot by a police officer when caught attempting to break into a liquor store located at 1249 Hollywood. Lieutenant Arkin added that Roosevelt Jennings was taken to the John Gaston Hospital and is in satisfactory condition.

Ronald Johnson, 111th Military Intelligence, Third Army, Memphis, Tennessee, has advised that the Tennessee National Guard has been increased to 3,800 men in Memphis, Tennessee.

Lieutenant Arkin advised that approximately 200 sanitation workers and their sympathizers marched single-file from Clayborn Temple to Memphis City Hall and returned with no incidents occurring.

According to Lieutenant Arkin, this march was completely peaceful. Lieutenant Arkin added that the curfew imposed by Memphis Mayor Henry Loeb from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m., beginning Thursday, April 4, 1968, remains in effect.

One pair of men's shorts. (Waistband in unstretched condition, one side, measures approximately 11 3/4 inches, which would be waistband of approximately $23\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Fully extended waistband measures approximately $17\frac{1}{2}$ inches, one side or a total of 35 inches.)

T-shirt, size 42-44, designated "Jockey Power Knit" T-shirt, large size. It appears on visual examination that lower portion of T-shirt has been cut.

Laboratory requested to examine T-shirt and shorts for any hidden laundry marks and any other examination that may help to determine origin of garments. In connection with the laundry tape that appears on both the shorts and T-shirt, the number O2B-6 appears. Since a portion of the left side of each of these tapes is missing, the possibility that the "O" might be the remnant of the letter "D" or some other combinations should not be overlooked.

Inquiry of the Albany Office discloses that the Textile Marking Machine Co., Syracuse, N.Y., has a representative, JOE COMBS, 5232 Devonshire Dr., Oxenhill, Maryland, Tel. 301-248-6128, in residence in Oxenhill. COMBS reportedly has the ability to determine on inspection of laundry marking tape as to whether or not this is type tape produced by his company and type of machine producing same.

ROBERT MANPEL, Special Agent in Charge, U. S. Secret Service, Columbus, Ohio, advised on 5/16/66, that victim telephoned his office and said he was contemplating a trip to Washington, D. C., that he may call the White House or Justice Department. On 5/17/66, Reverend ROBERT TRUMP of the North Community Lutheran Church, Columbus, Ohio, advised MADDEN appeared in his office and requested money for gasoline in order to leave Columbus and go west. MADDEN

told Reverend TRUMP that he had become overcome by pressures brought upon him because of communism.

On 3/10/67, the Attorney General's Office, State of Ohio, conducted a limited investigation because at present victim published a typewritten newspaper known as "The American" which is ultra-right and attacks subversive groups.

An extra copy of this report is being designated for the Eureau for dissemination to U. S. Secret Service, Washington, D. C. One copy is being furnished U. S. Secret Service, Cincinnati, Ohio, with FD-376, in view of apparent emotional instability and irrational behavior on the part of MADDEN.

On February 4, 1967, this office received a telephone call from a JOHN MADDEN, 910 Clinton Springs Avenue,
Apartment #2, Cincinnati, Chio, in which he stated he had
just received an extortion note and requested an interview.
He was interviewed at the Cincinnati Office by Special Agent
GEOFGE J. KLEIH on the same day and furnished the following
information:

MADDEN stated he ran a newspaper in Columbus, Chio, from December, 1955, through March, 1966, titled The American". This publication was strongly anti-communistic and MADDEN stated he received many favorable reactions, not only in and around the Columbus area, but throughout the country. This favorable reaction intensified MADDEN's attacks on Communistic factions and he said he received several unpleasant telephone calls and verbal taunts from anonymous individuals in the Columbus area during this period. MADDEN stated that on or about February 3, 1966, he was driving to Cleveland, Chio, to hear Vice President EUSERT HUMPHRET give a speech in that city. Several miles outside the city, on Route 22 entering Cleveland, MADDEN said four white men pulled up beside his car, one rolled down a window and two pistel shots were fired at MADDEN, both missing him.

After the incident in Cleveland, MADDEN returned to Columbus and continued with his newspaper for about thirty days before family pressure caused him to give it up. He then left Columbus for about five months and went to California where he felt he would be safe from the "pressures" that were building up. MADDEN stated he did not report these "pressures" to either the police or any Federal organization.

MADDEN left California and set up residence in Cincinnati, Chio, the latter part of June, 1966, and currently lives with his mother at 910 Clinton Springs Avenue. Since moving here he had not encountered any difficulties until he had to settle an automobile claim in Columbus on January 31, 1967. MADDEN claims that while walking in downtrwn Columbus on the date named he encountered a MICHAEL HOUSER, who MADDEN claims is the chairman of the "Sparticist" organization in Columbus, along with two other men; one a tall blond, and the other a short, stocky man, about 21 years old. MADDEN said that HOUSER called to him and stated "Hey MADDEN, I see you're back. I've got something I've got to tell you. HOUSER then proceeded to tell MADDEN where he lived, where he worked, hours he worked, and the scores he made on his Civil Service Examination. MADDEN did not take this seriously and did not report the incident to any authorities.

MADDEN is employed as an attendant at Longview Hospital and claims the superintendent had received two notes requesting MADDEN's dismissal. MADDEN advised he received a typewritten note at his residence about three weeks ago, postmarked Columbus, stating "Get out". He tore the letter up and considered it a joke.

Mrs. EMILE MADDEN, 910 Clinton Springs, Cincinnati, Ohio, appeared at the Cincinnati Office of the FBI and furnished the following information to SA GEORGE J. ELEIN and Complaint Clerk RICHARD D. SCHWEIN:

On February 7, 1967, she received a letter addressed to her son, JCHN K. HADDEN. This letter was postmarked February 6, 1967, at Mt. Summit, zip code 47361. The letter stated:

"Madden
Serious! Get out
or
Die!!
FBi Sat. no

help"

The letter was signed by a drawing of a shield containing a star and crossed sickles with the letters "M2-1."

Mrs. MADDEM stated she was aware that her son had talked to the FBI concerning threatening letters he had been receiving. Because he became frightened he left Cincinnati and told his mother he was heading for the West. She has no idea as to his present whereabouts.

Mrs. MADDEH stated her son had been employed as an attendant at Longview State Hospital, but he told her he had been discharged from his position because of a threatening letter sent to the superintendent of the Longviews State Hospital. She commented that her son told her the superintendent of Longview was "not enough an American."

Mrs. MADDEN advised that she is employed as a practical nurse for a family in Cincinnati, but she did not care to state the name of this family as they are very strict. Mrs. MADDEN further advised she could not spend much time being interviewed as she was suffering from the flu and had a doctor's appointment. She stated she had no knowledge of her son JOHN K. MADDEN's associates or friends and he had been living with her at 910 Clinton Springs since he arrived in Cincinnati in June, 1966. Prior to coming to Cincinnati her son lived in a hotel room in Columbus, Ohio, was employed in a factory at Columbus, and printed his own newspaper which was called "The American" and which was anti-communist. Her son feels he is receiving threatening letters because of his "anti-communist" activities.

Mrs. MADDEN stated that JOHN has had nervous problems since he was very young. At age 3 he was hit in the head with a baseball bat. His father, JAMES H. MADDEN, is an alcoholic and contributed to a poor home situation. JOHN dropped out of school after completing 9 or 10 years. He joined the U. S. Marine Corps at 17 and was discharged because of emotional problems. When he was 21 or 22 he was arrested by the FBI at Knoxville, Tennessee on bad check charges. Prior to his trial he jumped bond and was the subject of an investigation to locate him. He surrendered himself to the FBI at Knoxville and was subsequently sentenced to a term in a Federal prison under the Youth Corrections Act.

She recalls that he served approximately four years in Federal penal institutions at Chillicothe, Chio, and Terre Haute, Indiana. At both institutions he was given psychiatric treatment because of his instability.

Mrs, MADDEN recalled that JOHN was married to ELIZABETH MADDEN whom he met in Knoxville, Tennessee. They knew each other a few days and moved to California. Mrs. MADDEN has never seen or talked to ELIZABETH MADDEN.

JOHN and ELIZABETH are supposedly divorced now and ELIZABETH is somewhere in California.

Mrs. MADDEN was shown the letter she received and asked if the handwriting could be that of her son. She stated that this was a possibility and that JOHN could very well be "sick." She stated she knew of no one who would want to harm her son nor did she know any of his friends or acquaintances who might do this as a practical joke.

Mrs. MADDEN said that she believed her son had been persecuted in his trial at Federal court in Knowville, Tennessee, and he had been sent up falsely. She did not think the FBI was quite fair to JOHN and because he felt he would go to prison he jumped bond.

She stated she had received no more letters. She also advised that she believed additional information concerning her son could be obtained from the U. S. Secret Service at Columbus, Ohio.

On February 17, 1967, victim wrote a letter to the Cincinnati FBI Office, postmarked Los Angeles, California, 2/15/67, which letter is set out as follows:

"Dear Sir:

My mother tells me that your agents think that I wrote the "death", letters that I got in the mail from the M-2-1. She also tells me that your agents want a specimen of my hand-writing...just to make clear that I did not write the letters.

"First off leave my mother alone, she isn't to be involved and she will not answer any more stupid questions.

"Second, I will not give you anymore information, never again, about anything since your office is trying to save face for the communist. No, no, no, I did not write the death letters to myself.

"Third, I contacted the FBI here in Los Angeles, and a wise guy was: on the other end so I hung up.

"Finally. I will take all necessary action "on myoown," against the "Sparticists." and the M-2-1. I was in
