On 4/10/68, JUDSON RANDA LETT, Chief Analyst, Analysis Laboratory, Institute Cleaning Plant, 8021 Georgia Avenue, Silver Springs, Maryland, advised the institute supplies dry cleaning methods throughout the United States and the world.

LETT advised upon viewing the photos of the Thermal Seal Markings, that he knew of no way to identify the tape markings with any specific laundry-cleaners. He advised that markings are significant to a particular laundry-cleaners, but the only way to determine the specific establishment would be by process of elimination. This could only be done by showing the thermo tape to these establishments.

LETT advised that the red thermo tape is used by some laundry-cleaners to indicate the items are to be handled as a special, that is being done as soon as possible.

LETT advised that there are three methods of marking clothes. (1) thermal seal, (2) permanent ink markings, and (3) pre-marked strip tags, which are stapled on the clothes.
