DAVID M. KREPCHIN, Manager, San Diego Branch, M. Rosenblatt and Son, Incorporated, Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, 707 Broadway, San Diego, California, advised as follows:

JOHN DONALDSON WILLARD has been employed at M. Rosenblatt and Son as an electrical design draftsman since June, 1967. He provided a personal record on WILLARD which disclosed that he had served in the United States Navy from August 18, 1943 to April 1, 1963, leaving the Navy as a Senior Chief Electrician's Mate, Navy Serial Number 866-62-02. He was described as follows:

KREPCHIN advised that WILLARD had been sent from M. Rosenblatt and Company on March 25, 1968 to work for the M. Rosenblatt and Son representative at Lockheed Shipbuilding and Construction Company, 2929 Sixteenth Avenue, Southwest, Seattle, Washington, to report for work on March 26, 1968. KREPCHIN advised that he had received word that WILLARD had reported for work as scheduled, and was certain that he had worked from March 26 to March 29, 1968, but could not personally vouch for this attendance at work, and did not know whether WILLARD was present at work after March 29, 1968. His supervisor at the Seattle Company was to be Mr. RICHARD CUNNINGHAM, the M. Rosenblatt and Son representative at the Lockheed Shipbuilding and Construction Company.

WILLARD's personnel record also disclosed that he had a secret clearance to work on classified contracts, ~~the clearance granted by the Defense Industrial Security Clearance Office in Columbus, Ohio, on October 18, 1967.~~

According to a Form DD48 dated July 31, 1967, WILLARD attended schools in Kansas City, Kansas from September, 1931 through May, 1963 and had served in the Navy from August, 1943 to April, 1963. Former addresses for WILLARD after his leaving the service were listed as:

4601 Cottage Hill Road, Mobile, Alabama,  
April, 1963 through December, 1964;

Route 1, Box 132A, Theodore, Alabama,  
December, 1964 through April, 1967;

8117 Brampton Street, Spring Valley,  
California, June 1, 1967 through date of

He was shown to have been an electrical designer for R.S. BERNEY, 1412 Dauphn, Mobile, Alabama from June, 1964 to April, 1967 and an electronics coordinator at Alabama Drydock and Shipbuilding Company, Mobile, Alabama from July, 1963 to March, 1964. The only arrest listed for WILLARD was on October, 1956 at which time he had been arrested for excessive speed and accident, no location of arrest given and on February, 1952, at Oakland, California, he had been arrested on a drunk and disturbing the peace charge. No disposition was shown. Personal references are listed as JACK M. WELCH, 1412 Dauphn, Mobile, Alabama and E.H. GOULD, 5661 Cottage Hill Road, Mobile, Alabama.

WILLARD contained excellent remarks in his personnel record and was considered conscientious and a steady person.

KREPCHIN stated that he had never known WILLARD to be in any kind of trouble and considered him an excellent employee.

KREPCHIN furnished a photograph of WILLARD which had been taken in 1967.

The following investigation was conducted by SA DONALD M. MURRAY at Raleigh, North Carolina:

RE ERIC STARVO GALT

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. SARAH ARNETTE advised ENSLIE NICHOLSON GAULT, JR., Apartment 30, Tara Apartments, Raleigh, has rented this apartment since February 1, 1968. According to her records he is employed by Coca Cola Bottling Company and is single. He appears to be a good resident but she knows nothing further concerning him.

On April 15, 1968, ENSLIE NICHOLSON GAULT, JR., Apartment 30, Tara Apartments, advised he is employed as a Coca Cola bottling sales representative for Coca Cola, Inc., out of Atlanta, Georgia, and lives and works in the Raleigh area. On April 4, 1968, he specifically recalled during the afternoon hours contacting Mr. LUKE ALLEN, Sales Manager, Raleigh Coca Cola Plant, and later, at approximately 8:30 or 9:00 p.m., talking with a neighbor, EMMA JONES. On Friday, April 5, 1968, he flew to a meeting at the Coca Cola office in Atlanta and returned the same day, as he recalls.

He is described as a white male, born [redacted], White Plains, New York, 5'10" tall, 165 pounds, light brown hair, blue eyes, medium complexion, single, graduate of University of Virginia in 1963, employed by Coca Cola, Inc., since May, 1966, formerly in Charleston, South Carolina, telephone number 782-2984.

Contact with EMMA JONES, Tara Apartments, Raleigh, and Mr. LUKE ALLEN, Sales Manager, Coca Cola Bottling Company, Raleigh, on April 15, 1968, revealed these individuals had observed ENSLIE NICHOLSON GAULT on April 4, 1968. ALLEN saw him at the Coca Cola Bottling Plant in Raleigh at about 2:30 or 3:00 p.m. and EMMA JONES observed him in her apartment at about 8:30 or 9:00 p.m. on that date.

It should be noted that GAULT advised he has no relatives by the name ERIC STARVO GALT and had no idea who this individual might be.

RATKOWSKI, at which time, she reviewed her personal effects and photographs, which had been forwarded directly to the Nashville Resident Agency by the Miami Division.

Mrs. CUTOLO reviewed all of her photographs and was unable to find any photograph which in anyway resembled JAMES EARL RAY. She stated that she had been thinking about this matter and had looked at a number of photographs of RAY and that these photographs did not look familiar to her at all.

For the information of New Orleans, LIBERTO has three brothers residing in New Orleans; TONY LIBERTO, who resides near his mother, EMILY LIBERTO, 2219 Altomaster, New Orleans; VINCENT LIBERTO, who is a dock foreman at Viking Truck Lines, New Orleans; and SALVATORE LIBERTO, who is a truck driver for West Brother Truck Lines.

All efforts should be made to resolve alleged conspiracy on the part of LIBERTOS, according to MC FERREN's complaint.

Enclosed herewith for each office are two copies of an artist's conception of purported subject who murdered MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr.

Attached drawings were made available evening of 4/16/68 by Mr. EDWARD MC CLELLAN, Executive Director, NAACP, 431 S. Dearborn Street, Room 1317, telephone 939-5365, Chicago (racial liaison source of the Chicago Office) and OTIS RAPHEL, artist for the Chicago Police Department (PD). MC CLELLAN advised RAPHEL prepared the drawings based on impressions conveyed to him by Rev. CLIFFORD ROYCE, also known as "Mr. Psychic", 32 N. State Street, 10th Fbor, Chicago. MC CLELLAN advised that ROYCE purportedly possesses extra sensory perception and has a "batting average of about 94.6%" in his predictions and psychic impressions. ROYCE in advising MC CLELLAN and RAPHEL of his impressions of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr., stated he feels the assassin is currently in the vicinity of New Orleans. He described the assassin as being approximately 5'10 1/2" tall, 158-165 pounds, brown hair, light brown eyes, extremely small waist, 24-26 years of age, and feels subject at one time and possibly currently has homosexual tendencies. Further, that at one time the assassin was the subject of psychiatric treatment for which he was institutionalized and that the assassin was born in Georgia and received psychiatric treatment in Mississippi, or else was born in Mississippi and treated in Georgia. ROYCE also receives impressions that following the assassination, the murderer originally stopped at a motel approximately 30 miles west of Memphis on a main highway. The motel is in a run-down condition, described by ROYCE as being more or less a truck stop of approximately 15 units and ROYCE envisions a number of trees adjacent to the motel. According to ROYCE, this motel is located outside of a town and the assassin in this case has a "B" in his name and his name has no more than 6 letters. ROYCE's impression is that the assassin stopped at this motel after the murder of KING.

OTIS RAPHEL advised that approximately one year ago, Rev. ROYCE had asked to see him at which time ROYCE requested RAPHEL to draw the picture of a woman he visualized. ROYCE proceeded to describe the woman whom he felt would in the not to distant future, marry a particular person. According to RAPHEL approximately 6 months later the man in question married a woman not previously known to ROYCE but who looked exactly like the sketch drawn by RAPHEL based on impressions of ROYCE 6 months previous to the marriage.

It may be noted that MC CLELLAN was formerly the commanding officer of the Chicago PD Human Relations Unit, and in 1966 when he commanded and was later a part of this unit during the marches staged by MARTIN LUTHER KING in Chicago, MC CLELLAN spent a good deal of his time in maintaining contact with KING and at times serving as his in effect "body guard". MC CLELLAN in furnishing this information and the artist's drawings advised he desired to make this information available since he wished to leave no stone unturned in doing everything possible to identify and apprehend the murderer of KING.

Enclosed sketch is being furnished to the Bureau and the interested offices in view of the source from which it was received. Any action taken on this sketch is being left to the discretion of the Bureau and the office of origin.

~~Miss MARY ANN HOWARD~~, 704 Edwards Avenue, Leland, Mississippi, advised SA JOHN WILLIAM NEELLEY and SA WILLIAM C. MEARNs on 4/18/68 that she had a male guest whom she declined to identify in her kitchen approximately 4 weeks ago who made the statement that MARTIN LUTHER KING had to be disposed of. She questioned him as to what he meant, and he replied that he meant that KING had to be eliminated but not necessarily killed.

Miss HOWARD stated that this man came to her house in Leland and advised her that he was a friend of AL CAROLLO, owner of Al's Supper Club, Greenville, Mississippi. She ~~claimed~~ to not have seen this man prior to or since that time. He told her he worked for the Mafia but declined to furnish any details. He also claimed to be driving a 1968 Cadillac, which she did not see. She stated she had a few drinks with this man in her house and he may have made the above statement concerning KING because of the liquor. She stated that he resembled the sketch of ERIC STARVO GALT which she saw on television within the past few days.

Miss HOWARD furnished the following description of this individual, whom she refused to identify out of fear for her safety and because she would hate to see anyone punished for killing a Negro:

Height	6' 7"
Weight	160 pounds
Age	Late forties
Features	Sharp, pointed nose; very tall and slim

Miss HOWARD advised that she is a nurse at East Bolivar County Hospital, Cleveland, Mississippi. She is approximately 35 years of age, approximately 5' 6" tall, 115 pounds, blond, and lives alone. Miss HOWARD appeared to have been drinking heavily prior to the interview at 7:30 AM and did not answer the door when agents knocked. The door was open, screen was unlocked, lights on, her 1966 Chevrolet was parked in the driveway, and car keys were observed on the coffee table in the living room. She did not respond when her name was called. Her small white dog barked and should have awakened anyone who was sleeping.

Assistant Chief of Police LAW, Leland, Mississippi, appeared on the scene and entered Miss HOWARD's house and awakened her, after calling her name loudly several times. She was, from her speech and actions, obviously intoxicated or doped. There was no indication that her house had been ransacked.

After leaving the house, Miss HOWARD contacted the Leland Police Department and advised that she had decided that she would furnish the name of the man in question, provided that one FBI agent and one FBI agent alone would return to her house. The above two agents returned to Miss HOWARD's home and, after several statements which indicated her complete dislike for Negroes, she refused again to name the

individual who she claimed to be ERIC STARVO GALT, based on the sketch she saw on television.

Chief of Police JOE DEAN, Leland, Mississippi, advised that MARY ANN HOWARD is an alcoholic who frequently carouses all night. She is a very attractive girl who is well educated, is a nurse, and appears to be very intelligent when she is sober. She has made complaints to the PD on several occasions when she was not sober, and complained one time that she had been raped. She was taken to the General Hospital in Leland but refused to permit an examination after she learned that the doctor ordinarily on duty at that time of night was not at the hospital. She then admitted that she had furnished a false report.

In view of the description which Miss HOWARD furnished and her condition, the Jackson Office anticipates conducting no further investigation on this particular matter.

Memphis may desire to advise Inspector ZACHARY (NA), Memphis PD Homicide Bureau, of the above since HOWARD may again contact him.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [redacted] his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

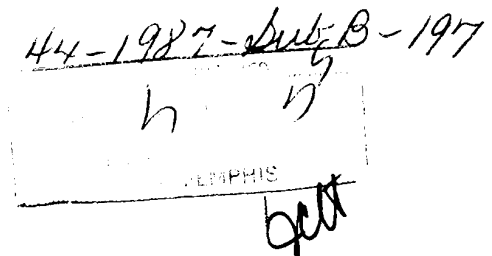
LUCILLE CORNISH, Unemployment Compensation Benefits Division, Alabama Department of Industrial Relations, advised as follows:

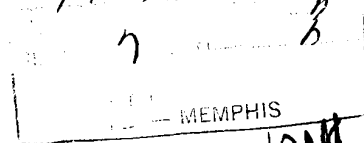
