JUREY his office covers compensation claims for the states of Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, West Virginia, Tennessee, and certain areas along the Great Lakes in Pennsylvania and New York. These claims are ones filed under the Federal Employees Compensation Act (FECA) and the Longshoremen's and Harbor Workers Compensation Act (LYWCA).

Mr. TRAYNOR advised he could locate no record in his files for ERIC STARVO GALT, JEROME WALLIS VERNON or HARVEY LOWMEYER. 



About the murder of Martin Luther King, it was NOT a white man (person). It was a colored person who is now hiding out at Hall of Motels in Memphis, Tenn. on Fealder Street. He is about 30 years old, 5' 9" tall and weighs about 160 lbs. He is armed and dangerous.

This is the message phoned to me at my office, and said I had been selected in some way as being trustworthy to deliver this message. The person is afraid for personal safety if this is not delivered secretly; the said person claimed not to be a crackpot, but very religious and conscientious, and felt it must be told. I have never taken part in any kind of disturbance anywhere, and have lived too long a sober-minded, minding-own-business person to start trouble for any person, group, or our country. The person felt conflict would continue until this person is caught, especially if the colored feel a white person was responsible.

I don't like to be secretive, and have never been so until now. Yet, I'm afraid for the first time in my life--of the negroes and the Communists. And my home and business would be hindered if I had to be protected by the police. I hate not to sign any letter, but cannot this one.

One to keep my word, and one interested in peace and justice.

GARMER said this name was printed thereon by GALT when GARMER requested his full name. Other handwritten notations thereon were, according to GARMER, prepared by himself.

GARGE stated that subsequent to a prior interview, he had been convehing his records and his memory and had now determined that on March 24, 1968, late in the evening, an individual kneeked on his apartment door, introduced himself as Mr. GALE, and requested a single room.

GARNER described GALT as a white male, 33 to 35 years of age, approximately six feet tall, slender build, black hair, worn very short with possibly a part on the side.

SARNER had previously noted GALT to be utilizing a light colored, possibly white, sutemblie and on the morning of April 15, 1966, telephonically contacted Mr. NARCLD VATERS, Room Mumber 1, 107 14th Street, Northeast, so this automobile was parked near WATERS, at which time he asked WATERS generally if he recalled the make of car and WATERS savised him it was a late model Mustans, possibly 1966 or 1967.

CARRER estimated his total contact with GALT on both occasions did not exceed one-half hour. He stated on both occasions GALT was neatly dressed in a dark suit, white shirt, and tie. He characterised him as looking like a preacher.

The incommissees in the information previously furnished by CARNER and the foregoing were thoroughly discussed with him and he could attribute it only to being confused", in that he had erroneously associated the name SALT with the recomm, VILLIAN LEE, about whom he had furnished the information.

At this time, GARNER made available a three page memorandum in his handwriting which chronologically acts forth his association with GALT. The envelope previously referred to, furnished by GARNER, on which GALT wrote his name, also contained the notation "Could do several different kinds of work." This note was prepared by GARNER.

In determining the individuals is each of the require houses operated by him (107 lith Street, Northwest, Atlanta, Georgia) who may have been in a position to observe GALS, he advised that at the time of resting to GALS, there was no other occupant in this building.

He stated he had elesed 113 1Ath Street on February 11, 1968, after the neighborhood hippies attempted to take it over

He edulated that he had two double rooms vacant at the time GALT applied for a room and that he had proviously rested these for the price of a single room, but GALT insisted on a single room, so he decided to open the other rooming house. He adulated it cost him more to do this than he would receive initially in root, but that he had been planning to open it, as the other house was filling up.

GALT remained the sole occupant of this building until April 1, 1968, at which time FRED C. JONES was placed in Room Number 1.

In centinuing to question GARMER as to why he had denied holding property for GALT, he finally admitted that it had been his policy in the past to retain for 30 days peasessions left behind by roomers, then to claim them as his own, and it was his intention to do this with the television set.

GARNER specifically desied that he had previously known GALT, that GALT had been referred to him by anyone, that he had accepted an extra amount of money from GALT for any reason, or that he had any knowledge concerning his present whereabouts.

GARMER stated that he was born and raised in Mississippi, was a member of the Beptist Church, and was "not a Gommanist." He denied having any knowledge of the John Birch or other right wing organizations, stating he had Joined only one organization which name he could not now recall, but described by him as a civic organization.

He reiterated that it had always been his intention to cooperate with the FHI and that he had, in fact, that morning given the address and telephone number of his restaurant to a roomer, Mr. BURGESS, where he could be reached should GALT return for the television set. He stated he did this so he could immediately notify the FHI of GALT's return.

Mrs. ESTELLE PETERS, Manager, Piedmont Laundry, Pick-Up Station, 1168 Peachtree, Northeast, home residence 1033 Milam Terrace Apartments, Clarkston, Georgia, home telephone number 433-4024, business telephone number 892-1467, advised that on April 1, 1968 shortly before 10 a.m. a white male came into the laundry and placed four undershirts, three underdrawers, one pair of socks, one wash cloth, as well as dry cleaning consisting of one pair of trousers, one coat and one tie and gave her the name ERIC GALT. She stated that she asked him if he spelled ERIC as ERIC and he replied yes and proceeded to spell his last name as GALT.

Mrs. PETERS described the dry cleaning and the coat as being a black checked coat with small check blocks and being an ordinary man's suit coat. She said it was not a sport coat or blazer, but an ordinary suit coat.

She described the trousers as a gray on the darker side and the tie as being black with tan and brown diagonal stripes.

She stated that GALT told her that he did not want any starch in his laundry and wanted the laundry folded.

An artist's sketch of GALT was exhibited to Mrs. PETERS and she advised that she could not say whether or not the sketch resembled GALT. She said she would not be in a position to state whether she could identify GALT if she were to see him again.

Mrs. PETERS continued that she recalled GALT as being in his thirties and slightly taller than Special Agent KANE, who is six feet in height and approximately the same weight as Special Agents KANE and ROSE whose weights are approximately 185 pounds.

GALT was clean shaven, neat with ordinary complexion. She failed to notice any particular regional accent and did not notice any peculiar marks or clothing characteristics. She did not recall his attire at the time the laundry and dry cleaning was placed April 1, 1968.

Mrs. PETERS advised from her ledger maintained by her in the usual course of business, the laundry and dry cleaning of GALT was picked up between 9 and 10 a.m. possibly closer to 9 a.m., on April 5, 1968 by the same individual who placed the laundry on April 1, 1968. She did recall that he was one of the earlier customers in the day and was of the opinion that he picked the laundry up earlier than he deposited the cleaning and laundry. To the best of her recollection, GALT entered the laundry and stated that he was there to pick up the laundry and cleaning of ERIC GALT.

At the time he obtained the completed laundry and dry cleaning, he was abrupt and short in his manner of speech giving her the impression that he was in a hurry or had a car parked in an area where he should not have parked. He appeared impatient while waiting for her to locate his laundry and cleaning. GALT paid for the laundry and cleaning in cash and she was of the opinion that he walked North on Peachtree Street toward Fourteenth Street after leaving the Laundry. She was unable to furnish his mode of dress on April 5, 1968 other than to stated that he did appear to be well shaven and neatly attired. Mrs. PETERS explained that the only area visible to her on Peachtree Street has prohibited parking and that his car, if he Had one, would not have been parked immediately in front of the Laundry. Both times GALT was observed he appeared to be alone and she did not associate any other person with GALT. She did not obtain the impression that GALT was depositing cleaning and laundry for anyone other than himself although she did not axign or mark the laundry. She did assign the dry cleaning AT 44-2386

items and was of the opinion that they would have been his clothing.

Mrs. PETERS produced a laundry slip from her transactions of April 5, 1968 indicating that ERIC GALT on April 1, 1968 deposited nine items of laundry described as three drawers, four undershirts, one pair of socks and one wash cloth. The notation appeared on the laundry slip "No Starch and Folded", indicating that the laundry would have been placed in a small rectangular stapled package. The laundry mark EGC83 would have been affixed in indelible black pencil in all the laundry items at the main plant of the Piedmont Laundry prior to laundering. She explained that the EG would indicate the customer as ERIC GALT and the C83 is the designation for her pid-up station. addition, the laundry slip indicates the marker as A Lot 10 which she explained as being the laundry designation and the lot number. A 19-30 appears on the laundry slip and she explained this as meaning the ledger and entry number utilized by her in her bookkeeping system. The total amount of the laundry was \$1.16.

In addition, she furnished a green dry cleaning slip dated April 1, 1968 bearing the name ERIC GALT which has the dry cleaning tag 8 over 755 stapled to the slip. She explained that this tag 8 over 755 would have been placed in each dry cleaning item by staples and this is the Laundry's designation to identify the dry cleaning. The dry cleaning slip reflects one coat, black check; one pair of trousers, gray and one tie, black with tan and brown stripes were deposited on April and claimed on April 5, 1968 by GALT at a total cost of \$1.55.

Mrs. PETERS furnished the above described laundry and dry cleaning slips indicating they were prepared by her April 1, 1968.

Mrs. PETERS explained that no laundry slips are issued to the customer by the laundry and the laundry and the customer would not have been issued a slip to claim his laundry

and dry cleaning as all of these items are handled by the laundry personnel only.

Mrs. PETERS recalled that GALT made no other remarks or any conversation giving her any other impression. She had no recollection of any prior transactions with GALT.

FD-302 (Rev. 4-15-64) FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION Date 1948 Detective R. L. DAVIS, Auto Theft Squad, Atlanta, Georgia Police Department, advised that he and Detective P. S. MC CRAYY, also assigned to the Atlanta Police Department Auto Theft Squad, were in a radio car on April 11. 1968, and at approximately 2:00 p.mp, on that date received a radio message to proceed to Connally Street and Memorial Drive to meet a person. They proceeded to this intersection and on arriving there set KENNETH JONES and IKE POWELL who indicated to them they were ministers in a local church. Mr. JONES informed them that a female member of their church by the same of LORENE, last same unrecalled, had told them that a white Mustang automobile bearing an Alabama license was parked in a parking area of Capitol Homes and in view of the recent publicity concerning the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, she suspected that this vehicle might have some connection with this matter. This car reportedly had been parked in the same location since the previous Friday and was not known to belong to anyone living in the Capital Homes public housing project. Detective DAVIS said he and Detective MC CRAYY proceeded to the parking area of the Capitol Homes which had an entrance off of Connally Street just south of Memorial Drive. In this parking area, they located a 1966 Ford Mustanz which was backed into a parking space on the left side of the parking area. He said they noted that this car was a two door model, white in color, and bore 1968 Alahama license 1-38993. Further, they observed a 1967 Alabama license 14-88354 lying on the deck above the rear seat of this car. They noted that this car was locked and in order to further determine ownership of same, they unlocked the left front door and from the

serial plate on this vehicle determined that it bore Vehicle Identification Number 6707C190647. Detective DAVIS advised that while obtaining this identification number, he observed a small metal key lying on the floorboard of the car between the two front seats. Detective DAVIS said he took custody of this key and marked same with DEXED.

He said that he also had a message sent to the State Police in Meatgowery, Alabama, concerning the license plates described above the the Vehicle Identification Number to which message a reply was received indicating that the Alabama State Police had received a reply from the Matienal Crime Information Center concerning this februal relating to one MIC STARYO GALT but no stolen information was received.

Mrs. MARY L. BRIDGES, Apartment 550, Capitol Homes, located off Memorial Boulevard, recalled that at about 8:30 AM on Friday, April 5, 1968, she had just gotten her children off to school and was alone in her home. She stated she remembered looking out of the window and observing a white automobile pull up in the parking lot directly across from the door to her apartment. She stated that at that time the parking lot was almost deserted, having very few cars in it, and she thought that the person driving the automobile was one of many people who utilize the parking area at Capitol Homes as a parking lot on their way to work.

Mrs. BRIDGES stated that the car pulled up and parked just to the left of her door and that it was backed into the parking spot. She recalled noticing that the car had an out-of-state license plate and upon further inspection stated it was an Alabama plate. She stated that she observed the lone male occupant of the automobile get out of the car and begin to walk across the parking lot in a direction away from her apartment and toward Memorial Drive. She stated that when he reached the other side of the parking lot, he approached Memorial Drive by the left hand lane between two of the apartment buildings directly to the front of her apartment. She stated that this man continued to walk toward Memorial Drive but because her apartment is slightly to the right of the two above apartment buildings, she lost sight of him prior to his arrival at Memorial Drive and therefore was unaware of what direction he took upon arriving at Memorial Drive and was also uncertain as to whether he had entered an apartment further down the street beyond her view.

Mrs. BRIDGES stated that this individual was alone and that she did not observe him locking his automobile. She described the unknown male as being about 30-35 years of age, 5'10" to 6', 165 pounds, medium build, wearing a navy blue suit

Mrs. LUCY CAYTON, Apartment 490, Capitol Homes
Apartment Building, Memorial Drive, advised that she had gotten
her children off to school at about 8:15 AM on April 5, 1968,
and her husband normally leaves for work at about 8:00. She
stated that it is her normal routine to begin cleaning her
apartment, and she stated that she had cleaned almost the
entire apartment, including the upstairs bedrooms, and while
she was sweeping her front stoop, she noticed a white male
about 5'8" - 5'9", approaching her apartment from the
parking lot which is to the left of her front door. She
advised that her front door faces from the opposite direction
from the parking lot as does Mrs. PAYNE and Mrs. BRIDGES.

Mrs. CAYTON stated that she did not observe this white male exit from the white Mustang located in the parking lot, but saw him as he approached the Memorial Drive side of the parking lot and he began to walk toward her apartment which is to the left of the end of the parking lot. She stated that this man then came to the back yard area of the two apartment buildings immediately to her left and after stopping at the beginning of the lane to the back yards as if he was attempting to gain his bearings, he then proceeded toward Memorial Drive through the back yard area at which time she lost sight of him. She was unable to determine as to where he journeyed or if he entered an apartment. She stated her first impression was that he was a salesman or an insurance agent looking for an apartment.

It should be noted that the buildings referred to by Mrs. CAYTON are not the same buildings referred to by Mrs. BRIDGES or Mrs. PAYNE in that PAYNE and BRIDGES state that the white male journeyed up the left lane of the front of the apartment building referred to by Mrs. CAYTON whereas she states that the white male proceeded toward Memorial Drive through the back yard lane.
