On April 12, 1968, Attorney DAVID ALFRED PISKORSKI, 144 West Main Street, Plainville, Connecticut, advised as follows:

In January, 1966, he entered on active duty in the U. S. Marine Corps under the Enlisted Reserve Program and he was on active duty until December 20, 1966. At time of release he was assigned to Company F, Second Battalion, Second Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. During the early part of December, 1966, his outfit went on maneuvers and approximately 30 reservist remained at Camp Lejeune processing for their discharge. During this period, an M-14 rifle was stolen from his company and the theft was not resolved.

In conversation with DAVID PARRISH, also of the United States Marine Corps, PISKORSKI learned that HUGH HAMILTON CRADDOCK, JR., who was a buddy of PARRISH had indicated to PARRISH that when he got out of the service, he, CRADDOCK, intended to kill DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. PARRISH stated that in conversation with other members of his unit, he recalls that they indicated that CRADDOCK possibly stole this rifle.

PISKORSKI stated that DAVID PARRISH could possibly furnish additional information regarding CRADDOCK and PARRISH was from Birmingham, Alabama, where he was released to report to the 14th Marines, 4th Marine Division, Birmingham, Alabama.

On April 12, 1968, DAVID CAVANAUGH PARRIS, 9713
Red Lane Drive, Birmingham, Alabama, advised as follows:

He was on active duty with Marines in Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, during December, 1988. He been

HUGH CRADDOCK, JR. of Charleston, South Carolina, very well and CRADDOCK admitted to him he, CRADDOCK, stole an M-14 rifle while at Camp Lejeune. He stated CRADDOCK also expressed his hate for Negroes and made statements about killing KING. He said CRADDOCK could be located through Charleston, South Carolina, telephone directory.

The following investigation was conducted at Charleston, South Carolina, by SA EDWARD E. FLECK and SA WARDLAW E. SKINNER:

On April 12, 1968, Mrs. VIRGINIA SHAW, Employee Relations Clerk, Personnel Office, Electronics Division, U. S. Naval Station, Charleston, S. C., advised her records reflect HUGH HAMILTON CRADDOCK, JR., was on annual leave March 25 - 29, 1968, but worked the entire week of April 1 - 5, 1968, from 8:00 AM to 4:45 PM. She stated CRADDOCK's supervisor is Mr. V. D. RUSS.

Mr. VAN RUSS, Supervisor, Electronics Division, U. S. Naval Station, Charleston, advised CRADDOCK was on annual leave from March 25-29, 1968 in order to get married. He recalled that CRADDOCK came by work for his pay check at 11:45 AM, March 29, 1968, apparently upon return from his honeymoon.

HUGH HAMILTON CRADDOCK, JR., home address 113 Counsellor Court, Goose Creek, South Carolina, was interviewed at his job, where he stated he has been employed for the past three years. He denied any knowledge whatsoever concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He admitted that he probably has made remarks in the past indicating he would like to see KING dead, but stated he cannot recall specifically saying he would like to, or intended to kill KING, although he added it is possible he may have made such a remark.

CRADDOCK stated he used 40 hours of annual leave from March 25-29, 1968, as he got married and went on his honeymoon. He said he was married Saturday, March 23, 1968, at Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina, and spent that night at the downtown Holiday Inn, Charleston. On March 24, 1968, he and his bride traveled to Atlanta, Georgia, and spent that night

at a Howard Johnson Motel located on the east side of Atlanta by the Atlanta Stadium. He also spent March 25, 1968, at this Howard Johnson. He spent the night of March 26, 1968 at the Waldorf (possibly) Motel located on the same super highway at Atlanta. On March 27, 1968, he and an associate, JOSEPH BAZZLE, went to Summerville, South Carolina, where BAZZLE bought some tires for his car. On March 29, 1968, he ordered a telephone, opened accounts at South Carolina National Bank and J. M. Fields Department Store, and stopped by his job to pick up his pay check. On the night of March 30, 1968, he went to Walterboro, South Carolina, along with JERRY TESTON, who works at Moody Oil Company, Hollywood, South Carolina, HERMAN GODBBEE, who works in Building 177 (mark 84) on the Naval Station, and "Scooter" (LNU), to watch the drag races.

He could furnish no information relating to this matter.

CRADDOCK said he spent six months active duty at Camp LeJeune, North Carolina, a couple of years ago, at which time he heard that a rifle turned up missing. He said he recalled an investigation was conducted concerning the rifle, although he was not interviewed about it. He said he did not take the rifle.

He resided in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, until 1964. While there he had a patient named LILLIAN WILLARD, wife of JOHN WILLARD, an attorney with office in Conway, South Carolina. JOHN WILLARD was a racist and an alcoholic and he fits the description of a penciled sketch of the JOHN WILLARD that Dr. THIBORAU saw in a recent newspaper of the wanted killer of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He described WILLARD as a white male, age 40, 5'9" tall, 160 pounds. He believes that LILLIAN WILLARD is well known to PHYLLIS BELLAMY, wife of the Chief of Police of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JON W. ARMSTRONG on April 10, 1968:

PHYLLIS BELLAMY, Woodland Drive, Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, advised that JOHN and LILLIAN WILLARD are residents of Conway, South Carolina, where they share a house with Mrs. MARGARET GRAINGER, 805 12 Avenue. She stated JOHN WILLARD is a practicing attorney with an office on 3rd Avenue, Conway, South Carolina.

She stated she has not associated with the WILLARDS for 2 years and has no knowledge regarding their present activities. She stated several years ago JOHN WILLARD drank excessively and as a result nearly ruined his law practice and marriage. She stated to her knowledge, JOHN WILLARD does not now drink or at least does not drink excessively. She described him as a white male, 45 plus years, brown hair greying, approximately 5'11", and stated he is a

brilliant attorney.

On same date, Chief of Police H. T. BARKER, Conway, South Carolina, Police Department, advised that JOHN WILLARD is a practicing attorney in Conway, South Carolina. He stated WILLARD used to drink excessively, and that during the period 1960-1964, JOHN WILLARD was arrested by his department on numerous occasions for being drunk and or disorderly. He stated that since 1964 his department has had no trouble from WILLARD. He stated very few attorneys in Conway, South Carolina, associate with WILLARD due to his past history of drinking and due to the abusive language he frequently uses. He stated WILLARD occupies an office by himself on the 2nd floor at 1123 3rd Avenue, Conway, S. C. described WILLARD as a white male, Date of Birth 6', 175 pounds, brown hair greying, brown eyes. He advised that his department has never received any information to indicate that WILLARD is a racist.

He advised that on April 1, 1968, WILLARD was present at a hearing held in Conway, South Carolina. BARKER stated he has a good friend, SAM COX, Cox's Surveyor's Company, who occupies the space directly below WILLARD's office and adjacent to the entrance to WILLARD's office, who might be able to confidentially furnish information regarding WILLARD's activities.

SAM COX, Owner, S. D. Cox Surveyors, Inc., 1121 3rd Avenue, Conway, South Carolina, advised that during the week April 1-6, 1968, he saw JOHN WILLARD on several different days. He advised that when WILLARD is at his office, he parks his car behind his, COX's place of business. He stated as he recalls, he remembers seeing WILLARD's car parked behind his place of business each day during the period April 1-6/68. He advised that to his knowledge, WILLARD has not been out of the Conway, South Carolina, area in the recent past.

On April 13, 1968, JOHN MISOYIANIS, 1203 Parkwood Drive, Charleston, South Carolina, advised TELEGAS has girl friend, name unknown, who resides Orlando, Florida., her father's name is Kincade or Kinard and is manager of XYZ Trailer Sales, Orlando. MISOYIANIS has amateur band which practices ever Wednesday night. TELEGAS sets up equipment for band practice. After band practice on Wednesday night, April 3, 1968, he took TELEGAS to railroad station,

TELEGAS, who presently resides at 540A Rutledge Avenue, Charleston, South Carolina, was interviewed on April 15, 1968, by SA WARDLAW E. SKINNER and SA EDWARD E. FLECK at which time he advised as follows:

On April 4, 1968 at 4:50 AM, he left Charleston, South Carolina, via Southern Coastline train for Orlando, Florida, arriving at Orlando, at about 2:30 PM, same date. At Orlando he visited Mr. and Mrs. FRED KENNEMER, and their daugher, DEBBIE who resides at 8650 South Orange Blossom Trail, Orlando, Florida. Mr. KENNEMER is manager of ETZ Trailer Sales at Orlando. He remained at Orlando with this family until April 11, 1968, when he returned to Charleston, South Carolina.

ORLAN EUGENE ROSE, Inmate No. 73723, Missouri State Penitentiary, said he first came to the Missouri State Penitentiary in 1958. He said he first met RAY in jail at Kansas City, Missouri in 1955, and celled with him and WALTER RIFE prior to the time that all three went to Leavenworth, Kansas. He said RIFE may have been a homosexual as he liked to fool around with young boys, but he said at the Jackson County Jail, Leavenworth, and Jefferson City, Missouri, RAY gave no indication of abnormal sexual behavior.

He described RAY as quiet, a loner, and "not a loud mouth". He could not picture RAY, he said, as being vicious. He said RAY liked to follow baseball. He said they both lived in K Hall and associated together. He said they talked every day. He said RAY "did not fool" with as many as five men in the penitentiary. He said RAY used amphetamines when he could get them. He paid from \$2.00 to \$5.00 a shot. He did not get into debt and did not gamble.

He said he was in maximum security when RAY escaped and knew nothing of the details. He said the rumor inside is that RAY did not escape in a bread truck, but he had no information as to how he did escape.

He said RAY has a half-sister in St. Louis, Missouri with his mother. He said RAY did not like his mother as she left him and started living with an ex-convict out of Illinois. He said RAY has a brother and some half brothers. He believed his mother is living and re-married after the ex-convict died. She may have had some property "which she lived up".

ROSE said the inmates call him "The Jew" in the penitentiary, but he said RAY was "tighter" with his money than ROSE. He said he could not imagine RAY spending any money for dancing lessons or leaving a gun behind him someplace because of this characteristic.

ROSE said he did not know any RAYMOND LEWIS CURTIS, nor did he know of this person as an associate of RAY's.

On April 22, 1968, Warden HAROLD SWENSON, in addition to furnishing a copy of the entire files of the Missouri State Penitentiary, furnished an article handed to him on April 22, 1968 by ORLAN ROSE which is:

Warden Swenson:

Would you look the attached article over and consider turning it over to a reporter of the Kansas City Star newspaper. I have a feeling that Jimmy Ray might give himself up if he happens to read what I have written. If you do release the article I give you full permission to reword it as you see fit as long as it contains the same line of thought.

There is a possibility that he might get killed before it is ever learned whether or not he is actually guilty of whoking shooting Doctor King. If this would happen, it would be another Oswald case in the eyes of the world.

If you do not think it appropriate to release this articke to the news media, just tear it up, however, knowing Jimmy as I do there is a very faint possibility that he would give himself up if he were to read what I have written. I am sure that he will be reading either the K.C. Star or the St. Louis papers whereever he is.

The above of the attacked 4- page statement hands to copt. Wyrick by Orlan Rose-73723, then to me-25ps KC 44-760

"IF JAMES EARL RAY IS GUILTY, WHO IS REALLY TO BLAME?"

"For quite a number of years I have been one of the very few close friends of James Earl Ray. Because of this I would like to say a few things about him since everyone else who discusses him reveals that he is either anti-social, a loner, an escape artist, seeks recognition, etc. If this sort of unfavorable publicity continues to be brought out against him there is a very good chance that he might end up like Lee Harvey Oswald without ever having been given a chance to prove his innocence or guilt before a trial court. If this happens it will be a disgrace in the eyes of the world and bring about the same amount of doubt and criticism that arose after Oswald was killed in cold blood by a fanatic who decided to take the law into his own hands.

I first met Jimmy in the Kansas City jail during 1955 where he was being held on a forgery charge. His accomplice on the forgery charge was another man named Walter Rife and we all three lived in the same cell together and passed many hours shooting the breeze while playing three-handed card games for candy bars. Jimmy loved candy bars and always managed to win his share.

On one of our several trips to the federal courthouse, prior to our sentencing, we were taken in the same group. Jimmy's fall partner, Rife, was facing a parole violation or detainer of some sort from the state of Illinois and planned to escape if the proper situation arose. On our trip to the courthouse, a chance did come up by means of a unlocked door in the holdover room which led to a hallway or strirs. Rife begged Jimmy to leave with him through the unlocked door, but Jimmy quashed the deal by saying that all he wanted to do was to plead guilty to the forgery and get his sentence served. I mention this reluctance to escape on Jimmy's part because everyone always brings up that he was continually trying to escape custody. This is not so. I will explain what I think to be the real reason behind his later escape attempts while he was serving the twenty year sentence, but first I would like to point out a few things about Jimmy Ray's personality that have never been mentioned by anyone up to the present time.

Eventually, we all three ended up in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kansas where our friendship continued. Rife went to work in the

prison hospital and lifted weights during his off duty hours while Jimmy and I either walked the yard or watched the ball games together. It is true that Jimmy is sort of a loner, but this is not unusual in a penitentiary. Being a loner doesn't mean that he didn't have many friends. Jimmy always wore a smile and laughed softly at the various occurrences during our time together in jail and while we were at Leavenworth. His friendly smile alone made him many friends and got him many greetings, but he just wasn't one to mix or join a group bull session as is most usually the case in jail or prison. He would rather stroll around the yard with one or two persons and discuss clothes, travel, baseball, or the enjoyment he got while working as a painter just prior to his arrest. It must have been one of the best paying jobs he ever had because he was always talking about it. If I remember correctly, I believe him and Rife lived in the Pickwick Hotel daning the time they both worked for the painting contractor. He liked nice clothes and was always very neatly dressed during his court appearances. He would sometimes mention his brother, but I never heard him ever mention his mother or father in any of our conversations. I took it for granted that he had not been blessed with many luxuries while growing up. He was very saving with the few dollars he was able to obtain while serving time, in fact, I often accused him of being a miser. Somehow he was able to smuggle a wristwatch into the jail at Kansas City and he was so proud of it that I actually believe it was the first wristwatch he ever owned. He did not want to part with it for anything, however, he finally did so because he learned that he could not possibly take it into the prison at Leavenworth with him. I ended up with the watch and passed it on to my brother, but only after having paid Jimmy a much higher price than is usual in jail. Up until I left him at Leavenworth, he was one of my best friends and he was always a very enjoyable person to be around.

When I again met him in 1960 at the Missouri State Penitentiary, he had aged a great deal, he lacked his usual smile, and his whole demeanor seemed to be changed. He was very withdrawn and it took quite a number of conversations before he finally opened up to me and told me why he felt so bad. We were both assigned jobs in the Food Service Department. He worked upstairs in the Bakery and I worked on the bottom

floor where he would deliver bread each weekday for outside delivery. We both lived on the same tier in K Cellhouse and would often talk with each other after our jobs were over. It was during these conversations that I finally loarned what I think to be the main reason behind his personality change. He told me that two police officers had framed him on the robbery charge he was serving the twenty years on. He swore up and down that he was innocent of the crime, but that he did not have the money to hire lawyers to prove his innocence or carry his case into the United States Supreme Court. I later learned that the two police officers were not above planting evidence in order to convict an exconvict, and that their conscience must have bothered them because they both resigned from the police force shortly after Jimmy was convicted. Anyway, Jimmy made several attempts to get his case reopened without making any headway. Escape was continually on his mind and after four different attempts, he finally made it.

As far as him being prejudice toward any person or race, I have never heard him ever mention one thing against anyone in all our time spent together. If he couldn't say something good about someone, he just wouldn't say anything. In fact, there was no outward showing of animosity ever revealed by him toward the two police officers who he accused of framing him. If there was he just kept such things to himself.

As far as him being the person who shot Martin Luther King, I just can't believe it is possible. However, if he is guilty of it I am wondering whether or not it all leads back to the fact that he was actually sent to prison on a trumpted up charge which in turn caused him to do so as a means of retaliation against society for the twenty year sentence he swears he didn't deserve.

I hope Jimmy is innocent of killing Doctor King. I also hope that he doesn't become a scapegoat simply because he drove a white mustang and happened to favor the alleged assassinator of Doctor King

For the benefit of you persons with hate in your heart toward Jimmy before he has been proven guilty or given the benefit of a fair trial I ask you to withhold your opinions. Instead I would ask you to think of him as being innocent until proven guilty. In the meantime, put

yourselves in his place, on the run from 200 million persons, without a known friend or voice raised in your behalf, and a hundred thousand dollar reward placed on your head. If you were innocent, how would you feel?

In closing, I would like to say that if this article reaches a newspaper and is published and read by Jimmy, I would like to advise you, Jimmy, as a friend to make immediate arrangements for your personal protection by contacting a Judge or Lawyer and give yourself up so that you can be given a fair trial. Don't put it off until you are recognized by some trigger happy happy nut like Jack Ruby who wants to make a name for himself. You realize that you are on the top wanted list with a large reward on your head. You know that the odds are against you because of this. You can't win. In the meantime, while you are thinking this over, if you happen to be cornered by police officers, for Christs sake don't hold a shootout. Grab a phonebook and call a judge or lawyer.

There's no need for me to mention my name because you know who I am. You do have some friends. Turn yourself in, but use discretion in doing so.

The following inventigation was conducted by SA THOMAS C. HENAGHAN, JR., At Atlanta, Georgia:

Mr. B. A. DODD Supervisor, Crew Scheduling, Desta Airlines, Atlanta Airport, on 4/23/68, identified the stewardesses aboard DAL Flight 725 on 4/1/68, as SYLVIA PAGE, DIAME MOSELEY and SUE STUMLER. DODD advised that SYLVIA PAGE is currently on a leave of absence, having recently been married.

SUE STUMEER, Stewardess, DAL, was interviewed on 4/23/68, at the Atlanta Airport, and advised that on 4/1/68, she was the First Class Stewardess on Delta flight 725. She advised in this capacity she received passengers at the front of the plane and recalled receiving a rifle case from a male passenger. She advised as is customary, she brought the case to the pilot's cabia and stored it there until termination of the flight in Atlanta, Ga. She advised DAL policy does not require that any record be made indicating the name of passengers bringing weapons on plane.

She advised she had little or no regollection of the individual from whom she received the weapon. She stated a review of the passengers as listed on the manifest for that flight did not refresh her memory in identifying this individual. The published vanted flyer of JAMES HARL RAT was exhibited to Miss STOMIES and she advised she recalled having seen photo on television but could not connect it with passenger bringing weapon on plane.

BIAM HORLEY, 538 Cleveland Avenue, Apt. 12-C, Mapeville, Georgia, advised on 4/23/68, that she was on duty in the tourist section of DAL Flight 735 on 4/1/68, with SYLVIA RAGE. She advised that her duties required her to remain in the rear section of the plane while the passengers boarded and that she does not recall a passenger bringing a weapon case on the plane. She also advised SYLVIA RAGE was in the rear of the plane and would not have been in a position to observe this. Miss MCSELEY advised based on the limited description available, she could not recall the individual described in referenced sirtel.

The published wanted flyer of JEANES EARL RAY was exhibited to Miss MOSELEY who advised she was unable to identify him.

In view of information furnished by Miss MOSSLEY it appears as though Stewardess SYLVIA PAGE would not have been in a position to observe incident or identify individual, and in view of her unavailability, she will not be interviewed.
