On 4/24/68, RICHARD PARDE, Comptroller, Computing Technology, Inc., 26 Park Place, Paramus, New Jersey, telephone 265-4040 telephonically contacted MYO and provided information concerning an electronic scanning device utilizing computers for ballistic examinations. He offered to make this procedure available to the FBI for ballistic examination of the bullet and gun used in the assassination in captioned civil rights matter.

Mr. PARDI said he understood through newspapers that ballistic tests to date were not conclusive. His company has developed a procedure whereby a computer optical scanner, using numerical systems programmed into computers is so sensitive that all surface changes are noted. He is of the opinion that tests with such equipment would be conclusive where other methods have failed.

He explained that with the computer system it is not necessary to depend on the human eye, nor light nor

microscopes. The computer system examination has been conducted by a very capable program man within his organization.

According to PARDI this procedure has been demonstrated to the NYCPD and published in one of the scientific journals. He said the NYCPD is attempting to obtain sufficient funds with which to procure and utilize this procedure.

PARDI stated that by letter he previously offered the use of this system to the FBI in Washington, D.C.

An information copy of this airtel is being furnished to Newark in the event it is deemed advisable by the Bureau to have PARDI contacted in Paramus, New Jersey for additional information.

PARDE said has company has expended thousands of dollars in developing this procedure but at the present time it is not being utilized. He said he is not seeking any publicity for his company in offering to make it available to the FBI.

Inclosed for the Bureau are three pieces of cloth containing sample tapes from three Thermo-Seal machines.

On 4/24/66, VARRES TIMES, Manager, White Star Laundry and Bry Cleaners, 4535 Cole, Ballins, Texas, furnished the englosed sample laundry marks from the three Thermo-Scal marking unchines operated by his concern. He advised the "20" is a let number, the "R" is the week, and the "3" is the customar impoles. He uses eight colors of Thermo-Scal tape each week and a light yellow color is therefore used 1/8 (approximately) of each week,

The enclosed samples are gold colored tape as opposed to the light yellow color he uses. Gold is used exclusively for one day specials. He stated he would put tape markers on sheets and pillow cases only when they are brought in for one day special service. He does not use any marker on normal flat work such as sheets and pillow cases, handling that by the bundle.

TYPE advised he makes records of the identity of quetomers only if they have a charge scatters. Almost all, if not all, of his one day service is done the peak basis.

I. as well as the members of the Memphis Police Department in their conduct in this investigation.

I again want to express to you personally my appreciation for the close cooperation and coordination that we have between the Memphis Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation and for the assistance which the Memphis office of the F. B. I. has rendered in this case.

King Assassin Bjt 350 By DOUG STONE

MEMPHIS, Tenn. AP - A ranking memphis police officer acknowledges there are 'a whole lot of discrepencies' in official descriptions of the man sought as the sniper slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Asst. Chief Bill Price referred to statements that James Earl Ray, 40, an escaped Missouri convict, and Eric Starvo Galt, first sought for King's April 4 assassination in Memphis, are the same person.

"You don't know what to look for," Price said Sunday as officers here and elsewhere continued their investigation of the slaying. The nationwide manhunt continues.

The FBI issued a conspiracy warrant wednesday for Galt, then updated their case Friday by saying a fingerprint comparison showed Galt was really Ray.

The naming of Ray in the case caused confusion, primarily because earlier official statements indicate that Galt and Ray were in different places at the same time.

When Galt was charged as a conspirator in King's death by rifle bullet, the FBI said the man had taken dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964-65. The FBI said later the earlier description should have said Galt reportedly took dancing lessos rather than stating it flatly.

During that time, Ray was in the Missouri State Prison at Jefferson City, serving a 20-year sentence for a 1959 supermarket robbery.

The age of the man also was in conflict.

Witnesses who saw a matin a Memphis rooming housefrom where the fatal bullet was fired estimated his age as in the late 20s. The FBI, in issuing its warrant for Galt, said he had given his birthdate

That would make him 36. The FBI said Friday Ray is 40.

The personalities of the two men are sometimes at odds. A prison pal described Ray as virtually a nondrinker. The FBI describes Galt as a fanciver of beer and vodka.

There were other differences:

Galt: neat appearance. Ray: careless appearance.

Galt: Southern accent. Ray: born in Alton. Ill. No Southern accent.

Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, who came to Memphis after King was slain, at first ruled out a conspiracy, but then the FBI issued its warrant for Galt on a conspiracy charge.

Police here have their own investigation of the slaying under way, and officials say detectives are working hard on the case.

One theory within the Memphis department is that Eric Starvo Galt is a myth, painstakingly created by the conspirators as a smoke screen.

*Somebody has muddled the waters, Price said.

He could mt explain why he would contact his attorney at the FBI Office in Charlotte when this contact concerned a State parole in Georgia.

His attorney, JAMES HUBBARD, was telephonically contacted and advised, after reviewing his files, that he represented one CHESTER BARFIELD of Anniston, Alabama, in 1967 in connection with filing a debtor's petition but had not heard from BARFIELD since that time. He advised he had no appointment with BARFIELD and was unfamiliar with any murder matter concerning "FATS" HARDY.

At the time the call was placed to the attorney, BARFIELD stated it was necessary for him to place another coin in the parking meter and left the office. He did not return to the office.

On April 15, 1968, SAMUEL GARRARD, an employee of the All Right Parking Lot, Jefferson Standard Building, Charlotte, North Carolina, advised he met CHESTER BARFIELD on the night of April 14, 1968, at room 109, Howard Johnson Motel. BARFIELD displayed a receipt for \$1,000 showing he had that amount deposited in the motel safe. He advised that BARFIELD told him he received the \$1,000 for killing MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON:

AT CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. JEAN PARKS, Manager, Howard Johnson Motel, Statesville Avenue, Charlotte, advised that CHESTER C. BARFIELD registered at the motel on April 13, 1968, and was assigned to room 109. He listed a residence address of

Mrs. PARKS advised that BARFIELD was in Charlotte to attend the Leesona School located on Interstate 85 near the motel. On April 14, 1968, he appeared at the motel in either a drunken condition or was under the influence of some kind of drugs. On the night of April 14, 1968, he and at least one other individual was in his room causing considerable disturbance. On the morning of April 15, 1968, he did not go to class. The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD G. SHERIDAN: AT LENOIR, NORTH CAROLINA On April 16, 1968, a review of the current Lenoir. North Carolina, Telephone and City Directories failed to reveal a listing for Linen or Lenoir Thread Company or CHESTER C. BARFIELD. Identification records of the Caldwell County and Lenoir City Police Department failed to reveal any record of CHESTER C. BARFIELD. Miss SUSIE GREEN, Lenoir Credit Bureau, advised her records filed in this office failed to list a Linen Thread Company, Lenoir Thread Company, of a CHESTER C. BARFIELD. The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON: AT CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA On April 16, 1968, Mrs. JEAN PARKS, Manager, Howard Johnson Motel, advised that due to the behavior of BARFIELD. she determined that he is employed by the Linen Thread Company, Blue Mountain, Alabama. She stated she had been in touch with his company. She advised that BARFIELD had checked out of the motel and his whereabouts were unknown to her. She stated that when he checked into the motel, he deposited \$75 cash in the motel safe and that he received this amount on April 15, 1968, after indicating he was going to Atlanta, Georgia, in view of the fact that his aunt there died. 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

COLLINS, Personnel Manager, Linen Thread Company, Blue Mountain, Alabama, advised April 17, 1968, that CHESTER C. BARFIELD, JR., had been employed by that firm since July 20, 1967. He was born His normal hours are from 6 A. M. to 2 P. M., Monday through Saturday. Time and attendance records showed that BARFIELD worked from 6 A. M. to 2:06 P. M. on April 4, 1968. CLAUDE BLACK, BARFIELD's immediate supervisor, advised that BARFIELD had not missed a day of work since January 4 and 5, 1968, when he was ill with the flu. He said BARFIELD is presently attending a special aschool in Charlotte, North Carolina, which is being given by the Unicorner Winding Company, Charlotte, North Carolina. This school was to begin April 15, 1968, and to run for two weeks. BARFIELD left work on Friday, in the afternoon, April 12, 1968, en route to Charlotte via Atlanta, Georgia, where he was going to leave his mother at a friend's house. BARFIELD was given \$200 advance for expenses when he left. The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON: AT CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA On April 18, 1968, Mr. C. WILLIAMS, Leesona Corporation, Charlotte, North Carolina, advised CHESTER C. BARFIELD was to be a student at a two-week school being held at that plant. He advised BARFIELD registered and never put in an appearance. He said BARFIELD's whereabouts are unknown but he believed he was recalled to Alabama by his employer.
