Approximately one year before becoming knowled in the instant efficies defendent was released from corvice of a scattere of one to two years for armed rebbery in the Illinois State Peniteutiary. In August of 195h he burglaried a clean-ing establishment in East Alten, Illinois. Although he conditionly was charged with burglary he apparently has never been before the appropriate court and apparently is not presently wanted on this charge. In 1969 in Les Angeles, California he was convicted of burglary and see moved to light means in the county jail. After serving minesy days of this accesses he was released on probables for a period of two years.

Defondant shows absolutely no remerce at this time. He ambicipates receiving a substantial sentence for the insulant offence. In uniteria epinion he is a confirmed original and a member to society when in the free world.





### Re ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS

By communication dated April 18, 1968, the Norfolk Office of the FBI advised as follows:

Mrs. LLOYD BLACK, Norfolk, Virginia, sister-in-law of ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS, advised on April 18, 1968, that newspaper pictures and description (of assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.) are identical with ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS. She advised WILLIAMS escaped approximately one year ago from confinement at Asheville, North Carolina, and had repeatedly stated he would kill Dr. KING. She said the wife of WILLIAMS, CAROLYN RUTH WILLIAMS, 1107 Ray Avenue, Sanford, North Carolina, received information that WILLIAMS called another sister, name unknown, about one week ago from Atlanta, Georgia, and requested money.

The following investigation was conducted by IC MARION E. HILLIARD at Raleigh, North Carolina:

Captain O. S. MOORE, Extradition Officer, North Carolina Department of Correction, Raleigh, advised on April 18, 1968, that ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS, FBI Number 372433F, escaped July 12, 1967, from the Haywood County Prison Unit. He was received by the Department of Correction on September 16, 1965, to serve ten years on four counts of assault on a female with a deadly weapon. He was described as follows:

The following investigation was conducted by SA LINDIAN J. SWAIM at Sanford, North Carolina:

On April 18, 1968, CAROLYN RUTH WILLIAMS, 1107 Ray Avenue, Sanford, advised she has been separated from ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS since June 14, 1965, and divorced from him since August 26, 1966. She last saw him when he was convicted and sent to prison.

She said about three weeks ago Mrs. FRANK (MARGARET) WIMBERLY, Dunn, North Carolina, WILLIAMS' sister, told her that shortly before Christmas he telephoned another sister, Mrs. EUNICE (Last Name Unknown) who lives in Indiana, and asked her to send him some money. He called from Atlanta, Georgia.

Mrs. WILLIAMS said her former husband is not a member of the Ku Klux Klan but did attend several Klan rallies in Sanford. When he was drunk he often talked about Dr. KING and several times stated he would like to "kill the SOB." She said he is emotionally unstable, has a violent temper, is always fighting and on one occasion threatened a highway patrolman who stopped him for speeding.

The following investigation was conducted by SA VICTOR P. HOLDREN at Sanford, North Carolina:

On the night of April 18, 1968, Mrs. WILLIAMS was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, at which time she stated the photograph was similar but not identical with her ex-husband.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT H. CAVERLY at Dunn, North Carolina:

Mrs. MARGARET WIMBERLY, 605 North General Lee Avenue, Dunn, advised on April 19, 1968, that she is the sister of ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS. She was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and she stated this photograph, in no way, CE 44-1365 CFW:jwr <u>3</u>

resembles her brother. She stated that in October or November, 1967, her brother called a sister, Mrs. GEORGE (EUNICE) SMITH in Princeton, Indiana, asking for money and stated he was calling from Atlanta, Georgia.

On April 19, 1968, Mrs. BEATRICE ROBERTS, Dunn, North Carolina, sister of ROBERT FRANKLIN WILLIAMS, was shown a photograph of GALT, at which time she advised that the photograph, in no way, resembled that of her brother.

### Re ERIC STARVO GALT

On April 19, 1968, the Bureau telephonically advised that a call had been received from RAYMOND HIGGINS, 300 East Worthington Avenue, Charlotte, North Carolina. HIGGINS works at Mitchell and Becker in the 1900 Block of South Boulevard, Charlotte.

HIGGINS advised he frequents Robertson's Drive-In Restaurant on South Boulevard. He said on the night of April 18, 1968, he observed a man in the restaurant whom he is positive is ERIC STARVO GALT. There was a woman with this individual who spoke with a foreign accent.

He said he followed the couple out of the restaurant to the 1800 Block of South Boulevard where they entered an apartment, possibly at 1821 South Boulevard. He said he has seen photographs of GALT and is sure this individual is GALT. The man's left ear was larger than his right ear.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON at Charlotte, North Carolina

On April 19, 1968, RAYMOND HIGGINS, 300 East Worthington Avenue, Charlotte, advised that the individual ne saw and thought was GALT was a white male, 30 to 35 years old, 5'7" tall, 200 pounds, dark complexion, short hair. He was shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and without hesitation he advised that this was not the man he saw in Charlotte on the night of April 18, 1968.



### RE ERIC STARVO GALT

The following investigation was conducted by SA EDWARD G. SHERIDAN at Hickory, North Carolina:

On April 18, 1968, Trooper HARRY L. WILLIAMS, North Carolina Highway Patrol, stationed in Catawba County, North Carolina, advised that he saw the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT in the newspaper on that date and stated that he is certain that he encountered GALT while conducting a road block in Catawba County on the evening of April 9, 1968.

On the evening of April 9, 1968, WILLIAMS and Trooper MARVIN WRIGHT were participating in a road block check on U. S. Highway 321 at the intersection of North Carolina Highway 10, inside the City Limits of Newton, North Carolina. The road block was set up as a result of the general racial situation following the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and the purpose of the road block was to locate and confiscate from motor vehicles alcoholic beverages and firearms that might have been in possession of motorists. The road block lasted from approximately 7:30 p.m. until approximately 11:00 p.m.

Sometime between 9:00 p.m. and 9:30 p.m., April 9, 1968, a white male driving a 1955 or 1956 Dodge four-door automobile was stopped by WILLIAMS. WILLIAMS described this automobile as being three-toned, that is, having an off white colored top, a dark green hood and trunk, with a strip of green around the sides, partially on the doors and again having an off white bottom. WILLIAMS did not notice the color of the interior of this automobile. This vehicle was heading north on Highway 321. WILLIAMS specifically remembers that this vehicle was bearing 1968 Florida license with the prefix '10W-." There were four or five digits after the dash but WILLIAMS did not remember these numbers. The white male driving the vehicle was alone and the vehicle was heavily loaded with luggage, having possibly five or six suitcases in the back.

Trooper WILLIAMS stated that in his own mind he has definitely identified the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT

as being identical with this individual he stopped. He stated that there is no doubt in his mind regarding the matter and stated that he would "stake his life on it."

When WILLIAMS stopped this individual, he asked him for his drivers license and registration. The individual there upon presented a valid State of Florida driver's license. WILLIAMS does not remember the name of the drivers license but remembers that it did contain a first, middle and last name. He also noted that the name was uncommon to this area of North Carolina. WILLIAMS stated that this last name was a short name and he believes there were four letters in the last name. WILLIAMS stated that the name could have been "GALT." He stated that if the name was any of the three names of GALT, LOWMYER or WILLIARD, it would have been GALT or LOWMYER.

WILLIAMS stated that he does not remember the street or city address or license number on the drivers license displayed to him. He stated, however, that he specifically remembers that the drivers license listed the driver's occupation as a pilot. WILLIAMS asked the individual what airlines he flew for and the individual gave a name of some not well known airline. WILLIAMS does not now remember the name of the airline given but remembers that the airline had two names to it. He does not remember the individual talking about any cities in Fla. or where he worked.

The individual never did display a registration for the vehicle and the matter of the registration was not pursued by WILLIAMS.

WILLIAMS observed a map folded on the front seat of the vehicle. This map included several southeastern states in the United States. WILLIAMS picked up the map and noted the driver had a route marked out from somewhere in deep central Georgia to Wytheville, Va. WILLIAMS noted that this route marked out constituted almost a straight line. The line ended at Wytheville, Va. WILLIAMS asked the individual where he was going and the individual said he was going on vacation to Wytheville, Va., to visit with some friends or relatives. The individual said he was then going to either Charleston or Bluefield, West Virginia. WILLIAMS

CE 44-1365

did not remember which of these two towns in West Va. the individual mentioned. The individual did not mention anything specific about his friends or relatives in Wytheville, Va., or Charleston or Bluefield, W. Va., and did not indicate how long he was going to stay at any of these places.

WILLIAMS then instructed this individual how to get on Highway 16 north heading out of Conover, N. C. WILLIAMS advised that the entire conversation took place in about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  minutes.

In commenting on the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, WILLIAMS advised that the individual he stopped, whom he believes to be GALT, did not have cheeks as full as are GALT's cheeks in the photograph. He stated that the individual had a face considerably less fleshy than is shown is GALT's photograph. He stated that the individual he stopped had noticeable features in that he had a sharp pointed chin, a long and narrow and pointed nose, and large ears. He also noted that the individual's hair was much shorter than is depicted in GALT's photograph and his hair was brushed straight back. He advised that the individual's face was considerably narrower and longer that is depicted in GALT's photograph.

In describing the individual's composure, WILLIAMS advised that the individual was calm and not excited. He stated that the individual was reserved in his talk, answered questions precisely but did not volunteer information. WILLIAMS described the individual as well-groomed, clean shaven and immaculate in appearance. He stated that the individual gave him the impression that he would be precise in everything he did.

WILLIAMS furnished the following description of this individual from memory:

Trooper MARVIN WRIGHT, who also participated in the road block, advised that he did not talk to the individual stopped by WILLIAMS because he went directly to the car stopped behind the car WILLIAMS stopped. However, WRIGHT described the green in the car WILLIAMS stopped as a faded green. Also, WRIGHT advised, after the individual stopped by WILLIAMS left, WRIGHT specifically remembers WILLIAMS remarking that the license plate on the car was a 1968 Florida license with the prefix "10W-." WRIGHT also remembers WILLIAMS remarking about what a short last name the individual had.

Neither WRIGHT nor WILLIAMS has seen this individual since April 9, 1968.

the name ERIC STARVO GALT, and pointed out that his last name is spelled GAULT and not GALT. EVERETT GAULT observed photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and advised that he had never seen this individual, and that this person is definitely not a member of his family or a relation thereof. He stated that he has a brother by the name of CURTIS HOPE GAULT, and his last known address was Pioneer, Louisiana. EVERETT GAULT stated that his brother, CURTIS GAULT, was employed by the Ford Bacon and Davis Construction Company, Monroe, Louisiana. He stated he has not been in contact with his brother for some period of time, and is not sure of his present whereabouts.

He also commented that MALCOLM A. GAULT and EZRA GAULT are both brothers of his. EVERETT GAULT stated he could furnish no information concerning anyone who resembles the person in the photograph identified as ERIC STARVO GALT. EVERETT GAULT advised his brother, CURTIS HOPE GAULT, is not identical with ERIC STARVO GALT.

No lead to locate and interview CURTIS HOPE GAULT, Pioneer, Louisiana, is being set out, and this matter is being left to the discretion of the office of origin.

DAVID McDONALD, Supervisor, National Airlines Ticket Office, Hobby Airport, Houston, Texas, furnished following additional information today:

Last evening while watching the FBI Story on television he observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was immediately reminded of a passenger whom he checked through on either National Airlines Flight 23 or National Airlines Flight 47 at approximately noon, 4/21/68. He described the person as about 6'1", with brown hair and a neatly trimmed goatee approximately 1" long covering the bottom lip and chin area only. He was wearing a light colored cowboy type straw hat, a beige Levi type jacket, and black horn rim sun glasses. He, while being checked by McDONALD, removed his sun glasses and stared intently/ at McDONALD. McDONALD stated the general configuration and look of this man's eyes appeared to be practically identical with the eyes in the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY He said the passenger's nose and general shape of his face and mouth also resemble the photograph of RAY. The passenger checked through with no luggage and was carrying a small two-handle type flight bag. He said he was unable to determine whether or not the passenger was identical with RAY but that he felt there was a good possibility that they might be identical.

National Airlines Flight 23 departed Houston at the above described time en route for Las Vegas with final destination San Francisco. National Airlines Flight 47 departed Houston at the above described time en route non-stop to Los Angeles.

On 4/22/68 Lt. NOBERT CALMELL, Commanding, Robbery Squad, Metropolitan Police Department advised SA JOHN M. FLATLEY, WFO that a Megro male about 65 years old who did not identify himself came to the Robbery Squad and said he saw a man who resembled the FRI Wented Flyer of ERIC STARYO GALL. The man told CALMELL he saw the man working as a Chaf or cook at the Golden Rule Restaurant, in Riverdale, Md., a day or two before. He said he himself has been a cook all his life and the man resembling GALT didn't seem to know what he was doing as a cook.

The Metropolitan Washington phone book, Maryland section, reflects a Colden Rule Dairy in Beltsville, Md., but no reference to a Golden Rule Restaurant.
