The file revealed that GAWRON was originally received at Joliet, Illinois, Penitentiary on November 2, 1934, under sentence of one to life for burglary. GAWRON received Menard Branch, Illinois State Penitentiary on July 25, 1956, from Adams County, Illinois, as a parole violator. GAWRON paroled from Menard on March 21, 1959, to Veterans Administration Hospital,

Wood, Wisconsin. He remained there three days and left without permission. GAWRON carried at that time in an absconder status until November 16, 1961, when he was returned to Menard Penitentiary. He was paroled on April 11, 1963, to the Soldiers and Sailors Home, Quincy, Illinois, but was never received at this home. GAWRON's address as of April, 1968, was shown as 1807 South 11th, St. Louis, Missouri.

This inmate was classified as a doubtfully improvable offender with delinquent attitudes and lack of initiative and ambition. His criminality appeared to be related to his alcoholic tendency. He was recently examined when he wrote a request for transfer to Stateville because of problems of ill health. He claimed that he was disabled in the World War and that his ear drums were ruptured. He now complains of head pains and discharging ears. He feels, rather vaguely, that larger, dryer cells at Stateville would be more conducive to good health. His conduct within the Old Prison has been satisfactory. He has been punished on only two or three occasions. He has a fairly good attitude toward his employment. shows no evidence of mental disease. Under the new policy he should be classified for Stateville since it is likely he will have to serve a number of years within the institution. In the interests of his general health and to further the present classification policy, resegregation is recommended.

Continued medical treatment for the ear condition and work in a dry, inside place is. suggested.

## BEHAVICR ON PAROLE

This 62 year old white man was paroled from Menard on 3-21-59 to a Veteran's Administra-

tion Hospital at Wood, Wisconsin, but remained there only three days and then left " without permission. He now says, "I got loaded up on liquor and goof balls, and when I came to I was in the Union Station at Chicago and found I had a ticket to St. Louis so I just went on to St. Louis and stayed there." He says he lived in St. Louis during the entire time he was at large as an absconder, and lived with a cousin at a rooming house at 1913 Hickory Street, St. Louis. He says he obtained employment, usually casual and part-time in nature, through an employment agency, and also received a V.A. compensation check amounting to \$61.00 monthly. During his last few months of liberty he also received public aid assistance. He states that on two occasions, from July to September, 1959 and again from October, 1960 to January, 1961, he was a patient at the Cochran V.A. Hospital in St. Louis because of a heart condition. Inmate says he was not arrested at any time while in St. Louis, but about 11-9-61 he and an acquaintance were picked up at Louisiana, Missouri, his identity as an Illinois violator was then discovered, and he waived extradition for return. He says this acquaintance left St. Louis to drive to Quincy, Illinois, asked inmate to go along, and he accepted. He says they stopped at Louisiana, Missouri and were questioned by police about the burglary of a supermarket in that area, but he knew nothing about that offense. Enclosed with reports from the Division of Supervision concerning this inmate is a detailed report of investigation by the Missouri Highway Patrol of the burglary, but we find nothing in this which would suggest that inmate and his companion were suspected of having any connection with the crime, and it seems evident that no charge was filed in Missouri. However, it will be noted that this episode seems to have at least some points of resemblance to the behavior which led to his return as a parole violator in July, 1956.

## REVIEW OF SOCIAL FACTORS:

The Reclassification Report of 9-2-56 offers a summary of inmate's background and we would re-

fer to that report. As indicated above, he assertedly lived with a cousin who operates a rooming house in St. Louis after he absconded from his most recent parole. Although he says he was under the influence of liquor and "goof balls" at the time he absconded from parole, he claims that thereafter he indluged only in moderate drinking. He says he worked at various part-time jobs as a janitor, etc., while in St. Louis until he was placed on public relief following his release from the Cochran V.A. Hospital in January, 1961 following a heart attack. He now corresponds with his cousin in St. Louis.

#### PERSONALITY:

Physically, inmate's appearance suggests his advancing age, and he gives a history of two fairly severe heart attacks in recent years. He has also been hard of hearing for a number of years, and receives V.A. disability compensation. We would refer to the current medical report for further information as to his condition. Recent psychometric test indicates superior intelligence, with a score approximating that previously obtained. Temperamentally, he is a rather beaten, prisonized individual who has in the past had a history of heavy drinking during the occasional interludes when he is not incarcerated, but who claims only moderate indulgence following the binge which led to his prompt absconding from his V.A. Hospital placement. We regard him as a rather dependent institutionalized

person who has long been an outcast from conventional society and who tends to submerge himself into anonymity whenever he is confronted with the demands of a free community adjustment.

This 57 year old white man was paroled 3. Recommendations BEHAVIOR ON PAROLE: from Joliet for the second time on

9-21-54 to placement at the Soldier's and Sailor's Home in Quincy. He remained there until March 1956, then left because he learned the police were looking for him in connection with investigation of an Armed Robbery at LaGrange, Missouri. Reports indicate that inmate had been drinking considerably while at the Soldier's and Sailor's Home, and had also been keeping company with a Mrs. Lucille Ryan, the mother of a Menard parolee, #23737 Ryan. This parolee was also arrested in connection with the armed robbery at La-Grange, Missouri, and is apparently now incarcerated in that state. Records indicate that another parolee, Menard #23686 Cain, was also arrested for questioning in connection with that investigation, but was released. Inmate says he left the home when he learned that police were looking for him, moved to a room in Quincy, and he evidently eluded investigation at that time. Although he refused to reveal where he was living, other information indicates that he was later living with Mrs. Ryan, According to his own story, he obtained employment with a road construction company after he left the home, and it would appear that his whereabouts might have been traced in this manner, had there been sufficient interest. Records indicate that a violation warrant was issued late in March 1956, and that he was then arrested by Quincy police on 6-28-56 as a burglary suspect. Cain, Menard #23686, had been arrested a few days earlier in connection with two burglaries in which inmate does not appear to have been directly implicated, although the loot was apparently taken to Mrs. Ryan's home, where inmate was staying. Cain then admitted some earlier burglaries, and implicated inmate as an associate in at least one of them. Inmate now professes rather naive innocence of any knowledge of these offenses, professes that he did not understand much of the questioning to which he was subjected following his arrest, and is evidently decided on a policy of admitting as little as possible. He does admit considerable drinking while on parole, and his technical violation in failure to send in a few reports. From present information, it would appear that there was a concerted and calculated series of criminal episodes in which two Menard parolees, Cain and Kyan, as well as at least one other associate were involved, and in which inmate was also implicated on the basis of Cain's statements.

#### REVIEW OF SOCIAL FACTORS:

Subject was born in Chicago on as the sixth of seven children of a native-born mother of Polish descent and a German immigrant father. During inmate's youth the family lived in a disorderly and delinquent area on the near northwest side in Chicago. He says his father "had a political job" with the Chicago street department, and the family was evidently of limited socio-enonomic status. He now says his father died in 1930 and his mother

also died in 1951. Inmate says he now has two living brothers, but has had ho contact with either of them for a considerable time. He claims to have completed eighth grade in public school. In February 1915 he was commited to St. Charles for stealing auto tires, apparently escaped twice, and it seems to have been during an escape from that institution that he enlisted in the Marines in May 1916. He was medically discharged from the Marines in May 1917. In April 1918 he was committed to Pontiac under one year sentence for larceny. In June 1921 he was committed to Leavenworth under year sentence for altering and passing government obligations. September 1927 he was sentenced to a six month term in the Chicago House of Correction for burglary. In June 1929 he was sentenced to a 1-15 year term at Folsom for burglary, and was paroled in December 1931. As records indicate, it was in November 1934 that he was originally committed to Joliet under his present l-Life sentance, and his only period in the free community since have been his recent parole period and one earlier parole from December ا المالات الم **of** the time and was eventually involved in another burglary. His civilian work history has thus been extremely irregular and casual. In previous interviews inmate has stated that he was married in 1932 and was later divorced. but he now denies that he was ever married and says this was a common-law attachment. Leisure activities have centered primarily around drinking. Immate now has no effective community attachments.

PERSONALITY: Physically inmate is an aging individual who is apparently somewhat hard of hearing, and he gives a history of chronic ear trouble dating from his Marine service in 1916-17. He has received partial disability compensation for a considerable number of vears, and apparently is fearful of giving a history of too satisfactory nealth because he feels that this maight possible be reduced or cut off. Previous psychometric tests have indicated superior intelligence, but his present reactions suggest thathe is functioning on a considerably lower level. Temperamentally he is a rather beaten, prisonized individual who has been incarcerated much of his life and who has no goals or constructive notivations. He has been inclined toward heavy drinking when not incarcerated, and apparently this was a problem during his recent parole period even before he became involved in more serious violations. In present interview he attempts to create as much sympathy for himself as possible, professes inpocence of any sermous wrong-doing, and claims to know nothing of the various ew criminal charges for which he was under investigation. He now impresses us as an essentially dependent, institutionalized person who is unable to avoid involvement in criminal activity in the free community, and for whom any hope of satisfactory adjustment now seems remote.

She stated that she recalls a man sitting either in front of her or next to her on the aisle who chewed his fingernails just like her husband. This man did not resemble the photograph of RAY.

JCHN C. MEDIZER was located at his place of employment, Texas Nameplate Company, 1900 South Ervay Street, at which time he was interviewed.

MEDIZER stated that he left Chicago, Illinois, on March 31, 1968, by way of Greyhound Bus, directly to Dallas, Texas, with an approximate 2-hour layover at St. Louis, Missouri, on the same date. He stated that he arrived in Dallas early on the morning of April 1, 1968, and immediately contacted a friend of his by the name of EDDIE CRANFIELD, who lives at 5506 East R. L. Thornton Freeway.

MEDIZER stated before leaving Chicago he lived at 4601 Belmont and worked for the Roto-Print Company.

He stated that while in Chicago he was a member of the American Nazi Party (ANP) and plans to continue his membership with the ANP by paying his dues to the ANP headquarters in Arlington, Virginia. MEDIZER further stated he does not plan to contact any of the ANP members in Dallas, Texas, since he is becoming inactive in the ANP inasmuch as he is getting married shortly to a Dallas girl by the name of CHARLENE HARRIS, who works at the Coca Cola Bottling Company, Dallas.

MEDIZER stated that on April 1, 1968, he obtained a construction job through his friend, EDDIE CRANFIELD, with the Leroy Roberts Construction Company, 4031 Mission Street, Dallas. He stated that he worked continuously at this construction company with EDDIE CRANFIELD until approximately April 12, 1968, at which time he left that company because he did not like construction work. MEDIZER stated that he then began working for the Texas Namplate Company on April 18, 1968, and has been so employed to the present date.

MEDIZER then stated that in regard to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he does not recall ever making any threats against the life of KING, however, since he is a member of the ANP, he does not agree at all with the policies followed by KING or his successors. He stated, however, that as a member

MEDIZER stated that since he is getting married in the near future, he plans to stay in the Dallas area and purchase a home and become inactive in the ANP.

He further stated that Mr. LEROY ROBERTS or his foreman, BILL DAVIDSON, could vouch for his whereabouts from April 1 to April 12, 1968.

MATCH BOOK FROM REID MOTEL GREENVILLE, ALABAMA, FOUND BEHIND 107-113 14TH STREET, N.E., ATLANTA, GEORGIA

The following investigation was conducted on May 3, 1968 by SA DANIEL W. MC ALLEN, III, at Greenville, Alabama:

Mr. LONNIE DANIELS, SR., Manager, Reid Motel, Highway 31, advised that he has been working at this motel for the past two years, and presently is managing same in the absence of the owner, Mrs. ETHEL B. DYKES. He said that he normally checks guests in and out of the motel and feels certain he would recognize individual guests from photographs. DANIELS said he was a law enforcement officer for 16 years and has had experience in identifying people from photographs.

DANIELS was shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and could not identify any of the photographs as anyone having stayed at this motel in the past. In addition he made available records of the motel which were examined by SA DANIEL W. MC ALLEN, III, but no registration for Subject RAY, under his true name or aliases, was found. This check covered the period from April, 1967 to date.

DANIELS stated that match books at this motel are not kept out in the open where anyone could pick them up, but are given out to persons only on request. He said that the motel has used several different colored match books, and the printing on the match books have differed at times. He stated that if the color of any particular match book and the writing thereon were made known to him, he would possibly be able to pinpoint the approximate time the match book was dispensed at that motel. DANIELS advised that numerous persons from the Atlanta, Georgia, area frequent this motel.

Mrs. MARY OWENS, maid, Reid Motel, was shown photographs of RAY, but could not identify the photographs as anyone having stayed at that motel in the past.

## ADMINISTRATIVE

## Re NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER

By teletype dated 4/26/68, the Columbia Office advised as follows:

For information of Charlotte, NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER, who resided at Camden, South Carolina, in 1966, was formerly SV 472-R (PROB), CO 48M-4, and RH 294-R. In 1965 he was described as Imperial Klexter of UKA, Inc., KKKK, and was dropped as an informant when he left the Klan. He told a Special Agent in 1965 that he hated Negroes and would gladly take part in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which information was reported to the Bureau.

CAULDER's last known address in February, 1967, was Route 1, Laurel Hill, North Carolina. Charlotte was instructed to conduct investigation to determine if CAULDER might be indicated as a conspirator in the assassination of KING.

The following investigation was conducted at Charlotte, North Carolina:

On April 24, 1968, Lieutenant C. Y. ROSS, Charlotte Police Department, advised that NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER had been arrested by the Charlotte police earlier on that date while in the process of burglarizing Lowe's Hardware Store. He gave his address as Route 1, Laurel Hill, North Carolina, and was driving a 1966 Dodge convertible.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMANUEL R. JOHNSON at Charlotte, North Carolina:

On April 28, 1968, CAULDER was interviewed at the Mecklenburg County Jail, at which time he stated that on April 4, 1968, he was at his mother's residence in Laurel Hill, North Carolina. He said his mother, ELOISE CAULDER, can verify the fact that he was there on that date. He stated he could not recall where he was on March 29 and 30, 1968. He denied killing MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. or being

a participant in connection with the shooting. He denied purchasing a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama. CAULDER also denied ever making a statement indicating that he would gladly take part in the killing of KING.

The following physical description of CAULDER was obtained from the records of the Charlotte Police Department and through observation and interview:

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT M. STEVENSON at Laurel Hill, North Carolina:

On May 2, 1968, Mr. DAN CAULDER and his wife ELOISE CAULDER, mailing address Route 1, Box 228, residence Springfield Mill Village, were interviewed separately and they both advised substantially the same information, which information is as follows:

Their son, NICHODAS NATHANIEL CAULDER, whom they refer to as "Nick" and "Sonny," had been working as an electrician for the Bryant or Bryan Construction Company on the construction of the Hercules Plant at Wilmington for about one year until he was laid off during the latter part of February or the first part of March, 1968, when he returned to their home to stay and seek employment in the vicinity. He was unsuccessful in getting local employment and he then traveled to an unknown place in the State of Mississippi to get employment at an unknown company. They furnished him sufficient money for his travel to Mississippi, which he performed in his personally owned automobile. He stayed away from home about three days and returned saying that he found

the company employees were on strike and he did not want to cross the picket lines. They could not furnish specific dates on which he made this trip but thought it was during the middle part of March, 1968.

They advised that CAULDER was at their home the evening that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR, was shot and killed because they specifically recalled that Mr. DAN CAULDER and their son were watching television the evening of April 4, 1968, and shortly after the news broadcast from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m., they saw a special bulletin flash on the screen that KING had been shot and DAN CAULDER and their son called for Mrs. CAULDER to come to watch the television. They said several minutes later they saw on television that KING had died.

Mr. and Mrs. CAULDER were emphatic that their son was at their home the evening of April 4, 1968, and stated that he stayed at their home continuously for at least two weeks prior to April 4, 1968, but could not state definitely as to his specific whereabouts on March 29-30, 1968, other than the fact that he was at their home at night on these dates.

They advised their son has never been in trouble before and they are completely heartbroken to learn that he had been arrested in Charlotte for burglary.

They both advised they work at the Springfield Textile Mill near Laurel Hill. Mrs. CAULDER works on the first shift and her husband works on the third shift.

RE: EARL FREEMAN DAVIS

By communication dated April 26, 1968, the Richmond Office of the FBI furnished the following information:

Chief of Police ROBERT ELLISON, Colonial Heights, Virginia, advised on April 26, 1968, that he had received a telephone call from EARL DAVIS, Route 1, Box 265, Wilson, North Carolina, telephone number 234-5967. He said that DAVIS desired that he (ELLISON) travel to Wilson, North Carolina and take him (DAVIS) into custody for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Chief ELLISON described DAVIS as a white male, about 45 years of age, who is employed as a road grader operator, and who is a heavy drinker. ELLISON said some time ago DAVIS was employed in the Colonial Heights, Virginia, area and was arrested several times by the Colonial Heights Police Department during that time.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES E. CALLAHAN, JR., at Wilson, North Carolina:

On April 26, 1968, JOHN TEAL, Identification Officer, Wilson Police Department, made available the arrest record for EARL FREEMAN DAVIS indicating numerous arrests from 1945 to date for drunkenness. He was shown as a white male, age 25 (1945), Route 1, Wilson, North Carolina, 5 feet 11 inches tall, 150 pounds, brown hair, and blue eyes.

On April 26, 1968, BERNICE DAVIS, the brother of EARL DAVIS, advised that EARL is presently employed by the S. T. Wooten Construction Company of Stantonsburg, North Carolina.

On April 26, 1968, Mrs. MODRING, Wooten Construction Company, advised that DAVIS is presently working on a road project in Nash County, North Carolina. She advised that her records show that DAVIS was employed by that company and was at work on April 3, April 4, and April 5, 1968.

EARL FREEMAN DAVIS advised that on April 24, 1968, he made a telephone call to an unknown dispatcher at the Colonial Heights, Virginia, Police Department. He explained that on that date it was raining, and for this reason he did not go to work, and as usual when he is not employed, he got drunk. He said he formerly worked for seven years for the city of Colonial Heights, He denied recollection of any mention of Virginia. the MARTIN LUTHER KING assassination and stated to the best of his knowledge he had never killed anyone in his life. He said he could not recall having made any statements regarding killing anyone and does not recall having spoken to Chief of Police ROBERT ELLISON. He advised he has no information which would assist in identifying the assassin of KING.

RE: JAMES EARL RAY

By communication dated April 6, 1968, the Washington Field Office of the FBI agvised as follows:

Doctor NORMAN FORRESTER, Dentist, 212 M Street, Southwest, Washington, D. C., advised that the artist's sketch of the suspect in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which appeared in a local newspaper, looks like an individual who accompanied a patient of his by the name of RONNIE CHRISTBERRY, 202 27th Street, Hickory, North Carolina, whom he treated on April 6, 1968.

He described the individual he considers a suspect as being a white male, 20 years of age, blond hair, and wearing a red sweater.

The following investigation was conducted by SA J. RALPH JONES:

#### AT HICKORY, NORTH CAROLINA

On April 8, 1968, Mrs. JEAN CHRISTENBURG, 202 27th Street, Southwest, Hickory, North Carolina, advised she is the mother of RONNIE CHRISTENBURG, who left home on April 2, 1968, leaving no word as to his whereabouts. She said in the past RONNIE has associated with JOHN POWELL, who lives in Burke County, North Carolina, and that on April 2, 1968, POWELL jumped from the courthouse in Morganton, North Carolina, where he was to be tried for drunk driving and hit and run.

On April 9, 1968, Deputy Sheriff GERALD POTEAT, Sheriff's Office, Morganton, North Carolina, advised that JOHN POWELL did jump and run from the courthouse on April 2, 1968, and his whereabouts are unknown.

FBI - MEMPHIS

Deputy Sheriff POTEAT described POWELL as a white male, six feet tall, 145 pounds, dark skin and hair, one slightly cocked eye, and about 20 years of age.

On April 12, 1968, AVERY C. ERVIN, North Carolina Probation Officer, advised that JOHN POWELL is on probation under his supervision. He said information had been received indicating that POWELL, after he ran from the courthouse on April 2, 1968, went to Virginia looking for employment. He advised that POWELL was born

On April 18, 1968, Sergeant BILL PAYNE, Hickory Police Department, advised that RONNIE CHRISTENBURG had returned to Hickory, and it was learned that he had been in the company of JOHN POWELL.

On April 24, 1968, North Carolina Probation Officer AVERY ERVIN advised that POWELL had been with RONNIE CHRISTENBURG and was reported to have returned to that county. He said he has known POWELL for several years and is aware of his family and background. He said POWELL could not be identical with or involved with JAMES EARL RAY in connection with the assassination of KING.

On April 24, 1968, HUGH HUTCHINS, Valdese, North Carolina, Police Department, advised that POWELL is a native of that city, is married to a local girl, and is well known to the police, who have arrested him on numerous occasions. He said POWELL does not resemble in any respect the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE

GAULT advised that LUNCEFORD inquired about a Western Union money order which was to be forwarded to him at New Smyrna, Florida. He asked GAULT if he could contact the appropriate Western Union office in Florida to determine if this money order had been received, and if so to have the money order forwarded to Darien, Georgia. GAULT telephonically contacted New Smyrna, Florida, and ascertained that the money order had not been received by that office.

LUNCEFORD then placed two calls to Clinton, North Capolina, concerning this money order with directions to have it sent elsewhere. GAULT believed the second number LUNCEFORD called may have been 592-9345.
