She does not know his present whereabouts or any future address for him. He has no relatives or known contacts at Montgomery, Alabama, but only at Chicago, Illinois.

AT PRATTVILLE, ALABAMA.

On April 22, 1968, ROY GOLDEN, Continental Gin Company, reported the following from his records:

RAYMOND M. HILBURN, 150 West Patton Street, Montgomery, Alabama, was employed from April 10-17, 1968, in the machine shop. His last known employment was Bills Standard Station, 3266 West Devon Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. He resigned and left no forwarding address.

AT MONTGOMERY, ALABAMA.

On April 24, 1968, RAYMOND M. HILBURN was interviewed at 130 West Patton Street, at which time he reported as follows:

On April 23, 1968, HILBURN left JOSEPH at New Orleans, Louisiana. JOSEPH was employed part-time as a bartender and was residing at the Music Box Lounge, 1900 Canal Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

On April 26, 1968, RAYMOND M. HILBURN, 130 West Patton Street, was re-interviewed and reported as follows:

When he and JOSEPH (LAST NAME UNKNOWN) were stopped by the policeman at Pascagoula, Mississippi, on April 19, 1968, the policeman asked JOSEPH if he knew who he looked like. JOSEPH answered, "GALT" and said he had been stopped before in the vicinity of Mobile, Alabama. JOSEPH identified himself with a card of a merchant seaman.

HILBURN does not believe JOSEPH appears identical with subject JAMES EARL RAY.

At New Orleans, Louisiana, HILBURN left JOSEPH at the Music Box Lounge on Canal Street. JOSEPH was staying in an old school bus parked at the rear of the Music Box Lounge. The bus was owned by a white male about 60. That man had a wife about 20. The wife wore bluejeans, cowboy boots and appeared to be retarded mentally. This couple had a room at the rear of the lounge.

JOSEPH was a "wino". He did work part-time as a bartender at the lounge. He was working as a bartender when last seen by HILBURN at 4:30 a.m., April 21, 1968.

JOSEPH is known to DALE HALEY, white male, about 28, who resides at the hotel located next door to the Music Box Lounge.

HILBURN furnished the following description of JOSEPH:

Referenced teletype advised HAROLD J. THOME! a possible mental case, had been attempting to have an audience with MARTIN LUTHER KING in Atlanta. He had reportedly threatened a neighbor in the past with a shotgun. The Bureau instructed that although subject RAY had been identified as the assailant, investigation should be conducted to determine if THOME might be implicated as a conspirator.

A review of Los Angeles files reflects HAROLD J. THOME had advised the Los Angeles Office office on 4/19/67 he had observed a pickup truck and dune buggy in a ravine near Tujunga, California, and the occupants of the vehicles were apparently burying something. He brought this to the attention of the FBI because he thought it was of possible interest in the YOUNG kidnaping case.

In September, 1967, THOME'S son, STEVEN THOME, 355 West Acacia, Glendale, California, was interviewed at the residence of his father, 10520 Hillhaven Street, Tujunga, and advised his father had written President JOHNSON and the Pope on numerous occasions, voicing opposition to the war in Vietnam. He stated his father had been arrested in the past for pulling a gun on police officers who were attempting to stop some hippies from marching through a canyon area.

In September, 1967, Mrs. HAROLD THOME, former wife of THOME, stated she did not know his current address, but said he had been confined to mental wards in various hospitals in the Los Angeles area. She said besides having a mental problem, she considered THOME an alcoholic.

Subsequent investigation of the dune buggy incident established the people working around the automobile were attempting to tow it out of an area in which it had been stuck and there was no apparent relationship to the Young kidnaping case. The Atlanta Office advised that THOME had appeared at SCLC Headquarters, Atlanta on 11/6/67, insisting upon having an interview with MARTIN LUTHER KING for an unknown reason. On 11/7/67, TIM THOME (above), advised his father had a history of mental difficulties, frequency of suicide and had been in and out of Camarillo State Mental Hospital. On 9/14/67, KENNETH C. MERRYHEW, U. S. Secret Service, Los Angeles, advised his department had investigated HAROLD JAMES THOME after receipt of a letter he had written President JOHNSON at his ranch in Texas, dated 12/21/66. MERRYHEW stated the letter in essence warned President JOHNSON he was "in grave danger" and set forth THOME's opposition to the United States involvement in Vietnam. MERRYHEW stated the letter indicated THOME had written the President on two previous occasions. Mr. MERRYHEW stated the records of Camarillo State Hospital reflected THOME was a patient from 1/30/64 to 5/2/64 and from 10/2/64 to 12/10/65. He was classified as a schizophrenic paranoid, disorganized, troublesome and unapproved. further investigation was conducted by Secret Service. Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) records reflect that on 3/13/66, THOME was arrested for threatening a neighbor with a gun. No disposition of this arrest was shown. On 6/4/67, THOME was arrested for drunk driving and at the time of arrest had a .410 shotgun on the dashboard of the car which was unloaded. At 2:43 p.m., December 13, 1965, Lieutenant MORRIS REDDING, Racial and Subversive Unit, Atlanta Police Department, advised that a few minutes previously he had been telephonically contacted by Miss DORA MC DONALD, Secretary to Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

MC DONALD informed Lieutenant REDDING she had just completed receipt of a long distance telephone call from a male individual who stated he was "Mr. CHEW" (phonetic) residing 800 Washington Street, Denver, Colorado. MC DONALD said that CHEW stated "Tell Dr. King to be careful, someone is going to assassinate him. When is he going to make another appearance?"

MC DONALD told Lieutenant REDDING she had furnished no information to this individual but was concerned because Reverend KING was scheduled to speak at 7:30 p.m., December 13, 1965 at the St. James Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama.

At 2:50 p.m., December 13, 1965 Miss DORA MC DONALD, Secretary to Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., telephonically contacted the Atlanta Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and furnished essentially the same information as Lieutenant REDDING advised Miss DORA MC DONALD had furnished him. Miss MC DONALD requested that Special Agents of the FBI be present at the St. James Baptist Church, Birmingham during the evening of December 13, 1965 because of possible danger involving Reverend KING. MC DONALD was informed that Special Agents of the FBI were not authorized to afford protective service to any individual but that the information she had furnished would be immediately made available to the Birmingham Police Department.

On December 13, 1965, a confidential source advised that DORA E. MC DONALD, Secretary to Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) was contacted by an individual who informed her that his name was "HOLT CHEW" (phonetic) and that his address was "800 Washington", Denver, Colorado.

"CHEW" inquired of MC DONALD "When does KING go out again." MC DONALD asked what he meant by this question and "CHEW" said he wanted to know when Reverend KING would appear in public. MC DONALD said that Reverend KING was scheduled to make a public appearance in Birmingham, Alabama during the evening of December 13, 1965.

Records of the Danver Police Department, Bureau of Identification and Records, Denver, Colorado, reflect that Nott Chew, Denver Police Department #588554, was arrested for investigation of aggravated assault on January 20, 1833, at 10:00 P.M. at his residence, 800 Machington Street, Denver, following the shooting of James Thomas Jackson. He was releast on bond January 21, 1863, with a capias hold charging Assault to Murder. Denver Police Department records reflect Chew was examined by a physician at Denver City Jail on January 21, 1833, prior to his release, at which time the examining physician indicated Chew was affected by an acute alcoholic withdrawal syndrome and characterized Chew as a chronic alcoholic.



MGIA CHEW MARTER LUTHER RING - VICTIM CIVIL RICHES

Records of the Leaver Police Department, Bureau of Identification and Records, Benver, Colorado, reveal that Holt Chew, Denver Police Becartment Humber 56584, was placed on probation April 24, 1067 after conviction for shooting James Thomas Jackson, a Negro on January 20, 1966.

On April 29, 1960 and April 30, 1930, Chew was interviewed by Special Agents of the FDI. He was asked if he recalled he made a telephone call to the office of Martin Luther King in Atlanta, Georgia on December 13, 1965. He reflected for a few moments and then said he was not about to lie about the situation, especially to the FBI. He said that he has no love for Martin Buther King and is glad he is dead. He stated King was not the non-violent civil rights leader he claimed to be. Wherever he went, violence followed and he was responsible for 27 deaths in the United States. He added that, as a personal matter, King was directly responsible for the destruction of the business career of one of his sons, Bill Chew of Saint Augustine, Florida. He estimated his son's financial loss at \$400,000.00.

Chew stated that his son was head of a hotel and metel association in Saint Augustine, Florida a few years ago when King and his followers came down to Florida and started efforts to integrate the industry. His son was also operating a motel in Saint Augustine at the time. Bill Chew was taken into Federal Court by these people for refusing to integrate his establishment and as the result of an unfavorable court decision, he ended up resigning his position with the association and selling his motel at a
