

Mr. GLERN MORNIG, 602 Gray Ave., Wildwood, owner and operator of the Family Diner, advised in 1957 or 1958, he employed as a cook and dishwasher for a short period of time a paroles from the Illinois State Prison at Menard, Ill., one HARVEY LOVEYER. According to HORNIG, LOVEYER only worked for him for a short period of time and this was at his night club that he, HOENIG, operated at Chester, Ill.

MOENIG advised he believes LOVMIER was serving a sentence for "armed robbery" when he was paroled.

He recalled that LOVETER indicated he had a sister in El Cajon, Calif. MONNIG was of the opinion that LOWNIAN went to California after leaving his employment.

According to HORNIG, he never had any further contact with LOWNYER after he left his employment in Illinois. He advised, however, the Illinois State Prison System should have a file regarding LOVEYER.
