On March 25, 1968, a Hrs. JASPER WARD and a Mrs. GEORGIA DAVIS came to his motel secking a room. No pointed out to them that he was at the motel carrying out contain maintenance details in preparation for opening the metal and that he was not at that time ready to rent any of his units in that he was still in the process of painting and carrying on other maintenance details. Mrs. WARD registered, listing her address as 2540 Esnadell Avenue, Levisville, Kentucky. At the time they registered, Mrs. WARD and Mrs. DAVIS were driving a 1967 Cadillac convertible. Mrs. WARD identified herself as a State Senator in the Hentucky Legislature. At the time they registered they indicated that they would be there from two to three weeks. They also indicated that they anticipated another guest arriving within several days who would join them at the motel.

On April 1, 1968, he came to the motal to continue his maintenance duties at which time he observed an individual seated on the patio of Unit Humber 4 drinking a can of bear. This individual introduced himself as neverend A.D. KING. Reverend KING checked into Unit 5 as a past of the party of Mrs. JASPER WARD and Mrs. GEORGIA DAVIS. They remained at the motel until April 3, 1965 when Reverend A.D. KING checked from the motel. Mrs. WARD and Mrs. DAVIS did not check from the motel. During the time that these individuals stayed at the Treasure Island Notel, he had very little conversation with them as they remained on the beach most of the day, during which time he was in the general area conducting maintenance work on the motel. He did not enserve any of these individuals having any visitors during the time they were at the motel, and they used the pay telephone located outside the motel office during their stay as the motel office was abt opened. He recalls that they made numerous telephone calls and that they had numerous incoming calls through the pay telephone during the hours that he was in the general area conducting his maintenance duties.

Mr. HASTINGS advised that he has no information whatsoever pertaining to the death of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING.



By communication dated April 25, 1968 the St. Louis Division advised that DAVID LIMDSET WILSON, Serial Number 14357317, enlisted in the U.S. Army September 20, 1950, and served on active duty until October 8, 1952 when issued General Discharge as Private, at Fort McPherson, Georgia, by reason of unsuitability due to character and behavior disorders.

specific details regarding his discharge are not shown as the record contained a neuropsychiatric examination dated April 2, 1952, wherein he received disgnosis of "Emotional Instability Reaction," moderate to severe with four menths combat duty in Koren and suffered environmental difficulties mince. His condition was characterized by strong, uncontrollable tendencies toward regression and furor actions, pathological dependencies on his family and wife, depressiveness, intolerance to anxiety and predecdintrapsychie stress. He went AVOL because of his own nervousness and because of emotional demands being made on his by his wife and parents. Gave history of crying when treated roughly or having temper tantrums or furor and in being emationally tense at all times.

It is noted his condition was not amenable to hospitalization treatment, disciplinary action, training, transfer to another station or reclassification. Considers to be not image, posted sufficient mental capacity to know difference between right and wrong and considered mentally responsible for his actions.

It is further noted he showed straight, forward immaturity reaction, that this constitutional psychopathic was not considered a medical disability in a condition for which he would receive treatment in military.

The psychiatrist was of the spinion that considerable lemiency was desirable in dealing with WILSON since origin of trouble began with battle-incurred wound. It was then recommended that he be separated from the military because of unsuitability.

GEORGE PRICE, Hanager, Yiyi's Coffee Shop, Flagetaff, Arisona, advised that he was on duty by the cash register throughout the evening of April 19-20, 1968. He noted that the cash register is located within ton feet of the public wisphone. He said that, on the night in question, there was a heavy snowfall and the restaurant was extremely exoused. He said he recalls seeing no one answering the description of VILSCH either as a patron or as a telephone caller from the restaurant. He said the two maitresses on duty that might are DANN JULKIN and KATRY SWEET.

DAWN JOLKIN advised that she was writing on tables during the night of April 19-20, 1968, at Yiyi's Bestaurant. She observed four photographs of DAVID L. WILSON and advised that she can recall serving no one of that description on the night in question. She noted, however, restaurant was extremely crowded that night owing to a heavy montall.

KATHY SWEET advised that she was working as a waitrees at the counter section of Yiyi's Restaurant on the night of April 19-20, 1968. She observed four photographs of DAVID L. WILSON and advised that the face is familiar to her. She said she can not recall when she saw it and could not positively state she had seen it on the night in question. She noted that the restaurant was extremely crowded that night.

Mrs. DEROTHY MEYER was telephonically contacted at her place of employment. The New York Central System. Saline, Michigan, telephone number 429-9380. Mrs. MEYER advised that she is the older gister of DAVID L. WILSON and has helped him out of numerous personal problems throughout the past several years. She advised that she had been contacted by telephone two or three times since the previous Friday, by WILSON, and has been puzzled as to the full cause of his "peculiar" behavior. She said she would welcome any contact by an FBI Agent in her city and would be more than happy to cooperate in any way she could, by furnishing necessary background information on her brother.

Mrs. MEYER advised that she wired her brother \$50.00 cash in Phoenix on Menday night with the understanding that he would use the money to transport he and his femily to Michigan where they would reside temporarily with her. She said she has been kept in the dark with regard to his present turmoil but that his behavior is not at all inconsistent with his past behavior, in times of stress. She said that, when he last phoned her, WILSON said he was receiving threatening telephone calls and has received threatening notes at his residence. She said he told her that his wife was in danger and the lives of his family numbers were also in danger. She said he did not elaborate any further but merely indicated that he was in great fear.

Mrs. MEYER advised that her brother, DAVID WILSON, does have a history of hospital treatment for mental diserders arising from a battle wound suffered during combat in the Korean conflict in 1950 or 1951. She said that she knows his condition has been diagnosed as paramois with some indication of schizeld tendencies. She said a record of his treatment and diagnosis can be obtained through the military hospital records. She said her brother served in the United States Army, entering on duty at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, in 1950 or 1951. She said he received treatment at a federal hospital in Pennsylvania and at another hospital in Kentucky and was finally discharged from the hospital. She said she

was not personally acquainted with all the details of his condition but knows that it has had a definite bearing on his personal problems and criminal behavior throughout most of his adult life.

She said this condition contributed to the destruction of his first marriage to MARY HAMMOND (phonetic) of Clinton, Tennessee. She said HAMMOND would have a much more precise recollection of the details of WILSON's condition and could probably be located through her father, BILL HAMMOND, Deputy Sheriff, Clinton, Tennessee. She said MARY would at least be acquainted with the hospitals in which DAVID was treated.

Mrs. MEYER advised that, because of her brother's mental distrbance, he has never seemed able to avoid trouble. She said he has a habit of blaiming all his problems on other people and has frequently been convinced that he is the victim of one vicious attack or another. She said he has never been in serious trouble but has constantly been involved in a long series of smaller scale brushes with the law. She noted that WILSON has a tendery to make major problems out of small indidents and observed that his arrest at Lebanon, Missouri, during the summer of 1967 is a perfect example of this. She said that according to her information, he went to the aid of a friend who was confronted by the police for being intoxicated and, in his defense of the friend, managed to get himself arrested.

Mrs. MEYER advised that she can account for her brother's whereabouts from the time of his release from jail in Lebanon, Missouri, during August of 1967, until his return to Flagstaff, Arizona, in late November, 1967. She said that WILSON came directly to her home in Michigan upon his release, and sought employment at the then striking Ford plant. She said he remained with her until the early autumn then traveled to the home of their parents in Dade City, Florida. She said that, in Florida, he acquired work with a trucking firm for which he had worked in the past. She said he drove a truck from that firm to a point in Texas then hitchhiked to Flagstaff.

Mrs. MEYER advised that, if deemed advisable, she would be happy to listen to the tape recorded voice of the anonymous caller in an effort to establish whether or not it is in fact her brother. She noted that she has known WILSON since childhood and is acquainted with speech mannerisms and conversational expressions of which others may not be aware. She further advised that, at one time, WILSON was considered an excellent story teller. She said his talent for telling tales was so good that she had occasion to make a number of tape recordings of his voice. She said she may still have some of these tapes around her home and would be most agreeable to furnishing them for voice comparison tests.

Mrs. MEYER advised that she resides in a trailer on Ann Arbr Street in Saline, Michigan, near the New York Central Depot. She said she is employed as a traveling agent for the New York Central System and can be located through the office at any time. Mrs. MEYER advised that she would contact the FBI immediately upon hearing any further word of her brother's whereabouts.

Mrs. EDMA WILSON was contacted at the home of her sister-in-law, TILLIE HERNANDEZ, 2 Woodland Circle, Flagstaff, Arizona, and advised as follows:

She and her husband, DAVID WILSON, and their children travelled from Flagstaff to Phoenix, Arizana, on Sunday, April 21, 1968, in the car which her husband had rented in Phoenix two days previously. They left the home of TILLIE HERNANDEZ shortly before meen and returned to their regidence at 2129 West Lingoln, Phoenix:

WILSON returned to work at the Continental Body Shop, Phoenix, as usual on Monday morning. Upon his return from work he told her that he had received a number of threatening phone calls and that men in cars were staked out watching his place of employment. She said he told her that his life was in danger and that her life and the lives of their children were also in danger. She said he telephoned his sister, DOROTHY MEYER, in Saline, Michigan, that evening and she wired him 850. She said WILSON them abruptly moved her and the children from the Lincoln Avenue address to an address on Polk Street. She said he then left her and returned awhile later in a taxi cab, stopping briefly to give her \$20 and to tell her that he was "getting lest." Mrs. WILSON said her husband instructed her to take the children via bus back to Flagstaff and remain with her family in this city. She said he told her that he would recontact her as soon as possible. She said the last she say of him he was riding away from her in a taxi cab.

Mrs. WILSON advised that he had been interviewed the previous day by an PBI Agent at Phoenix, Arizona, and in that interview, had listened to a tape recorded voice which named her husband as an associate of JAMES EARL RAY. She said that, in that interview, she tentatively identified the voice as that of her previous husband, RICHARD HARRELL. She said she named HARRELL as it is the only other male in her acquaintance who speaks with a pronounced Southern drawal. She said that she actually has very little reason to believe that the voice was HARRELL's although it could be.



RICHARD HARRELL, her sister, EDKA's, previous husband. She advised EDKA diverged HARRELL in 1954 or 1955, but prior to that time HARRELL was a frequent visitor to her residence. She said that HARRELL does speak with a Southern drawel and she is reasonably certain she would recognize his voice if heard. She said she has seen HARRELL only one time since his diverce from EDKA. She said this was during the summer of 1965 when HARRELL appeared at her house attempting to locate EDKA and their daughter. She said that on this occasion HARRELL was belligarent and entagonistic in his attitude and she had hargh words with HARRELL and threatened him with a police complaint. She said she has not seen or heard from or about him since. She said she is almost certain HARRELL and DAVID WILSON have never met. She viewed a photograph of HARRELL and said it was a good likeness of him.

Mrs. MGLLY HARRELL. Clerk, El Disierto Grocery Store, 618 South Clay Street, Flagetsff, Arizona, advised that she is the wife of PAUL HARRELL, cousin of EICHARD 5. HARRELL. She said her husband is presently in Mosb. Utah. Working in a mine. She said her husband has been in Utah for approximately four months.

Mrs. HARRELL viewed a photograph of EICHARD E.

HARRELL and said it is a good likeness of her recollection
of him. She said she lest saw RICHARD HARRELL in 1957 and is
cortain he has not been in contact with her husband because of
a serious falling out between the two men. She said she is
sware that HARRELL paid a brief visit to the home of TILLIE
HERMANDEZ, sister of his former wife, in 1965, but that
incident is the last she has heard of him since his departure
from Flegstaff in 1957. She said RICHARD HARRELL made no
contact with either she or her husband during his 1965 visit
to Flegstaff.

Mrs. HARRELL advised that she has no idea what establishments RICHARD HARRELL normally frequents in Flagstoff, nor the identity of any of his friends. She said that he and her husband have no mutual relatives now living in Flagstoff.

Mrs. DAVID WILSON (EDNA) was contacted at her request at 1149 East Polk, the residence of a friend. She related that on the previous day her husband, DAVID WILSON, told her that he had received a phone call at the Continental Body Shop where he works win which a man saked him if he were WILSON. When he said he was, the man said that he was just calling to be sure that WILSON was still there. She said the caller then hung up, according to her husband, and her husband was very fearful as a result of this. She stated that her husband also claimed that strange cars were driving by the house frequently and as a result of this, he moved his family out of the house at 2129 West Lincoln to 1149 East Polk.

Mrs. WILDOW stated that they planned to leave for Flagstaff, Arizona, by her at around 10:00 that morning but that her humband had to wait for the money. She said that his sister was sending money and it did come later. The said that her humband came to 1149 Rawt Polk by taxicab and gave her the money for the bus trip to Flagstaff but at this time declined to go with her or even to wait and take her to the bus depot. The said that he left by cab and gave her no indication as to where he was going or when she would see his again.

Mrs. VILLOW stated that until this weekend she had never heard VILLOW talk about JAMES MARL RAY and that the only thing he ever told her was that he knew him in prison very briefly while he was being transferred someplace. She stated that her husband never mentioned to her that he had not RAY in Lebanon, Missouri, last summer when he was arrested for Driving While Intexicated.

Work age the previous Friday, namely on April 12, 1968, her husband, MAYID WILSON, had taken her to Flagstaff, Arizona, where she resided with her mother and father at 29 Pine Grove Road until she returned to Phoenix that day.

Mrs. VILSON stated that on Friday, April 19, 1968, her husband DAVID VILSON again came to Flagstaif for the purpose of picking her up and bringing her back to Phoenix. She stated that on this occasion when DAVID VILSON came to Flagstaff, she was at her mother's house where her husband arrived at about 12:30 a.m., April 20, 1968. She said that prior to coming to the mother's house, her husband had visited at the home of her sister, TILLIE and JOE MERNAMONE, which is about four blocks from the mother's home, and that she understood that her husband was there about one hour before he came over to the mother's house.

Mrs. VILSON stated that when her husband arrived at the mother's house at 12:30 a.m., Maturday morning, it was evident to her that he had been drinking some and he told her that he had had a six-pack or two when he left Phoenix for Flagstaff. She stated that her husband probably had at least one heer at her sister's house before coming over to the nother's house. The stated that she fixed becon and eggs for her husband upon his arrival at the mother's home and that, at that time, he wanted her to impediately return with him to Phoenix, Arizona. said the refused to go at that time and her husband BAVID then left and west over to her sister TILLIE's house where he drank coffee for a while and then went out and got a hot boof mandwich at tolther the Subles or Yayas (phonetic), restaurants in Flagstaff, before he returned to the mother's house and west to bed.

Mrs. Villes advised that she had great difficulty in recalling any associates of her husband, since he had none. She said that the purson who might be considered the closest associate of MAYID WILLES was some 21-year-old boy mased MINS, last some unrecalled, who lived in Fingstaff.

Arizona, prior to the time that they were married. She said this boy MIKE married an Indian girl at Las Vegas, Nevada, and she and DAVID WILSON steed up for these people at this marriage. She stated that obviously this was a number of years ago and that there has been no recent association between MIKE and her husband, to the best of her knowledge.

Mrs. WILSON advised that her husband had never mentioned the name of CLARK or CLARKER CLARK to her and that such an individual is unknown to her. She stated that she had no recollection of her husband ever bringing anyone with him whom he had previously known in jail or otherwise, to the residence of her mother or the residence of her sister in Flagstaff.

Mrs. WILSON stated that after her husband had been interviewed by FBI Agent C. RICHARD WARNER, JR., and Lieutenant JACKSON of the Flagstaff Police Department at Flagstaff on April 20, 1968, he told her when he had returned that he had known the man "RAY" who was being seught in connection with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in prison in Missouri, though only for a few days. She said her husband said that he was being transferred at the time and therefore had known RAY only briefly. She stated that her husband further told her that he had given someone a ride to Flagstaff on the night of April 19, 1968, but that the person given the ride was not "RAY."

Mrs. WILSON said that she recalled that on the day that she went to Flagstaff as previously related, namely April 12, 1968, a Friday, some man came to the door of their residence alsoking for someone else, not her husband, but that she could not recall the name of the person this individual was seeking. She said she did remember that whoever it was, it was someone unknown to her. She said she paid little attention to the matter and that she could only describe the man who inquired as being a white male American, in his early 30s, about 5' 7" tall and of medium build. She repeated that she had no reason to believe that this was any associate of her husband.

Mrs. WILSON advised that on the Saturday morning prior to being interviewed by FBI Agent WARNER and Lieutenant JACKSON, her husband had been drinking heavily. She said that when her husband returned to the house to await the arrival of Lieutenant JACKSON, whom he had contacted for the purpose of being accompanied to the interview with FBI Agent WARNER, he, WILSON, had a bottle of whisky in his car from which he was drinking. She stated that when her husband returned from the interview he cried and laughed alternately, but mostly cried. She said that he talked during this time about being "railroaded as he had been in Florida." She said her husband mentioned no names whatscever at this time. She stated that WILSON then wanted to talk to his sister in Kalamazoo, Michigan, and he put in a telephone call to her. She said the only reason that he called this sister, so far as she knew, was that they were the closest to one another in the family.

Mrs. WILSON stated that Agent WARNER, who had come to the house, was present when WILSON telephoned this sister in Michigan, and talked briefly to her. Mrs. WILSON said that her husband has a sister in LaFollette, Tennessee, and a brother in Dade City, Florida, though she believed that the brother may have recently moved to someplace the identity of which she could not recall.

Mrs. WILSON stated that her husband DAVID had left her in Flagstaff, Arizona, in May, 1967, and did not return until November, 1967. She said that he kept in touch during this period and that when he first left, he went to Nevada and then returned to Flagstaff where he briefly worked for the Holiday Inn. He then went to Arkansas where he drove a truck out of Elms Springs, Arkansas, and was arrested, possibly in August or September, 1967, in a small town named Libdon or Limpdon or something like that. She said she recalled that her husband was in jail for a While until his pay check reached him so that he could pay his fine, which she believed was \$125. She said that she had received a letter from her husband at this location and she believed she still had it. She checked her effects, however, and said she could not find this letter.

Mrs. WILSON advised that her husband then apparently went to Michigan where he visited his sister at Kalamazeo and from there went to Florida. From Florida he went to Barstow, California, and from Barstow, came to Phoenix.

Mrs. WILSON stated that her husband upon coming to Phoenix, arrived in November, 1967, and obtained employment with the Continental Body Shop, working there until late December or early January, 1968, when he came to Flagstaff and worked a very brief time at the Southwest Lumber Mill. She stated that in January, 1968, they returned to Phoenix and her husband again went to work for Continental Body Shop where he has been employed until the present time.

Mrs. WILSON advised that about three or four weeks ago, on a Sunday night, her husband was arrested in a bar on Buckeye Road and was taken to the City Jail for drunkenness. She said that he came home the following day, a Monday, but did not go to work that day but stayed at home. She said that in connection with this arrest, her husband had left the house about 5 p.m. and about 10:30 or 11 p.m. a man came by and informed her that DAVID WILSON had been arrested for drunkenness. She said she did not see a car at the time this man came to the house and she did not know the identity of this individual.

Mrs. WILSON advised that except for the night that her husband was in the Phoenix Jail, he has been present in her company in Phoenix the complete time since January of this year.

Mrs. WILSON was afforded an opportunity to listen to a tape recording of a conversation wherein a male stated that DAVID WILSON, who was married to a Mexican girl from Flagstaff, Arizona, had made a trip by air to Memphis, Tennessee, or Nashville, Tennessee, a day or two prior to the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KIMS, JR. After listening to this recording, Mrs. WILSON stated that she had definitely heard that voice before and she believed that it probably was the voice of her former husband, RICHARD HARRELL, who is commonly known as JIMMIR. She stated that she had married
