LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On April 27, 1968, SA T-1 telephonically contacted the San Antonio FBI Office to say that he had information relative to assassins. He did not wish to talk over the telephone and requested an Agent contact him in the lobby of the Gunter Hotel, 205 East Houston Street, San Antonio, Texas.

Upon personal contact, SA T-1 described himself as a rancher specializing in Hereford cattle and as a partner in important developing oil property in Hemphill County, southeast of Canadian, Texas.

SA T-1 and his wife stayed about four months prior to the death of President Kennedy in Dallas, Texas, at the Statler-Hilton Hotel. Learning of the arrival of the President at that time in Dallas, SA T-1 and his wife left town because of expected crowds.

At some time prior to departure from the Statler-Hilton, another guest using the name John Foster engaged SA T-1 in talk from time to time. Foster, who bore a physical resemblance to Ray, principal suspect in the murder of Martin Luther King, showed SA T-1 a deposit slip for \$7,500, explaining to SA T-1 that this was a fee for arranging matters regarding four persons holding cotton land rights benefiting from Billy Sol Estes operations around Pecos, Texas. The money, \$7,500, had been deposited to Foster's account at the bank across the street from the Statler-Hilton.

SA T-l described John Foster as similar to the description of Ray in this case, but could not be more specific, except to say that Foster had a mannerism of clicking his heels together European or Continental style when being introduced to someone.

Foster told SA T-1 of owning a souped-up P-38 plane with which he could beat Government officials to the Capitol, Washington, D. C., from Dallas.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD Foster reportedly attempted to interest another guest of the Statler-Hilton of this period, Michael Stack, and similarly described as to age and appearance as Foster, in a deal whereby with above plane they would transport gold internationally, presumably through Mexico. Foster proposed to pay off Stack for his complicity in gold, according to SA T-1. During this same period, about four months prior to the death of President Kennedy, Foster and Stack were to be seen in Dallas, as was Jack Ruby. Ruby also about this same time met SA T-1 at the Shamrock Hotel in Houston and then tried to interest SA T-1 in buying an expensive diamond ring. SA T-1 speculated that the assassination of Kennedy occurring while the above three were frequenting the Statler-Hilton at Dallas might have arisen over complicity between a man like Foster, with his fast plane, and Ruby. SA T-1 went on to speculate that the Memphis murder of Martin Luther King, having equally high national significance, may have been done through conspiracy involving such as John Foster, described above. SA T-1 stated that the above vein of thought arose upon seeing present with his wife and family at the Gunter Hotel one Joseph R. Cavagnaro, Sales Manager in Dallas currently of the Statler-Hilton. Cavagnaro, according to SA T-1, was to be seen frequently drinking coffee with John Foster and Michael Stack and would accordingly be able to identify them. SA T-1 recommended that an Agent make personal contact with Cavagnaro, and not disclose SA T-1's identity, but ask Cavagnaro to identify Foster and Stack, the two having frequented the Statler-Hilton the four months prior to the death of John Kennedy in Dallas. - 2 -2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

LEE HARVEY OSWALD Foster was suspected by SA T-1 of having been possibly implicated in the death of a Government man, an expected witness in the forthcoming Billy Sol Estes prosecutions, based on his seeming willingness to enter dangerous and shady ventures, his fast airplane, and his strange or foreign mannerisms. Joseph R. Cavagnaro, Sales Manager, Statler-Hilton Hotel, Dallas, Texas, in response to a written note left for him at the Gunter Hotel desk, contacted the San Antonio FBI Office telephonically on April 27, 1968. Mr. Cavagnaro said he was in San Antonio with his wife and children to see Hemisfair. He stated that he did not recognize by name or description either of the persons above named, John Foster or Michael Stack. Mr. Cavagnaro advised that across the street from the Statler-Hilton is the Mercantile Bank of Dallas.

None of the circumstances as related by SA T-1 bore

since the former had requested such anonymity.

It is to be noted that James Earl Ray could not be identical with John Foster described by source above inasmuch as Ray was in jail in Missouri in 1963.

Mr. WILLIAM SMITH CHEW, also known as Bill Chew, was located at the Paradise Hetel, U. S. Highway 301, near the intersection of Georgia Highway 17, Screven County, Georgia which he openies and leases from the owner. He advised the following:

He and his wife, Mrs. JOHNIE CHEW, operate the Paradise Notel. Hr. HOLT CHEW is his father who lives in Denver, Colorado. His father was charged with the shooting of JAMES THOMAS JACKSON in 1966. His father had told him that JAMES THOMAS JACKSON had been attempting to rob him (HOLT CHEW) just before his father had shot JACKSON.

In early April , 1968, his father had travelled by Eastern Airlines to visit his and also to centect his for business reasons. On April 6, 1968, at about \$:00 PM, his father, Mr. HOLF CHEV, had telephonically contacted his at his residence in Screves County, Ga., from Charlotte, N. C. and stated he would arrive at the airport in Augusta, Ga., at about 10:55 PM or 10:35 PM.

Since he had very little time to drive from Screven County, Ga., to Augusta, Ga., to meet his father, he had to leave immediately after receiving the telephone call from his father. Be then arranged for someone to stay with his wife at the Paradise Motel and proceeded to Augusta, Ga.

As soon as his father had landed at the airport in Augusta, Ga., he mut him and they drove to Screven County, Ga., to the Paradise Notel. HOLT CHEW did not stay in Augusta, Gs., at any time. At the time of his father's arrival, his father's luggage was missing and they were informed that the luggage would arrive on a later flight. They went back to Augusta, Ga., on Monday, April 8, 1968, but the luggage was still missing. Eastern Airlines them placed a tracer on the luggage and it arrived the next day Tuesday, April 9, 1968.

His father, HOLF CHEW, had come to visit him at his (VILLIAM SHITH CHEW) request to inspect and invest in land, in various cities, to be developed into a restaurant chain. This restaurant chain will probably be known as

"Chewbys." Restaurants are being planned for Savannah, Ga., Augusta, Ga., Charlotte, N. C., Miami, Fla., other locations in Florida, Ohio, and in Colorado. These restaurants are to specialize in roast beef, ham, and corn beef sandwiches at an above average price.

When his father arrived, his father was completely exhausted and not feeling well. A day after his father's arrival, he found it necessary to have a doctor come to the Paradise Motel to treat him. His father has been an alcoholic for about five years and maintains a large liquor cabinet in his office in Denver, Colorado. His father had stopped smoking cigars on advice of a physician due to diabetes about five years ago and had then taken up drinking of intoxicants.

On the visit in April, 1968, his father and he travelled around inspecting and negotiating for different parcels of land on which to construct restaurants. They travelled into N. C., S. C., Florida, as well as Georgia and met different businessmen with whom they discussed their business venture. One of the men contacted was MATTHEW HEFFERNAM, Miami, Fla. He would not reveal the names of any other businessmen contacted.

His stepmether, Mrs. ELAIME CHEW, and a brother joined his father and him in Florida on April 12, 1968. His father then departed with his stepmether and brother for Denver, Colorado, on April 27, 1968.

He has within the past day or so completed negotiations for a piece of land near the K-Mart, Savannah, Ga., for the erection of a Chewbys Restaurant.

In connection with the contemplated restaurant chain, Chewbys, he had made a trip to Denver, Colorado, starting on September 12, 1967, in which his father, HOLT CHEW, then accompanied him to Ill., Ohio, N. C., and Georgia, for the purpose of getting options on sites for the restaurants.

In connection with the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he denied having anything to do with it or to know anything about it. He had made a telephone call to his father in Denver, Colorado, the night, Thursday, April 4,

1968, when Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot. At that time he talked with his stepmother, Mrs. ELAINE CHEW. Mrs. CHEW had told him that his father was in bed as the result of an excessive consumption of intomcants. He has since heard that his father did not receive information of the killing of KING until the next day. He has no knowledge of a conspiracy in relation to the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. It is his opinion that the Reverend RALPH D. ABERNATHY led KING to his death and that from the appearances on the faces of KING and ABERNATHY as seen in news photos just prior to the shooting of KING, that they both knew KING had not much longer to live.

He (WILLIAM SMITH CHEW) at one time was the owner of a motel in St. Augustine, Fla., and was also active in a motel and restaurant association in Florida. Then Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was instrumental in starting protests and demonstrations against his motels and other motels which finally forced him to sell his motel and resign his position with the motel and restaurant associations. He had refused to serve individuals in his restaurant who he had proof were criminals and who were being treated for veneral lineases. As a result a civil rights complaint was filed against him, he was found guilty, and fined. The case is still pending in the courts.

On May 8, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINTANCE displayed to Mr. ARTHUR LARIMER, Postmaster, U. S. Post Office, Sandusky, Ohio, the unsigned printed note and envelopes addressed to "Chief of Police, Memphis, Tenn.", and "Postmaster, Pelee Island, Ontario".

Mr. LARINER advised that although the identity of the author was unknown to him he noted the apparent shaky printing, and suggested that it might be the effort of an elderly person. He suggested an inquiry at the old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Sandusky, might be productive.

On May 9, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINTANCE contacted Mr. MICHAEL KRESTEL, Assistant Reeve, Pelee Island, Ontario, Canada, in the absence of the Reeve, Mr. CHARLES WALLACE, and the Constable, Mr. ZAHE HOOKER. Mr. KRESTEL questioned the Postmaster, Mr. BOMALD GOW, who advised that instant note, .35 change, and cover envelopes, were received at the post office on approximately April 24, 1968. He said that he opened the envelope addressed to him. He discovered the inner envelope already opened, which he believes may have been done accidentally by him in opening the outer envelope. He recalled the change and note, however, were lying loose in the outer envelope. He said he did not know what disposition to make of the contents and finally asked Mr. WALLACE, the Reeve, for advice. He stated it was the suggestion of Mr. WALLACE that these items be mailed to the FBI, Federal Building, Sandusky. He was unable to suggest any suspect as the author of instant note.

On May 9, 1968, Mr. ROBERT BORDERS, Registrar, Old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Columbus Avenue, Sandusky, examined instant note and envelopes and advised SA ROBERT A. QUAINTANCE he suspected them to be the work of a resident,

S. Army, Quartermaster Corps., from July 29, 1942, until Hovember
6, 1944, when he received an honorable discharge at Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio, as a private, ASH He furnished WITZLER'S V A Claim Number as 17-306-751, and his Social Security Timber as He said WITZLER arrived at the Home on July 19, 1962. He added that WITZLER would not be available for interview until May 10, 1968. On May 10, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINTANCE confronted CHARLES MANN WITZLER with instent note and envelopes. He admitted being the author. He said he could offer no logical reason for his writing the note and said he could only suggest that he must have been drinking at the time. He stated It was not his intention to burden or harmss the Memphis. Tennessee Police Department, FRI, or any other law enforcement agency by his action. He said his reason for enclosing \$.35 with the note was to include \$.10 for air mail postage from Pelee Island to Memphis, Tennessee; he said he visits Pelee Island a few times each summer and has bought postage at the post office there. He said he sent his note via Pelee Island simply to give the postmaster a little business. He was admonished by SA QUAINTANCE for the consequences of his action, the wasted time and money that could have been spent on other matters. He was also admonished by Mr. BORDERS, and threatened with possible expulsion if he should repeat this misconduct. Mr. WITZIME apologised for his action and promised to refrain from any such conduct in the future. He admitted his note intended reference to the slaying of MARTIN LUTHER KIES, however, he denied sympathy for the assassination.
