

The following investigation was conducted by the Salt Lake City Division:

Re Friendship Inns

By communication dated April 2008, the Memphis Office advised that a bar of some control found in motels was located in luggage left by the subject when he departed the scene of the shooting. The cover on the bar of soap bore the name "Friendship Inns."

Mrs. LUCILLE WILLIAMS, Town House Motel, Salt Lake City, Utah, furnished a list of 377 Poleadship Inn motels throughout the country. She advised that not all of these motels utilized bars of soap bearing the name "Friendship Inns," but that the soap is available to all of these motels and she had no information as to which motels used it and which did not. She said the name of JOHN WILLARD is not known to her.

Re Suspect HARVEY LOWMEYER or LOWMYER

No record was located from the suspect or anyone having the surname LOWMEYER or LOWMYER in the State of Utah through check of indices, City Directories, telephone directories, Driver's license Bureau, Motor Vehicle Division, Selective Service, credit and criminal checks, and State Tax Commission.

RUTH SKEETERS, Election lork, Salt Lake County Clark Office, Salt Lake City, Utah, advised that voters' registrations in State of Utah are maintained in County Clark's Office of each county in State. These records are maintained by address and and it is impossible to check a name through the REMEMBER COUNTERED.

Re Laundry Mark 02B-6 or D2B-6

Mr. TED REESE, Sales Representative, Patek and Solid Salt Lake City, stated his company is the representative in this area for Thermo Seal marking machines, manufactured by Territe Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York. He stated to only three laundries in State of Utah utilize a Thermo Seal mark machine. These laundries were contacted negatively as set to below:

Mrs. CLEO MACKIE, fashion Cleaners and Shirt Laundry, Salt Lake City, Utah, stated her organization uses a Thermo Seal marking machine on all laundry processed; however, the above combination of letters and numbers could not be utilized by her company.

Mr. GORDON MARZ, Wasatch Dry Cleaners, 719 East 21st South, Salt Lake City, Utah, advised the above mark is not utilized by his company.

Re Suspect THERAL BURNS LYMAN1

By communication dated April 10, 1968, the Sacramento Office advised that one JERRY HEDGEMAN, St. Petersburg, Florida, had advised that BURNS LYMAN, when he had known in St. Petersburg in about 1963, had appressed a great dislike for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. HEDGEMAN said LYMAN had four on five guns which he had allegedly used for hunting bear in Utah. He allegedly made statements to HEDGEMAN several times that his ambition was to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., around others. HEDGEMAN furnished background information regarded LYMAN which identified him with one THERAL BURNS LYMAN, a white male who was born , at Moab, Utah.

Records of the San Juan County Sheriff's Office. Monticello, Utah, which were checked on April 11, 1968, showed that THERAL BURNS LYMAN, who was identical with the suspect, was killed in a single airplane crash at Blandard Utah, June 17, 1967.

Re Suspect JOHN CLINTON MILLSAPS

By communication dated April 10, 1968, the Charlotte Office advised that WILLIAM CLYDE MILLSAPS, Gastonia, North Carolina, had furnished information indicating that he suspected his nephew, JOHN CLINTON MILLSAPS, who resided in Salt Lake City, may have been involved in the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. During a visit in January or February, 1968, JOHN CLINTON MILLSAPS had told his uncle that he was going to purchase a high-power or rifle to shoot Negroes with. WILLIAM MILLSAPS observed a sketch of the assasin of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which he felt strongly resembled his nephew.

Mrs. TRUDY MILLSAPS, wife of JOHN CLINTON MILLSAPS, was contacted at Salt Lake City, Utah, on April 10, 1968, and advised her husband was then in Richmond, Virginia, working with Mr. JAY CUMMINGS, Salesman for Plastic-Vac, Incorporated. She said MILLSAPS and CUMMINGS left Salt Lake City, March 26, 1968, via United Airlines. Since leaving Salt Lake City, MILLSAPS had supposedly been only in Virginia and North Carolina. Mrs. MILLSAPS stated her husband had expressed a strong dislike for Negroes but never made threats and does not own a gun. She described him as 6'4", 200 pounds, brown hair and eyes, and having a partial tattoo of an anchor on his left hand. He was born at Salt Lake City, Utah.

Re Suspect ERIC STARVO GALT

A check of credit and oriminal records, Driver's License Bureau, Motor Vehicle Departments, City and telephone directories, Selective Service Headquarters, and financial institutions were negative regarding suspect.

Four GALT families were located in Utah as follows:

- (1) ALLAN HUGH GALT, RFD 1, Spanish fork, Utab
- (2) MATTHEW A. GALT, 556 East 9th North, Bould Dally Utah
- (3) MARTIN HAPPER GALT, Box 131, Kanab, Utah
- (4) HAMILTON S. GALT, 824 East 3rd South, Sat Lake City, Utah.

Investigation has developed that MARTIN HAPPER GALT left Kanab, Utah, approximately five years ago and his last known address was 950 Southwest 21st Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

Mr. ALLAN HUGH GALT, RFD 1, Box 703, Spanish Fork, Utah, advised on April 11, 1968, he was the in Tracy, California, on July 9, 1917, and that had father, HUGH GALT, was killed in California in 1927. He said his father was born in Scotland, and that his father is brother, HAMILTON GALT, resided in Salt Lake City, Utah. He said HAMILTON had two other brothers besides HUGH, but that their whereabouts were not known to him. He advised that his mother, ANNA MONK GALT MOORE, resided at Spanish Fork and that his own wife and four children, ages 8 to 17, reside with him in the family home in Spanish Fork. He stated he had heard of a GALT family in Bountiful, Utah, and that he had never heard of anyone else named GALT in Utah or any other state.

He advised he did not know ERIC STARVO GALT and could furnish no information concerning him.

On April 11, 1968, No. ALICE BAKER, 826 East Third South, Salt Lake City, advised that HAMILTON S. GALT resides at 824 East Third South. She further advised that GALT left approximately one and one-half weeks prior on a vacation to California and would return in approximately three weeks. She could furnish no further information.

On April 11, 1968, Miss LYNNETTE GALT, 556 East Mirch North, Bountiful, Utah, advised that her father, MATTERY A. GALT, was the Principal of Millcreek Junior High School Bountiful, Utah.

Her father has a brother, ROBERT GALT, who is living in Denver, Colorado.

She has three brothers, ANDREW, age 12; RUSSEVA, age 9; and ROBERT, age 6.

She does not know any person named ERIC STARVO GALT and stated ERIC STARVO GALT is not related to her firstly.

Her grandfather's name is MATTHEW A. GALT and is no longer living.

Re Dancing Schools

All logical dancing schools in the State of Utah were checked for a record of autondance in the names ERIC STARVO GALT, HARVEY LOWMEYER or LOWMYER, and JOHN WILLARD. No such record was located.

Re JAMES EARL RAY

By communication on April 19, 1968, the Omaha Office advised that Subject JAMES EARL RAY had allegedly become acquainted with one BILL HOLLAND, who in 1950, reportedly lived in Salt Lake City.

The Salt Lake City directories for the periods 1948 through 1955 were reviewed and it was determined that the only possibilities listed were WILLIAM A. HOLLAND, 1714 Roberta Street; WILLIAM H. HOLLAND, 1852 East 17th South, and WILLIE M. HOLLAND, 246 North Eighth West.

On April 20, 1968, William A. HOLLAND, currently residing at 161 1/2 Commonwealth Avenue, and WILLIE M. HOLLAND, 246 North Eighth West, Salt Lake City, were contacted and both advised subject RAY was unknown to them and further that they had not been in the Las Vegas, Nevada, area in 1950.

Records of the Credit Bureau of Salt Lake City show that WILLIAM HENRY HOLLAND, who formerly resided at 1852 East 17th South in Salt Lake City, had apparently moved to 857 Crenshaw Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, in 1957. Los Angeles was requested by communication to locate WILLIAM HENRY HOLLAND.

At 8:00 PM, on April 21, 1968, Mr. HOWARD ROES MILEY, 120 South Queen Anne Avenue, Seattle, Washington, telephonically contacted the Salt Lake City Office. Mr. ROESCHLEY said he and his wifewere staying in Room 218 of the Imperial 400 Motel in Salt Lake City. At about 10:00 AM that date they were eating breakfast in the Hot Shoppe located between Fifth South and Sixty South on Main Street, Salt Lake City, when

Mrs. ROESCHLEY observed an individual who to her appeared identical with a sketch she had seen of the Subject in this matter.

Mr. and Mrs. ROESCHLEY were contacted at the Imperial 400 Motel on April 21, 1968. Mrs. ROESCHICK said she observed the above-mentioned individual sitting at the counter at the Hot Shoppe Cafe. She said he was alone and that he was acting in a suspicious manner, in that he kept watching the door and glancing around as though he were trying to hide from something. She said he did not talk to anyone and did not seem to know anyone in the restaurant. This individual was sitting at the counter when the ROESCHLEYs came in and was still there when they left. She said he was probably in his 30's, about six feet tall, having dark hair cut in a crew cut, blue eyes, was well-groomed in a grayish-green suit and wearing a matching shirt and tie. She said he was very smartly dressed. Mrs. ROESCHLEY said she felt uneasy about this individual all day because of his actions, and then when she saw a picture of JAMES EARL RAY on television during the FBI Program, she realized that this individual bore a very strong resemblance to RAY. She said she could furnish no additional information concerning this individual and has no idea whether or not he was staying at Covey's Motel and could not state whether or not he had a car.

By communication dated May 11, 1968, the Butte Office advised that on May 9, 1968, at about 7:00 P.M., an unknown individual resembling the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY was seen in Casey's Golden Pheasant Ram, Billings, Montana. Inquiry at the Ponderosa Motel where this individual reprotedly was staying determined that R. NELSON and M. C. MARGULIES, representing Tappan Kitchens, 3080 South Second West, Salt Lake City, Utah, and driving a Cadillac bearing Utah License EA 8748, occupied room 129 from April 30 through May 9, 1988.

On May 11, 1968, Mrs. SHIRLEY ATRKSON, Secretary, North American Builders, 3080 South Second West, Salt Lake City, advised that M. C. MARGULIES and ROGER NELSON are siding salesmen for this company. She said MARGULIES was presently in Salt Lake City and that NELSON was in Minnesota for the weekend and would return to the Ponderosa Motel of May 13, 1968. She said NELSON had been with the company for one year, and MARGULIES for five years. Mrs. AIRKSON said neighbor is identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 16, 1968, Mrs. GWEN INSELBERGER, Utah State Bureau of Vital Statistics, State Health Department, advised that reports of all unknown deceased persons are referred to the Bureau of Vital Statistics. She said none has been referred since April 4, 1968. A copy of the identification order of JAMES EARL RAY was furnished Mrs. INSELBERGER and she stated she would compare reports concerning unknown deceased persons with that identification order in the future.

On May 22, 23 and 24, 1968, Mr. MAX MARTINEZ, Utah State Driver's License Bureau, State Capitol, Salt Lake City, made available film negatives of all driver's licenses issued during the months of April and May, 1968. Approximately 30,000 negatives were reviewed by Special Agents NORMAN S. HIGSON, GREGORY ANTHONY POST, JOHN W. CROFTS, JR., JAMES E. QUICK, WALTER I. ANDERSON, JR., and WILLIAM J. GEIERMANN. No identification was made with JAMES EARL RAY.

Major police agencies which maintain unidentified latent fingerprints in Utah have been contacted and these fingerprints searched against those of JAMES EARL RAY. No positive results were obtained.

Salvation Army and chiritable-type missions in the State of Utah have been furnished copies of the Identification order relating to JAMES EARL RAY. No pertinent information has been received as a result of this distribution.
