I would say that about a minute, not more, passed between my hearing the shot and when I opened the door. First, I looked toward the bathroom and I saw that the door was open and it was empty. Then I went to the bunister and looked the other way. When I did, I naw a man running near the end of the hallway. I have put on "O" mark on the floor plac, Exhibit I, to show about where he was when I caw him. He was carrying a bundle in his right hand. From what I could see, the bundle was at least three or four feet long and six or eight inches thick. The bundle appeared to be wrapped in what looked like newspaper. The man turned left toward the stains when he reached the end of the hallway. Although I did not got a long look at him before be turned left, I think it was the same man I now earlier with Mrs. Erover looking at Room 5-D. Mrs. THOMAS C. CUMMINGHAM, 631 Orpheus, wes interviewed and furnished the following information:

On May 24, 1968, she departed Heathrow Airport, Slough, England, at approximately 5:00 p.m. on British-Resopean Airesys Flight Number 606 for Frankfort, Germany, for the purpose of visiting her family who resides in the Frankfort area.



The following investigation was conducted by SA HAYES H. BURLESON on June 13, 1968:

At McAlester, Oklahoma

A review of the files of the Oklahoma State Penitentiary (OSP), revealed that JOSEPH SEIBERT OSP #76649, was received on February 17, 1968, from [Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and sentenced to a term of 150 years for the crime of Robbery with Firearms, after former conviction of a felony. His minimum release date is shown as February 20, 2040, and his maximum release date is shown as February 17, 2118. A review of the FB1 Identification Record of JOSEPH SETBERT, FBI #74 262 C, revealed that he was received at the Department of Corrections, Jefferson City, Missouri, on October 2, 1964, under #09111, and charged with Murder, 1ST Degree. He was sentenced for the remainder of his natural life. The next item shown on SEIBERT's Identification Record is October 26, 1967, when he was arrested by the Sheriff's Office, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and charged with Armed Robbery and Assault and Battery with a Deadly Weapon. The next item on SEIEERT's Identification Record is shown as November 17, 1967, when he was fingerprinted as a patient at Eastern State Hospital, Vinita, Oklahoma. The final entry on SEIBERT's Identification Record is February 17, 1968, when he was received at Oklahoma State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma, sentenced to a term of 150 years, for Robbery, with Firearms.

During an interview with JOSEPH SEIBERT he admitted a casual acquaintance with JAMES EARL RAY while both were inmates at the Missouri State Penitentiary. He stated that RAY was an inmate at Missouri State Penitentiary when SEIBERT arrived there on October 2, 1964.

SEIBERT stated that he worked in the Mess Hall at Missouri Sta's Penitentiary while JAMES EARL RAY worked in the bakery which joins the Mess Hall. SEIBERT said that he occasionally visited with RAY from time to time while they were working and also on the prison yard.

SEIBERT stated that he actually escaped from the Jackson County Court House, Kansas City, Missouri, on box obsel 13, 1967. He said that he made his way from Kansas City, Missouri, to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he arrived on offors R 16, 1967. SEIBERT said that for reasons of possibly incriminating himself in local burglaries, he did not care to state how he traveled from Kansas City, Missouri, to Tulsa, Oklahoma. He claimed that he went to work on particles 16, 1967, at the Piccadilly Cafeteria, Tulsa, Oklahoma, under the name JOHN LA MAY. He claimed to have worked at the Piccadilly Cafeteria as a dishwasher until October 26, 1967, when he was arrested at Tulsa, Oklahoma, for Armed Robbery. He said that he stayed at the Grand Hotel on East 3rd Street, TMsa, Oklahoma, during this period of time, also using the name JOHN LA MAY. He claimed to have been in continual custody from October 26, 1967, until the present time. He admitted spending approximately 30 days at the Vinita, Oklahoma Eastern State Hospital.

However, SEIBERT maintained that he would not consider himself a personal friend of RAY.

SEIBERT said that on March 11, 1966, he planned to escape from the Missouri State Ponitentiary. He said that he learned later that RAY had planned to escape on the same night, and their plans were not known to each other. SEIBERT said that he placed a dummy in his cell and wont to the recreation room.

According to SEIBERT, after the recreation period was over, he hid behind the television set in the recreation room and waited for the lights to be turned out. When the lights were out, he began moving television benches to the prison wall and had planned to go over the wall by means of climbing the television benches. Unknown to SEIBERT at the time, RAY had managed to get onto the roof of the Administration Building, but had fallen and hurt his arm. The prison officials and guards were looking for RAY when they discovered SEIBERT. He said that RAY managed to hide himself in a ventilation shaft in the Officers Dining Room for two or three days before he was discovered.

SEIBERT advised that he could furnis absolutely no information concerning RAY's escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967. He said he knew nothing of RAY's escape plan, his source of funds, his associates inside or outside the penitentiary, nor any thing concerning the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

SETBERT said that it was his personal opinion that RAY was not intelligent enough to plan the murder of Dr. KING and certainly not intelligent enough to plan an apparent elaborate escape procedure including passports by himself. SEIBERT said that when RAY finally escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, he escaped in a bread box from the bakery where he had worked for a long period of time. SEIBERT stated that he had observed that this method of escape would probably be successful after he had been at the penitentiary for only a short period of time.

> Re: Look-Alike Leaving Life Magazine at Stapleton International Airport Denver, Colorado

On May 6, 1968, Mr. WILLIAM C. HARRIS 3260 Ivy Street, Denver, Colorado, who is employed as a Skycap at Stapleton International Airport, Denver, furnished a copy of the May 3, 1968, edition of Life Magazine, to SA WALLACE M. GLOVER. Mr. HARRIS advised that on the night of April 30, 1968, he observed a man, who he now believes to be JAMES EARL RAY, sitting in the TV area of the lobby at Stapleton International Airport, between 9:40 P.M. and 10:30 P.M. He stated this man was reading a magazine and was observed by HARRIS to tear out some of the pages which he folded and put in his inside coat pocket. This man left the area about 10:30 P.M., leaving the magazine on the seat. HARRIS picked the magazine up and later discovered that the pages containing the article about JAMES EARL RAY had been torn out and were missing. HARRIS later read an issue of "Jet" which had a photograph and an article concerning RAY, and at that time came to the conclusion that the man he saw on April 30, 1968, was possibly identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

This magazine was furnished to the Latent Fingerprint Section of the FBI on May 6, 1968, and by communication dated May 16, 1968, the Latent Fingerprint Section advised that four latents of value were developed on the magazine, but none were identical with fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI No. 405 942 G.

By telephone call on May 4, 1968, the Minneapolis Division of the FBI advised that it had received information from a student of the University of Black Hills, Spearfish, South Dakota, SUE SORENSON ODEL, Rural Route 1, Spearfish, who works at Margie's Diner at Spearfish, to the effect that she had come into contact with an individual using the name of JACK HERZOG who has been residing at the Siesta Motel in Spearfish. Miss ODEL advised that HERZOG greatly resembles JAMES EARL RAY. Investigation by the Minneapolis Division indicated that HERZOG lived at 6830 Manhattan Lane, Cheyenne, Wyoming.

On May 5, 1968, JACOB CLEON HERZOG, 6830 Manhattan Lane, Cheyenne, Wyoming, was contacted at his residence by SA ROBERT C. GUSTAFSON, and it was determined from personal observation, interrogation, and fingerprints, that he is not identical with JAMES EARL RAY. During the interview it was determined that HERZOG is working in South Dakota, and resides at the Siesta Motel in Spearfish while in that city.

Result of examination:

Although little in the way of comparable letters is present, differences were noted between the "H. J. Schumacher" signatures on Q331, Q332 and Q333 and the Carl Ray signatures on Q328, Q329 and Q330 and between these signatures and the known writings of JAMES EARL RAY.

It was determined that the questioned hand printing on Q322 (Frontier Airlines temporary credit card #31088) and that appearing in the lower right-hand portion of the Q328 transportation receipt were prepared by the same individual.

It was further determined that the hand printing on Q328 and Q332 was not prepared by the individual who prepared the hand printing appearing on the Q330 application and that the hand printing on the three items mentioned was not prepared by JAMES EARL RAY.

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By communications dated May 9, 1968, and May 17, 1968, the Latent Fingerprint Section of the Identification Division advised that no latent impressions were developed on the items submitted that were identical with the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI No. 405 942 G.

Los Angeles, by communication dated May 4, 1968, indicated that CARL RAY left a call back telephone number of 377-1987, in Denver, Colorado, at the time he made reservations in Phoenix, Arizona, for a flight on Frontier Airlines. This telephone number is listed to Mrs. ROSA M. NIENHAUS, 2536 Race Street, Denver. Miss NIENHAUS was interviewed by SA BOYD D. ADSIT and it was determined that she is an aged widow who does not know CARL RAY or anyone fitting the description of CARL RAY. She stated no friend or relative stayed at her house in the recent past.

On May 7, 1968, First Class Cabin Stewardess CATHERINE HINES, aboard Frontier Airlines Flight No. 785 F, April 27, 1968, on flight from Albuquerque to Phoenix, and Tourist Cabin Stewardess Miss J. JACKSON, aboard the same flight, advised SA BOYD D. ADSIT that they recalled no one by the name of CARL RAY being aboard that flight and neither recognized any picture of JAMES EARL RAY as being that of any person aboard the flight.

By telephone call from the Los Angeles Division of the FBI on May 3, 1968, and by communication dated May 4, 1968, the Los Angeles Division advised that personnel of United Airlines, Los Angeles International Airport, informed the Los Angeles Office of the FBI, on May 3, 1968, that an individual using the name of CARL RAY requested one round trip and one oneway ticket from Los Angeles to Honolulu, and stated he would like to use Frontier Airline Ticket Nos. 829753 and 829754 issued in Denver, Colorado, on May 1, 1968, to Mr. and Mrs. CARL RAY / for Flight No. 710 from Las Vegas, Nevada, to St. Louis, Missouri, and return, as partial payment for the tickets being requested. The individual subsequently left the ticket counter, leaving the Frontier Airlines tickets behind, as well as a 30-day temporary Frontier Airlines Travel Credit Card, bearing No. on April 26, 1968, to Mr. CARL RAY, Ray Land and Cattle Company, Route 4, Box 868, Pecos, Texas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA BOYD D. ADSIT:

On May 3, 1968, BEN GUTIERREZ, Operations Supervisor, Frontier Airlines, Stapleton Airport, searched through voucher copies of tickets for May 1, 1968, through May 3, 1968, without locating ticket numbers 829753 and 829754. He did locate the ticket numbers, credit card number, and same dollar amounts on the Ticket Sales Report B for May 1, 1968, which showed the tickets were issued by JACK GROOM at the Frontier Airlines counter at Stapleton International Airport.

JACK GROOM, 3364 South Grape, Denver, Colorado, Telephone No. 757-0763, was interviewed at Frontier Airlines (FL),

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Stapleton International Airport, on May 3, 1968. He stated he had a faint recollection of the transaction, due to a few unusual features, and recalled that about 10:00 A.M., a fairly heavy-set man, who was alone, described as being about 38 years of age, 5' 9", 200-210 pounds, blondish-brown hair worn in a crew cut, wearing a gray-blue sport coat, with a white shirt open at the neck, approached his counter, and asked for round trip tickets from Las Vegas, Nevada, to St. Louis, Missouri. GROOM thinks he asked the man if he had reservations and the man said that he did. GROOM then wrote up the tickets and told the man the price.

The man pulled out a temporary Frontier Credit Card which showed his name to be CARL RAY. He recalled that the card indicated the man was from Pecos, Texas, and that the card was to expire on May 25, 1968. When asked if the card could have contained the words "Ray Land and Cattle Company", GROOM stated the words were definitely on the card. Because of the amount, GROOM turned to his supervisor, JOHN KNAPP, and obtained his approval on the transaction.

GROOM said the man explained his reason for buying the ticket was that he was immediately going to Las Vegas, where he would catch the flight. GROOM thought he said he was catching the United Airlines 11:00 A.M., flight on May 1, 1968, to Las Vegas. GROOM stated there was also some conversation about how full the flights to St. Louis from Las Vegas, were likely to be.

The various photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were shown to GROOM. He re-emphasized that he had only a faint recollection of the man's features. He stated he felt the man was a lot heavier than the man in the 1966 prison photograph of RAY, and did not think the man particularly resembled the photograph of RAY, but stated it was possible that they were the same person.

GROOM stated the man wore his hair in a crew cut like the 1955 photograph of RAY and noted that the nose of the man resembled the nose in the 1955 photograph.

On May 3, 1968, JOHN KNAPP, Supervisor, FL Counter, Stapleton International Airport, home address 9151 East 14th, Apartment No. 103, Telephone No. 343-4235, advised he vaguely recalls being contacted by GROOM but has absolutely no recollection of the man CARL RAY.

BEN GUTIERREZ contacted BILL BATES, FL Reservations concerning any reservations made by CARL RAY. BATES said Reservations in Las Vegas would have to be contacted to determine if RAY had made reservations from Las Vegas to St. Louis.

Mr. MARTIN E. LARSON, Director of Revenue and Accounting, FL, 8075 East 40th, provided the original and one copy of the charge document called a Transportation Receipt, bearing the signature of CARL RAY, as well as one copy each of the file copies of the two tickets, No. 829753 and No. 829754. He requested that the original of the Transportation Receipt be mailed to him at Frontier Airlines, 5900 East 39th, Denver, 80207.

On May 3, 1968, WILLIAM R. NOONEN, Supervisor of Accounts Receivable, FL, 5900 West 39th, Telephone No. 398-4743, had a search made for the credit application submitted by CARL RAY when he obtained temporary credit card No. 31088. A search was made by Mrs. PAT BENEFIEL, who stated that she went through all records twice with negative results and feels the application has not reached Denver from whatever FL Office accepted it. She stated she would continue to look for the application and would notify the FBI when located.

Mr. NOONEN, through the assistance of Mr. BERT CLARK, FL, commenced calling around to likely FL stations to determine where CARL RAY had obtained the temporary card. Mr. NOONEN also put out an all-stations teletype to accomplish this same end. This teletype was later canceled since CLARK determined the card was obtained in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

BERT CLARK telephonically advised late on May 3, 1968, that he had determined the temporary credit card, number had been issued at Albuquerque on April 26, 1968, to CARL RAY, Ray Land and Cattle Company, Route 4, Box 868, Pecos, Texas. That same day, RAY used the credit card to obtain Ticket No. 028-101-547-962 for Frontier Flight No. 581, leaving for Phoenix from Albuquerque at 10:30 P.M., April 26, 1968. It was a one-way ticket, first class, costing \$30.45. Later, RAY had the ticket reissued for first class jet transportation aboard Flight No. 785 leaving Albuquerque at 8:10 A.M., April 27, 1968, and arriving in Phoenix at 9:42 A.M. The new ticket number as 028-101-547-975.

CLARK said he talked by telephone with MICHAL STONE, the girl at the ticket counter in Albuquerque, who waited on CARL RAY during part of his transactions. She described CARL RAY as tanned, 6°, dark brown hair, complete Western clothing.

While talking with Mr. NOONEN, he stated that a person of a different name had used the same Modus Operandi as CARL RAY in obtaining FL tickets and exchanging them. He said one HERMAN J. SCHUMACHER obtained temporary FL Credit Card No. (believed to be obtained in Phoenix, Arizona). The station manager for FL, Phoenix, called FL, Denver, on about April 15, 1968, and advised that SCHUMACHER had purchased two round trip

tickets from Phoenix to St. Louis, for a man and wife on April 15, 1968, and on April 16, 1968, Western Airlines, Phoenix, advised the station manager SAM CALLES that these two tickets had been turned in to Western for tickets from Phoenix to Mexico City. According to Western Airlines, the tickets were not used. Mr. NOONEN said he put out an all-station teletype to be wary of transactions with SCHUMACHER on April 17, 1968, and at about 1:00 P.M. that day, MARTY MARTIN, Station Manager, Las Vegas, called saying that he had sold two round trip tickets from Las Vegas to St. Louis for Mr. and Mrs. H. SCHUMACHER that day and, as near as he could tell, SCHUMACHER took the trip.

To cover the possibility that SCHUMACHER and RAY are one and the same, Mr. NOONEN put out an all-station teletype in an effort to definitely ascertain which station issued the credit card and to locate the credit application, which could not be located in Denver. He stated records in Denver will continue to be searched for this application.

Commencing during the evening of May 3, 1968, all hotels in the Denver area, and motels in the vicinity of the airport, were contacted by Special Agents of the Denver Office to determine if any CARL RAY was registered there as of April 29, 1968. The results of these checks were negative.

On May 4, 1968, the original of a Frontier Airlines Transportation Receipt, signed by one CARL RAY, in connection with obtaining two round trip tickets from Las Vegas to St. Louis, at Frontier Airlines Ticket Counter, Stapleton International Airport, Denver, Colorado, on May 1, 1968, were forwarded to the FBI Laboratory with the request to compare the signature with the known handwriting of JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 7, 1968, two originals of Frontier Airlines Transportation Receipts, bearing the signature of CARL RAY and the original of Frontier Credit Application which CARL RAY reportedly filled out and signed, were forwarded to the FBI Laboratory for comparison of handwriting of CARL RAY with JAMES EARL RAY. Also enclosed were three originals of Frontier Transportation Receipts bearing the signature of HERMAN J. SCHUMACHER. The FBI Laboratory was requested to compare SCHUMACHER's handwriting with that of CARL RAY and JAMES EARL RAY.

Mr. and Mrs. W. E. MOON, 177 Glory View Drive, Grand Junction, Colorado, advised SA RAY M. HICKMAN, on May 2, 1968, and May 4, 1968, that telephone number 242-0720, is listed to them. They stated they have no children and that they received no call from Alpine, Texas, on the afternoon of December 17, 1967. They were of the belief there must have been some mistake in the records.

CHARLES and SANDRA MC ANALLY of Modern Roofing and Installation Company, advised SA RAY M. HICKMAN on May 2, 1968, that telephone number 242-7412 is listed to Modern Roofing and Installation Company, 2841 North Avenue, Grand Junction, Colorado. They advised they had made the call on December 15, 1967, from Alpine, Texas, to their parents in Grand Junction, Colorado, because Mr. MC ANALLY's father was in the hospital at that time.

Neither the MOONs nor MC ANALLYs had any information concerning JAMES EARL RAY.

On May 2, 1968, Mrs. RICHARD FOREMAN, 6950 Avrum Drive, Arvada, Colorado, advised SA BOYD D. ADSIT that telephone number 428-9207 is listed to her husband, RICHARD FOREMAN.

Miss LINDA SANDLIN, 6950 Avrum Drive, Arvada, grand-daughter of Mrs. RICHARD FOREMAN, advised SA BOYD D. ADSIT that she received a call from CHARLES HUGH HANAH, age 19, from Alpine, Texas, on or about December 15, 1967. She stated that HANAH is a boyfriend attending Sul Ross State College and has the address of Box 5R5743 in Alpine, Texas.

On May 6, 1968, Miss LA VERNE BAKER, formerly in the Womans Army Corps, now employed by Electronic Systems, who resides at 111½ West Cheyenne Road, Colorado Springs, Colorado, with DIANNE PATTERSON and LOUISE CARROLL, all unmarried and employed at Colorado Springs, advised SA ANDREW P. BUGAS that telephone number 636-1773, in Colorado Springs, is listed to her. She stated that she has no knowledge of any pay telephone call from Beaumont, Texas. She said her mother, Mrs. HATTIE ROMERO, resides in Beaumont, Texas, and calls her frequently. She stated her mother has telephone number HE6-1446. She was unable to recall whether her mother might have called her on December 16, 1967. She stated that her roommate, LOUISE CARROLL, has a boyfriend, one ROBERT BROUSSARD, a resident of Beaumont.

Miss DIANNE PATTERSON advised SA BUGAS on May 6, 1968, that she has no acquaintances in Beaumont, Texas, and has not received a telephone call from there.

Miss LOUISE CARROLL, Specialist 5, Defense Communications Agency, Western Hemisphere, Fort Carson, Colorado, advised SA ANDREW P. BUGAS, on May 8, 1968, that she has a boyfriend, one ROBERT BROUSSARD, who works in his father's store, Henry Broussard Food Fair, Beaumont, Texas. She stated he resides at 8775 Old Sour Lake Road, Beaumont. She stated during the months of December, 1967, and January, 1968, ROBERT BROUSSARD telephoned her two or three times a week. She recalled on one occasion he made a telephone call from a pay station. She remembered this because the operator cut in and BROUSSARD had to put additional money in the telephone. She stated that BROUSSARD said he was away from the store at the time and she believed this occurred on about December 16, 1967.

Re. J. R. KELLER, Reported Associate of JAMES EARL RAY at Leavenworth

Records relating to J. R. KELLER, Leavenworth Prison No. 72614-L, were located at the Federal Records Center, Denver, Colorado, on May 2, 1968. A review of these records by SA JOHN H. GALLIE revealed that JOHN RICHARD KELLER, FBI No. 1687578, was fingerprinted on August 15, 1955, at the Federal Correctional Institution, LaTuna, Texas, and was transferred to Florence, Arizona, Prison Camp on February 22, 1957, while serving a three year sentence for violation of the Interstate Transportation of Stolen Motor Vehicle statute. Nowhere in the file is subject RAY's name mentioned, or are names of any other friends or associates of KELLER, while in prison. KELLER's prison file indicates he was last released from the Federal Prison Camp at Florence, Arizona, on June 1, 1962, at which time his destination was listed as Tucson, Arizona.

The file reflected KELLER had four other sons residing with their mother, and one son in the U. S. Marine Corps.

The file also indicates that KELLER, in late 1957, conspired with MARION MURRELL COOPER to steal a car in Tucson, Arizona, and transport it to Guatemala City, Guatemala.

Re: HOLT CHEW, Maker of Prior Threat
Against Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

By communication dated December 13, 1965, the Atlanta Office of the FBI reported that an assistant of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. received a telephone call from a male individual, who stated he was 'Mr. CHEW" (PHONETIC), address 1800 Washington Street, Denver, Colorado, and this person told KING's assistant that KING should be careful as someone was going to assassinate him.

Records of the Denver Police Department, Bureau of Identification and Records, Denver, Colorado, reveal that HOLT CHEW, Denver Police Department No. 58534, was placed on probation on April 24, 1967, after conviction for shooting JAMES THOMAS JACKSON, a Negro, on January 20, 1966.

On April 29, 1968, and April 30, 1968, CHEW was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI. He was asked if he recalled making a telephone call to the office of MARTIN LUTHER KING in Atlanta, Georgia, on December 13, 1965. He reflected for a few minutes and then said he was not about to lie about the situation, especially to the FBI. He said that he has no love for MARTIN LUTHER KING, and is glad he is dead. He stated KING was not the non-violent civil rights leader he claimed to be. He stated wherever KING went violence followed and he was responsible for 37 deaths in the United States. He added that, as a personal matter, KING was directly responsible for the destruction of the business career of one of his sons, BILL CHEW, of Saint Augustine, Florida. He estimated his son's Financial loss at \$400,000.00.

CHEW stated that his son was head of a hotel and motel association in Saint Augustine, Florida, a few years ago, when KING and his followers came down to Florida, and started efforts

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to integrate the industry. His son was also operating a motel in Saint Augustine at the time. BILL CHEW was taken into Federal Court by these people for refusing to integrate his establishment and, as the result of an unfavorable court decision, ended up resigning his position with the association and selling his motel at a severe loss. CHEW said that there was considerable newspaper publicity over the matter at the time.

CHEW placed KING in the same cate as STOKLEY CARMICHAEL and H. RAP BROWN, and stated frankly that he hoped the same fate befalls the latter two. He made the statement that he is not against the Negro race; that he was born in Georgia, and was raised with Negroes, with whom he hunted and fished. He made it clear that he is against some individual Negroes like CARMICHAEL and BROWN, who advocate violence and have no regard for property rights, but is not against all Negroes.

Having made these points, CHEW returned to the original question and stated he had no recollection of the telephone call and admitted that the reason could be that he could have been drinking at the time the call was made. He volunteered that at that time in his life he was a bad drinker. He emphasized that he had no doubt that he made the call, if interviewing Agents said he did, but stated he did not recall it. He stated he was certain, regardless of whether or not he had been drinking, that he would not have made a threat over the telephone since he knows such a threat could lead to trouble for him. He said if he had any intention of doing anything concerning KING, he would not have used the telephone, but would have taken direct action.

CHEW advised that he is certain that no one "put him up" to making the telephone call, and it was not an action involving anyone other than himself. He was shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, the man being sought in connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and disclaimed any knowledge whatsoever of RAY.

He constantly referred to KING, CARMICHAEL and BROWN using expletives in an effort to show his intense dislike for these men.

He stated that he was in Denver on April 4, 1968, and April 5, 1968, and left the city by Eastern Airlines for Augusta, Georgia, on April 6, 1968, where he is promoting business interests in the food industry, whereby he hopes to set his son BILL up in business. He was unwilling to further identify his business interests. He stated his son BILL is presently running the Paradise Motel in Sylvania, Georgia, and drove up from Sylvania to meet him in Augusta the first part of the week of April 7, 1968. He stated both he and his son then drove to Sylvania, and on to Saint Augustine, Florida, where they were met on April 12, 1968, by Mrs. CHEW and a younger son, who had just returned from military service in Korea. He said his wife and younger son flew to Saint Augustine from Denver. He stated thereafter he and his family vacationed in Florida, until he, his wife and younger son returned to Denver, on April 29, 1968, in a new car that he purchased in Florida.

CHEW specifically stated that he had nothing to do with KING's death, and said that he knew of no conspiracy relating to it.

CHEW stated that he saw KING's funeral on television and the way it was conducted looked to him like it had been planned for twenty years.

He volunteered to the interviewing Agents that he has every intention of protecting his apartment house property in Denver, Colorado, with as much force as is necessary if anyone attempts to cause damage or loot it. He stated he was angry with the leaders of this country for allowing rioting, looting, etc. He thinks that the Attorney General is "very weak" and used more expletives to emphasize his point. He stated that he is "all for" law and order, but would like to see law enforcement empowered to act. He also stated that he was angry because the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was able to close businesses throughout the country after KING's death, when very few businesses closed after President KENNEDY's assassination; and he is convinced that threats were used to accomplish the closing of businesses in Denver, as he was so informed before he left on his trip.

It should be noted that a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 21, 1966, that CHEW is a highly irascible and unpredictable individual, and alcoholic, and possibly a user of narcotics.

Mrs. HOLT CHEW, on April 30, 1968, advised that her husband left Denver on April 6, 1968, for Augusta, Georgia, via Eastern Airlines, and that she and a younger son traveled to Florida, to meet him on April 12, 1968, wia United, Eastern, and Delta Airlines.

was born at Bert City, Georgia. He attended
school there and came to Denver in 1932. He served in the United
States Army during World War II, and has been the owner and
operator of Holt Chew Motor Company for many years. His wife's
name is ELAINE, and he has four children. He has been on
record with the credit bureau since February, 1937, and has
maintained a satisfactory credit rating.
