On July 3, 1968 a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that he had received information that person by the name of Lonnal Wilhelm has started a defense fund for James Earl Ray. According to the source funds solicited are to be sent to Columbus, Texas.

On July 3, 1968 another source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised as follows:

On June 26, 1968, Lonnal Wilhelm, P.O. Box 686, Columbus, Texas with residence at 431 Front Street, Columbus, applied and received P.O. Box 602, U.S. Post Office, Columbus, Texas. Wilhelm reportedly listed the purpose for having P.O. Box 602 as being for the receipt of funds for the defense of James Earl Ray suspected murderer of Martin Luther King on April 4, 1968. Lonnal Wilhelm, a white male, is approximately 30 years old, married and is the son of Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen, P.O. Box 686, Columbus, Texas, residence 431 Front Street, Columbus, Texas. Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen, also known as Loyce Bentsen arrived at Columbus, Texas in August, 1967 from Harlingin, Texas.

Lonnal Wilhelm's Texas driver's license number is 0072544 and Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen's Texas driver's license is 0022346.

On July 3, 1968, Frances Davinport, Credit Bureau of Columbus, Texas, advised that on June 26, 1968 she had a local inquiry on a L.E. Wilhelm who was reported to be self-employed as a nurseryman.

On July 3, 1968 a check of records of Colorado County Sheriff's Office, Columbus, Texas, revealed no information identifiable with the name Lonnal Wilhelm.



WFO 157-744 He said he served on the Board of the National Knights of the KKK (NKKKK) with JAMES VENABLE and H. J. HILL, but later resigned from that Board and formed the Knights of the Klu Klux Klan (KKKK), and is now Emperor of that group. He said he was unable to furnish records of the Federated Klan as ordered because his house burned in 1954 or 1955 and destroyed all such records and also said that he has no records pertaining to the KKKK although he later stated he had some material which he will search out and make available to the committee. He refused on the basis of constitutional privilege to identify members of the Imperial Concillium. He took this privilege in refusing to furnish the identity of persons in attendance in April, 1965, at the organization meeting of the KKKK. He stated he was aware of the "assassination letter" written by DANIEL WAGNER and that he had discussed this letter with ELOISE WITTE, but said that both regarded the letter as ridiculous, and he said he never administered any oath or any part of the Klan writual in WAGNER's presence or to WAGNER as he regarded him as a "mad dog" in his thinking. He said he did tell WAGNER to write out the specifics contained in that letter but never investigated any part of it and had not informed any law enforcement agency of its contents. He stated he talked to the FBI initially contacted him in regard to it. reported trip of WAGNER and CHUCK GILLIAM to Georgia to get dynamite and knew nothing of any dynamite being transported He stated the Klan rally held at PARKIE SCOTT's farm was advertised as being a KKKK rally but was a joint venture as JAMES VEHABLE was in attendance. Referenced UFO airtel, 2/14/66, re MCUA Klan Hearings, RM (Klan) (a dopy emelosed for Houphis) contains information about ELOISE VITIE's testimony before MCUA on 2/14/66. This testimony included the following:

ELOISE WITTE, in 1966, an Empress of Mational Enights of the Et Elux Klan (MEKK) in Ohio. Also, WITTE considered "assessination letter" of WAGMER to be ridiculous and stated WAGMER had never discussed the detailed violence in that letter with her. ELOISE WITTE said she repeatedly told WAGMER the Klan did not believe in violence.

WPO indices reviewed and do not contain any information that KLOISE WITTE, 1654 Otto Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio, was interviewed concerning her testimony before House Counties on Un-American Activities on 2/14/66.

"Activities of Na Klux Klam Organizations in the United States," Part 5, Hearings Before the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 89th Congress, Second Session, published by U.S. Government Printing Office in 1966, reviewed concurning testimony of ELDISE WITTE on 2/14/64 and ELCHARD JOSEPH HAMMA on 2/15/66.

Page 3543 of Hrs. WITTE's testinguy contains the following:

Mr. MANUEL: "Did you ever make the statement to Mr. WAGNER that the Klan had hired a gumman for \$25.0001"

Mrs. WITTE: "Resvens, no."

Mr. MANUEL: "Did you have any conversation with Mr. MACHER regarding the appearance of MAKTIN LUTHER KING at Antioch College in Tollow Springs, Chie?"

Mrs. WITE: "No."

WITTH added that WAGNER read of this in newspaper, wrote a letter to WITTH, and phoned has about KING's appearance at Antioch College. DANNY WAGNER said he hoped WITTH would not be alarmed with him but he had some ideas he wanted to carry out. She added that WAGNER never told her what these plans were that he had for MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Page 3545 contains information from WITE that Mr. HORRIS told her he had heard of a plot underfoot to do away with the President, Mr. WITE, KLOISE WITE: husband, Mr. MORRIS, MARTIN LUTHER KING, and HUMPHREY. Mrs. WITE said she did not know the above plot in a letter written by DANNY WAGNER. She described the plot as ridicalous and WAGNER, a psychopathic case, Mrs. WITE said she did not furnish this information to law enforcement officers as she did not think WAGNER would carry through an anything as ridicalous as this. Mrs. WITE thought WAGNER wight have taken this method of retaliation for being denied numbership in the Klan.

Mrs. WITE stated she did not introduce WAGNER to W. A. DAVIS at National States Rights Party to put WAGNER in touch with a gen dealer.

Page 3631 contains portion of testimony of RICHARD JOSEPH HAMMA on 2/15/66. HAMMA said Mrs. RICHER NEO 44-703

WITTE said "Mr. MAGNER to do nome work for her. Mr. JOHNSON, if he meeded assessingtion, Mr. MAGNER could do it." Mrs. WITTE added, "Might now, me are interested in other people." A check of FGA records disclosed GALT's name what not appear on 1967 American Maritage subscriber's list.

Mr. CARLSON made available the above mentioned American Heritage business reply postcard and stated it need not be returned.

He indicated the purpose of these trips was to try and develop information relative to the assassination of Doctor KING and other information relating to the National States Rights Party. He did not elaborate on his assignments nor did he indicate he had developed any unusual or pertinent information. He reportedly was in contact with witnesses involved in the KING case and based on information heard on the "street," it was said that the chauffeur of Doctor KING was suspected of "setting up Doctor KING for the assassination." SOMERSETT was unable to identify source of this information.
