On October 3, 1967, the Phoenix Division advised as follows:

For the information of Savannah, records at Mexican ports of entry through Arizona are maintained by date only and not retained over one year.

In view of the extremely large number of persons entering Mexico daily, in order to check available records it would be necessary to know the name used by subject, description, and license number of vehicle used and approximate date of entry.

It is further noted that border patrol officers seldom observe persons entering or leaving Mexico. Past experience has indicated it is not feasible to exhibit photographs to Mexican customs officials or U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service officers in view of the extensive daily traffic.

On November 14, 1967, the Jacksonville Division advised as follows:

Synopsiss

BILLY and WANDA BARNS believed to have moved from Mansfield, Mo., to Plainview, rexas. Alabama drivers license used by subject in cashing forged check issued to DONALD LEE PICARD at a fictitious address, Huntsville, Alabama. and wife visited unknown town in Mexico July of 1966. RICHARD - EUGENE BOSLEY, brother of subject reportedly confined Nevada State Penitentiary in 1961. Subject served in U.S. Navy 1/15/45 to 10/31/47, and U.S. Coast Guard 1/20/48 to 6/24/48, when he received general discharge. Relatives of subject ia Indiana furnished no additional information of assistance. Investigation at Macon, Ga., and Jacksonville, Fla., developed no information concerning whereabouts of subject. Mrs. RUTH WESTERVELT, Catonsville, Md., classmate of subject's ex-wife, had no knowledge re whereabouts of subject. LEON REESE AVERITT. fellow damate of subject at Mississippi State Pentitentiary, was paroled 12/15/65, to supervision of Parole Officer, Macon, Ga. CONSIDER SUBJECT ARMED AND DANGEROUS IN VIEW OF NATURE OF CRIME COMMITTED.

DETAILS

The Kansas City Division furnished the following information September 29, 1967:

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

On September 19, 1967, Sheriff REX KELLEY, Wright County, Hartville, Missouri, advised SA KARL A. PAYSON that HAROLD LANSDOWN no longer resides in the area of Mansfield, Missouri. He stated that he heard that HAROLD was living in Rockport, Missouri, and was employed by a rock crushing company. He stated that he was not absolutely certain as to LANSDOWN's employment. He said, however, that he was quite certain LANSDOWN was now living in the Rockport area.

On September 19, 1967, Deputy Sheriff HOMER FRY, Mansfield, Missouri, advised SA PAYSON that he had no pertinent information to report in addition to that previously reported. He stated he had seen no one in the vicinity of Mansfield who looked like the subject. In addition, he stated, BILLY and WANDA BARNS are not around the Mansfield area very much any more. He advised that he believes they have moved down around Plainview, Texas.

FRY stated that there have been very few out of state cars around the BARNS property in Mansfield. He stated that LOUISE PHELPS, sister-in-law of BILLY BARNS, has also left the area. He stated that she formerly managed the Mimosa Cafe in Mansfield, Mo. However, she passed several bad checks to various merchants in the area during the time she was operating this business, and has left the Mansfield area in order to escape prosecution. He stated that all of the checks which she passed were drawn on a Mansfield bank, and the total amount of the checks was a little over \$200.00. He stated that when she was unable to make good on the checks, the various business men who had accepted them, brought legal proceedings and had her interests in the cafe attached, and she merely left town.

FRY advised that he had heard HAROLD LANSDOWN was again associating with BILLY and WANDA BARNS, BARNS is supposed to have some interest in a truck line, but FRY stated he did not know the name of the truck line or where its terminal locations were. He stated he thought, perhaps, BARNS' brother might be the owner of the truck line and that BARNS merely worked for his brother in some capacity.

FRY further stated that HAROLD LANSDOWN had moved to Rockport, Missouri, and is supposedly working for a chemical company there, or a crushed rock company, as a truck driver. He advised that LANSDOWN drives a blue 1961 Ford, but he did

not know the license number. He stated he believed that the car was licensed in Missouri. He stated LANSDOWN usually hauls a horse trailer behind his car wherever he goes.

FRY stated that LANSDOWN's wife, ANNETTE, is presently living with him. He advised that LANSDOWN and his wife had obtained a divorce some time ago. He stated he heard this had been a subterfuge worked out by LANSDOWN and his wife so his wife could continue to receive child support payments from the State of Missouri. FRY said that after LANSDOWN's wife obtained the divorce from him, and the State reinstituted payment of child support funds to her, she and LANSDOWN joined together again, and are now living together as husband and wife.

FRY stated HAROLD LANSDOWN, in his opinion, is capable of just about anything. He stated LANSDOWN has been paroled approximately four times out of Wright County for various local crimes. He stated he doubts seriously if LANSPOWN would cooperate with law enforcement authorities unless it would be to his benefit. He stated that LANSDOWN can be made to talk, however, when he believes, or knows, that some law enforcement agency has developed information regarding one or more of his criminal activities which could result in prosecution against him. FRY said this is about the only way that he knows to get LANSDOWN to cooperate. He said, in his opinion, LANSDOWN is personally acquainted with the majority of the criminal element in and around Wright County and the surrounding areas. He stated that he feels LANSDOWN could be of assistance, but the question is whether he will be or not.

She was unable to locate a record identifiable with subject under his true name and aliases.

On October 18, 1967, the Birmingham Division advised as follows:

On October 9, 1967, SA MARION B. HUMMEL contacted Detective RICHARD OTTMAN, Fugitive Squad, Detective Division, Huntsville, Alabama, Police Department. Detective OTTMAN advised that the Huntsville Police Department still has an outstanding forgery warrant for JACK DEMPSEY BOSLEY whom they have classified as a fugitive. He advised that BOSLEY has been indicted and that the indictment is presently held by the Madison County Sheriff's Office. Detective OTTMAN has developed no information regarding subject's whereabouts.

License was issued to DONALD LEE PICARD, 2511 Martin Road, Huntsville, Alabama. It is noted that 2511 Martin Road is a non-existent address. Martin Road is an access road leading from Highway 231 to Redstone Arsenal. There are no residences located or this road.

On October 12, 1967, Mr. FRANK SOUTHERLAND, Security Officer, Brown Engineering Company, Huntsville, reviewed

the employment records of both present and former employees of this company and advised that no individual by the name of DONALD LEE PICARD had ever been employed by this company.

DAVE KETTLES, Georgia Bureau of Investigation Agent, Swainsboro, Georgia, advised SA JAMES H. APPLEGATE on October 11, 1967, it was his recollection that subject stated trip to Mexico was made during the latter part of July and returned about the first week in August. KETTLES further advised he had observed a Mexican registration sticker believed on the lower lefthand corner of the windshield on subject's car, which the last he knew was in possession of subject's wife at Macon, Ga. He stated he could not recall the name of any town in Mexico on this sticker, believed it was a black or grey in color, shaped like the country of Mexico with white numbers on it. He further advised he did not recall BOSLEY stating at what point he entered into Mexico nor did he recall the name of the town in Mexico which he visited but it was his recollection BOSLEY mentioned stopping in Dallas, Texas, on the return trip.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LESLIE B. DIRCHMAN:

AT BOISE, IDAHO

On October 10, 1967, Mr. GERALD N. LEHAN, Identification Officer, Idaho State Penitentiary (ISP), advised his records reflect that RICHARD ENGENE BOSLEY, also known as Fred Smith, Jr., Inmate #9743, was received at the ISP on September 28, 1957, to serve a term of two to four years following his conviction of the crime of burglary in the second degree: BOSLEY was paroled on March 28, 1959, declared a parole violator on June 22, 1959, reinstated on parole on September 13, 1960, and given a final discharge on September 13, 1961.

While he was incarcerated at the ISP, his correspondence included the following:

A letter dated April 6, 1961, from the Warden at the Nevada State Penitentiary (NSP), Carson City, Nevada, advised that RICHARD EUGENE BOSLEY, NSP #8051, was then incarcerated in the NSP and requested a summary of his activities while at the ISP. BT #88-4636 SY #88-5131 LBD/jrd Page 2

A review of interview reports conducted by the Penitentiary psychologist reflects RICHARD EUGENE BOSLEY claims he broke connectors with his family at age 16 or in about 1936, and he had no desire to re-establish these connections.

Mr. LEHAN made available one copy of an ISP Pre-placement report dated January 12, 1959.

On October 24, 1967, the St. Louis Division advised as follows:

A review of October 23, 1967, by IC EARL M. RANKY of the military service records on file at the National Personnel Records Center (Civilian Personnel Records), SLMO, for JACK DEMPSEY BOSLEY, SN 387 29 00, indicated he enlisted in the U.S. Navy on January 15, 1945, and served on active duty until January 10, 1946, and was honorably discharged as a Fireman 1st Class at San Diego, Calif., by reason of Convenience of the Government.

On January 11, 1946, he re-enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served on active duty until October 31, 1947, at which time he was honorably discharged as a Fireman 1st Class at San Diego, Calif., by reason of expiration of enlistment.

While serving in the U. S. Navy, he received non-judicial punishment on two occasions, once for disobedience of orders and once for absence over leave.

Naval records for BOSLEY indicated he had enlisted in the U. S. Coast Guard subsequent to his serving in the U. S. Navy.

A check of the U. S. Coast Guard records on file at the above center revealed that JACK DEMPSEY BOSLEY, served in the U. S. Coast Guard from January 20, 1948 to June 24, 1948,

ne be discharged from the U. S. Coast Guard.

The Indianapolis Division furnished the following information, November 7, 1967:

On October 10, 1967, Mrs. LLOYD RANSFORD, 605 South Third Street, Clinton, Indiana, advised over the past few months she has talked with her brother MAX in Seattle, Washington, her brother WILLARD in Indianapolis and also her sister MARGARET in Sherman Oaks, California, and she had learned the FBI had contacted all of them. She advised she could render no additional information other than that which she had previously given regarding her brother, the subject. She stated her last contact with JACK BOSLEY was a little more than two years ago and that contact had been telephonic.

She advised that at the time her brother WILLARD had also been contacted by him telephonically.

She stated she is quite certain that all the members of her family would be as cooperative as possible with the FBI in the event the subject should make contact with them.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LAMONT LEO HAGAN at Indianapolis:

On October 13, 15, and 20, 1967, attempts were made to contact WILLARD BOSLEY, 5019 North Central, Indianapolis, brother of subject, with negative results.

On October 25, 1967, WILLARD BOSLEY was contacted and advised that he has received no information concerning subject since last contacted by the FBI. BOSLEY stated that he does not want his brother coming around his residence and stated that if subject does show up at his residence he will contact the FBI.

BOSLEY stated that he has no sympathy at all for subject and would like to see him apprehended if possible.

The Atlanta Division furnished the following information November 8, 1967:

On October 26, 1967, JACK LONDON, Umberlake Grocery Company, Macon, Georgia, advised that subject's wife continues to be employed as a secretary and on occasion comments that she has not seen nor heard anything concerning the subject since his disappearance from Macon, Ga., in December 1966. LONDON said he would be alert for any information indicating the subject's whereabouts and would immediately advise the FBI should any such information come to his attention.

On October 27, 1967, an examination of the vehicle driven by subject's wife disclosed it is the same vehicle, a 1966 Ford LTD, 4-door, white in color with black vinyl tep, which subject was using while living in Macon. No identification stickers were noted on this vehicle.

On October 27, 1967, BARBARA PENDER advised she is no longer hustling in the Macon area but still is in contact with the local prostitutes who are working in Macon and inquiries of these individuals did not disclose any indication that the subject is presently in or around the Macon area. PENDER said should she learn any information concerning the subject's whereabouts, she will immediately advise the FBI.

On November 6, 1967, the Seattle Division furnished the following information:

Address of 1941 Fairview North, Seattle, is nonexistent. The street numbers run from 102 to 1158 only. The figure of 1941 apparently was the year listed for residence on Fairview Avenue.

The Street Guide for this avenue reveals no name similar to that of the subject.

Several attempts to locate the subject's brother, DAVID MAX BOSLEY at 15066 S. E. Maple Valley Highway, have proved unproductive.

The following investigation was conducted by the Jacksonville, Florida Division:

On October 5, 1967, IC R. EUGENE HERRING conducted the following investigation:

ELLEN HARRISON, Supervisor, Drivers License Bureau, Tallahassee, Florida, advised that she was unable to locate a drivers license record in her files identifiable with the subject under his true name or aliases.

Mrs. HARRISON also advised that she would be unable to furnish information concerning Florida drivers license number inasmuch as her files are set up by alphabetical order only and therefore cannot check records by license number.

On October 4, 1967, Deputy Sheriff JOHN KEANE, Duval County Sheriff's Office, and Detective Sergeant DON NELSON, Duval County Sheriff's Office, advised that their office still had an outstanding warrant charging subject with breaking and entering. NELSON advised that PERCY LIVINGSTON, an accomplice of BOSLEY in the breaking and entering, was to appear for trial in Jacksonville on December 27, 1967. No further infomation as to the location of BOSLEY or his associates was available.

On October 16, 1967, Mrs. STELLA CHAPMAN and Mrs. WILLIE MAE PARRAMORE, 2123 Buckman Street, advised that they had received no further information about BOSLEY from JERRY PARRAMORE or from any other source. Mrs. PARRAMORE advised that her husband was presently in Polk County Jail, Bartow, Florida. Mrs. CHAPMAN advised that she last saw subject in August, 1966, when he visited her house on Phyllis Street, Jacksonville, Florida. She stated that he telephoned in November or December, 1966, trying to locate JERRY PARRAMORE. She advised that should

she receive any information as to his whereabouts she would contact the FBI.

On October 17, 1967, an attempt was made to contact WESLEY PITTMAN at 3358 Nolan Street, Jacksonville, Florida. Mrs. PITTMAN advised that her son WESLEY had not been in Jacksonville for approximately to weeks, and that she had no idea as to his whereabouts. She stated that he was presently being sought by Volusia County authorities for breaking and entering. She advised that she had never heard of BOSLEY, and his description meant nothing to her; however, upon being shown a photograph of BOSLEY, she stated that it looked familiar and although she could not be sure she thought she had seen him approximately one month before. However, she could provide nothing specific as to his companions, automobile, or whereabouts. She advised that if she should recall any more information she would contact the FBI.

On October 18, 1967, SAS ROBERT J. BURKE and JON W. BELL conducted the following investigation at Florida State Prison, Raiford, Florida:

ED ALFORD, Chief Records Clerk, Florida State Prison, made available records which disclosed the following information:

MILTON F. FRANK, number A-006770, was sentenced March 29, 1967, at Polk County, Florida, for two years on four counts of uttering and passing a forged instrument. His date of birth was listed as at Gadsden, Florida, and his FBI number was A notation was made that he was a narcotic addict, and that he was a hespital patient suffering from gangrene of the hand.

LOUIE WRIGHT, number 8009991, cell E-15, was sentenced on April 5, 1967, for two years for fraudulently obtaining a narcotic drug in Duval

County. His date of birth was listed as at Jacksonville, Florida, and his FBI number was listed as

MILTON FRANK advised that he had heard in the past several months that BOSLEY was dead, however, he could not pinpoint the source of this information, only that it was a rumor which had spread through Raiford. He had no idea where BOSLEY could be located other than Macon, Georgia, where he had lived in the past. He stated that the last he saw BOSLEY was in December, 1966, in Georgia.

LOUIE WRIGHT advised that he was unwilling to discuss anything with the FBI about my matter whatsoever. He refused to answer any questions concerning BOSLEY.

On October 27, 1967, SAS ROBERT J. BURKE and JAMES R. HASTINGS interviewed JOE MORGAN at the Duval County Jail, Jacksonville, Plorida. MORGAN advised that he had been in Raiford in 1955 with BOSLEY, and that he had had very little contact with him since that time. He advised that he had no idea as to BOSLEY's location. It is noted that MORGAN appeared uncooperative and would not furnish any information of value.

On November 3, 1967, MARY TYSON, 4318
Springfield Boulevard, advised that she was not acquainted with the peopletliving at 4326
Springfield Boulevard since they were new tenants and had only been there approximately two weeks. She viewed a photograph of subject BOSLEY and stated that the photograph was unfamiliar to her. She advised that a Mr. DIXON, Manager of the Gregg Hotel in Jacksonville, was the owner of the house located at 4326 Springfield Boulevard and might be able to furnish information of value.

On the same date, Mr. DIXON advised that a review of his records failed to locate any record identifiable with BOSLEY under his true name or aliases. He stated that the photograph was unfamiliar to him.

On the same date, Mrs. MICHEL, 2024 North Market Street, advised that subject's photograph was unfamiliar to her. She stated that 2008 Market Street must be the apartment complex located at 2000 Market Street. She did not know the name of the manager of the apartments.

On November 7, 1987, Mrs. LANA CORRAN, 2000 North Market Street, Apartment 4, advised that she was the wife of "RED" COHRAN who is presently serving time in the Duval County Prison Farm. She advised that she was well acquainted with JACK BOSLEY who had in the past resided in the apartment complex located at 2000 Market Street. She stated that she had last seen BOSLEY approximately two years ago, and had not heard anything from or about him in over a year. She advised that should she receive any information she would contact the FBL.

Numerous attempts to contact JOE DEKLE at Dekle's Trophy Shop on Cassat Avenue met with negative results.

Baltimore furnished the following information on November 15, 1967:

The following investigation was conducted by SA TROMAS J. UTASKI, at Baltimore and Catonsville, Maryland:

On October 17, 1967, AL WEBB, Superintendent, Catonsville Post Office, advised that no Catonville or Catonsville Road exists in the Baltimore-Catonsville, Maryland area but he advised that there are several WESTERVELT families living in the Catonsville, Maryland, area.

He stated he would contact local carriers in an attempt to determine address of any, if any, of one RUTH WESTERVELT.

On November 9, 1967, AL WEBB advised that Mrs. RUTH WESTERVELT resides with her husband RALPH O. WESTERVELT, at 5 North Rollin Road, Catonsville Road.

On November 14, 1967, Mrs. RUTH WESTERVELT, 5 North Rollin Road, advised that in August 1967, she attempted to contact an old college friend one Mrs. ELIZABETH BOSLEY of Brewton, Ala. She had not seen her fellow alumnae of the University of Alabama for over 18 years and she wished to speak with her in that they were good friends at one time. She telephonically contacted the O'BANNON residence of Brewton, Ala., but she was unable to obtain Mrs. BOSLEY's address from the person speaking whom she determined to be Mrs. BOSLEY's mother. She gave Mrs. O'BANNON her address in Catonsville, Md., hoping that Mrs. BOSLEY would write to her, which she did some weeks later.

Mrs. BOSLEY did respond and her letter contained mostly reminiscences of old college days but she did advise Mrs. WESTERVELT that she was working as a teacher in a school in Kreole, Miss.

Mrs. WESTERVELT stated that she has not seen Mrs. BOSLEY for approximately 18 years and that she has never met Mrs. BOSLEY's husband, the subject. She advised she could provide no further information pertinent to the investigation.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES W. SAMMON at Parchman, Mississippi, on November 9, 1967:

PEACOCK picks up his, the sheriff's, garbage. He said he is quite sure PEACOCK has never gotten very far from Shepherdsville and would be "lost" in a big city.

Mr. RUSSELL PEACOCK was contacted and it was noted he does not comb his hair straight back and does not fit description of Unsub. He appeared to be a person of very limited education. He was poorly dressed and appeared to be a man with little or no regard for personal hygiene. He advised that he recalls he was in Shepherdsville, Kentucky last Thursday, remembering that it raimed in the morning and he picked up garbage in the evening.

This memo contained information concerning ANDREW JAFFE, a reporter for "Newsweek" who contacted the Memphis FBI Office on 4/8/68 advising that he had picked up information re RODNEY W. LINK, who was reported missing on the evening of 4/4/68. JAFFE indicated at this time that he suspected LINK of being involved in captioned murder although he gave no reason for this suspicion.

On 4/10/68, SA FITZPATRICK and Lt. GEORGE DANDRIDGE, Homicide Division, Memphis PD, contacted LINK's employer, DONALD G. O'dell, at the Glenn Allen Company, 300 Poplar Avenue, Memphis.

O'DELL advised that on 4/4/68, LINK reported to work at the company at approximately 8:30 A.M. and remained on the job all day until 6:30 P.M., except for a period at approximately 1 P.M. when LINK went to lunch. O'DELL advised that LINK was with him all day and in his immediate presence in the company, and that this fact was substantiated by other employees at the company. O'DELL advised that LINK contacted him on 4/6/68 at approximately 4 P.M. telling him that he was at his residence.

O'DELL advised that in his association with LINK, he has always known him to be a fine person and does not consider him to have a propensity for violence and does not consider him a suspect in the KING assassination.

CROWDER advised that LINK delivered some beer to his bar and stayed with him at his home until Saturday, 4/6/68.

CROWDER advised he is a flight engineer for Trans World Airlines and that he flew to New York on 4/5/68 thereafter flying to Frankfurt, Germany, on Friday night, 4/5/68, aboard flight #740 out of New York City.

Mrs. WARREN C. CROWDER, same address, verified LINK's presence at the CROWDER residence on 4/4/68, 4/5/68, and until approximately 2 P.M. of 4/6/68.

ERNEST JOSEPH BARRASSO, 2081 Cabana Circle South, Apartment 6, Memphis, advised SA FITZPATRICK and Lt. DANDRIDGE that he is the owner and operator of the Club Caesar located at Poplar and Crosstown. BARRASSO advised that LINK came to this club at approximately 7 P.M., 4/4/68, and thereafter was in BARRASSO's presence until approximately 8:30 or 9 P.M., 4/4/68. BARRASSO advised that LINK was driving a 1965 Chevrolet panel truck and he and LINK went by the Glenn Alen Company and thereafter rode down Main Street turning onto Third Street and then returned to the club at approximately 8 P.M.

RODNEY LINK, 3535 Stuart Road, Memphis, phone 324-1087, was interviewed by SA FITZPATRICK and Lt. DANDRIDGE at which time he furnished the following information.

LINK advised that he reported to work at the Glenn Allen Company on 4/4/68 at approximately 8:15 or 8:30 A.M. LINK advised that he stayed at work all day except at about 1 P.M. he left to go to lunch. LINK advised that he left work at 6:30 P.M. and went to Club Caesar and met with a person named ERNIE BARRASSO.

LINK advised that he and BARRASSO drove from the club to the Glenn Allen Company and thereafter went to Main Street turning onto Third Street and then returned to the club at approximately 7:30 to 8 P.M.

LINK advised that while at the club he was in possession of two rifles, one a 30-caliber semi-automatic carbine and the other a 30-30 Marlin rifle which he stated he brought there in the event the Negroes attempted to break into the Glenn Allen Company or Club Caesar.

LINK advised that at approximately 9 P.M. or 10 P.M., he went to the Sundowner Bar located at Cooper Street and met his friends, Mr. and Mrs. WARREN CROWDER, owner and operator of the Sundowner. LINK advised that he stayed with the CROWDERs all night 4/4/68 and thereafter stayed with Mrs. CROWDER and a girl named DORIS GRIFFIN until Saturday, 4/6/68, until about 2 P.M.

LINK advised that he returned home to his wife at 2 P.M. or around that time on 4/6/68 and thereafter left his residence about 6 P.M. to spend the weekend with his mother, Mrs. BLONDELL BROWN, Route 1, Dyersburg, Tennessee, phone 285-8157. LINK advised he left his mother's home at 6 P.M., 4/7/68, returned to his home, and thereafter reported to work on 4/8/68 at approximately 8 A.M.

LINK advised that he learned on 4/8/68 that a person who identified himself as ANDREW JAFFE and two other persons were at his home taking photos and appeared to be looking into his house and generally trespassing on his property. LINK advised that JAFFE asked him questions concerning his whereabouts and he stated he told JAFFE to mind his own business and to get off his property. He stated JAFFE accused him of being involved in the KING assassination and he subsequently told JAFFE he would not furnish him any information at all concerning his whereabouts on 4/4, 4/5, and 4/6/68.

LINK advised he had nothing to do with the KING murder and stated he has never been involved with any groups known to have a propensity for violence nor has he known any persons to have had a propensity for violence. LINK strongly denied having any knowledge concerning the KING murder and stated he had no idea why JAFFE would accuse him of being involved in the KING murder.
