Since he received a twelve-day leave, starting March 29, 1968. He stated he had visited his family at 3509 Mary Ellen, North East (Court), Albuquerque, New Mexico.

DAYHOFF was described as a white male, age 20, 140 pounds, fair complexion, brown hair, and black eyes.

DAYHOFF was released to military authorities by the Murfreesboro Police Department later on April 10, 1968.

According to PURDY, TATE has just recently terminated employment with this individual but she would not give PURDY his name. PURDY advised that TATE told him that this man had tried to make a bet with her that KING would not leave Memphis alive. PURDY had no further information but stated that TATE could identify this individual and possibly furnish additional information.

On the late afternoon of 4/9/68, Lt. E. H. ARKIN, Inspectional Bureau, Memphis PD, personally brought to SA WILLIAM H. LAWRENCE the original of an anonymous hand-printed note, undated, no return address, which was received in an envelope postmarked Chicago, Illinois, April 7, bearing no return address, but addressed to Miss BARBARA PARKER 2417 Blue Road, Memphis, Tennessee. The text of the note reads: "The men you want for the death of King is Artis Parker of 3410 Renault St Memphis The gun belongs to John Feltman 790 Dolan Rd They both have white cars."

Lt. ARKIN advised that Miss PARKER had called the PD and a squad car was sent to pick up the letter on the late afternoon of April 9. Miss PARKER allegedly told the officers that she had no idea as to who may have sent the note and did not know ARTIS PARKER or FELTMAN. She pointed out that she, the children, and possibly others had handled the envelope and there was little likelihood any fingerprints of value could be obtained. The original of the note and envelope are being retained in the 1-A section of instant file.

She has been employed as a PBX operator at the Sheraton-Crest Hotel, Austin, Texas. An individual named JOHN WILLARD has registered in that hotel on at least two occasions. registration card reflects that JOHN WILLARD is from Charleston, South Carolina, and that he is a Revlon representative. He was at the hotel approximately two months ago. Whide at the hotel he received "strange" telephone calls.

Mrs. SLACK was apprehensive about furnishing the information about WILLARD to a local Agent and wanted to know if she could trust them. She was informed she could trust any FBI Agent. She stated that most of the people in that area are racists and that they laugh at her for taking up for President JOHNSON.

Among her comments is the fact that while WILLARD was in the hotel, Mrs. SLACK's recollection is to the effect that he received telephone calls from Memphis.

Before I could ask additional questions, she stated she could not afford a telephone call. I informed her an Agent from the San Antonio Office would get in touch with her.

Mr. ROSALIE STELL, Innkeeper, Holiday Inn Motel, Williston, Florida, advised that her records reflect that ALVIN FRENCH, first checked in at that motel on February 29, 1968, and left on March 5, 1968. She stated that FRENCH's present whereabouts are believed to be Memphis, Tennessee, where he was staying at the Holiday Inn, Southeast Memphis, Tennessee, U. S. Highway 78. She stated that she has in her possession a Holidax (a teletype used by the Holiday Inns) from the Holiday Inn, Southeast Memphis, advising that they had a DICK T. FRENCH registered there at this time and that FRENCH had registered there on March 30, 1968. She further stated that this Holidex indicated that it was the only FRENCH at that motel in either the months, March or April.

She further stated that FRENCH appeared to have a liking for her desk clerk, GLORIA GEIGER, but that they were absolutely not romantically connected. She stated that Miss GEIGER had never given FRENCH any indication of any affection for him but that FRENCH appeared to have an attraction for her.

STELL further stated that FRENCH unexpectedly appeared on March 30th, asking for GEIGER, but due to the fact that GEIGER was not working, left and that he has not been seen since.

Gent lemen:

This is the third letter to you giving possible clues to the Martin Luther King slaying.

Since Charles G. Adams took Martin Luther King's pulpit in Atlanta, Georgia for the whole week before King was slain, it seems he, Adams, should be questioned as to who appointed him to run the revival and under what conditions; he should also be questioned as to any confidences he may have entered into with the officers of Dr. King's church (many times the deacons and trustees do confide in a visiting minister against the pastor); (Adams had a way of trying to root greater men than himself out of their positions).

It would be very wise to question the tenor of things during his schedule with Martin Luther King's church in Atlanta last week, to determine if Adams did any secret deals with King's membership. Adams likes to place his friends in big churches, especially from Harvard and who knows if they are not paying him large sums of money for such pastoral placements?

Adams actually wants rulership, and sponsors more racism than Christian doctrine. He staged a march against the Police Dept. in Dorchester, Mass about two years ago.

Now he is presently fooling his illiterate congregation with the idea of building a Concord Towers for \$30,000. He keeps them raising money, but with no results. When this \$30,000 is raised he will in all probability give them a reason why he cannot go through with it.

He may keep his monies deposited in Detroit, Mich. his home town, where he spends the summer every year. He has found that his Harvard Masters Degree helps him to fool and fleece the unlearned Negro people, so he keeps them jumping.

He knew he was against Dr. King, and yet took his pulpit last week.

He has invited Martin Luther King's father here to speak in his church next month, just as a drawing card for money purposes. Just as he posted the title Truman Capete's IN COID BLOOD,

Gentlemen:

If you will study very carefully this list of Baptist Officers who were closely associated with Martin Luther King you will find the names of two who should be questioned very carefully.

These are preachers who pulled out from the regular National Baptist Convention and organized a convention of their own, but could not rule Martin Luther King when it came to staging marches. After this convention about two or three years ago, Charles G. Adams, historian, on the list of officers came back to Concorn Baptist Church here in Boston and started to poison the minds of his members against Martin Luther King and the way he staged his marches. This list also includes a very close friend of Adams who is a judge in the courts of Memphis, Tennessee, namely, Judge B. Hooks (you will see his name also on the enclosed list of officers) who did not agree with King and his marches. They wanted to help control the marches, but it seems King would not accept their arguments.

This same Charles G. Adams of Concord Baptist of Boston has just finished a week's revival in Martin Luther King's church in Atlanta, but he was not King's friend. There was also some strife over King's manner of doing things. They contended that King was staging marches against the hands that fed them, etc.

I really do not think you could make a mistake by questioning both this Judge B. Hooks of the Memphis Courts and this UU - 1987 Sub R-188 Charles G. Adams of Boston who preached in Kingis church the week before he was killed. They did much to know the many ner of staging marches.

These officers not only pulled out from the regular convention but pulled out from the publishing company and started publishing their own literature. There has always been the most sitter strife in these National Baptists Conventions.

Re Bureau letter 4/10/68, which cheldsed copies of three letters to the Bureau from SARA F. JONES, one dated 4/5/68 and two dated 4/6/68.

During unsuccessful attempts to locate Mrs. JONES at her current address, 123 Pembroke St., Boston, Mass., on 4/11/68, Mr. and Mrs. BRUNO SALVATORE, who operate a small grocery store at 202 Warren Ave., Boston, volunteered information that they have been acquainted with Mrs. JONES for many years. They described Mrs. JONES as a chronic complainer and a religious fanatic. According to Mr. and Mrs. SALVATORE, Mrs. JONES has been seen walking barefoot in the winter snow and has clamed to have had conversations with God on several occasions. Mr. SALVATORE stated that on one occasion, Mrs. JONES deliberately plugged up her own drain and then made a number of herself complaining to the Boston Sewer Department and various other city officials.

On 4/12/68, after telephonic contact was made with Mrs. JONES, she was interviewed at the Boston Office of the FBI. Her letters were acknowledged and it was suggested to her that in the interests of convenience and expedience, she may wish to contact the Boston Office directly in the event

she has any additional information to furnish. She stated that she directed a fourth letter recently to the Bureau, dealing with the same subject matter as the previous three letters.

During the interview with Mrs. JONES, she made the same allegations as were contained in her letters concerning CHARLES G. ADAMS of the Concord Baptist Church of Boston and Judge B. HOOKS of Memphis, Tenn. Repeated attempts were made during the interview to pin her down for specifics and for any concrete bases for her allegations but without success. When pressed for specifics, she continually revered to the same information contained in her letters and could furnish no additional information. Her answers to questions were rambling, incoherent and not responsive. She frequently changed the subject to dwell upon her employment experience during World War II when she was connected with the Office of Price Administration and the Veterans Affairs Office in Chicago, Ill.

After it became evident that no pertinent information of value could be obtained from Mrs. JONES, the interview was terminated.

Boston files reflect that Mrs. JONES was a victimcomplainant in a civil rights-election laws matter in 1964,
the details of which are contained in Boston airtel and
letterhead memorandum to the Bureau dated 11/18/64, captioned,
"UNSUB; SARAH F. JONES - VICTIM; CR - ELECTION LAWS," Bureau
file unknown.

In that matter, Mrs. JONES directed a letter to the Bureau in which she alleged police brutality at the time she was voting on election day, stating that police knocked her out of the polling place, that the election commissioner stood behind this brutality and that her vote was not counted. When Mrs. JONES was interviewed in connection with that matter, she appeared to be extremely irrational and it was evident that her difficulty stemmed from her failure to comply with election law regulations. It appeared that the alleged force used by the police was only used to remove her from the voting area where she was apparently creating a scene.

During the course of that investigation. Superintendent EWING A. FLU, Station A. V. S. Post Office, Boston, Mass., advised that Mrs. JONES was well known to him because she had submitted numerous edmplaints to his office, both in person and by mail. He stated that her complaints generally consisted of charges of other people having opened her mail or were stealing her mail. According to FLU, Mrs. JONES had also complained about heading obscene language spoken by the men who work behind the P. O. boxes and that her most recent complaint was that she had written a letter to the Mayor of Boston with a return receipt requested and had not received the return receipt. She also accused someone in the Post Office of having stolen her letter. Superintendent FLU described Mrs. JONES as a very eccentric person who is continually issuing complaints about every subject possible.

It is noted that Boston files contain no pertinent information concerning CHARLES G. ADAMS or Judge B. HOOKS.

In view of the above information, no further investigation is being conducted concerning the information furnished by Mrs. JONES, UACB.




