DEWEESE said he had last worked as a stockroom man for Samsonite Corporation, 1050 South Broadway, Denver, Colorado. His check number was 15370, and he possessed a payroll slip which showed he was paid for the week ending 3/3/68. He said that he left Denver en route to Florida; stopped by Houston, Texas; then to New Orleans; then Mobile, Then he went to Jacksonville, Florida. He said he left Denver on 3/2/68. He said he left on a Saturday of the last week he worked. He indicated that the work week at Samsonite ended on Sunday. He said he was married to MARTHA E. BROWN, a widow with two children, and that they were at the Lanier Road address in Jacksonville, Florida. He said he was unemployed at the time and that he had obtained his USCG Merchant Seaman's papers and was attempting to catch a ship out. He said he was a member of the National Maritime Union (NMU), and he was told in Jacksonville that it would be easier to catch a ship through the Norfolk NMU than the Jacksonville NMU. He also advised he took a round

trip to Baltimore and remained in Baltimore two days staying at the Roosevelt Hotel. That was between the time he arrived in Jacksonville, Florida, and the date he got married, which was 3/18/68. He indicated further that he traveled to Baltimore in his personally-owned automobile, a 1956 Chrysler New Yorker. He also stated that he stayed in Jacksonville, Florida, until Saturday, 4/6/68, at 4:15 PM, when he caught a bus from Jacksonville to Newport News, Virginia, arriving in Newport News on 4/7/68. He indicated he came to Richmond and then transferred to Newport News.

He possessed a card which indicated that he registered in the NMU Hall, Norfolk, Virginia, at 9:04 AM, 4/8/68. He said that when he arrived in Newport News on 4/7/68, he went to his sister's house and stayed with her and her husband, CHARLES H. JONES, 735 Westward Avenue, Hampton, Virginia.

He was observed smoking incessantly, and he said he had been smoking Winston cigarettes for many years. He was observed to have blue eyes and brown hair with a crewcut, which he said he had been wearing since he was 21 years old.

He was very emphatic and positive he had not been in Memphis, Nashville, Birmingham or vicinity during the latter part of March or first part of April, 1968. He was specifically asked if he had been in Birmingham on 3/28 - 30/68, which he indicated he had not. He was also asked about his whereabouts on 4/4/68. He claimed he was in Jacksonville, Florida, during these pertinent periods. He said he was staying with his wife and their two children (his wife's children by another marriage). He said he had never been in Birmingham to his knowledge, and he went to Memphis one time several years ago.

He had in his possession a Navy identification card which indicated that he, MARVIN RAYMOND DEWEESE, was retired from the U. S. Navy on 7/9/65. He also had a Merchant Mariner's Permit Identification Card Number description was: brown hair; blue eyes; 6'; 200 pounds; born Narrows, Virginia; address - 1730 Merivale Road, Jacksonville, Florida.

REGGIE SMITH, cameraman, Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS), Atlanta, Georgia, telephonically contacted SA JAMES O. INGRAM on April 12, 1968. He stated he had just arrived in Atlanta upon instructions issued by officials of CBS. The news media is presently carrying headlines indicating that ERIC STARVO GALT is a prime suspect in the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. at Memphis, Tennessee. A white Mustang registered to GALT was found in Atlanta, on April 11, 1968, abandoned. Through news media, SMITH has obtained description of GALT and believes he has information which could be of value to the FBI. He furnished the following information:

On Saturday, April 6, 1968, he and his soundman, LEROY COLLINS, traveled to Spelman College, Atlanta, Georgia, to film persons viewing the body of Dr. KING, or incidents. The first roll of film that he shot was of a group of about ten people. There was one lone white male who viewed the body in this first group and he and his soundman, COLLINS, noticed the unknown male pass by the coffin and smile. He appeared to laugh, looked around to see if anyone was observing him, and he left "with a smile on his face." SMITH did not consider the incident of any value at that time, until he reviewed the information on GALT and GALT's description.

He described the unknown subject who viewed the body of KING as a white male, in his early thirties, 5' 10" to 5' 11", weight 160 - 170 pounds, dark hair, and was wearing a light-colored suit. SMITH suggested that the FBI may desire to review his first can of sixteen





Dear Inspector:

As a person with medical experience in psychiatric clinics, I am writing to suggest you examine the statements of the Mr. -?- Q. Stevens who was interviewed on TV concerning the death of Martin Luther King. My impression was that this was a man who was very ill emotionally.

Specifically I would point to his description of the killer as having a receding hairline when he himself most prominently fitted this description. Also his statement describing the suit of the fleeing killer as "coal Black" possessed far too much emotion for him to be describing a suit, and seemed to indicate his own hatred of the Negros.

I feel it is urgent to give you this humble opinion since Dr. King's killer is not identified yet, and since this man could well represent the classic pathological killer. I hope this suggestion will receive considered attention.

(On the other hand, if your leads are definite regarding another suspect, I regret any delay I may have caused.)

On 2/7/69, ME 338-R advised that the petty cash treasurer of the Invaders, an elderly Negro man, about 55 years of age, white headed, named JAMES PEGUES, has a 1964 or 1965 blue Pontiac, four-door sedan, bearing license BK-5893, that he is the same one who was with the Invaders during the night of 11/25 and early morning of 11/26/68 when they, along with Students for a Democratic Society, took over the Administration Building of LeMoyns-Owen College, supporting a student series of demands.

Informant is trying to talk with PEGUES to determine what makes him tick and determine why am older man such as he would spend so much time with the Invaders, but thus far has been unable to get any real rapport with him.

Informant advised that a night or so before the meeting was held, probably the night of 2/5/69, the group consisting of Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Committee on Move For Equality (COME) and Invaders to plan a celebration of some sort on 4/4/69 which will be the first anniversary date of the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., at the Lorraine Motel, this meeting was held at the Minimum Salary Building, a cross section of white and black leaders were present. ROY LEE TURKS represented the Invaders, TAYLOR BLAIR, organizer of the International Brotherhood

of Electrical Workers, which is trying to organize the blue collar workers at the Memphis, Light, Gas and Water Division was there.

Details have not yet been effected and it is undetermined as just what will take place on 4/4/69.

Invader CLIFFORD LOUIS TAYLOR, currently in jail on a charge of the shotgum shooting of an alleged suitor of his wife, is desperately trying to get out on bond.

Another former active Invader, DON NEELY, who is AWOL from the U. S. Army, is still working the Beale Street area. He figures he will be arrested momentarily. He has grown a beard.

Amother former Invader, REUBEN WATTS and EDWARD REED TAYLOR, brother of CLIFFORD LOUIS TAYLOR, hang out on Beale Street. They have not recently engaged in any Invaders activity.

REUBEN WATTS indicated that he is writing a book although he did not elaborate.

The Memphis private investigator RENFRO TURNER HAYS who allegedly did some investigation on behalf of the first attorney of JAMES EARL RAY, indicted killer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., namely Attorney HAYNES of Birmingham, Alabama, may be preparing to write a book concerning his experiences in investigating the death of KING. He has been talking to BILL SARTER or SARTOR of Greenville, Mississippi, white male, who has done free-lance writing for Time magazine and Life magazine and RENFRO HAYS has gone to New York City to see about having a story published.

ROY LEE TURKS and MAURICE LEWIS, both Invaders, have recently stated that they are about to hook up with the Memphis Branch NAACP youth council and that the youth council may take them to Atlanta, Georgia, to some regional youth council meeting. Informant pointed out that TURKS and LEWIS are primarily interested in trying to "con" money from the NAACP and are not sincerely interested in the NAACP program.

ME 157-1067

Informant advised that BAXTON BRYANT, Executive Secretary of the Temmessee Council on Human Relations. a White male, red headed, has been in town. He claims that he is investigating the fact that am alleged white landlord told some white girls. living in a Negro meighborhood that they had too mamy Negro visitors and would have to move. Another case in which BRYANT is interested is the fact that the woman who works for the Dryfus Jewelry Company, a blond, who has been so active in interracial activities and who was with the Invaders and other groups at the Lorraine Motel during the demonstrations during the Spring of 1968, and who has a son who wears steel-rimmed glasses and who frequents the Southern Christian Leadership Conference youth choirs in Memphis, is also involved in alleged housing discrimination. This woman, whose mame may be Mrs. DOCKERY (phometic), stated that her som used to attend Messick High School, that she lives near Memphis State University in an apartment, that some of the meighbors are bring pressure on the landlord because she has so many Negro visitors at her home.

The picture of her son is depicted in the photograph of JANES BEVEL when BEVEL held his news conference in Memphis, the night 1/23/69, at Clayborne Temple. The lad is with two Negro girls from the SCLC who were interviewing BEVEL during the time that he made his public charge that JAMES EARL RAY was not guilty of the killing of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

JUANITA MILLER, an Invaderette, is the one who got up the money for JOHN CHARLES SMITH's bond when he was arrested 1/28/69, on the charge of disorderly conduct. She claims that she is in love with JOHN CHARLES, that she is now going to a trade school on North Cleveland, being sponsored by the Temmessee Department of Public Welfare.

Some of the Invaders sold leaflets of the Invaders at the recent DUKE ELLINGTON guest appearance with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra at the Ellis Auditorium.

JAMES NORMAN, a young Invader and JOE LEE BURNS, JR., aka KING JEWEL, both of whom are young thugs, recently broke a window out at the Blue Stallion Night Club on Beale Street and later got into a fight and broke out a window at the Invaders Headquarters, 271 Vance.

CACHEATUH SMITH, secretary of the Invaders, claims that she is now pregnant, that the father of her child to be, is LANCE SWEET WILLIE WINE WATSON, who is currently in Shelby County Jail. She claims that she is in love with WATSON. CACHEATUH SMITH still hopes to have 1,000 copies of a slick photograph, 8x10 inches in size of LANCE SWEET WILLIE WINE WATSON taken with a clinched raised fist which the Invaders will sell in an effort to make his peace bond. They will sell these photographs for \$1. She has made a \$50 deposit, still owes approximately \$72 and cannot get the pictures until the \$72 is paid.

WICHAEL MOUNTAIN, who spends considerable time with the Invaders and who recently indicated that he was through with the Invaders, but reversed his field when he marched with them during the 1/23/69 National Council of Churches MARTIN LUTHER KING Memorial March. He stated that he is going to St. Louis to live. He did not elaborate.

On 4/17/68 Miss REBECCA FORD, Credit Bureau of Nashville, Tenn., advised her office records reflect that AMSELL A. COLEBROOK, wife GEORGIA, resides at Osborn Road, Arrington, Tenn. His employment is listed as A. A. Alexander Inc., Brentwood, Tenn., a real estate firm. She stated that in 1960 COLEBROOK's employment was listed as Colebrook and Associates, and in November 1962, COLEBROOK went through bankruptcy proceedings owing \$45,268.09. She said this was subsequently cleared. She stated an inquiry concerning COLEBROOK was made on 4/11/68 by the First American National Bank, Nashville. Her records indicate COLEBROOK was from 26 to 28 years of age in 1947.

On 4/17/68 Miss SARA GILMORE, First American National Bank, advised that A. A. COLEBROOK telephoned the bank on 4/10/68 and required regarding a home improvement loan in the amount of \$5,000. She stated her records list COLEBROOK's address as Osborn Road, Arrington, Tenn.

On 4/17/68 Mrs. A. A. COLEBROOK, Osborn Road, Arrington, Tenn., advised her husband is in the real estate business and is 43 years of age. She stated that in 1966 her husband purchased a 1961 Corvair which he then drove to Mexico. ME 44-1987 in 1966 he purchased an old beat-up Corvair for \$150. He proceeded to drive this automobile to Mexico. He spoke with a Mr. SANTOS at the American Embassy in Mexico City, Mexico, and was advised that he would have to get permission to have the car impounded by the Mexican Government. According to COLEBROOK, the car was impounded by the Mexican Government and was left in a Government pound in the outskirts of Guadalajara, Mexico.
