JN 23-R (PROB) advised on 11/16/64 that at a state-wide meeting of the WKKKKOM near Harrisville, Miss. on 11/16/64 SAM BOWERS was asked by an unknown Klansman why MARTIN LUTHER KING was not killed when he came to Miss. during the Summer of 1964. BOWERS allegedly replied that two men came to him who claimed they were good with a rifle and wanted his approval to take care of KING. BOWERS stated at this particular meeting that he gave these two men strict orders not to take any chances whatsoever and added that these two men never returned and he heard no more concerning this matter.

On 11/16/64 JN 55-R (PROB) advised that during the same state meeting as set forth above, some individuals reported that MARTIN LUTHER KING had expected to come to Mc Comb, Miss. on Monday, 11/16/64 and that all business places in Mc Comb would be tested by integrationists on that date. Someone remarked that something should be done about this and SAM BOWERS stated that when MARTIN LUTHER KING last toured the State of Miss., two men were assigned with high-powered rifles to take care of KING, but plans went amiss when KING took a route other than the one he was supposed to. BOWERS stated that these two men are working on this matter. He did not identify the two men.

On 4/30/68 JN 23-R (PROB) was located and interviewed. He could add nothing further to the information he furnished on 11/16/64.

On 5/1/68 JN 55-R (PROB) reported that he had nothing additional concerning the above incident.

JN 55-R (PROB) was contacted during the evening of 4/4/68 immediately after the assassination of KING and he had no information of value at that time.

Other incidents summarized in referenced airtel are being investigated, where possible, to determine if any persons concerned implicated in anyway with KING's death.

Referenced teletype sets forth information from Sergeant ROBERT R. ELDRIDGE, AFS, Charleston, South Carolina, (CONCEAL IDENTITY) wherein ELDRIDGE states he was stationed at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi, prior to September, 1967, and did business at Fernwood Texaco Station in Biloxi, Mississippi.

He advised that the owner of the station was WAYNE RODGERS and that one of RODGERS's employees, a white male, 40 to 50 years old, was heard to state many times that he knew of a man that would pay a large sum of money for someone to kill KING.

Investigation at Biloxi, Mississippi, disclosed the following:

LOWELL WAYNE ROGERS, Owner, Ferawood Texaco Service Station, located and interviewed and states that prior to September 1967, he and WOODY PRINGLE were partners in the

Fernwood Texas Station and that during that period of time, in addition to himself and PRINGLE, an individual identified as THOMAS MOODY, a white male, age approximately 44, and JOE SWANIER, a Negro male, approximately 28, were employed at the station.

ROGERS advised that he has never heard either PRINGLE or MOODY make any comment which could be construed to indicate that either of them was aware of an individual who would pay a great sum of money to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. ROGERS advised that he has never made suchea comment himself.

ROGERS advised that at the present time PRINGLE, MOODY, and SWAINER were working at the Fernwood Service Station, Biloxi, Mississippi. He said that to the best of his knowledge neither MOODY nor PRINGLE were particularly opposed to the civil rights movement and are not known to have ever been members of any organization opposed to the civil rights movement.

THOMAS BLOUNT MOODY was interviewed at Biloxi, Mississippi, on 4/26/68. He advised that to the best of his recollection he never made the comment to anyone indicating that he knew anyone who would be willing to pay a/large sum of money to see that Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was killed. MOODY indicated that he is not opposed to the civil rights movement although he did not feel that the methods employed by certain civil rights leaders, including Doctor KING, were in the best interest of the country. He indicated that he regretted that Doctor KING had been murdered and felt that it was a tragedy for the nation. MOODY vehemently denied that he has made such a statement concerning the murder of KING. He stated that on occasion when he drinks he might make a statement of this type just to show off. He indicated that if such a statement was made, it was certainly no basis for it in fact.

WOODROW W. PRINGLE, JR., was interviewed at Biloxi. Mississippi on April 27, 1968.

PRINGLE stated that he has been acquainted with MOODY for several years and considers MOODY to be an honest, trustworthy individual. In the years that he has known MOODY, he stated he has never heard MOODY make any statement which might indicate that he was violently opposed to the civil rights movement in this country. Specifically, PRINGLE stated he has never heard MOODY make any type of comment which could be construed to indicate that MOODY knew of an individual who would pay a large sum of money to have Doctor KING killed. He stated to the best of his knowledge MOODY has never been a member of any Klan or hate-type organization and has never shown a propensity for violence in regard to the civil rights movement.

JOSEPH (NMN) SWAINER was interviewed at Biloxi, Mississippi, on April 27, 1968.

SWAINER, a male Negro, advised that prior to September, 1967, he was employed by ROGERS and PRINGLE at the Fernwood Texaco Service Station. During this period of time he worked with an individual named THOMAS MOODY, and he indicated he thought he was very well acquainted with MOODY. He said he never heard MOODY make any type of comment which might indicate MOODY was aware of an individual who would pay a large sum of money to see MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., killed.

SWAINER said he has no reason to believe that MOODY is now or ever has been a member of any Klan or hate-type organization.

All of the above investigation was conducted by SA PAUL A. MEISSNER, JR.

Inasmuch as the above investigation is purely negative, FD 302s containing description and background information are being retained at Jackson.

Subject: INVESTIGATION OF DR. KING'S ASSASSIN, RE: GALT-RAY.

My Dear Mr. Hoover:

I wish to inform you that I have some very 'hot' leads on your 11th most wanted man, James Earl Ray; alias Eric Starvo Galt, John Willard, Harvy Lowmyer and obviously many others.

I do not believe that this man you are really searching for is the true assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who was gunned down in Memphis, Tennessee on the evening of April 4, 1988. It is quite possible he may be connected with a conspiracy plot of which was well planned some time prior to the shooting.

Here are some detailed pointers that have puzzled me in many ways:

- 1. In the first place when Attorney General Clark went to Memphis after King was slain immediately said there was no conspiracy involved. Later on Galt was charged in conspiring to King's death by a single rifle shot.
- 2. It was reported that Ray was in the Missouri State Prison during the years of 1964-65. Remember at this same time Galt was taking dancing lessons in New Orleans, Louisiana.
- 3. How about the true age of the suspect? I believe witnesses at the Lorraine Motel estimated his age at around 25 to 30. Your office in issuing the warrent for Galt gave his date of birth as \_\_\_\_\_\_. My calculation by this account would say that he is now 36 years of age. On Friday, April 19, 1968 your headquarters announced he was 40.
- 4. I have through good sources discovered that Ray was very careless and did not give much of a 'hoot' about his appearances. On the other hand Galt tried his very best to appear very neat and well dressed at all times.
- 5. Also Galt was quite fond of beer and vodka while Ray was non-drinker.
- 6. Last but not least Ray was born in Alton, Illinois with obviously no Southern accent wherefore Galt was noted as quite Southern and loved his good ole' Hill-Billy music.

In order that I will be able to conduct a proper investigation that may perhaps lead to the apprehension and arrest of this 'dangerous criminal', I must first have full authority in the form of a Commission issued by your Department or the President of the United States. It must be necessary that I have a proper permit to carry a weapon as authorized for Special Investigators in such cases. I will further need a clear photo (front and side view) of the suspect.

My commission was denied by the Metropolitian Police Department over two (2) years ago. I have written several letters to Chief of Police Layton, Director of Safety Murphy, D. C. Mayor Washington, U. S. President Johnson along with many other high officials. I failed to receive any response whatsoever in most cases. In other words I have not been properly informed as to the reason why my commission is being denied in this instance.

Many times within the past Mr. Hoover, I have had the opportunity to help in the apprehension of criminals, but without the authority, I am more or less just like the other average citizens, "I do not care to get involved".

Another point I would like to mention here if I may; I do not approve of the "Poor Peoples Campaign March" on Washington early in May. Although it is intended as non-violent, it is quite evident that we will witness a lot more looting, rioting and burning. I herewith predict that the worse will come to happen around Monday, May 13, 1968, the week after "MOTHER'S DAY".

If something isn't soon done in order to combat crime and disorder within our cities, we are heading for one of the worse revolutions of our time. The so called Militant leaders are teaching (behind closed doors) their followers just how they can win by breaking law and order. They must be purnished for the crimes they have committed regardless of the cost.

I honestly believe Mr. Hoover, you and your staff of some 6,000 Special Agents are doing a magnificent job. This is one great reason I would be highly honored to work with you.

I will be expecting a prompt answer along with my Official Credentials before it is too late.

I thank you Mr. Hoover.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I regret to report that my letter of April 22, 1968 has not been acknowledged either by you or your agency.

Due to the fact I did not receive your proper authorization to investigate on behalf to the suspected assassin of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. it is now without doubt whatsoever entirely too late to retrace the true evidence before me sometime ago.

If I may, I wish to reiterate my statement in more complete detail sent to you, but obviously ignored: On Thursday April 18th 1968 at approximately 6:40 P.M. I personally met and passed a man bearing almost idental description to the one released by your office on Galt-Ray. I was quite shocked at this encounter. I continued to walk down this street for almost a block. I decided to turn around and see if I could further proove to myself that this was really the "wanted man". Lo and behold, I again met him coming in the opposite direction than seven minutes previously. He was dressed very neatly and was carrying a black brief case under his arm. He even looked worried at this instance. I kept him under surveylance until he disappeared into a new apartment building. I wanted to follow the man, and also make an inquiry at the apartment house, but I have no police or other authority to investigate, especially criminals of Rays' standing. I came very close to calling your office immediately and making a complete report, but something seemed to tell me that you would only drop the inquest and place me on the list as only; "Another 'nut" trying to get publicity and at the same time misleading the F. B. I. in their investigation".

I have only one more thing to say Mr. Hoover. I absolutely do not have any intention in disgrading your Department in any way whatsoever. I am only offering my sincere services to do all within my limited powers to help in the fight against crime and disorder in our country today.

I honestly believe that all murderers should be scalled in to Notice and properly prosicuted, and there should be no rules of regulations forbiding certain law abiding officers to apprehend them.

I would appreciate your prompt acknowledgement to this important matter regardless of whether you believe in me or not. Someday I hope to proove my report correct.
