Please permit me to refer briefly to the assassination of Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

With regard to the contradictions in the evidence as presented by the FBI concerning JAMES EARL RAY wa. ERIC STARVO GALT as the only subject in this case, and with regard to other mysteries and questions as published, I would like to call your attention to this:

From the first, the information reported which I read seemed to me to be absurd, confused, and, perhaps, "prepared".

Permit me to suggest, or rather, to ask, if you have conducted an appropriate investigation of the man or men who saw the presumed assassin fleeing from the hotel from which the shots were fired.

Also I would like to suggest an inquiry of the hotel owner regarding the truth concerning the income of the suspect, his stay in the hotel, etc., as well as an inquiry regarding the two principal characters who backed him as I believe this will turn up a lead resulting in the apprehension of the criminal.



. . And Struck with a Single Shot

Memphis — The tragedy that was to envelop Memphis and the nation began to enfold on South Main Street on the afternoon of Thursday, April 4.

In a cheap rooming house at 4221/2 S. Main, a stranger about 6 feet tall, with a prominent nose and sandy-to-dark hair, suddenly appeared at the second floor flat of Mrs. Bessie Brewer, the fiftyish work-worn landlady on the premises. It was between 3 and 3:30 p.m.

He was well dressed, but she could not recall much beyond that.

"He wanted to rent a room," she said. Mrs. Brewer showed him a neat, clean room, No. 8, that rented for \$19 a week. It had a stove and refrigerator.

He rejected it. "I don't need a stove and refrigerator," he told her.

Mrs. Brewer showed him a second room in a second building - connected to 4221/2 by a second-floor walkway. It was Room 5B, a tawdry place near the end of a 50-foot corridor, and about 10 feet from the bathroom at the corner of the building.

He barely glanced at the second room, she said. "I'll take it," he told her. She motioned to the bathroom down the hall, "There's the bathroom," she said.

Room 5B had one important difference from Room 8. It had a window which, by leaning

out, one could get a clear view of the Lorraine Motel, where Dr. King was staying.

The bathroom, at a corner of the building, also provided an unobstructed view of Dr. King's quarters, through the sparse branches

Back at her own apartment, she collected \$8.50 from the stranger. ("I alwayscollect in advance"), and the stranger paid with a \$20

She made the receipt in the name he gave her: "John Willard."

That was all. She had no reason to doubt him. He didn't tell her where he came from, where he was going, and it's not necessary to ask needless questions.

She returned to her cooking, and that was the last she saw of "John Willard."

A few minutes after 6 p.m. she heard what she thought was a shot and "somebody hollering." To her husband, Frank, it sounded like a

They rushed to the rear of the rooming house and saw swarms of police at the Lorraine Motel, a half block away. An officer shouted to them, "get back! Get back!" They

Meanwhile, Charlie Q. Stephens, 46, a tuberular pensioner in Room 6B, next to the bathroom, also heard what he thought was a shot. He had been trying to repair his table radio.

He went to the door and, opening it, saw a

carrying "something wrapped in newspapers," Stephens recalled.

Moments later, Guy Canipe, 58, owner of an amusement machine shop at 424 S. Main St., saw a man drop a zipper bag and a long package wrapped in "old green curtains or a bedspread" in the alcove entrance of his shop.

Canipe went out to examine it, and before the police came, he saw that the carton, open at one end, contained a rifle.

Between 20 and 35 police were on the scene, but the man who dropped the package -"John Willard" or anybody else - slipped away down Main Street.

With the zipper bag police found a pair of binoculars purchased in Memphis that day, they said, and a box containing some car-


The shot that had been fired - from a Remington rifle with telescopic sights - traveled 205 feet. 3 inches.

Dr. King had been standing on the balcony of the Lorraine, talking to Ben Branch, a Chicago musician who was to play at a rally that evening, and Solomon Jones, his chauffeur.

"Don't forget to wear your topcoat," Jones. called up to him. "It has turned chill."

At that moment the bullet crashed into Dr. King. He fell backward silently, blood gushing from his neck, as the Rev. Jesse Jackson, an aide, leaped toward him.

Dr. King lay silently, bleeding. At the hospital, minutes later, the doctors said it was too late. He was dead.


