Reference is made to prior communications in the captioned matter, the most recent one being dated June 19, 1968.

Mr. Emory A. Dowling, Jr., son of the owner of Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Inc., 2425 East Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information on August 12, 1968:

Pernell Ezzell recently had his Florida driver's license revoked because he had been involved in an accident some months ago in North Carolina. Ezzell had to terminate his employment with the company as a color TV technician because he was unable to drive a car and his services were not needed on a full time basis in the shop. Because he was unable to do his job in Florida, he went to California to seek employment. At that time, he was not drinking and he was perfectly normal. He had just returned from a trip to North Carolina, where he had gotten his 1965 Buick automobile back from an automobile repair garage.

On Saturday, August 10, 1968, Mr. Dowling had received a long distance telephone call from a manager of a motel in Long Beach, California. He could not recall the manager's name or the identity of the establishment which he represented. The manager inquired as to whether he should cash a check for Pernell Ezzell in the amount of about \$200.00 and he refused to recommend cashing the check. He could not recall the name of the bank on which the check was drawn and he said he did not speak with Ezzell at the time, but he believed he was standing nearby during the telephone call.

Mr. Dowling said that he had no further information concerning Ezzell at this time.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. Fay Ezzell, wife of Pernell Ezzell, 636 22md Street, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell Ezzell had his driver's license revoked for five years by the State of Florida because he had hit a bridge with his 1965 Buick in or near Fayetteville, North Carolina, or Clinton, North Carolina, during his last escapade. He had been charged with driving while intoxicated. Ezzell said that he had paid for the damages to the bridge, but his license was still revoked last week. Mrs. Ezzell said that her husband tried to obtain bench work as a TV technician in the Orlando, Florida, area, but he was unsuccessful, since he had no driver's license and he could not travel throughout the city to do his work. She advised that he left Orlando on Monday, August 5, 1968, for California, in order to seek employment.

On Thursday, August 9, 1968, he called in the middle of the night, saying that he was in Los Angeles. California, working for an aircraft plant and making good money. He did not mention the name of his employer or the location of the aircraft plant. He told his wife that he wanted her and the family to fly out in the near future when he would send money.

On Saturday, August 11, 1968, Ezzell called about 8:00 P.M., saying he was in Los Angeles, California. He remarked to the effect that he had been out of the country and he had just gotten back, therefore, he had not gotten a permanent address. He did not state where he could be reached or the name of his employer. He did not say where he had gone while he was out of the country. Mrs. Ezzell said she is bitter because her husband had run up about a \$1,000.00 debt of his American Express Credit Card during his last escapade and he still has this card. She said that she wanted him to show good faith by supporting her and their child before she would decide whether or not to go to California. Mrs. Ezzell said that she was not certain whether or not Ezzell had been drinking, but she was unable to detect that he was under the influence of alcohol from the sound of his voice on the two occasions on which he made calls. She said that if he does

not help support their child, she will change her telemone number to an unlisted telephone number in the near future to avoid getting telephone calls from her husband in the middle of the night. She explained that she has to go to work very early each day. She said that she did not believe Ezzell's story about being out of the country and that he had possibly utilized the story to cover up for a period during which he had been drunk. She said that she could not believe but very little of any statements that Ezzell made to her and she, therefore, does not question him when he calls her. She said that she has no information as to her husband's exact whereabouts, the identity of his employer, or any of the details or location of the foreign trip that he allegedly made. She said that she did not believe him because he did not previously have a passport and he had not had time to obtain a passport before allegedly going out of the country. She said that she is waiting to see if he shows good faith by sending money for her and their child's support or whether he will go on another escapade and go deeper into financial trouble.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. Mary Smith, Orange County Drivers License Office, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell (no middle name) Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, was issued chauffeur's license number on April 8, 1968. It was ordered revoked for five years by the Department of Public Safety, State of Florida, Tallahassee, Florida, for driving while intoxicated on the third offense within a ten-year period. It became effective May 27, 1968, but the order was not received and executed in Orlando, Florida, until August 6, 1968. The revocation resulted from Ezzell being convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicants in the State of North Carolina. One of his other suspensions of his driver's license was from August 18, 1967, until February 29, 1968, because he forfeited bond in the State of South Carolina, on a charge of driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

Mrs. Smith said that she did not have a record of the third offense pertaining to Ezzell.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. LILA HOEQUIST, Orange County Auto Tag Office, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell Ezzell or Fay Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, obtained Florida automobile license registration number 7W-10531, on May 1, 1968, for a 1965 Buick, two-door sedan, and Florida license 7-1518 on the same date, for a 1966 Chevrolet, two-door sedan. The file contained no additional descriptive information pertaining to these automobiles.

WILLIAM J. WILSON, General Trick Sales, 535 Murfreesboro Boad, Mashville, Tennessee advised as fellows:

Buring May of 1968 he attended a conference of the Matgonal Automobile Dealers Association in Miami Beach, Florida, which was attended by a number of truck dealers throughout the United States. On one evening during this series of meetings he was with a group of individuals including "BUSDY" ANNEX of Fairfield, Connecticut and ARTHUR INVIN of Lima, Ohio. Everyone in this group of some thenty to twenty-five men had been drinking heavily and conversations could only be described as extremely "alcoholic."

On one occasion, "BURDY" JENSEH made some remark to the effect that BUREY MENNEY would never live to become President, if he were neminated and elected, that someone would probably shoot him. JENSEH did not say that he had attended any meeting where this was discussed, nor was any conversation recalled with reference to MARTIN LUTHER KING.

He does not recall any other remarks of JAMAN and does not recall discussing JAMAN'S remarks on a subsequent trip to Jamaica, which he made accompained by other men at the conference.

He paid absolutely no attention to JEMEN'S remark regarding EXHEDY, since he was drinking heavily, as were most of the men at the conference.

He described JEMEN as an "ultra conservative", a loual American, and one who would have no part in the death of MENERY or KING.

ARTHUR IRWIN, 2629 Shoreline Drive, advised that he is the President of the Irwin GMC, Inc., 2320 St. Johns Avenue, Lima, Ohio, and that he had in May, attended a conference of the National Automobile Dealers Association truck meeting at the Americana Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida. He recalled around May 18, 1968, he had attended dinner and at this dinner "BUDDY" JENSEN, GMC truck dealer at Fairfield, Connecticut; FRANK GOODPASTURE, JR., of the Goodpasture Motor Company, Birstol, Virginia; a BILL WILSON of Nashville, Tennessee, and a man from Bristol, Tennessee, attended. stated he could not recall the name of the man from Bristol, Tennessee. Mr. IRWIN said there were about 14 people who sat at a long table at this dinner and that a large number of persons attended the conference at the Hotel. Mr. IRWIN said that he had a place at the table about 4 to 6 persons from "BUDDY" JENSEN. He said he does recall that in general conversation someone, he did not know who made the remark, said something about some group possibly being behind the KING matter.

He stated he could recall no further details. He said he had placed absolutely no significance in this and that these had been quite a bit of drinking going on. Mr. IRWIN said that he has known "BUDDY" JENSEN for about 6 years and he described him as a very reputable man of good reputation. Mr. IRWIN said it was his belieft Mr. JENSON was the type of man who would possibly have rather strong opinions and just go ahead and say something.

Mr. IRWIN said further that during the dinner, someone also made a remark to the effect that after what had happened to JACK, something might happen to BOBBY.
Mr. IRWIN could not recall any specific words, other details, nor could be recall who made this remark.

JOHN A. JENSEN, proprietor, General Motors Service and Truck Company, 386 State Street Extension, Fairfield, Connecticut, advised that he is also known as "BUDDY" JENSEN. He informed that he attended a General Motors truck dealers convention in Miami Beach, Flerida, during mid-May of 1968. He related that one evening during the convention, he participated in a cocktail party and dinner with other General Motors dealers at the Luau Restaurant in Miami Beach. He mentioned among those participating in the party were BILL WILSON, a dealer from Nashville, Tennessee, and his wife; FRANK GOODPASTURE, a dealer from Bristol, Virginia, and his wife; ART IRWIN, a dealer from Lima, Ohio, and his wife; and one Mr. CALLAHAN, a Dodge dealer from Bristol, Tennessee, and his wife. He stated that all were close friends and associates of his, with the exception of Mr. and Mrs. CALLAHAN, whom he met at the convention.

JENSEN related that considerable consumption of intoxicating beverages preceded the dinner party. He specifically asserted having "two large blasts" prior to dinner. He immediately mentioned that he has extrasensory perception, and during the course of the dinner mentioned that he had predicted the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY and Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING. He remarked that his utterances in this regard may have been stupid, but that he had sincerely believed in his ability of extrasensory perception. He also mentioned that he remarked during the dinner party that if Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was nominated and elected President he would also be assassinated.

JENSEN reiterated that this remark was probably stupid on his part, but insisted on his ability toward extrasensory perception and "guesswork."

JENSEN stated that following the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, he was told by friends that Mrs. CALLAHAN, who is pregnant and very emotional, became very upset and in recalling

the party at the Luau Restaurant in Miami Beach, decided to contact the FBI concerning remarks made by JENSEN.

JENSEN repeated his belief of his ability toward extrasensory perception. He asserted that he does not belong to any organizations other than the Kiwanis Club and the General Motors dealers organizations. He specifically denied attending any meetings of any prominent tigures were discussed. He also claimed that during the dinner party at the Luau Restaurant in Miami Beach, he had not mentioned attending any meetings where the assassinations of the Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING and Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been discussed.

JENSEN denied being sympathetic toward or affiliated with any racist, extremist or hate groups. He recalled that he and his wife were the only Northerners at the dinner party at the Luau Restaurant and that the others present were deeply interested in their comments concerning racial matters. He stated that some racial questions were probably discussed and mentioned during the course of the evening; however, he was unable to recall any specific racial topic, other than he may have accused the Southerners of sending all of the Negroes north to create problems here.

JENSEN remarked: "I will probably have to keep my mouth shut. I know it was a stupid thing to say, but I knew all of the rest of the people in the party, with the exception of the CALLAHANS."

JENSEN steadfastly claimed that although his remarks may have sounded stepid, it was his honest belief that his predictions were based on his power of extrasensory perception or "purely guesswork."

TO THE FBI, Atlanta, Ga.

Here is some information I feel you may be interested in and I wish to report it in the hope it will be of value to you, but also hope you will not make my name public.

On the evening of Sunday June 2nd 1968 my niece, husband and children from Illinois came to visit me on their vaccion.

On Monday the next day, June 3rd, they felt too tired from their trip to do much sight seeing around Atlanta, but suggested they would like to go the the airport in the evening to see the Jets come in and take off; a past time enjoyed by many people.

That evening of June 3rd when we walked into the main upper lobby of the airport building about 7 PM Atlanta time, we heard a loud voice coming over the airport loud speaker calling Cerr an o - Corrano. It was repeated several times asking the party tocome to one of the ticket counters. My friend who lives with me looked at me and I at her both thinking what an odd name with both first and last names the came.

We went immediately to the observation platform and enjoyed seeing the children enjoying the sights. As I was seated on one of the benches 3 men pushed by me rather rudely, so I took special notice of them. One, a thin slender, blonde about 5ft5inches long thin face with very light complexion. A second man short about 5ft, round face dark hair but looked american, and a taller man about 5ft 9 thin, dark brown hair and dark skin who looked foreign to me. Their countenances looked evil to me and they seemed to be in a hurry. I jumped up from the bench to find the children not knowing whant 3 men were up to. Then I saw them enter (the 3 men) the inner glassed in portion of the observation platform and pointing towards the Eastern air lines planes. The thought crossed my ming and I wondered whether they were plotting to hi-jack a plane. Then they disappeared.

About ten minutes to 9 PM we left the platform going back thru the main lobby to the parking lot to get our car. Again when we entered the lobby we still heard the name Cerrano Cerrano being called and repeated several times. I kept wondering to mys_elf what was the significance of that name.

The next morning Tuesday June 4th when we heard that Robert Kennedy had been shot by a man whose name was SIRHAN SIRHAN I still could not shake off the feeling of the night before. AT BISBEE, ARIZONA

On August 16, 1968, WALTER BRUMLEY, Post Office Box 552, Bisbee, advised that during the early part of April, 1968, he was in the Cochise County Welfare Office in Bisbee and noticed a poster of JAMES EARL RAY. A few days later, possibly April 6 or 7, 1968, BRUMLEY was standing in front of the Hotel Golden on Main Street, Bisbee, when a man approached and asked him where he could find a place to stay for a short period of time. BRUMLEY suggested the Hotel Golden would provide him a room for less than \$10.00 per week. The stranger left and walked into the hotel and a short while later returned to ask BRUMLEY where he could buy some groceries. BRUMLEY said that after the stranger approached him the second time, he never saw him again.

A couple of days following the above described incidents, it occurred to BRUMLEY that the stranger possessed a certain likeness to the poster of JAMES EARL RAY in the Cochise County Welfare Department. He reported the description of the stranger, along with his impression that he thought this stranger to be JAMES EARL RAY, to Chief of Police ARTHUR KENT. Bisbee Police Department.

BRUMLEY furnished the following description of the individual:

unknown manufacture, bearing red license plates with white figures.

BRUMLEY said he could very easily have made an error in establishing the identity of the stranger as JAMES EARL RAY inasmuch as there was a period of days between the time he had first seen the poster of RAY and when he had been approached by the unknown individual. BRUMLEY stated that he thought that he would direct a letter to the District Attorney General PHIL CANATE, Washington, D. C., in order to clarify the matter in his own mind.

On August 16, 1968, Chief of Police ARTHUR KENT, Bisbee Police Department, advised that he had been notified by WALTER BRUMLEY that the latter had observed someone thought to have fit the description of JAMES EARL RAY. KENT advised that BRUMLEY is a maintenance custodian at the Bisbee High School. is married. and has one daughter, He said BRUMLEY has contacted his office in the past and has been of assistance in providing the Police Department with various information concerning criminal activities in the Bisbee area.

KENT said that BRUMLEY first contacted his department concerning this matter shortly following the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. When BRUMLEY told him the stranger was occupying a room at the Hotel Goldon, KENT stated he had a surveillance placed on the suspect immediately. He advised he had given instructions to his men on the surveillance to pick him up on the slightest infraction of the law in order that the suspect could be to photographed and fingerprinted. The surveillance/accomplish this purpose, although complaints were received from the waitresses at the Bisbee Lunch that the suspect had an evil way of looking at the girls employed there.

Hotel records at the Hotel Golden revealed the suspect's name to be H. J. BLANKENSHIP and he had provided his previous address as Tucson, Arizona.

KENT advised that BLANKENSHIP stayed at the hotel for a period of about ten days and later rented a

run-down home at 1221 Brewery Gulch in Bisbee. BLANKENSHIP stayed at that home until the end of April. KENT said that during April, BLANKENSHIP stayed in the Bisbee area and never developed any male or female associates. No one saw him leave the Bisbee area and he left with his rent paid.

KENT stated that after he and his police force first saw BLANKENSHIP, he discounted the possibility of his being JAMES EARL RAY, inasmuch as he did not fit the description given for RAY on the wanted posters. He said the only reason the Police Department continued the surveillance on BLANKENSHIP was because he looked like a potential trouble-maker and that it appeared he may have had perverse sexual motives. He stated that he has not seen BLANKENSHIP in the Bisbee area since that time.

The following investigation was conducted by SA BARDWELL D. ODUM:

AT DALLAS, TEXAS

On 5/14/68, FELIX MC KMIGHT co-publisher of "The Dallas Times Herald", advised that it appeared to him that the alleged newspaper artist's sketch appeared to have been made by someone who was looking at the photo of the unknown lookalike, both photos furnished by the Baltimore office of the FBI. He advised that BILL ALLER is now employed by the API at Little Rock, Arkansas. He produced the negative from which the close-up was taken. It shows a Dallas Police Officer leading three men followed by another Police Officer away from the front of the Texas School Book Depository.

On 5/15/68, BILL BASS, Identification Division, Dallas PD, identified the officer leading these three men as himself, and stated that on 11/22/63, the date the photo was taken, he, ROY VAUGHM, and MARVIM WISE had found three men in a boxear about a mile from the Texas School Book Depository down the railroad tracks. They brought them to the Dallas County 80 and turned them over to an unknown Deputy Sheriff. He did not know the names of these individuals and did not know if they were booked.

On 5/15/68, officers MARVIN WISE and ROY VAUGHN advised that they could add nothing to the information furnished by BASS, confirmed what he had furnished and advised

they did not know the identity of the Deputy Sheriff or the three men they brought in.

On 5/16/68, JAMES D. KITCHING, Dallas County SO, advised that he is in charge of the Identification Division, and that he had personally looked up the jacket and photo of each person booked on 11/22/63, and did not find anyone who bears a resemblance to the persons appearing in the photo with Dallas policeman BILL BASS. He advised that this indicates that these persons were not booked but they may have been interviewed. He advised that a sort of screening office was operated by the Dallas County SO on 11/22/63, and numerous persons were interviewed. He advised that without the names of the persons it would be almost impossible to develop the name of the persons in the photo.

On 5/17/68, Sheriff BILL DECKER, Dallas County, advised that he does not know who the men are in the photo taken by BILL ALLEN, but that recently this same photo had been shown to him by someone representing JIM AGARRESON, DA, New Orleans, Louisians. He stated he did not know the significance.

On 5/17/68, FELIX MC KWIGHT advised that he had received a telephonic inquiry from the head of the Associated Press in New York, New York, apparently inquiring about this same photo. The AP information had originated from a press release by TRENT GOUGH, a Canadian actor who says he-is connected with the Citizens Coumittee of Inquiry and the Hennedy Assassination Inquiry Committee, 243 West 54th Street, New York.

For the information of Momphis and Baltimore, a photo of the same close-up as that submitted by Baltimore was furnished to SA CHARLES A. BLOSSFIELD on 4/23/68, by AL CHAPMAN, member of the Ku Klux Klam, Ballas, Texas. He declined to say where he got this photo. (See enclosed teletype.)

Momphis mote that instant photo has been given considerable widespread distribution. No further investigation is being conducted re same, in absence of specific instructions from OO.

PERNELL EZZELL was interviewed at the Shreveport, Louisiana, Resident Agency. At the outset of the interview EZZELL was advised of his rights but declined to sign a waiver of same. EZZELL declined to furnish a signed statement but voluntarily furnished the following information:

EZZELL denied that he had received or was ever in possession of a great amount of money as a result of his participation in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING and the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He further denied stating to anyone he was on the payroll of the OSI and CIA.

EZZELL said he definately did not participate in any manner, nor did he have any knowledge of or information concerning the murders of MARTIN LUTHER KING and Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

EZZELL admitted that he was glad KING was dead as he felt KING was a troblemaker, but emphasized that he did not have anything to do with killing him.

EZZELL said he could not remember making any statements to anyone regarding any of the above. He admitted that he may have made them when he was in a drunken condition, but could not recall making any such statements. He said he often has black-out periods which occur when he is drinking and he has been known to appear sober even when he is in a drunken state.

EZZELL said FRANK WETZEL is the Shop Foreman for his former employer at Perdue Radio and Television Company, Orlando, Florida. He and Wetzel have been out drinking together on a few occasions, usually after closing shop or on a payday night. WETZEL has been trying to get him into trouble with his wife. EZZELL said WETZEL thinks he is a ladies man and has in the past tried to take his wife out. His wife has told him that WETZEL has called her several times and in addition to trying to make a date would tell her of his second with other women. EZZELL believed WETZEL tells his (EZZELL's) wife what he tells WETZEL in confidence. He was sure WETZEL told her about

his being responsible for another girl's pregnancy at the time he married his wife.

EZZELL stated he has never confronted WETZEL with any of the above, but WETZEL has told him that he called him one night when he was drunk and cursed him out. EZZELL said he could not remember this call.

EZZELL advised that he has a serious drinking problem, but he did not consider himself an alcoholic. He said he was treated in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Fayetteville, North Carolina, for drunkeness shortly after his release from the Air Force in 1953. He further

EZZELL stated that he has had this serious drinking problem since his marriage in November 1967. He indicated he was forced to marry his wife as a result of her pregnancy prior to their wedding. He said, since his marriage he has been under constant pressure from his wife and in addition has serious financial problems.

EZZELL advised that because of his heavy drinking and the resulting "black-outs" he is not able to fix exactly his whereabouts on specific dates during the past year. However, he remembered the night of MARTIN LUTHER KING's death and said he was drunk at the time. He was registered at the Motel South, Orlando, Florida. With him at the time was a girl friend, whom he identified as VIOLET ALLRED, a nurse, who operates the Clear Lake Manor Nursing Home, Orlando, Florida. He said she is about 38 years of age. He recalled hearing of KING's death on the T.V. on the night it happened.

EZZELL said he did not remember where he was the night Senator KENNEDY was shot.

EZZELL could not account for his whereabouts on the night of June 5, 1968 and said he could not recall where he was at all during the month of June as he again was on a drunk.

EZZELL remembers flying from Orlando, Florida,

to Los Angeles twice in recent months. The last was about August 4, 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines. He stayed in Los Angeles four days and left driving a rented car after an unsuccessful effort in finding a job. On his way to Shreveport he stopped briefly at Phoenix, Albuquerque, and Hope, Arkansas. He claimed he pawned his 357 magnum revolver with a police officer in Hope, Arkansas, for \$45 on August 23, 1968. The gun was purchased for his second job as a security guard with Associated Security Company, Orlando, Florida. He claims he has never used the gun in commission of a crime.

EZZELL believed the previous trip to Los Angeles was made in June 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines from Orlando, Florida. He was looking for a job on the occasion also. He stayed only two days and remembers returning from California via an unrecalled airline and that he stopped at Las Vegas, Denver, New Orleans and Miami. He does not remember if he stayed in any of these cities for any length of time. After reaching Miami he rented a car and drove to Orlando.

EZZELL claims he had no employment other than his jobs in Orlando and that he financed his trips with the money earned from working these two jobs, along with using his credit cards.

EZZELL recalled after driving from Miami he did not go home, but to a motel with Miss ALLRED. The following day he drove back to Miami and then returned to Orlando by bus. He thinks he rented the car at Miami from either Hertz or Avis-Rent-A-Car.

EZZELL stated he has not worked any where since August 4, 1968, and that he presently had in his possession \$36.00 which was left over from the sale of his gun.

EZZELL claimed he pawned a .38 Colt "Cobra" in Los Angeles on the last trip at an unrecalled pawn shop and that he presently has no weapon.

EZZELL could not recall any other details concerning his first trip to Los Angeles, he said he was drinking heavy on these trips and could not remember anything much about them. He could not remember the names of motels where he stayed. He claimed he has no friends in Los Angeles and

that he made none while there on these trips.

EZZELL stated he is not now and never has been a member of any "hate" type organization such as the Ku Klux Klan.

EZZELL stated he would be leaving Shreveport, Louisiana, this evening by bus and could be reached through his mother Mrs. ACRIE EZZELL, Route 4, Clinton, North Carolina.

Om 8/30/68, JIM LOCKHART, a W/M, 3307 - 15th Ave., Little Shawart, Ala., stated he was furnishing the following information with the understanding his name would be protested, that he would not have to testify and his name would not be divulged outside the Bureau. LOCKHART has not been in trouble in the past three years and is supporting his family at this time.

LOCKHART said that approximately five years ago during the spring of 1963 he was incarcerated at the Birmingham County Jail, Birmingham, Ala., where he was serving time on a worthless check charge. At this time Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING was in the Birmingham area.

LOCKHART said that he (LOCKHART) was treated as a trusty in that he had the privilege of traveling anywhere in the prison including the maximum security section; he also worked in the hospital section. LOCKHART advised that while he was in prison he learned by "the grapevine" that a contract was being put out for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. The individual was accepted the contract would be represented by ROMERT PRATT, a lawyer who would get this individual out of Jail, and the individual would receive \$10,000 for assassinating Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.
