# LIBRARIES

All libraries in Jefferson County were contacted and all personnel interviewed in an attempt to develop any information concerning GALT or the possibility that he may have spent time in such institutions while at Birmingham. This investigation proved negative and the names of those people contacted are maintained in the Birmingham file.

# LAUNDRIES AND DRY CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS

In addition to positive results obtained based on dry cleaning ticket found in GALT's effects at Atlanta, all laundries and dry-cleaning establishments, together with their branches, especially the southside area of Birmingham, were contacted and the names of those individuals are maintained in the Birmingham file.

# MARRIAGE, DIVORCE, AND VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS

The marriage and divorce records of Jefferson County, Alabama, and the counties which comprise the Birmingham Office territory were reviewed from the year 1947 to date, based on GALT's reported statement to an individual that his divorced wife lived "over the mountain" near Birmingham. This review of such records proved negative as to any divorce record of that individual. A check of the Vital Statistics in Jefferson County at Birmingham also proved negative as to any record of GALT.

# BARGE LINE OPERATORS

In view of CALT's reported statement that he was formerly employed on a barge, all companies and river terminals, together with all sources known that might have information concerning his employment, were contacted on the navigable rivers in the Birmingham Office territory. This included all points on the Warrior River, which extends from Birmingport through Tuscaloosa to Mobile, Alabama, and on the Tennessee River which is located in the northern portion of the State of Alabama. All such investigation proved negative.

FRANCES BROWN, Waitress, Andy's Lounge, 1923 1st Avenue North, was interviewed and related the following with reference to a man who was in the lounge on the evening of March 29, 1968. Mrs. BROWN stated she recalls the date because this is the day she and her boyfriend drove to Nashville, Tennessee, and she left work early and this individual was still sitting in the lounge when she left.

Mrs. BROWN stated she had an opportunity to view this person for approximately 45 minutes. He entered the lounge at approximately 6:30 p.m., sat at a table on the side of the lounge that she services, and was still sitting there when she left work at 7:10 p.m. During the period this man was under her observation, he ordered and drank two Schlitz beers. Mrs. BROWN stated the person she observed was a white male approximately 35 years of age, neatly dressed, wearing dark trousers, a dress shirt and tie, and a dark brown or blue sport coat. She stated he appeared to be of average height, although she could not tell his exact height because he was seated during the entire period she could see him. She recalls he had blue eyes and sandy, brush-cut hair, which was longer on the sides. Mrs. BROWN stated that the individual sat by himself and did not converse with anyone other than her when he ordered his beer. As best she recalls, he had a local accent.

Mrs. BROWN advised she had never seen this individual before and has not seen him since. She commented that Andy's Lounge caters to regular customers, and it is slightly unusual when a stranger comes in off the street.

Mr. W. M. GARDNER, Manager, Retail Credit Company, Birmingham, said the records of his office contain a Broadcast of Disappearance, which is essentially a stop notice for JOHN E. WILLARD, white, male, 5' 11", 203 pounds, date of birth last known address 2564 South Blue Island Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. WILLARD was last employed by Gateway Transportation Company, Chicago. WILLARD disappeared during September, 1966. The Broadcast of Disappearance was published November 1, 1966, at the request of A. M. Tenison, Jr. GARDNER said his records contained no file number or other information and he could not identify TENISON. However, the home office of Retail Credit Company, 1600 Peach Street, Atlanta, Georgia, would be able to identify TENISON and furnish additional information from their file.

In addition Mr. GARDNER said the records of his office also contain a Broadcast of Disappearance for J. D. WILLARD, white male, 28 years of age in 1961, last known address 414 Elizabeth Street, Corder, Missouri, former occupation insurance agent, wife's name GERALDINE L. WILLARD. J. D. WILLARD disappeared during July, 1960 and the Broadcast of Disappearance was published June 5. 1961. Prior addresses in Kansas City, Missouri, were listed as:

# INFORMATION CONCERNING LOOK-ALIKE DOUGLAS EUGENE CROWSON:

On April 9, 1968 BETTY WHITE, barmaid, Redmont Hotel, Birmingham, Alabama, telephonically contacted the Birmingham FBI office, advising that she had seen the artist's conception of the unknown subject and that there was an individual presently at the bar in the Redmont who she thought resembled unknown subject.

On April 9, 1968 BETTY WHITE, barmaid, Redmont Hotel, advised SA DAVID T. DALY and RALPH N. BUTLER that the individual who she thought resembled unknown abject, upon second consideration bore only a slight resemblance and she thought that this was not the individual. She identified this person as a patron at the bar.

It was noted from observation by SA DALY and SA BUTLER that the individual identified by BETTY WHITE bore only a slight facial resemblance to unknown subject and is a much smaller man than the description of unknown subject.

On April 9, 1968 JOHN D. FORD, Transworld Leasing Corporation, 318 Office Park Circle, was shown the artist's conception of the unknown subject and stated that he knew of no one that resembled this picture.

He was advised that one of his employees, DOUGLAS EUGENE CROWSON, had been identified as resembling the artist's conception, and he stated that in his opinion, CROWSON has been employed on a daily basis during the last month and has not left the Birmingham area.

On April 8, 1968, Dr. WARREN B. WEIL, 1714 11th Avenue, South, and his employees, DORIS REISS and MARY UNDERWOOD were afforded an opportunity to observe the second artist's conception. All three expressed the belief that this individual was a detail man or drug salesman for a major pharmaceutical supply house. They were unable to furnish his name but expressed the belief that it might be (FNU) JOHNSTON. Dr. WEIL expressed his belief that the salesman's name was possibly known to a Dr. JOHN HILLHOUSE in the Medical Arts Building. Attempts were made to contact Dr. HILLHOUSE with negative results, on this date.

The following investigation was conducted by SA PATRICK J. MOYNIHAN on April 9, 1968:

Dr. JOHN L. HILLHOUSE was located at his home, 3721 Redmont Road, Birmingham (252-1984). He advised that he is the official physician for the Birmingham City Jail and also functions as an examiner for the Federal Aviation Agency.

A copy of artist's conception #2 was exhibited and Dr. HILLHOUSE did not immediately establish a connection with the drug salesman mentioned previously by Dr. WARREN WEIL. WEIL's information was brought to the attention of HILLHOUSE, and he advised that the artist's conception does in fact look a good bit like a drug salesman who was in his office as recently as April 8, 1968, and who has been servicing him for some period of time with a frequency of perhaps four visits a year. Dr. HILLHOUSE established that the salesman's name is BARNEY TRAMMEL (phonetic) and he is employed by

Sandoz and Company. Dr. HILLHOUSE described TRAMMELL as a white male, approximately 35 years old, 5'll", 175 pounds, erect bearing, brown-blond hair, and well dressed. He advised that TRAMMELL resides somewhere in the Birmingham area, has a family, is a long-time resident, and is, to his knowledge, a person of good reputation and character, not likely to be sought in connection with an FBI investigation.

On April 9, 1968, BARNEY TRAMMELL was located and interviewed at his home in Gardendale, Alabama. It was noted that he bears a strong resemblance to artist's conception #2. He furnished the following information:

He is employed by the Sandoz Pharmaceutical Company of Hanover, New Jersey, as a sales representative and has been so employed for the past three years. His territory includes the south side of Birmingham, Anniston, Gadsden, Sylacauga and Talladega, all in Alabama. He operates out of his home as the company has no office in Alabama and his immediate superior is Mr. DEAN SIBES, Regional Manager for the company, located in Atlanta, Georgia. His duties consist of calling on doctors and selling drugs and medicines manufactured by the Sandoz Company.

Mr. TRAMMELL referred to his notes and determined the following regarding his recent activities:

On Friday, March 29, 1968, he was in Birmingham, Alabama, at the Jefferson Medical Group located at 1500 6th Avenue, South, in connection with an exhibit at this location and was in contact with various doctors at this time and place. He was present there from approximately 8:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. Following his departure from 1500 6th Avenue, South, he went to the Main Library in Birmingham at 7th Avenue and 21st Street, North, and spent the time from approximately 1:30 until 3:00 or 3:30 p.m.

preparing reports. He then drove to his home in Gardendale and spent the rest of the evening there.

On Saturday, March 30, 1968, he was at home and his father-in-law visited with him from approximately 7:30 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. Following lunch, he took his son to the Roebuck Shopping Center where they visited the barber and did some shopping. He then returned home.

From his memory he furnished the following:

On April 1, 1968, he left home about 8:00 a.m. and returned at approximately 6:30 p.m. He made calls in Ashland. Roanoke, Lineville and Wedowee, Alabama.

On April 2, 1968, he left his home at approximately 8:15 a.m. and did not return until 8:30 p.m. His calls on this date took him to Sylacauga, Alabama. He had dinner in Birmingham in the evening before his return to his home with his boss, DEAN SIBES, Regional Manager from Atlanta.

On April 3, 1968, he left home at approximately 8:15 a.m. and conducted his business in Siluria, Columbiana, Montevallo and Alabaster, Alabama. He returned home at approximately 3:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

On April 4, 1968, he left home at about 8:00 a.m. and his business took him to Anniston, Jacksonville and Fort McClellan, Alabama. He was in the company during the day of DEAN SIBES, Regional Manager from Atlanta, and he left SIBES off in Anniston to catch a plane at about 6:00 p.m.

On April 5, 1968, he left home at 8:00 or 8:15 a.m. and conducted his business at the Smolian Clinic in Birmingham until 12:30 or 1:00 p.m., at which time he returned to his home.

Mr. U. L. BAKER, who in the first instance sold a rifle to HARVEY LOWMEYER on March 29, 1968, was afforded an opportunity on April 16, 1968, to observe the seven photographs which were exhibited to DONALD WOODS on April 16, 1968. The photographs were exhibited by SAs NEIL P. SHANAHAN and PATRICK J. MOYNIHAN. Mr. BAKER advised that he did not believe that the man to whom he sold the rifle was in the group exhibited. He said he could not select the man from the group. He advised, however, that the purchaser of the rifle could be in this group of photographs.

BH 44-1740 ISSUANCE OF FEDERAL PROCESS AT BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA On April 17, 1968, the facts of this matter were discussed by SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE and SA HENRY A. SNOW with Assistant U. S. Attorney R. MACEY TAYLOR. At that time, AUSA TAYLOR authorized the filing of a complaint against ERIC STARVO GALT for violation of Section 241, Title 18, USC, in that he did conspire to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in the free exercise and enjoyment of his rights secured by the Constitution of the United States, namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. Mr. TAYLOR recommended bond be set in the amount of \$50,000. A complaint was filed by SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE. based on the above authority, before U. S. Commissioner MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, on the same date, at which time Mrs. SPRAGUE issued a warrant of arrest for ERIC STARVO GALT.
