New Orleans advised by communicated dated May 7, 1968, that the subject, as ERIC GALT, had registered at the Provincial Motel, New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 16, 1967, as ERIC S. GALT and was assigned Room 126. He checked out December 19, 1967.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEE MASON EIDSON at Buffalo, New York:


Information was received from the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that Mr. and Mrs. VINTON P. OSTRANCHERY 126 Meadow Lane, Buffalo, had registered on December 19, 1967, at the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. They were reported to have been driving a Cadillac automobile, bearing New York License TP 3035 and stayed in Room 207 of that motel.

On May 10, 1968, Mrs. VINTON P. OSTRANDER, 126 Meadow Lane, Kenmore, New York, advised SA LEE MASON EIDSON that she and her husband, Mr. OSTRANDER, stayed in Room 207 of the Provincial Motel, New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 19, 1967. She said Room 207 is located on the second floor of the motel. She said they parked their car, a Cadillac bearing New York License TP 3035, in the courtyard parking area. She said that she did not recall having seen a white Mustang automobile while staying at that motel. Mrs. OSTRANDER observed photographs of the subject, and she stated she could not recall ever having seen any individual resembling the subject.

Mr. VINTON P. OSTRANDER, Administrative Assistant Scout Executive, Greater Niagara Frontier Council, Boy Scouts of America, 344 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo, New York, residence 126 Meadow Lane, Kenmore, New York, advised that he and his wife checked into the Provincial Motel in New Orleans, Louisiana on December 19, 1967, exact time unrecalled, but sometime after dark. He said he and his wife went out

that evening and returned rather late to the motel. He said the next morning he and his wife had breakfast in the motel dining room and then went shopping; and, therefore, spent very little time in the vicinity of the motel. Mr. OSTRANDER reviewed photographs of the subject and stated he could recall having seen no one resembling the subject. Mr. OSTRANDER said he could recall having seen no white Mustang automobile while at the Provincial Motel in New Orleans, Louisiana.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EUGENE A. HEVERON at Penfield, New York:

On May 10, 1968, Mrs, CUTLER J. COULSON, 200 Collingsworth Drive, advised that she and her husband left Rochester, New York, on or about Sunday, December 17, 1967, by airplane and flew to New Orleans, Louisiana, arriving there the same date.

They checked into the Provincial Motel, Chartres Street, New Orleans, where they remained until Thursday, December 21, 1967 or Friday, December 22, 1967.

Mrs. COULSON said the purpose of their trip was to take a freighter from New Orleans to South Africa. Her husband was formerly assigned to the United States Foreign Service for seven years and during part of this time she was employed at the United States Embassy, New Delhi, India. Her husband is semi-retired, doing education photography throughout the world.

Mrs. COUISON advised that the Provincial Motel did not have a lobby as such nor a barroom; and, therefore, they would not necessarily see everyone at the motel. They spent a great deal of time touring New Orleans and eating in various restaurants in New Orleans.

Mrs. COULSON advised that in view of the fact they did not have a car at the motel, they did not go into the small parking area at the motel. Mrs. COULSON and her husband have observed numerous photographs of subject in newspapers and magazines; and, after viewing photographs of subject, she advised she does not recall seeing anyone resembling the subject.

Mrs. COULSON advised that Mr. COULSON was not presently available; but when he returned, she would ask him if he recalled ever seeing a white Mustang or anyone resembling the subject at the motel. If he does recall any information whatsoever, she said she would immediately contact the Rochester, New York, Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

By communication dated April 30, 1968, Chicago advised that JAMES EARL RAY ordered photographic equipment from Superior Bulk Film Company in late September, 1967.

Ordered was one Kodak Dual Projector, M-95-Z. He also ordered Kodak Super 8 D-38 plus an HP 1 combination 8 MM Super Splicer.

The Super 8 camera was not in stock and Superior shipped a Crestline camera as a replacement. The subject returned the Crestline and insisted on the Kodak Super 8, Model M 8.

Chicago desired to know if serial numbers were available on this equipment, and they also desired a search of warranty slips under RAY's true name and aliases.

On May 2, 1968, BERT S. LONNGREN, Coordinator, Outbound Traffic, Eastman Kodak Company (EKCO), Rochester, New York, advised SA WALTER J. SAMELSTAD that no warranty is given for any Kodak camera and serial numbers are not recorded when shipped by EKCO.

RAYMOND PORTER, Director of Security, EKCO Office, Rochester, advised that warranty is furnished for Kodak projector M-94-Z, and approximately 50 per cent are returned by purchasers.

Approximately 6,000 projectors have been sold with warranties returned since October, 1967. Mr. PORTER said these would be examined to determine if subject had returned a warranty which should contain a serial number. 44.1984-144

RICHARD TOWNSEND, General Manager, Repair Center, EKCO, Rochester, advised cameras received for repairs are recorded by name and by state in which the owner lives. There are also repair shops for EKCO at New York City, Atlanta, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Chicago and Dallas, plus 34 camera shops recognized by EKCO to do repairs on EKCO equipment.

On May 7, 1968, RAYMOND PORTER, advised SA SAMELSTAD that a review of the 6,000 warranties for the Kodak Dual Projector M-95-Z, failed to locate any information for RAY under his true name or known aliases.

Mr. PORTER said that a review of repair records could be made at each of the seven regional centers, but he estimated it would take approximately 40 Agent hours at each center. The time needed for review of records at the 34 authorized shops in the United States was not known to Mr. PORTER because he did not know the volume or nature of the records maintained at these shops.

By letter dated May 23, 1968, F. H. WAKELEY, Manager, Equipment Services, EKCO, advised that the following letter was mailed to all EKCO repair shops in the United States, Hawaii and Bermuda, where a person might seek service on a piece of Kodak equipment. This letter was accompanied by an identification sheet of JAMES EARL RAY.

The letter reads as follows:

"May 23, 1968

"The FBI recently asked us to send the enclosed identification sheet to you with the information that the party wanted -- James Earl Ray -- purchased a Kodak Instamatic M8 Movie Camera and a Kodak Instamatic M95 Movie Projector around October or November, 1967. The serial numbers of the equipment are not known.

RE: INVESTIGATION CONCERNING EARL EVERETT RAY, DECEASED UNCLE OF JAMES EARL RAY

By communication dated April 23, 1968, Albany advised that EARL EVERETT RAY, uncle of the subject, died May 2, 1959, in Buffalo. His body was found under a rail-road bridge at the foot of Commercial Street, Buffalo, New York. EARL RAY came to Albany in 1957 from 476 Franklin Street, Buffalo, New York, where he was employed at Buffalo Hospital.

On April 24, 1968, SA ELMER F. MOULIN, JR., contacted WILLIAM J. COLLINS in charge of the micro section of the Buffalo Police Department. His records show that EARL E. RAY's body was found under the D. L. & W. railroad bridge at the foot of Commercial Street. Dr. LEE of Emergency Hospital pronounced RAY dead on arrival.

On April 24, 1968, NICHOLAS SALINARDO, Erie County Morgue, made available records which disclosed the body was brought to the morgue by the Roberts Funeral Home and after laying in the morgue for two days, was claimed by Mrs. FRANK FULLER, sister, 2601 Chestnut, Quincy, Ill., the claim being made by telegram.

GEORGE ROBERTS, Roberts Funeral Home, 2400 Main Street, Buffalo, on April 24, 1968, advised he took the body to the Erie County Morgue on May 2, 1959. His copy of the death certificate disclosed RAY's last place of residence as Western Road, Albany; occupation, steward; but unemployed at time of death; marital status, divorced; father, JAMES RAY and mother, LILLIAN MATTHEWS. The death certificate was signed by Dr. ROCCO DE DOMINICIS.

Mr. ROBERTS said the body was shipped to the Duke's Brothers Funeral Home, 823 Broadway, Quincy, Illinois, on May 4, 1959, as ordered by Mrs. FRANK FULLER.

The records of Buffalo General Hospital were checked by personnel director, TOM MICHEL, on August 24, 1968, but he could locate no employment record for RAY.

On this same date, Miss ELLEN JONES, Personnel Office, Buffalo State Hospital, advised she could locate no employment record for RAY.

No neighborhood could be conducted at 476 Franklin Street, Buffalo, as residences in this downtown area were torn down in 1960 and have been replaced by business establishments.

The records of the Buffalo Retail Merchants Credit Bureau contain data on one EARL RAY, 476 Franklin Street, Buffalo, in 1956. His previous residence was shown as 439 Cherry Street, Quincy, Illinois. His employment was shown as Buffalo General Hospital in 1956 with a previous employment shown as St. Mary's Hospital, Quincy, Illinois. His credit bureau file has been inactive since 1956.

The file contains a report from the Quincy Credit Bureau which showed that in July, 1955, EARL RAY paid a \$15 fine on a charge of assaulting YVONNE MC GINLEY. It also showed that RAY was in Menard Prison as of May 19, 1951, arising out of an assault charge for which he was sentenced three to ten years in September, 1948.

RE: EASTERN AIRLINES CHECK AT BUFFALO

Atlanta advised on April 23, 1968, that F. A. ALLEY, co-pilot, Eastern Airlines Flight 328, leaving Atlanta on April 5, 1968, made stops at Pittsburgh and Buffalo, terminating in Toronto, Canada. He suggested Eastern Airlines ticket agents in Buffalo be contacted as normal procedure is for the ticket agent at Buffalo to board the plane to distribute declaration forms for customs and, thus, facilitate entry into Canada at Toronto.

On April 23, 1968, SA JAMES A. COMFORT contacted MARSHALL J. ROWLETTE, Supervisor, Eastern Airlines, Buffalo International Airport, Cheektowaga, New York. The Identification Order (IO) photograph of RAY was shown to all Eastern Airlines employees but none recalled seeing RAY at the airport at any time and, in particular, on April 5, 1968.

Copies of the IO were left with Mr. ROWLETTE for appropriate posting at the airport.



HILL advised that he knows of no pertinent information regarding RAY, his activities or feelings. HILL advised that he does, at times, go to the Old Fortress. Tavern in Kansas City, but has certainly never seen RAY there.

BEVERLY VOGAN interviewed this date at the Kansas State Penitentiary. She advised she is currently serving one to seven years for forgery, having been incarcerated since April 1968. She stated she has never used the name BEVERLY HILL, and knows of no one by that name. She advised that BUSTER HILL from Kansas City is a close friend of hers and some people may think they are related, but she never actually used the name BEVERLY HILL.

She does not know the Old Fortress Tavern by name, but stated she frequented several taverns in that area on Troost Boulevard, Kansas City, Missouri, and does not know all of their names. She stated she does not know JAMES EARL RAY, nor has she heard of anyone using that name or any of his aliases. She read about him in the newspapers but knows nothing more. She viewed a photograph of RAY and stated she does not remember seeing the person in the photograph anywhere. She advised she was sick with blood poisoning most of the month of February 1968, and did not visit any taverns at this time. BEVERLY VOGAN also stated she knows of no one by the name PAUL BRIDGEMAN.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM C. ERVIN at North Augusta, South Carolina, on June 7, 1968:

Mrs. RONALD GREENE, Apartment 27-A, Savannah Terrace Apartments, advised that she is the manager of these apartments, and has held that position since September of 1964. She stated that when she took the position she was not given any records other than the records of current rental payments to that time. The previous owner was Mr. HUGO SIMS, an Orangeburg, South Carolina attorney. She stated that she came to work when Mr. SIMS sold the Savannah Terrace Apartments to Mr. R.O. BARTON, JR. of the Boatwright Company in Augusta, Georgia, who continued to own these apartments.

Mrs. GREENE advised that she had no current record of Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT L. JENKINS, who resided in Apartment 40-D. She stated that she would attempt to locate any record of them from records given to her at the time she began working. She advised that Mrs. LILLIAN C. PRICE, who resides in Apartment 41-B, had been at that address for approximately fifteen years, and would know Mr. and Mrs. JENKINS, had they resided in the apartments for any length of time.

Mrs. LILLIAN C. PRICE, Apartment 41-B, Savannah Terrace Apartments, advised that she was closely acquaited with ROBERT and RUBY JENKINS, who previously resided at 40-D, the apartment adjacent to hers. She stated that Mr. JENKINS was a Sergeant at Fort Gordon, Georgia, with the United States Army, and he and his wife RUBY had no children. She further advised that RUBY came from Bloomington, Illinois, where her mother currently resided, and where she returned on several occasions to work temporarily in a department store. These occasions were usually caused by temporary duty on the part of her husband, who was frequently called to training exercises in other states. Mrs. PRICE mentioned that ROBERT and RUBY JENKINS frequently received the Bloomington,

Illinois, newspaper which was apparently mailed to them under a subscription. She further advised that her recollection is that they moved from the Savannah Terrace Apartments in September of 1963, possibly to Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and from there to Germany. Mrs. PRICE continued that her recollection is that the JENKINS' maintained a checking account in a bank in Augusta, Georgia. She continued that she would possibly be able to locate their last address on a card written to her by Mrs. JENKINS; however, this would take some time.

On June 7, 1968, Mrs. RONALD GREENE was recontacted and advised that a search of her records indicates that Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT L. JENKINS, resided in Apartment 40-D, from approximately November, 1963, to November, 1964. No ofther information was available in these records.

On June 7, 1968, Mrs. LILLIAN PRICE was recontacted and she advised that on December 14, 1964, she received a postcard from RUBY M. JENKINS, who was at that time residing at 2600½, A, Fort Bragg Road, Fayettville, North Carolina. In that postcard Mrs. JENKINS advised that she was very friendly with hr neighbors residing directly behind her. Mrs. PRICE further advised that she received an additional postcard on January 26, 1965, which stated that Mr. JENKINS had been transferred to Germany, and Mrs. JENKINS would join him shortly.

Mrs. FRANCIS KIRSCH, Credit Bureau of Augusta, Augusta, Georgia, provided the following credit report:

A September, 1963, credit report for ROBERT JENKINS reflects that an inquiry was made by the Junction City, Kansas, Credit Bureau, which listed JENKINS as a Sergeant E-5, of the 206th Signal Company, Army Serial Number RA55535647. A 1965, month of February, credit report reflects an address of 260½, Fort Bragg Road, Fayettville, North Carolina. This report under the name ROBERT L. JENKINS, and indicates a permanent address of 409 East Mill Street, Bloomington, Illinois, Zip Code 61701. Credit record was satisfactory, and no further pertinent information was located.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLARENCE A. GROOMS, JR., on June 11, 1968:

WILLIAM A. CARSWELL, SR., 1317 South Boundary Street, S.W., Aiken, South Carolina, operator of a general store, Highway 215, Aiken, South Carolina, advised approximately a year and a half ago, he recalled a discussion by several individuals at his store concerning the activities of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and that someone mentioned it was a miracle he had not been killed. He further recalled that during this conversation, someone remarked "what would you do if someone approached you," presumably meaning what would he do if someone approached him to kill KING or donate money for someone to kill KING.

Mr. CARSWELL stated the entire conversation took place so long ago that he is not even sure of the statements made or the individuals who were in his store at that time. He recalled that he did state at the time that he would not be a part to any such action against KING.

Mr. CARSWELL adamantly denied that he had ever been approached to contribute money for the murder of KING. He stated under no circumstances would he ever contribute money for such a cause. He denied any personal knowledge of the KING murder.

WILLIAM A. CARSWELL, JR., 769 Boardman Road, Aiken, South Carolina, informed approximately two years ago, he was in his father's store, identified above, and overheard a discussion between several individuals and his father and recalled that some statement was made about "money being collected" and the "activities of MARTIN LUTHER KING." CARSWELL, JR., stated his recollection of the conversation is now extremely vague, and since his father was a direct participant in the conversation, any statement he, CARSWELL, SR., made as to what was said would be correct. He adamantly denied he had any knowledge any individual had ever approached his father to collect money to murder KING and stated he did not intend to convey such an impression in any conversation he may have had in the past with any individual or individuals. CARSWELL, JR., stated he had absolutely no personal knowledge of the KING murder.

The above two mentioned residents of Aiken, South Carolina, were interviewed based on information received that WILLIAM CARSWELL, SR., had possibly been approached prior to the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING by an individual collecting money to have brackers.

For information of Cincinnati, St. Louis has advised that JOHN EUGENE CAURON, alleged JAMES SARL RAY and an unnamed man, robbed a bank in June - July, 1967. GAWRON subsequently revealed the location as the Bank of Alton, Illinois, and the unnamed man as JIMMIE (LNU), and that he was visited by JIMMIE (LNU) the night of 5/13 - 14/68. One JAMES H. CARPENTER, FBI #230 243 is known to have visited GAWRON on these dates, however, CARPENTER was in St. Louis City Jail from 6/5/67 - 3/1/68, and could not have participated in the Alton bank robbery.

The bank of Alton, Illinois was rebbed by 2 unknown subjects on 7/13/67, wearing nylon stocking masks and using a sawed off shotgun. They escaped with \$27,230. Description of the number 2 man could fit RAY.

Subsequent to the bank robbery a shotgun and items of clothing were found in a vacant let in Alton, including a white Van Heusen Van-Guard shirt with markings "NO" or "NO", "JON - U" or "JON - O", inside collar; a pair of tan pleated trousers with the markings "44--" and "3107-3" on the right front pecket and "T6276" and "U7703" on the right rear pecket.
