At 9100 AM on 10/17/68, Imapecter CARL DORY, ROMP, Toronto, Ontario, Canada, was contacted and informed that Misters DWIER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE were scheduled to arrive at the Toronto International Airport at 1:57 PM, 10/17/68. At the same time, Inspector DORY was informed of the respective positions of these men.

Inspector DORY indicated that he had already received instructions from Ottawa as to the impending arrival of these men in Toronto and the purpose of their trip, but that their specific arrival time had not previously been furnished to him. He added that he was assigning Corporal JOHN DUNLOF of the ROMP, who participated in the original investigation of RAY's activities in Toronto, to look after these representatives of the State of Termosses.

It should be noted in cornection with this particular conversation with Inspector DOMY that he made the observation that it appeared highly improbable to him

and CARLISLE were met at the ramp of the Toronto International Airport by SA JAMES P. MC MAHON of the Buffalo Office and Corporal DUNLOP of the RCMP as they alighted from their plane. Their passage through Canadian immigration and customs was facilitated by Corporal DUNLOP and they were thereafter driven to Headquarters of the RCMP in Toronto in an RCMP car by Corporal DUNLOP. During the brief discussion at the airport, DWYER, REASLEY and CARLISLE expressed their appreciation for the cooperation of the FHI, pointing out that they "don't know what they would have done if it were not for the Bureau."

At that same time, it was pointed out to these gentlemen that the possibility of arranging all of the interviews which they indicated they desired while in Toronto would be extremely unlikely in the one full day which they have allocated for their stay in Toronto particularly since at least two of the interviews, those of the two landladies at the residences in Toronto at which RAY had stayed required the services of a Chinese and Polish interpreter. Despite this, they insisted they were committed to adhere to their original schedule and that they would have to accomplish as much as they could during the time they had allocated for Toronto.

Arrangements were made with Corporal DUNLOF for him to notify the Buffalo Office just as soon as the men from Tennessee "firmed up" their plans for departure from Toronto for Montreal.

Supervisor DICK LONG of the Bureau telephonically informed as follows. 10/18/68:

Bureau sent an Airtel to Memphis, August 8, 1968, enclosing copies of six documents, No. 6 being the court testimony of individuals who testified in London / England.

LONG also commented that he did not feel that the Assistant Attorneys General BEASLEY DWYER, etc. who are in Canada, would be able to meet their appointment in Montreal nor did he feel they could keep their schedule in traveling to London, England. A Chinese person is to be interviewed in Canada and a Polish woman also is to be interviewed. of these interviews will require interpreters. LONG stated the only way he felt the schedule could be maintained is for the Asst. Attorneys General to cancel some of the interviews.

Bureau has arranged through the Legat in London for interviews by BEASLEY, DWYER, etc. to be handled in London, however, arrangements as of 10/18/68 had not been completed in Lisbon.

He admitted this was his laundry mark, bewever he could not supply any details concerning the owner of the clothing. When laundry is brought to his shop, he issues a tag to the customer; when the customer returns the tags are matched and the laundry handed over. CHIM failed to recognize the second laundry mark NG C 83.

We had supper and then decided to go to the Grey Rock Resort for the evening. As we entered the lounge, we saw a man sitting alone at a table facing the Dance Floor. I am satisfied that RAY did not mention anything about Passports to Mrs. KEATING and that the fact that her sister is Secretary to the Registrar of Citizenship is only a co-incidence. Mrs. KEATING has been most co-operative and I am positive that sac is an honest person, placed in a very embarrassing position by her association with RAY.

In compliance with instructions received, I also reinterviewed Ruth CHAPPELL and asked her for a written statement. Mrs. CHAPPELL is a widow with a 19-year-old son. She is desperately afraid of her name being made public and only reluctantly agreed to give the following signed statement:

STATEMENT OF: Ruth CHAPPELL

DOB: 143 Longpre Street, Eastview, Ontario

During the first long week-end in August, I accompanied Claire KEATING to St-Jovite, P.Q., where we stayed at the "Petit Hanoir" Inn. During the evening, we motored up to the Grey Rock Inn where we met a man who introduced himself as Eric GALT. I did not pay much attention to him and after a few drinks I went back to the Manoir. Claire stayed with him. I did not see GALT again until we visited him in Montreal the following Monday. Since it was impossible to find a room in Montreal because of Expo, we stayed with him during the two nights that the event in Montreal. He took us out to the Acapulco Club. He seemed to have enough money to

get along, but he did not strike me as being very prosperous. He never mentioned friends or associates and did not introduce us to anyone. He appeared to be a quiet and regular sort of a guy. He never mentioned the word passport to us. I never saw him again after we left Montreal. I heard from Claire later that he had been to Ottawa to see her. After James Earl RAY'S arrest, she called me and asked if I thought that he could be the man we had met. I did not think so at the time and was surprised when it turned out to be him.

Discreet enquiries at the Town and Country Motel, 1476 Richmond Road, Ottawa, revealed that Eric GALT registered there on the 18th of AUGUST 1967 and left on the 20th of AUGUST 1967. He gave his address as 507 Chestnut Street, Chicago, Ill., and was driving a Plymouth, Licence No. LM5942. He stayed in Cabin No. 30, which is not equipped with a telephone. Any calls made by him from one of the several pay phones at the Motel would not go through the Motel Switchboard and be recorded. Although he registered as Mr. & Mrs. Eric GALT, Mrs. KEATING did not stay with him at the Motel, as mentioned in her statement dated 15 AUG 68. The Desk Clerk on duty at the Town and Country Motel when HAY, alias GALT, registered, Mrs. Edythe COBLEY, is reported to be dying from terminal cancer and will not be interviewed. It is extremely doubtful that she could remember anything of any significance about RAY. Copies of the Motel Registration Card are attached hereto.

- 1. Morris KERTZER Barrister was contacted this date, and he advised that he had no objection to me re-interviewing his client Claire KEATING as long as it was done in his presence. He arranged to have Mrs. KEATING in his office at 1.30PM, at which time she was interviewed.
- 2. Mrs. KEATING advised that hay never gave any indication of hatred toward Negroes. The only time the subject was mentioned was during a conversation on the subject of Separatism in the Province of Quebec, when RAY said that they had a similar problem with Negroes in the South. Mrs. KEATING advised that RAY appeared to be neutral on the subject and did not express any love or hate of Negroes. She flatly denied telling William Bradford HUTE that RAY was very outspoken in his dislike of Negroes.
- Mrs. KEATING advised that she is willing to be interviewed in Ottawa in the presence of her Lawyer by someone in Authority from Memphis, and if he can convince her that her evidence is material to the case, she will consider the possibility of appearing as a witness. Mr. KERTZER advised that he certainly would not allow his client to appear in Memphis as a witness, without first talking to someone from there in a position to tell them exactly what is involved.

Enclosed is a list of books and writings by JOACHIM JOESTEN which was furnished to this office by the 66th Military Intelligence Group.

The 66th advised that they were able to discreetly obtain this list but were unable to obtain information concerning the book which JOESTEN is supposed to have written about JAMES EARL RAY.

The 65th determined that JOESTEN is registered as residing in Munich, Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), at 13/1 Grieg Strasse, in care of SCHMITZ. This registration record shows that he was born on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ in Cologne, Germany. He came to his present address on 10/15/68 from 87-70 173rd Street, New York, New York.

JOESTEN is an American citizen with American Passport No. Z 668893 issued on 4/18/67 at the American Consulate General in Stuttgart, FRG. JOESTEN was married on 9/8/40 in Stockholm to the former MAY J. NIELSSON, who was born on \_\_\_\_\_\_ in Gaevle. Sweden. They have a daughter, INGRID J., who was born on \_\_\_\_\_\_ in New York. JOESTEN's wife and daughter reside in the United States.

Other records in Munich which might be expected to contain some information about JOESTEN are negative.

None of our other applicable sources has been able to discreetly determine if JOESTEN's book concerning RAY is available at no cost. It would appear that the desired information cannot be obtained here discreetly. A direct approach to JOESTEN would probably determine whether or not the RAY publication is available free.
