FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE BUREAU, DURING ORIGINAL INTERVIEW WITH LEON POWELL, POWELL ADVISED THAT WHEN HE FIRST MET RALPH (LNU), RALPH AND HE AND HIS BROTHER WENT TO BACK ROOM OF BAR AND SAT IN THE BOOTHS. HOWEVER, DURING SUBSEQUENT INTERVIEW, WHEN POWELL WAS SKETCHING DIAGRAM OF BAR, POWELL ADVISED THAT HE, HIS BROTHER AND RALPH WENT TO ONE OF THE TABLES LOCATED IN THE BACK PART OF THE BAR. POWELL ADVISED HE COULD NOT REMEMBER WHICH SPECIFIC TABLE, HOWEVER, THOUGHT IT WAS ONE RIGHT BEHIND THE PARTITION WHICH SEPARATED THIS ROOM FROM THE BAR.

ATTEMPT TO LOCATE AND INTERVIEW BILL LOWERY OF LOWERY,

FOR INFORMATION OF ST. LOUIS, ON JAN. 12, 1976, LEON POWELL TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED ATLANTA OFFICE OF THE FBI AND ADVISED THAT HE AND HIS BROTHER CLAUDE POWELL. JR. . HAD BEEN APPROACHED BY AN INDIVIDUAL AND ASKED IF THEY WOULD BE INTERESTED IN ASSASSINATING MARTIN LUTHER KING. THIS INDIVIDUAL THEN PUT THEM IN CONTACT WITH A THIRD INDIVIDUAL, KNOWN ONLY TO THE POWELLS AS RALPH (LNU), WHO OFFERED THE POWELLS APPROXIMATELY \$75,000 TO DO THIS ASSASSINATION. THE POWELLS CLAIMED THEY NEVER TOOK THE CONTRACT AND DISMISSED THIS UNTIL THE RECENT DAN RATHER SPECIAL ON THE ASSASSINATION OF KING THE RELATIVES OF THE POWELLS HAVE BEEN CONTACTED AND ADVISED THAT THEY ARE NOT SURE THAT THIS INCIDENT AS RELATED BY THE POWELL BROTHERS ACTUALLY HAPPENED IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT BOTH LEON AND CLAUDE. JR.. HAVE BEEN KNOWNDTO DRINK QUITE HEAVILY. Enclosed for Memphis is a copy of identification record re FRED JENE DOBSON.

On 2/23/76, FRED JENE DOBSON, former PCI of the Las Vegas Office related the following information to SA WALTER J. SLAUGHTER:

DOBSON alleges that he served time with RAY in the Missouri State Prison, exact dates unrecalled. He said that RAY approached him as he, DOBSON, was considered a leader in the section of the prison where RAY was incarcerated. RAY told DOBSON he had a big job to do when he got out and needed some help. He solicited DOBSON's help but would not disclose the nature of the job but said it was "big." RAY told DOBSON he had influential friends and that there was a lot of money involved. RAY did not mention the amount but said it was in the thousands. RAY said he would talk to "his people" about getting DOBSON released early but later told DOBSON that his sources told him it could not be arranged.

Above being merely furnished to Memphis inasmuch as DOBSON has made this a matter of record.

ADVISED HE DID NOT KNOW A RALPH SETZET OF A RALPH SELTZED AND DID NOT MENTION EITHER NAME TO HIS BROTHER, TOM. LEE GODFREY TRAVELED TO ATLANTA ON WEEKEND OF FEB. 28, 1976, AND TALKED TO HIS BROTHER, ARNOLD RAY GODFREY. ARNOLD GODFREY RELATED HE DID NOT KNOW A RALPH SMITH AND WHEN LEE DESCRIBED THE INDIVIDUAL HE KNEW AS RALPH SMITH, ARNOLD SAID HE THOUGHT THE MAN'S NAME WAS JIM SMITH. HE DID NOT KNOW SMITH'S CURRENT WHEREABOUTS. ARNOLD SAID HE KNEW LEDN AND CLAUDE POWELL ON SIGHT BUT DID NOT ASSOCIATE WITH EITHER OME. HE DESCRIBED THEM AS DRUNKS. 



CLAUDE POWELL, JR., was located at the Scottish Inn Motel, Interstate Highway 20 at Holiday Hill Road, Room 211. POWELL was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and at the outset of the interview, was asked if he had been in contact with any member of his family or in particular, his brother, LEON POWELL. POWELL denied being in contact with any member of his family, including LEON POWELL, since his departure from Atlanta, Georgia, on December 31, 1975. He was then interviewed as follows:

POWELL was asked if he had ever been offered a large sum of money to commit a murder, and he immediately volunteered that he had been offered \$25,000 shortly before the actual assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING to murder MARTIN LUTHER KING. He recalled the circumstances of that offer as follows:

Approximately three to four weeks prior to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, he and his brother, LEON POWELL, were seated in a booth in Pete's Bar on Moreland Avenue in Atlanta, Georgia. A friend of his brother, RAY GODFREY, a musician and Atlanta City employee, joined them at their booth and engaged in conversation with LEON. He paid no particular attention to what LEON and RAY were talking about. GODFREY left the booth, and, in approximately 10 to 15 minutes, an individual previously unknown to him, came to their booth and seated himself opposite from LEON and him.

As this unknown person sat down, he placed an expensive-looking black brief case on the table. He described the unknown person as being a white male, approximately 5'8" in height, medium build, approximately 150 pounds, approximately 30 years of age. POWELL explained that the unknown person appeared to him to be out of place in such an establishment as Pete's Bar, in view of his dress, which did not fit into the crowd that frequented Pete's Bar.

The unknown person impressed him as being a well educated person, who appeared to be a professional type such as a lawyer. He said the unknown person was clean cut, and very calm and cool in his manner. He stated the unknown person may have introduced himself, but he does not recall any names. The unknown person asked LEON and him if they wanted to pull a job. He does not known the exact wording, but he questioned the unknown person concerning the nature of the job, and how much money it paid. The unknown person told him and LEON that he wanted them to do away with someone and when POWELL questioned the unknown person further, he was told that it was someone important. The unknown person then told him and LEON that he wanted them to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, and would pay them \$25,000 now and \$25,000 when the job was done. The unknown person then opened his brief case which was full of wrapped currency; some of the bills he noticed were in \$100 denominations. He stated that he was shocked by the statements of the unknown person, and initially assumed that it was some sort of prank or possibly a law enforcement officer trying to trick him. After the unknown person made the offer, he ignored any further conversation, whereupon the unknown person closed his brief case and departed.

He has never had any further contact, nor did he ever ascertain the identity of the unknown person, or means or reason for the offered payment to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING. He related that he had gained the bad reputation of being a hoodlum because of his past prison record, participation in several fights, and habit of carrying a shotgun in his vehicle, which he frequently loaned to the bartender at Pete's Bar whenever trouble occurred. He denied ever receiving such an offer prior to this incident, and further denied affiliation with any group which advocated racial hatred. He admitted that he had made statements while drunk to the effect that he had no aversion to killing blacks, although he had never seriously considered doing so.

POWELL stated he was shocked and dismayed to learn, approximately three to four weeks later, that MARTIN LUTHER KING had been murdered. He advised that he did not

go to any law enforcement officers, and tell them of the above contact with the unknown person, because he felt he might become a suspect in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

POWELL was then requested to assist the FBI by providing an artist conception of the unknown person who contacted him at Pete's Bar by the use of a facial identification catalogue. It was explained to POWELL that a sketch would be made from a combination of features that he selected from photographs displayed in the catalogue. Each category in the catalogue was thoroughly explained and photographs in these categories were shown to POWELL. POWELL then stated that he would be unable to assist in this regard because he had only talked with the unknown person for approximately five minutes, and that he would not recognize him even if he was brought into his motel room at that moment.



Pursuant to our recent telpehone conversation the following is a synopsis of Mrs. Minnitt's claim to a reward offered for information in James Earl Ray and the assassination of Martin Luther King. I would appreciate it if you would make a determination as to whether or not there is any reward money and, if so, what amount Mrs. Minnitt is entitled to receive. Please make any further communications with Mrs. Minnitt through my office regarding this matter.

Mrs. Minnitt contacted the F.B.I. in Washington, D.C. approximately 2 weeks after the death of Martin Luther King. Mrs. Minnitt first noticed Mr. Ray in Tucson & few weeks prior to the assassination of Dr. King. Apparently, Mr. Ray attended various church services and posed as a missionary. As you know, Mrs. Minnitt is an ordained Minister in the Pentecostal Church. Mrs. Minnitt had a newspaper clipping of James Earl Ray after the assassination. Mrs. Minnitt compared the newspaper clipping with the individual who reappeared at Church after the assassination and concluded that James Earl Ray was the individual attending the church services. Apparently, in the newspaper clipping Mr. Ray's hair was long and dark but was sandy and crewcut while in Tucson. As you know, the F.B.I. contacted Mrs. Minnitt approximately 24 hours after her telephone conversation with Washington. Mrs. Minnitt mentioned to F.B.I. agents that she was not sure whether she was interested in any reward for her services. I might add that Mrs. Minnitt mentioned that the first time, prior to the assassination, Mr. Ray looked in poor condition but after the assassination when he reappeared in Tucson he was dressed very nice and looked in good comdition.

AL THATCHER, 39 Briarcliff Road, Mountain Lakes, New Jersey, furnished the following information:

At approximately 8 p.m. on Wednesday, April 3, 1968, THATCHER was at the Municipal Airport in Detroit, Michigan, awating his home bound flight when he chanced to meet FRANCIS ERDMAN, a college classmate. Since both had time to wait before their respective flights, THATCHER and ERDMAN went to the airport bar where they sat at a table near the entrance doorway to the bar. Immedialely after entering the bar, THATCHER's attention was drawn to a young man in military unfiform who was seated at the far end of the bar. Although THATCHER could not overhear any of the conversation between the young man and bartender, it was obvious that the young man was engaged in excited conversation with the bartender because of the manner in which he was gesticulating.

As the young man prepared to leave the bar, approximately 20 minutes after THATCHER and his friend had entered the bar, the young man stopped at the THATCHER table and spoke with THATCHER and his friend for approximately two minutes. The gist of the this conversation by the young man according to THATCHER's recollection, was that he was enroute to Memphis, Tennessee, and that he was going to "- - get even" with Reverend KING because three Negro men had raped his redheaded girl friend. Although the young man did not seem to have a southern accent, THATCHER was left with the impression that Memphis was the home of the young man and that he was just returning from Vietnam.

According to THATCHER's recollection, the young man was a white male, in his mid twenties, 5'10" to 6' tall, approximately 180 pounds with sandy hair cut short, possibly crew cut, wearing a khaki uniform, either U.S. Army or Marine with chevrons indicating his rate to be that of corporal or sergeant. THATCHER stated that he was not positive but believed that the young man may have had a scar under his right eye.
