Birmingham, Ala. -UPI-Federal bureau of investigapoint that they had tracked down Eric Starvo Galt, the al-had revealed. leged assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., somewhere in California, sources close to the investigation disclosed Thursday.

The tip reportedly came from the "alleged brother" or some other co-conspirator in the killing.

Arrest Expected

It apparently was because of the expected impending arrest that authorities obtained a first degree murder warrant against Galt and also a federal warrant charging him with conspiracy.

The exact location in California where authorities expected to make the arrest Wednesday was not disclosed, but Galt is known to have area.

Sources said that the tip obviously was wrong or that Galt-if he is in Californiaeluded authorities.

An FBI spokesman in Washington said, "The FBI has no one in custody in connection with Dr. King's slaying," but another source indicated the FBI was either in communication with or questioning the "alleged brother" of Eric Galt. The brother has not been charged.

Rifle Returned

After Galt bought a rigle from a sporting goods store

> The FBI apparently had reason to believe that Galt, who speaks with a rural accent and had several aliases, might have returned to Birmingham after the assassination Apr. 4.

In a check of 22 rooming houses in Birmingham Thursday, 10 managers said FBI agents had questioned them in search of Galt early this week.

Most of the same boarding houses already had been checked by FBI agents in the days immediately after the slaying, when agents traced the rifle found in Memphis to the Birmingham sporting goods store.

Galt was charged Wednesday in a federal warrant spent time in the Los Angeles signed by FBI agent Joseph.H. amble and United States Commissioner Mildred F. Sprague with conspiracy to violate the civil rights of King.

Memphis, Tenn. - The mysterious Eric Starvo Galt has been charged with conspiracy and murder in the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr.

The FBI said in a fugitive warrant issued Wednesday n ight in Birmingham, Ala., that Galt, 36, conspired with a man "whom he alleged to be his brother" to violate King's civil rights.

The state charge of first degree murder was filed against Gast in Memphis where King, 39 was shot to death on a fhotel balcony Apr. 4 by a sniper wlo fled from a nearby robming house.

First degree murder in Tennessee carries the death penalty, although the state's electric chair has not been used since 1960.

the charge against Galt, however, is contained in a warrant. Before he could stand tria, he must be indicted by a

grand jury.

The maximum penalty under the federal charge of conspiracy to violate a person's civil rights is a \$5,000 fine and 10 year prison sentence.

There was no further mention in the FBI statement about the alleged brother, and no charge was filed against

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover announced in Washington that the conspiracy to "injure, oppress, <u>threaten</u> <u>or</u> intimidate" King began "on or about Mar. 30" in Birmingham.

The FBI statement said a .30-'06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight found near the rooming house shortly after King was slain, was purchased Mar. 30 in Birmingham.

Hunt Began Week Ago

The FBI started hunting Galt a week ago. Agents even contacted persons named Galt in several states in an attempt to find him.

"Unless he was wearing a wig or had had a face lift or! something, it's not the man I saw," said Charles Q. Stevens, who lives at the Main st. rooming house from which the fatal shot apparently was fired.

"The hair is too full and the face is too young," he said. But Stevens said he only got a side view of the fleeing figure.

Nervous Man Recalled

But Willie Greene, an attendant at a service station about three blocks from where King was shot, was emphatic. He said he remembered a nervous man using a telephone outside his station the day of the slaying.

Shown the FBI picture of Galt, Greene exclaimed: 'That's him.'

Greene said the man apparently tried to make a call and didn't succeed.

"He was nervous. He kept walking up and d'own the street. It was right about the time Dr. King was killed and he kept pacing up and down the street until we closed with the curfew." King was killed at 6:01 p.m. The curfew began at 7 p.m.

The FBI, apparently relying on witnesses, said the fugitive had been described as a white man, 5 feet 8 to 5 feet 11, 160 to 175 pounds, with brown hair in a brush cut, blue eyes, straight nose.

Used Aliases

Galt has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Lowmeyer, the FBI said. The assassin registered at the Memphis rooming house under the name of John Willard.

Details of the alleged conspiracy were missing from the FHI release, as were vital statistics, such as Galt's birthplice, formal schooling, employment. The statement said

The FBI statement also said: Galt claimed to have been a

owner of a 1966 white Mustang with Alabama license plates that was abandoned in Atlanta the day after King was shot to death. The vehicle was left in the parking lot of an apartment project near the Georgia capitol.

Two white Mustangs were parked near the rooming house shortly before the shooting, witnesses have said, and both disappeared minutes later. Some witnesses told of a man in a black business suit, neatly dressed, walking down the steps to the street, dropping a rifle and getting into a Mustang with either Alabama or Arkansas tags.

Saw Arkansas Tag

A businessman said Wednesday night that he was certain that the Mustang parked farthest from the shooting scene had an Arkansas tag. "I'm clear in my own mind," he said.

The FBI said Galt's car traveled more than 19,000 miles between Aug. 30, 1967, when he bought it in Birmingham, and its abandonment last week in Atlanta. There were trips to Los Angeles, New Orleans and Mexico, the FBI

"Galt was reported to have been in Memphis Apr. 3 and 4, 1968, and to have departed from there for Atlanta," the FBI said.

Galt was said to have taken danking lessons in New Orleans in 1964 or 1965, in Birmingham during 1967 and in Long Beach, Calif., in recent months.

Ray on Most Wanted List

From Press Dispatches

Washington, D. C. – The manhunt for the escaped convict accused of the murder of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., gained new intensity Saturday when the FBI placed his name on its most wanted list.

James Earl Ray, who masqueraded as Eric Starvo Galt at the time King was slain in Memphis, was placed on the list even though there are 10 fugitives already on it.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said he decided to add Ray to insure the widest possible dissemination of the 40 year old suspect's picture and description to the police and the public:

In addition, a special alert was set up in the Mexican border area, in the event Ray tried to flee the country. Special arrangements were made to show Ray's picture on the ABC television show, "The FBI," Sunday evening.


The New York Times news service reported Saturday that the man now known as Ray seemed well supplied with money when he lived in Birmingham last fall.

Agents have found that he spent more than \$4,000, but they have been unable to find where he worked during that period, or whether he worked at all, the report said.

Ray apparently kept his money in a safety deposit box at the Birmingham Trust National bank.

During his stay in Birmingham from Aug. 27 to Apr. 4, Ray's expenses included a 1966 Mustang, for which he paid \$1,995 in cash; repair work on the car; living expenses at about \$50 a week; an expensive pair of binorylar; and a rifle with a telescopic sight.

King was slain on the porch of a hotel in Memphis on Apr. 4. He was shot from ambush by a man in a rundown rooming house across the street. The man escaped in a white Mustang, later found abandoned in Atlanta.

It was reported Thursday that an informer, co-operating with the FBI, led to a belief that King's slayer was in California.

A reliable source told UPI that FBI agents were in communication with Galt's "alleged brother."

Out of its belief that an arrest was imminent on Wednesday, the FBI had filed its charges against Galt. Officials in Memphis followed up by swearing out a murder warrant for his arrest.

But if the manhunt — one of the most intensive in American history — was in fact closing around Galt, he apparently managed to escape it.

Ray was identified in the FBI announcement as having used the aliases of Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

The man who checked into the Memphis rooming house a few hours before King was shot used the name John Willand.

The latest development strengthened the theory that King's slayer had carefully created the personality of "Eric Starvo Galt" in the

months before the murder in a "lon careful plan to escape after the crime was committed."

Hoover said Ray's criminal record dated back to 1949 when he was convicted of burglary in Los Angeles. He was convicted of armed robbery in Chicago in 1952 and of forging United States postal money orders in Missouri in 1955.

He had served time in the Los Angeles county jail in 1949; in state prisons at Joliet, Ill., and Pontiac, Ill., from 1952 to 1954; and in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kan., from 1955 to 195%.

Warden Harold Swenson of the Missouri state prison in Jefferson City said Ray was "an evasive type of person."

"I don't think anybody either liked him or disliked him," the warden said.

Swenson said Ray had succeeded in escaping from the prison by hiding in a bread truck. He had been working in the prison's food service system.

Prison records showed Ray was born Mar. 19, 1928, at Alton, Ill. The FBI said he claimed to have attended school through the 10th grade in Alton.

H e said, however, that he and Galt went their separate ways while in that city, and that he had no idea what his companion was up to

At the time of the trip, Galt was staying in a Los Angeles apartment. Residents there eithe did not know or remained tight lipped about him.

However, Galt subsequently

moved to a hotel, the St. Francis on Hollywood blvd., one block away from a cocktail lounge known as the Rabbits Foot club. The crowd there remembers Galt very well.

Nightly Patron

Until three or four weeks ago, according to bartender Bo Del Monte, Galt was a nightly patron.

He would come in at around 9 p.m, perch on a stool near the door, and order the first of several screwdrivers (vodka

The thing everybody at the Rabbits Foot-club remembers most about Galt is the big dispute he got into.

Jim Morrison, who was the bartender that night, recalled that Galt had begun talking with a young woman named Pattie. Somehow the conversation turned to Negroes, and she declared them to be "good people."

Suddenly, Galt began dragging her by the arm toward the door.

"I'll drop you off in Watts and we'll see how you like it there!" Galt shouted.

Reports Differ

From Press Dispatches
United Press International
reported Thursday that Galt
allegedly had a conspirator in
the King assassination and
that the conspirator later informed on Galt to the FBI.

The Los Angeles Times, however, contradicted that report by saying that Galt was the lone subject of the FBI investigation, even though an FBI complaint charged that Galt conspired in the slaying with his "alleged brother."

with his "alleged brother."

The UPI said a tip from the alleged informer led the FBI to believe it could arrest Galt in California Wednesday. This belief led federal authorities to rapidly obtain a conspiracy warrant against Galt. Memphis officials then swore out a murder warrant.

The FBI said in Washington Thursday that it "has no one in custody in connection with Dr. King's slaying," but UPI queted a reliable source as saying that agents either were in communication with or questioning Galt's "alleged brother."

The Los Angeles Times, on the other hand, said a federal soufce pointed out that the complaint alleging a conspirate could have been based on nothing more substantial than testimony by a witness that he had heard Galt say he and a brother planned to kill King or to use the rifle believed to be the murder weapon.

De Pugh Mentioned

Kansas City, Mo. -AP- The United States attorney's office said Thursday that an informant "of apparent reliability" told the federal government some time ago that King was among persons ordered assassinated if Robert Bolivar De Pugh ever went to jail.

De Pugh is the leader of the Minutemen organization, a militant right wing organization. He is appealing a November, 1966, conviction in Kansas City for a national firearms violation, but is wanted on a federal grand jury indictment accusing him of conspiracy to rob banks in Seattle in January. His whereabouts is not known.

FBI Alert in Florida Still Names Eric Galt

Tallahassee, Fla. -UPI- The lid on any public progress research for the slayer of the port in the manhunt. The poli-Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., took another mysterious twist Tuesday when the FBI issued a pickup order for prime suspect Eric Starvo Galt and asked that it be transmitted to all law enforcement agencies in Florida.

The order said Galt was wanted for "civil rights conspiracy" and had used the aliases of Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard.

It made no mention of James Earl Ray, the 40 year old escapee from the Missouri state prison. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has said fingerprints have proved Ray was the same person as Galt. "Ray and Galt are identical." Hoover said last week.

The FBI in Miami refused comment. Earlier Monday, the FBI in Washington clamped a cy was expected to prevail until a suspect was captured or some dramatic new development occurred.

The Florida alert was the state's second in 12 days for Galt. On Apr. 11, the day a white Mustang car registered to Galt was found abandoned in Atlanta, the FBI issued a "locate and observe" order for: Galt in Florida. About five hours later, it was canceled and the FBI indicated later that the order was a mistake.

A Miami police official was skeptical of the current alert's failure to mention Ray's name.

"Maybe in about another week the correction will catch up with the message," he said.

In Los Angeles, the FBI was reported trying to find a blond woman who was dating Ray before he disappeared from southern California.

The FBI office declined to comment on the report.

However, the woman was known to have been with Ray in a Hollywood bar one evening during the second week in March — one of the last times Ray was seen in the area before King's assassination.

FBI agents have been making inquiries about her in Los Angeles, giving rise to conjecture she might have traveled with Ray when he left.

King Suspect Eyed Bounty'

Dalton, Ga. - A prison buddy of James Earl Ray said Tuesday that when Ray heard there was a "million-dollar bounty" on the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., he smiled and said, "I'll collect it."

Ray, a 40 year old fugitive from the Missouri state prison, is accused by the federal bureau of investigation of assassihating King in Memphis on Apr. 4.

In the Dalton jail, Raymond Curtis, 40, awaiting appeal on a murder sentence, said he had known Ray in the Kansas city jail, in federal prison at Leavenworth, Kan., and in the state prison at Jefferson City,

He described Ray as "lik-able," addicted to "dope," a "loner" and a man concerned only with money.

On the day President Ken-

23, 1963-Curtis said he, Ray and about 150 other prisoners were in an exercise yard when they heard the news.

He said Ray remarked. "Well, somebody made a pret-ty penny on that."

About a week later, Curtis said, he and Ray were in the yard when "a new man just in off the street" told them, "The businessmen's association has a million-dollar bounty out for Martin Luther King."

Ray smiled, Curtis said, and said, "If there's a million dollars out for King, I believe if I ever get out I'll collect it."

Curtis said he never figured out what the "new-man" meant by the "businessmen's association." He said he couldn't remember who the

confirmed that Curtis and Ray were in prison at the same time. Authorities in Dalton said the FBI had interviewed Curtis on Sunday and again Monday night. It refused comment on the matter.

Meanwhile, the Los Angeles Times reported Tuesday that the FBI was seeking a woman in connection with the hunt for Ray. The FBI refused to comment.

The Times said it learned that the bureau was looking for a blond, blue eyed woman, about 27, who was reportedly seen with Ray in the Los Angeles area this year. She disappeared about the same time Ray did, the paper said it had found.

The two were reportedly seen together in a cocktail lounge in mid-March in the Hollywood hotel where "Ray
